



1891 BERRY BROS. TOKAY ESSENCE, PRINCE OF BRETZENHEIM

1891 was an excellent vintage in Tokaj. This Essencia comes from the Estate of Prince Ferdinand of Bretzenheim (1801-1855), whose father moved to the Tokaj region in 1803, when he sold the German Imperial town Lindau to Austria in 1803, which leaded almost into an European war. Like this he obtained lands, vineyards and the legendary Rákoczi castle with its cellar in Sárospatak, where this wine was walled up during the Hungarian Revolution of 1849, until it was rediscovered and imported into England in 1925.

In 1831, Ferdinand of Bretzenheim married Princess Karoline of Schwarzenberg, great-grandchild of the "Vampire Princess" Eleonore of Schwarzenberg, which may well be the inspiration for Bram Stoker's "Dracula". The family line extinct in 1863, when Ferdinand's brother Alfons, the 3rd Prince of Bretzenheim, passed away.

Interesting side fact: The Berry Brothers Essence vintage 1891 was featured in the 2008 movie "Dean Spanley" (starring Peter O'Toole). Although in reality the Essence was labeled and released by Berry Bros. in the 1930s, the movie is set in Edwardian England in the early 1900s.

KRUG CLOS DU MESNIL

The village of Mesnil sur Oger is known for its excellent vineyards, mostly planted with Chardonnay.

In 1971 Henri and Remi Krug received word that some fifteen acres of prime vineyard land have been put up for sale. This rarely happens so the Krug brothers jumped to the occasion and without seeing the land they sealed the deal over the phone.

When they later on drove from Reims to Mesnil sur Oger to inspect the land they just bought it was with delight they discovered that within the vineyard plot there was a tiny walled vineyard of just 1.84 hectare, all planted with Chardonnay. In the wall there was a carved inscription:

"In the year 1698 this wall was built by Claude Jannin and Pierre Debee Metoen between them, in that same year the vineyard was planted by Gaspard Jannin, son of Claude".

So here starts the history of the Krug Clos du Mesnil. In the years after the acquisition the wines where showing great promise but so far only used in the blends for the other Champagnes up until the 1979 harvest. This was of such high quality that Henri Krug decided to age the Champagne from Clos du Mesnil 1979 separately and after seven years of aging this resulted in the first Krug single vineyard release of the great 1979.

Here we offer two vintages of Clos du Mesnil from the eighties, one a hidden treasure of the overlooked small production vintage 1981 and one legendary classic 1985. Both bottles where labelled especially for this Christie's Geneva sale, therefore are in pristine condition.

KRUG 1996

1996 in Champagne was a very special year, said to be one of the best vintages of the century and often compared to the legendary 1928. At the House of Krug, even Paul Krug II, known for his strictly objective observations, also noted it may well have been "the next 1928". In other ways, it was strange and eccentric, it is also known as something of a 'wild horse', galloping between extreme maturity and freshness. Krug 1996 is the last Vintage blended by three generations of the Krug family working together; Paul II, Henry and Remi, and Olivier. With extraordinary ratings, together with Krug's other Champagnes, it has made Krug the world's best-rated Champagne.

Krug 1996 is the story of this outstanding year captured by Krug. The wines resulting from its harvest had in general a very high level of acidity, meaning freshness, but at the same time they were very balanced with good profile of taste and aromas. It was known as 10/10 year, very high level of acidity/very high level of maturity, very rare to have. Very promising still wines, hoping for a great Krug Vintage but patience was clearly required and for Krug time is an ally. It is the result of a blend of : Chardonnay (31%), Pinot Noir (48%), Pinot Meunier (21%) coming from 17 different plots.

This jeroboam is a very rare format for Krug, the regular bottle of 1996 is slowly showing its full potential, this great large format will stay fresh for decades. A unique chance to acquire a Champagne legend in pristine condition.

KRUG CLOS D'AMBONNAY

The meticulous savoir-faire of the House of Krug has revealed two extraordinary and rare Champagnes of two exceptional terroirs: Krug Clos d'Ambonnay & Krug Clos du Mesnil. Each expresses the individuality, purity and intensity of a single walled plot of vines, a single grape variety and a single year in two of the greatest terroirs in the Champagne region.

Josph II had said early in the twentieth century that Ambonnay is to Champagne what Chateau Margaux is to Bordeaux. At Ambonnay Henri and Remi Krug spent seven years looking for the perfect plot. In 1991 they found one and three quarter acres on the edge of the village, a piece of land that had been walled since 1766 (The year that James Christie held his first auction!!).

This vineyard was bought in 1994. In 2007 the first Krug Clos d'Ambonnay was released, this was vintage 1995. From 100% pinot noir this Champagne is bound to become as legendary as the Clos du Mesnil. An epic blanc de noir with subtil aromas of macademia nuts, dried red fruits and brioche. If Clos du Mesnil is the queen of all blanc de blancs Champagnes then Clos d'Ambonnay is the king of Champagne pinot noir.

