

"A cowboy's saddle is just about his most important piece of equipment. Along with his bed, leggings, spurs and assorted bits, it pretty much rounds out the

average cowboy's working gear. A saddle used on the big cow ranches or in the arena generally reflects a cowboy's tastes as to style and finish. The country a man works in and the people he admires has a lot to do with the cut of his gear.

A saddle can have any number of trees from the Bowman to the Wade. It can have round or square skirts, be tooled or basket stamped. One thing for sure, whether used for working outside or in the arena it has to have a seat in it and it has got to be made to take a lot of abuse.

This bronze sculpture is of the saddle that I use for team roping and have used on the 06 Ranch at Alpine, Texas. It was made for me by Kalispell, Montana saddlemaker [sic], Earl Twist in 1979. It has a Bowman tree with a 13 inch swell, 15 1/2 inch seat and a 3 1/2 cantle. The saddle is full hand tooled with an inlaid quilted seat. I had Earl put a small pocket on the rear skirt to carry an extra horseshoe, some nails and a Swiss army knife.

I wish I had a nickel for every steer I have turned back in this saddle and it is just as good as the day it was made. I would just like to figure out a way to spend a little more time in it."  $^{1}$



According to S.H. McGarry, in *Honoring The Western Tradition: The L.D. "Brink" Brinkman Collection*, the artist Ray Swanson's background having grown up on a farm served as influence for much of the work he produced throughout his career. 'God created all people with beauty, and that is how I will paint them,' Swanson told his biographer Tom O'Keefe" Among his paintings of elder Navajo tribesmen, McGarry said of the present work, "the man in *Returning Home*, whose distinguished age and demeanor are set off by contemporary combinations of buckskin moccasins, blue jeans, a rumpled sports jacket, felt hat and cane."<sup>2</sup>

In a description of the present work, the artist recorded in a letter to L.D. Brinkman:

"When the indians took prisoners they tried to drive them half nuts before they killed them. Binding them so that a long stick passed between their arms and back was a favorite way of doing this.

Usually the stick was a stont [sic] willow, the willow would bend but would not break so the prisoner always had it with him. The stick was long enough that if the prisoner tried to escape the ends of the stick would catch in the brush and bushes and thereby slow the escapee down.

Another reason for using the willow was that because of its suppleness its constant pressure against the prisoner's back reminded him that things were pretty grim and his captors had complete control."<sup>1</sup>
