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

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Property from the collection of Nicole and William M. Keck II Sold to Benefit Multiple Charitable Organizations

William M. Keck II ("Bill") was the grandson of the legendary oil wildcatter, William Myron Keck, the patriarch of the family, who would ultimately create one of the nation's largest philanthropic institutions – the W.M. Keck Foundation. Known as "W.M." to the family, Bill's grandfather and sole namesake founded The Superior Oil Company in Coalinga, CA in 1921, which – following decades of growth – was sold to Mobil Oil in 1984. At the time of the sale, Superior Oil Company was the largest independent oil producer in the country.

Bill's grandfather originally established seven separate foundations to further education and research in the fields of science, engineering and social welfare. Among the numerous grants distributed over the years, the W.M. Keck Foundation may be best known for the construction of the W.M. Keck Observatory on Mauna Kea in Hawaii, and for its funding of original programming for PBS's Sesame Street.

While the Keck family name is attached to medical buildings and research centers, William M. Keck II preferred avoiding the "naming" limelight in philanthropic endeavors. Nonetheless, he served for many years on the board of the W.M. Keck Foundation and also led the W.M. Keck, Jr. Foundation, also established by his grandfather. Bill's focus, however, steadfastly remained on the core missions of the foundations.

Following Bill's passing in 2014, Bonhams was honored to present much of the Keck Collection at auction. Today, Bill's wife and widow, Nicole Keck, has decided the time has come for new stewardship of the remaining collection. Continuing their history of philanthropy and charitable giving, the Keck Collection is being sold to benefit a wide range of charitable organizations around the world – from Los Angeles to Nepal. The proceeds of these sales will help fund diverse organizations, including the Maryknoll Father and Brothers, whose goal is to bring health clinics, schools and clean water to underserved areas in Nepal; Harvey Mudd College in Claremont, CA, which will augment existing William M. Keck II Scholarship Funds; The Julliard School of Music in New York, adding to tuition scholarship funds; as well as UCLA Medical Center and Jules Stein Eye Institute in Los Angeles, which will fund ongoing research. After decades of association with the Collection of Nicole and William M. Keck II, Bonhams is honored to be a part of the collection's latest chapter.

Developed for Patek Philippe in the late 1950's by the renowned Louis Cottier, the uncommon dual time Ref. 2597 was aimed at the sophisticated international air traveler encountering rapidly changing time zones. Previous dual time watches requiring two separate movements were difficult to synchronize. By making the hour hand adjustable while the minute hand remains fixed, the problem was avoided. In addition, with buttons on the side of the case to adjust the hour, it was no longer necessary to remove the watch from the wrist to set the hour.

Patented in 1959, the present example, from 1960, is one of the first series produced. An additional fixed hour hand was added to later versions. From the collection of the original owner, this watch has never before been offered for sale. The Gübelin signature on the dial adds to its rarity.

The present lot is a first execution model with drilled and applied hour-markers, compared to later examples that used glued-on hourmarkers. The dial is signed by Gübelin, making it a rarer version of a 'standard' Ref. 2526. It also features its original 18K gold 'D-type' brickwork Gay Frères bracelet, with the same double 'PP' motif on the outer folding clasp, and stamped '1 / 55', the same year the watch was sold.







Margaret Olivia Slocum Sage (1828 – 1918) was the second wife of the notorious miserly robber baron, Russell Sage (1816 – 1906).

Russell Sage was a self-taught entrepreneur who began his career at his brother's Troy, New York grocery store. By the age of 21, he was able to buy the store, only to sell it in 1839 and use the profits to set up a wholesale shipping trade along the Hudson River. Active in local politics, he then served in the US House of Representatives, 1853-1857.

Moving to New York City in the 1860's, he made his fortune on Wall Street investing notably in railroad stocks. More than many of his contemporaries, he earned a reputation as a miser.

Olivia Slocum married him in 1869. Upon her husband's death, she inherited his \$70 million fortune and, in contrast, devoted the rest of her life to philanthropy.

Watches made for the Turkish market appear distinctly different from Brequet's typically restrained neo classical designs.

A.- L. Breguet developed the market for his watches in the Ottoman Empire partly in response to the disruption of European trade due to the Napoleonic Wars. His sales to England all but ceased in the opening decade of the 1800's. He was aided in this venture by his friendship with Esseid Ali Effendi who had served as the Ottoman ambassador to Paris 1797-1802. The two corresponded after his return to Constantinople. Ali Effendi advised Breguet on the appearance of watches to appeal to Turkish taste. The result were watches such as the present example, richly decorated with red enamel and scenic panels produced in Geneva. His watches were well received and, in 1804, Ali Effendi commissioned an elaborate watch for the Ottoman emperor.