The only problem is that this Champagne is even rarer then the Clos du Mesnil from the 0,68ha only a small number of bottles are made.

• 1996

Extremely wide temperature variations as the grapes were coming to the end of the cycle in the vineyard, with warm, sunny days and very cold nights, resulted in ripened grapes with an extremely high freshness. This weather pattern exalted the finesse of Clos d'Ambonnay's Pinot Noir grapes. 1996 is to become a year that will go down in Champagne's history books.

3000 bottles were made, each individually numbered.

• 1998

1998 was a classic year, full of contrasts, typical in Champagne with an extremely hot month of August followed by some heavy rains. In the case of Ambonnay, this resulted in astoundingly rich, delicious grapes that hinted at the wonderful potential of 1998 Krug's Clos d'Ambonnay wines from the very first tasting sessions.

4,760 bottles were made, each individually numbered.

• 2000

2000 was once hot, rainy and stormy. The harvest at Krug's Clos d'Ambonnay took place in one day on September 29th; it was superbly bountiful with astoundingly rich Pinot Noir grapes.

This tiny vineyard of just 0.68 hectare makes Krug Clos d'Ambonnay 2000 extremely rare. Only 5158 bottles were bottled each individually numbered.

KRUG TRIGOLY 2003

A year of many circumstances: dry winter and spring, premature blooming, frosts and very hot summer. A very long harvest, the longest in living memory: from August - the earliest since 1822 - until October. Small yields, healthy grapes, extremely varied level of maturity, over and underripeness, the latter due to vines stopping their maturation as a form of selfprotection from the heat.

CLOS DU MESNIL

The House of Krug chose to create Krug Clos du Mesnil 2003 because, from the very first tastings, the Chardonnay grapes of the 2003 harvest already revealed a delightful, expressive and balanced character without any excess aromatic intensity. The year 2003 thus succeeded in expressing the full potential of this walled plot with beauty and poise.

Clos du Mesnil 2003 reveals a precise signature and a striking grace, which has developed beautifully while resting in our cellars for over ten years. 2003 is one of the smallest releases since the creation of this Champagne.

VINTAGE

Krug 2003 is an adventure of unexpected freshness, delicious intensity and astonishing finesse - far from the preconceived ideas about an over-heated year.

Respect for the individual expression of every plot very unique to Krug craftsmanship – allowed the House to discover the beauties of nature and create

Krug 2003 is among other hot years revealed by Krug such as Krug 1959, 1962, 1976, 1979 and 1989.

Krug decided to create a vintage for this particular year and named it Vivacious Radiance to relate a story of a hot year that surprised Krug with unexpected freshness and fruit in some of the plot's wines. Krug 2003 is a blend of selected wines of the year, from many different plots.

It is a dialogue of rich Chardonnays (29%), fresh and balanced Pinot Noirs (46%) giving structure and body combined with vivacious Meuniers (25%) selected from many villages. The finesse and elegance of Krug 2003 is aged for nearly ten years before being released.

GRANDE CUVEE

Krug Grande Cuvée is at the heart of the House of Krug, it is its reason of existence. Since 1843, Krug Grande Cuvée has embodied the vision of its founder, Joseph Krug, whose dream was to offer the very best Champagne every single year, regardless of annual climate variations. Each year, a new edition of this vision is created. The first Prestige Champagne is re-created each year beyond the notion of vintage to offer the fullest expression of Champagne. A blend of more than 120 wines from ten or more different years and three grape varieties, Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Meunier. After at least seven years in the old Krug cellars this exceptional Champagne is released.

The origins of the estate go right back to the early Middle Ages, when the hamlet of « Calones » (named after the ferries that used to transport timber across the estuary) and the surrounding land of Saint Estèphe were bequeathed to the family that was to become les Monseigneurs de Calon. Its real identity, however, had to wait until the 18th century when Nicolas-Alexandre, Marquis de Ségur and President of the Bordeaux Parliament, married into the family. He was already owner of other top Médoc estates, but he never hid his preference for Calon : « I make wine at Lafite and Latour but my heart is at Calon ». This was to herald the now instantly recognisable heart logo of the château.

For many decades, before the existence of Montrose or the rise of Cos, Calon Ségur stood alone at the pinnacle of the Saint-Estèphes. After all of Bordeaux's 19th century tribulations of war, of vineyards ravished by oidium and phylloxera, and of long series of off-vintages, the property was finally sold in 1894 to Georges Gasqueton, already owner of the Saint-Estèphe estate Château Capbern since before the French Revolution.

The estate continued in the forefront of the Médoc crus classés, especially during the 40s and 50s, under the stewardship of Georges Gasqueton. This period is often referred to as the golden era of Calon Ségur but unfortunately there is no stock remaining at the château and bottles come on the market only very rarely. My experience of this period is limited to a gloriously deep-styled '49 and a very rich '61, both still well in their stride ten years ago.

