By the early 1960s Nolan's international fame was reaching a crescendo based on his paintings of Kelly, Burke and Wills, Mrs Fraser and the convict Bracefell, and Gallipoli. Each of these flawed heroes and anti-heroes existed within landscapes that were essential to their narrative. In each case, Nolan visited the areas he depicted before starting to paint. In 1964 when an opportunity came to visit Antarctica on a U.S. naval ship he lept at the opportunity. Aside from his love of travel and natural curiosity, he had a lifelong interest in the great age of Antarctic exploration and its leading men, Amundsen, Scott, Mawson and Shackleton. The *Antarctic* series that followed Nolan's journey was to be his last major body of work that examined the making of legends. When the paintings were first exhibited in New York and London early the following year they were shown alongside *Kelly* and *Burke and Wills* paintings.





The presence of the great explorers was central to the *Antarctic* series. The imagery of the hooded and goggled men encrusted in ice was inspired by photographs taken by Herbert Ponting during the Scott expedition and Frank Hurley who accompanied the Mawson and Shackleton expeditions. Nolan had used historic photographs before as source material for both the *Kelly* and *Burke and Wills* series. However, in the case of the Antarctic explorers his diary reveals other visual references too as diverse as Byzantine saints and Aboriginal carvings.

At the first exhibitions of the *Antarctic* series in New York, London, Canberra and Melbourne in 1965 the paintings of the explorers were displayed interspersed among the landscapes. As Allan Moorhead wrote in his introduction to the New York and London catalogues, 'The polar explorer is an embattled figure with staring goggled eyes and a swirl of protective covering round his head and body... He is a static object, it is the landscape that moves: the drifting iceberg, the circling sun and the mirage towering up and dissolving on the heights above.'









Nolan suffered a severe injury to his hand whilst serving in the army at Ballarat in 1943. In this retelling, Nolan symbolically casts himself in military slouch hat framed by the square of a Kelly helmet and depicts a face (a reworking of his wartime work The Vegetative Eye now in the collection of Heide Museum of Modern Art, Melbourne), presumably that of his former lover and patron Sunday Reed, biting off his fingers. Nolan's poem, 'Ballarat', on this theme appeared in his book *Paradise Garden* in 1971.



Alan Moorehead, the distinguished Australian author whose book on Gallipoli had been one of the inspirations for Nolan's series on that subject in the 1950s was also behind the voyage to Antarctica in 1964. He planned to write about the heroic age of explorers and Nolan, who accompanied him, was to paint the subject. The book was not written but Moorehead's introduction to Nolan's London and New York exhibition catalogues evoked in words the landscape that Nolan depicted in paint: 'as you gaze upwards, you see a tremendous mirage forming. It creates a second range of mountains on top of the first, and this false range is impossibly, unbelievably high, and often its outlines are clearer than the real range that lies below.'

Nolan was seldom influenced by a single source and in the present work appears to draw on the work of J.M.W. Turner, the master of the Romantic sublime, whose tumultuous, swirling seascapes captured both the awe and potential danger of their environment.

While painting the Antarctic explorers Nolan was reading *The Worst Journey* in the World by Apsley Cherry Garrard, a member of Scott's disastrous last expedition, who was left shocked by his experiences. Nolan's paintings of the Antarctic explorers delve into the physical and psychological struggles they endured.

In this work the bowed head, saint-like with a halo of ice, is reminiscent of John Charles Dollman's popular painting, *A Very Gallant Gentleman*, 1913, that depicts the stooped figure of Captain Oates as he walked heroically from Scott's tent. Nolan, however, was rarely literal in depicting his legends nor limited himself to single sources of inspiration and here we also see the influence of Coleridge's epic poem 'The Ryme of the Ancient Mariner' which recounts the story of a sailor surviving a voyage in Antarctic waters.







- "Forgery" an imitation intended by the maker or any other person to deceive as to authorship, attribution, origin, authenticity, style, date, age, period, provenance, culture source or composition, which at the date of the Sale had a value materially less than it would have had if the Lot had not been such an imitation, and which is not stated to be such an imitation in any description of the Lot. - "interpleader proceedings": proceedings in the Courts to determine ownership or rights over a *Lot*. "knocked down": when a *Lot* is sold to a Bidder, indicated by
- the fall of the hammer at the Sale.
- "lien": a right for the person who has possession of the Lot to

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
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