Edouard François was granted French patent no. 128652 on 25 January 1879, for a "chronomètre perfectionné".

He designed a remontoire mechanism in which the mainspring is used to wind a subsidiary spring barrel that actually drives the train. Planted on the backplate, the base of the smaller barrel is set with a series of pins that periodically engage a lever that releases a cam that unlocks the mainspring barrel. A short period of rewinding follows until the cam is re engaged.

The chronometer mechanism is contained within the three patinated "tanks". The tallest conceals the weight. It is raised by a pulley in the middle tank that also contains the great wheel. The winder is a spoked wheel on the top of the tank. The great wheel is linked by a pinion in the right hand tank to the wheel train of the chronometer.

The chronometer movement has partly cut away round plates ioined by four pillars. The escapement is mounted in a subplate and three separate cocks it has a spring detent, conical hairspring and regulator, four arm bimetallic balance with adjustable weights. The silvered dial has an outer 60-seconds ring enclosing a subsidiary roman chapter ring and blued hands

To the right of the tall tank is a smaller weight that rises to give the state of wind on a silvered scale as the main weight falls. Above the tanks is a calendar mechanism linked by a cord to the smaller weight and displaying the date on a silvered ring.

In front of the tanks is a spring driven series of automated levers that mimic the action of a pump and is wound by a separate spoked wheel



There is only scattered information about the creator of this remarkable clock, Pierre Calmel (1783 - 1849). He held the position of contremaître serrurier (foreman locksmith) at the Arsenal de Rochefort, the French naval base and dockyard. He was clearly a talented machinist and self taught clockmaker as the present example demonstrates.

In 1825 he constructed an elaborate astronomical clock under the direction of Jean Claude Nicolas Le Huen (1790-1860), a naval officer, marine engineer and hydrographer at the naval base. The clock survives today in the Musée d'Art et d'Histoire of Rochefort. Designed as a large mechanical orrery, the clock shows: mean time, the day, week, date, month and season in addition to the daily rotation of the earth and its annual revolution around the sun, the movement of the moon around the earth and its phase. Also, the yearly progression of the Sun through the 12 signs of the Zodiac and the Sun's position relative to the main planets.

In 1844, Calmel exhibited several of his creations comprising "a socalled pneumatic clock, an astronomical clock, and a striking ship's clock" at an Exposition of Art and Industry in Bordeaux. Sadly, the jury found them overly complex and too expensive to merit an award. That said, the present automaton clock is certainly a monument to the creativity of this all but forgotten inventor.

Samuel Kralik (b. 1815) was an Austro-Hungarian clockmaker much honored in his lifetime for his work with precision clocks. In addition to the Vienna Exposition, he showed his work at numerous international exhibitions, notably the 1851 Great Exhibition at Crystal Palace, London. In 1862, he was appointed clockmaker to the King of Hungary and in 1875 became clockmaker to the Austrian Emperor Franz Joseph I.

The present clock is one of several he exhibited in Vienna. These impressed the American Commissioners attending the Exhibition: "Samuel Kralik, of Pesth, had a very creditable display of clocks showing excellent workmanship. In this collection were sixteen well-made models of different escapements for demonstration; the balances being about four inches in diameter. Two large-sized mantel-clocks were meritorious for good workmanship and ingenuity. One had a large -balance, with two escapement-wheels, acting something like a Swiss chronometer; the teeth of one of the wheels acting on the detent, and the other upon the roller-impulse jewel." The present clock is a remarkable document on the state of published clock making technology at the end of the 18th century. It addresses two of the major concerns faced by clock makers: precision time keeping and the measurement of "true time."

Precision pendulum clocks revealed a significant difference between "true time", the apparent time seen in the shadow of a sundial, and "mean time" the average time measured by a clock. The yearly cycle of this variation became known as the "Equation of Time." Needless to say, building a mechanically elegant, self-adjusting Equation clock presented an irresistible challenge to 18th century clock makers.

Lazarus duplicated the movement of the George Graham regulator described and illustrated in the 1745 treatise, *De Astronomica Specula Domestica et Organico Apparatu Astronomico* published in Vienna by G.J. Marinoni (1676-1755), mathematician and astronomer to the Imperial Court of Austria. This work is a catalogue of the astronomical instruments in his private observatory. He ultimately left these to the Empress Maria Theresa, to whom he had dedicated the work. The shape of the movement plates and pillars, form of the anchor, layout of the train and the placement of the maintaining power on an intermediate wheel are all clearly illustrated in the engravings that accompany the treatise.

For the additional Equation work Lazarus could have turned to articles Julien Le Roy contributed to the *Grande Encyclopédie* of Diderot. Lazarus chose to plant his equation cam on a small subsidiary calendar wheel driven from the main calendar by a rod and worm gear. This design was described in Le Roy's essay on the Equation of Time.