At Georges's death in 1962, his son Philippe managed the property until his own death in 1995. Philippe was a lovely man, who made wines after his own image, all soft-spoken and natural, nothing forced. The wines were sometimed ferociously tannic in their youth, but always mellowed out into a captivating, smokey, spicy, sometimes even earthy quality of flavours that I always found, and still find today, totally beguiling. The ageability of such fragrant wine was also notoriously difficult to predict and has always offerred some beautifully pleasant surprises after two, three or even more decades. These 60s and 70s are lighter wines but were always, and many still are today, charming, sensual and intensely satisfying wines.

His widow Madame Denise Gasqueton, a strong-minded and devout lady, embarked on a determined renovation of the vineyard. (the cellar having already been modernised by her husband). The style of the wines started to tighten up, to become less dominated by their fragrance and more classically Saint-Estèphe, culminating in the decision in 2006, when Vincent Millet arrived from Château Margaux, to drastically increase the proportion of Cabernet-Sauvignon in the Grand Vin, relegating the estate's rich-styled Merlots, which had been for so long the power platform of the main blend, to the second wine Marquis de Calon. From this date on, Calon Ségur became an even more precise and focused Cabernet-Sauvignon style, and the Marquis de Calon a much richer fatter style.

Madame Gasqueton passed away in 2012 and the estate was purchased in November by the Suravenir Bank, a division of the Crédit Mutuel. The Bank had well understood the immense long-term potential of Calon Ségur and immediately appointed the enterprising and affable Laurent Dufau to set about accelerating the vineyard's refurbishment, a 20 year project, and completely rebuilding and renovating the cellar. We will most certainly be enjoying the results of this considerable investment over the coming decades.



These bottles have all been removed from Maison Champy reserves and labelled especially for this sale. Overall condition is therefore perfect and wines are ready for enjoyment for any Burgundy lover.

CHAMPY is a small, passionate, family run business. The company's principle is not to grow significantly, but to consistently produce artisanal wines with continued supply.

Overall the production philosophy is to control yields for the terroirs to be fully expressed, which is crucial to produce wines of character. CHAMPY's focus for the Bourgogne and "smaller village" wines is to provide quality and consistency. The Premier and Grand Cru appellations are vinified to be approachable, but with the ability to last the long term. The resulting wines offer a unique combination of balance, elegance, and purity of fruit.

The grapes for CHAMPY wines come from two sources. The estate consists of 28 hectares (acquired since 1990), all located in the Côte de Beaune. Other appellations are sourced by long standing contracts with local winegrowers (where grapes are purchased, mainly from the Côte de Nuits). The estate produces approximately 40% white and 60% red wine.

CHAMPY's commitment to the environment means that all treatments in the estate vineyards are sustainable organic and biodynamic. The vineyard tasks are based around the cycles of the moon, and no pesticides or herbicides are used. CHAMPY is moving into an exciting new phase as the vineyards are currently going through a process of organic certification.

The winemaking techniques are non-interventionist (to maximise what nature has provided) and are adapted to the particular vintage in question. Harvest is 100% conducted and sorted by hand. The winemaking processes differ depending on variety:

Chardonnay: After gentle bunch pressing, the juice is settled and then racked into either stainless steel tanks (for certain parcels of the Bourgogne Blanc) or barrels (for Chardonnay signature, Village, 1er Cru and Grand Cru appellations). There the fermentation starts naturally with indigenous yeasts. The wines in barrel undergo lees stirring 1-2 times per week until the end of the malolatic fermentation.

Pinot Noir : The grape bunches are partially or fully de-stemmed depending on the vintage. The grapes are not crushed, so whole berries are left in tank to undergo cold maceration for 6-7 days. Natural yeasts start the alcoholic fermentation. The wines are punched-down 1-2 times a day when needed.

The Bourgogne white and red wines age in either stainless steel or oak for 12 months. The Village, 1er Cru and Grand Cru wines age in oak during up to 18 months. Only 20% of new oak is used for Bourgogne and Villages appellations, 30% for 1er Cru appellations and up to 50% for Grand Crus. All wines go 100% through malolatic fermentation and are non-filtered (when possible).

They are then bottled, by gravity and according to the lunar calendar, at the premises in Beaune.



We do not provide any guarantee in relation to the nature of a **lot** apart from our **authenticity warranty** contained in paragraph E2 and to the extent provided in paragraph I below.

3 CONDITION

(a) The condition of lots sold in our auctions can vary widely due to factors such as age, previous damage, restoration, repair and wear and tear. Their nature means that they will rarely be in perfect condition. Lots are sold 'as is', in the condition they are in at the time of the sale, without any representation or warranty or assumption of liability of any kind as to condition by Christie's or by the seller.

(b) if. (i) within twenty-one days of the date of the auction. 2. TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP TO YOU


