




- Unless otherwise stated, the condition of the prints can, in our opinion, be characterised as fine or very fine
- All prints have the collector's stamp of Philip J. on verso (see enlarged illustration on title-page)
- Nearly all prints are kept under an acid-free stiff paper passepartout

"The Etching Club of Holland was founded in 1885 with Anton Der Kinderen, Jan Veth and Willem Witsen as its principal officers. The initiative had been taken by young Amsterdam artists, Jan Veth in particular, but artists from The Hague were also invited to participate. The club's aim was to promote the practice of etching among young artists, on the model of the French and Belgian *peintre-graveurs*, and it endeavoured to achieve this by organizing annual exhibitions, held alternately in Amsterdam and The Hague, and by publishing portfolios of etchings by its members. By the time the club was disbanded in 1896 seven exhibitions had been held and nine portfolios of prints published. (...) From 1893 on, thanks to the activities of Veth and R.N. Roland Holst, more and more attention was paid in the exhibitions to Symbolist and decorative art, while more lithographs were included in the portfolios. This was one of the most important reasons for the eventual disbandment of the club." (J. Giltay, "De Nederlandsche Etsclub (1885-1896)", NKJ 1976, p.118-119).