The incentive to construct an Equation timepiece may have been in response to LeRoy's pronouncement that that any skilled maker could make a mean time *[temps moyen]* clock, but the true test of a fine clock maker was to construct a clock keeping apparent solar time *[temps vrai]*.

French enameler, painter and writer Claudius Marcel Popelin (1825-1892) began his career as an historical painter, and from 1852 to 1862 he sent paintings based on French and Italian Renaissance subjects to the Salon; from 1860, however, his study of the 16th Century inclined him towards the decorative arts. Though initially producing faience, he preferred the painting on enamel.

Working in the tradition of the 16th Century Limosin family, from 1863 he devoted the next 30 years to the art of enameling. His portrait of Napoleon III of 1865 is in the Musée d'Orsay, Paris. His masterpiece, Triumph of Truth, exhibited in the Salon in 1867, consisted of portraits of 12 philosophers arranged around the central figure.

His success resulted in orders from manufacturers, and his enamels were used to decorate furniture, bronzes, silver and gold objects and bookbinding plates. Popelin was an erudite artist, a bibliophile and a poet and was one of the circle of artists who met at the salons of Princess Mathilde Bonaparte, who became his wife in 1873. He popularized the art of enameling through several theoretical essays. He was the author of *L'Email des Peintres* (1866), a treatise on the history and techniques of enameling.

The mediator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling mediations. Any communications made during the mediation process shall not be admissible in any subsequent arbitration, mediation or judicial proceeding. All proceedings and any resolutions thereof shall be confidential, and the terms governing arbitration set forth in paragraph (c) below shall govern.

(b) If mediation does not resolve all disputes between the parties, or in any event no longer than 60 days after receipt of the written notice of dispute referred to above, the parties shall submit the dispute for binding arbitration before a single neutral arbitrator. Such arbitrator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling arbitrations. Such arbitrator shall make all appropriate disclosures required by law. The arbitrator shall be drawn from a panel of a national arbitration service agreed to by the parties, and shall be selected as follows: (i) If the national arbitration service has specific rules or procedures, those rules or procedures shall be followed: (ii) If the national arbitration service does not have rules or procedures for the selection of an arbitrator, the arbitrator shall be an individual jointly agreed to by the parties. If the parties cannot agree on a national arbitration service, the arbitration shall be conducted by the American Arbitration Association, and the arbitrator shall be selected in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator's award shall be in writing and shall set forth findings of fact and legal conclusions.

Conditions of sale - continued

(c) Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties or provided by the published rules of the national arbitration service:

(i) the arbitration shall occur within 60 days following the selection of the arbitrator;

(ii) the arbitration shall be conducted in the designated location, as follows: (A) in any case in which the subject auction by Bonhams took place or was scheduled to take place in the State of New York or Connecticut or the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the arbitration shall take place in New York City, New York; (B) in all other cases, the arbitration shall take place in the city of San Francisco, California; and

(iii) discovery and the procedure for the arbitration shall be as follows:

(A) All arbitration proceedings shall be confidential;

(B) The parties shall submit written briefs to the arbitrator no later than 15 days before the arbitration commences;

(C) Discovery, if any, shall be limited as follows: (I) Requests for no more than 10 categories of documents, to be provided to the requesting party within 14 days of written request therefor; (II) No more than two (2) depositions per party, provided however, the deposition(s) are to be completed within one (1) day; (III) Compliance with the above shall be enforced by the arbitrator in accordance with California law;

(D) Each party shall have no longer than eight (8) hours to present its position. The entire hearing before the arbitrator shall not take longer than three (3) consecutive days;

(E) The award shall be made in writing no more than 30 days following the end of the proceeding. Judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered by any court having jurisdiction thereof.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, and except as required by applicable arbitration rules, each party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs in connection with the proceedings and shall share equally the fees and expenses of the arbitrator.

LIMITED RIGHT OF RESCISSION

If within one (1) year from the date of sale, the original buyer (a) gives written notice to us alleging that the identification of Authorship (as defined below) of such lot as set forth in the BOLD TYPE heading of the catalog description of such lot (as amended by any saleroom notices or verbal announcements during the sale) is not substantially correct based on a fair reading of the catalog (including the terms of any glossary contained therein), and (b) within 10 days after such notice returns the lot to us in the same condition as at the time of sale, and (c) establishes the allegation in the notice to our satisfaction (including by providing one or more written opinions by recognized experts in the field, as we may reasonably require), then the sale of such lot will be rescinded and, unless we have already paid to the consignor monies owed him in connection with the sale, the original purchase price will be refunded.

Previews
