

The Modern House: Contemporary Art + Design is Bonhams new multidisciplinary auction created by specialists across our contemporary art, design, photographs and prints departments in Los Angeles. It is dedicated not only in the way many of us collect—but live. Browse the catalog or peruse the preview in our Los Angeles galleries and you will find Mid-Century design for your home including furniture and objets d'art from some of the giants in the field—a Sam Maloof rocker, a myriad of offerings from legendary glassmaker Dale Chihuly, works from Pierre Jeanneret and George Nakashima and one of the most important collections of John Dickinson design ever assembled. Contemporary photography is particularly strong this iteration including a monumental photograph of Michael Jackson from celebrated imagist David LaChapelle to artist Trevor Paglen's haunting photo of a clandestine US military black site. Paintings in The Modern House mirror its offerings of Mid-Century design with abstractions from Thomas Downing, Larry Zox, Thomas Mehring and Paul Reed. These selections of paintings are balanced with artists dynamic emerging markets such as California artists Zio Ziegler, Liza Lou and Terence Koh as well as compelling Latin American pieces by Olga de Amaral, José Bedia and Mathias Goeritz.

Los Angeles artist Liza Lou (who now splits her time between LA and South Africa) was thrust in the international spotlight for her monumental sculptural installation The Kitchen (1991-1996), a life size kitchen created from a dizzying mosaic of glass beads. The work is actually comprised of many smaller pieces as her kitchen is overflowing with items one would find in an actual domestic setting -a six pack of beer, Windex on the counter, a pie in the oven, a broom with swept up cereal in the dust pan, striped curtains over the windows and many other elements that comprise this tableau of micro-moments. A collective gasp from visitors could be heard when the work was exhibited at the New Museum of Contemporary Art, New York, while museumgoers took in the epic 5-year project and considered the monumental effort put forth by the artist, who laid every bead with her own hand. Physically, the massive undertaking took its toll on Lou, and the artist's subsequent works, after 1995, were created by larger teams of artisans. The present lots, Comet (1993) and Campbell's Soup (1992), created very early in Lou's career, were made by the artist during the production of The Kitchen. One fascinating element of the Campbell's Soup works is that each one was created over an actual full can of Campbell's Soup - soup included. A variant of the Comet can be seen to the right of the sink in the installation, which has since been acquired for the permanent collection of the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York.

# THE LEGACY OF DESIGNER JOHN DICKINSON DIANE DORRANS SAEKS

I was extremely fortunate to meet John Dickinson, and to include his work in several of my design books. Before his death in 1983, we were working on a book about his ideas, inspirations, interiors and furniture. He became a mentor for me—and I taped many conversations with him.

John Dickinson's words are relevant today.

"Prettiness has nothing to do with style," John told me. "Logic precludes prettiness. If you're stripping down rooms, as I do, there's no place for it."

Perhaps because he was very inaccessible--he seldom left San Francisco and loved to spend the day working at his studio-- his work and his persona were somewhat intimidating. He hand-picked his clients. There is a mystique about the man and his designs that continues to inspire designers.

Like Jean-Michael Frank who said about his designs, "One doesn't work in centimetres but in millimetres", John Dickinson was a perfectionist. Nothing about his rooms was left to chance but they never looked stiff, intimidating, pretentious or on-show. Chairs were to be used and moved, pillows were to be leaned on. Lights were for reading or drawing, tables were the right height for books, drinks, ashtrays, newspapers.

# THE JOHN DICKINSON 'LOOK'

John Dickinson's look was original, daring, witty, learned, rigorous and rather rarified. His signatures included his remarkable line white plaster tables and lamps, natural canvas upholstery, simple sculptural shapes, classical references, white-painted wood, plain taupe or gray carpet outlined in white or black, muted colors and not too many of them. Luxury is in the details and in fine craftsmanship, and usually some charming eccentricity.

Tables have faux primitive animal legs, lamps and mirrors sprout twigs, a console has the rough texture of hacked stone, a three-legged lamp-base was inspired by an African tribal wood stool. One chic small table he designed looked, he said, "like rough boards pegged together by a five-year-old."

Dickinson loved the paradox of what Andree Putman calls, "rich and poor"--expensive upholstery details on plan canvas, an elegant slipper chair upholstered in white Naugahyde, muslin curtains done in the most "Balenciaga" way.

### THE FIREHOUSE

John Dickinson lived in his finest design, an 1893 firehouse. With its brass name plates, white-canvas duck curtained portiere, white-lacquered grand piano, white canvas sofas, plaster tables, chromed fireplace, gray carpets, and "peeling" walls, it was a remarkable place to visit. Leo Keoshian encountered John Dickinson when they were both members of the Society for the Encouragement of Contemporary Art (SECA) program at SFMoMA. Knowing and admiring John's work, Mr. Keoshian engaged him in 1970 to renovate his 1930s Northern California home. The work took place in two stages over a period of two years.

The commission was a collaboration of mutual trust and admiration. Leo and Marlys Keoshian happily gave carte blanche to the designer, while also adding their informed ideas, resulting in a living space that complemented the owners' personalities.

Dickinson designed almost all elements of the house, including furniture, lighting and carpets and carefully placed the rest, with the custom-designed pattern of the carpet in the living room, dining room and hall guiding the placement of the furniture he had chosen and designed.

A perfect jewel box of John Dickinson's style, it demonstrated his elements of classicism, whimsy, and of course, logic and function.

If the parties cannot agree on a national arbitration service, the arbitration shall be conducted by the American Arbitration Association, and the arbitrator

shall be selected in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator's award shall be in writing and shall set forth findings of fact and legal conclusions.

- (i) the arbitration shall occur within 60 days following the selection of the arbitrator;
