We are delighted to introduce our first sale, a single-owner Evening Sale – *Magnificence in Focus* – we are thrilled by the focus of the collector's hand and the sheer concentration of quality – the sale offers vinous delights which are rarely seen in the fine wine market. It is an honor to bring this magnificent collection to our saleroom.

For the sale which follows *Fine Wines and Spirits, Featuring the Exceptional Collection of Jay Stein* – the scope has been widened, but the opportunity to acquire property of exceptional quality and rarity has not been changed.

The sale opens with this landmark collection, *The Exceptional Collection of Jay Stein*, a spectacular offering of mature Bordeaux and Burgundy from the collection of Mr. Stein, a much-respected figure in the Delaware business community. The collection includes some of the greatest wines of the 20th century. Mr. Stein acquired the majority of the wines in the early 1990s and they have been stored in the family's perfectly maintained home cellar since purchase. The focus is split between the greatest estates of Bordeaux and several of the most rarified wines of the Côte de Nuits. Old grand cru Faiveley wines are highly sought-after and much celebrated when found. The collection includes Faiveley Musigny 1964, Latricières Chambertin 1966 and Chambertin Clos de Bèze 1978. Rousseau is well-represented in the rarely-seen 1980 vintage – in the form of Chambertin, Clos de la Roche and Charmes-Chambertin.

We must take time to make particular mention of the wines from the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti which feature as highlights within this collection. Several wines play supporting roles, La Tâche 1978, Romanée-St-Vivant 1966, and Romanée-Conti 1976 are all noteworthy for their rarity and stature, however it is the single lot of six bottles of the fabled Romanée-Conti 1978, with consecutive serial numbers that acts as the star of this auction. Mr. Stein bought these bottles as a part-case in the early 1990s and these six remain — they have been stored in temperature-controlled conditions since purchase — this is one of the great wines the world has ever known. We are delighted to bring it to auction this fall.

Lafite-Rothschild is arguably the most extolled of all the great Bordeaux châteaux. The collection that features in this auction is as pristine a collection of young Lafite as one is likely to find at auction. The collection was acquired on release and never left the owner's cellar before being released to Christie's, many cases are still banded – these exceptional young wines are in their infancy and have long and glorious lives ahead.

It is unusual to see a collection of fine Italian wines the like of which we offer in lots 659 – 747. This collection is marked by excellence in varying forms. Whether the staunch power of Giacomo Conterno's Barolo Riserva Monfortino or the magnificent depths of Giuseppe Quinterelli's Amarones or his very rare Alzero – the collection's quality is incomparable. The collection includes large format bottles from Giacosa, Dal Forno and Quintarelli – treasures for lovers of these great wines.

Earlier in the sale, the focus was on the old and rare, this collection offers the seasoned collector contemporary vintages of exceptional red and white Burgundy, rare wines from Northern and Southern Rhône, Italian Gems, and even some Rioja

Highlights in this offering include the Grand Cru Burgundy from Groffier, Leroy, Domaine des Lambrays, Grivot, and Lafarge. An exceptional pristine case of Dujac's Clos de la Roche from the 2002 vintage round out the selection of red Burgundy. From the master of Chardonnay, Domaine Leflaive is offered in case quantity for the serious collector.

THE EXCEPTIONAL COLLECTION OF JAY STEIN



Jay Stein's legal name was Joseph Jeffrey Stein, but anyone who knew this fascinating man knew him simply as "Jay". He was Jay to friends, colleagues and family, the informality spoke of his natural warmth and the conviviality that could be felt in his company.

Mr. Stein was a much-respected figure in the Delaware business community, a lifelong entrepreneur in the art world, and collector in various fields. He was what you might call a Renaissance Man. He was of course, an old client of Christie's, with collections of Wine catalogs reaching back to the 1980s. His personal areas of interest were broad, from fine tailoring to gastronomy, but his real expertise was being an antiquarian: Fine Art, Precious Gems, Rare Carpets, and of course wine. Jay was happiest in a tuxedo. He loved the elegance of formal dress and fine craftsmanship but for the perceived formality, he was an extremely approachable gentleman. It is clear that enduring connoisseurship was a defining aspect of Jay's character, but the most notable features of his character are as a warm, loving and generous husband, father and grandfather.

Having spent time with Jay's family, Christie's team enjoyed hearing memorable tales of a family who clearly delighted in each other's company. Stories of Thanksgivings and Christmases where all would congregate together over long dinners and endless fine bottles. Jay loved to share his wine and knowledge with his loved ones, conversation and discourse on the wines playing as important a part as the tasting. Jay and his wife, Dian, were extremely well traveled, spending much of their leisure time traveling to Europe and driving through France and Italy, staying at many of the great, classic hotels. They would travel the world, making long stops in Paris and London, or exploring the Far East. Jay and Dian enjoyed traveling on QE2 and dining in The Queen's Grill where Jay would bring magnificent bottles from his cellar and open them in the dining room, much to the sommeliers' delight!

The collection Jay acquired is truly exceptional and includes some of the greatest Burgundies ever bottled, but Bordeaux was arguably the collector's first love. Pétrus was one of the wines he most enjoyed – the towering 1970 vintage was a particular favorite. Left and Right Bank Bordeaux from the 1950s, 60s, 70s and 80s all feature in quantity. There are many legendary wines – Margaux '53, Mouton '61, La Mission-Haut-Brion '61 and Palmer '61. There are many full cases of great wines from the 1982 vintage – Latour, Lafite, La Mission-Haut-Brion and Gruaud-Larose followed by rarities from the right bank like Trotanoy 1975 and 1979.

Jay is sadly no longer here to enjoy some of his greatest bottles, but we have it on good authority that he would be thrilled to know that his cellar had been entrusted to Christie's and that these treasures were ready to move into the hands of someone who could enjoy them as much as he would have.

DOM PERIGNON

In 1935 Moët were asked to supply a special bottling for their British importers, Simon Bros and Co, to celebrate the London firm's centenary. The Epenay house provided 300 specially commissioned, heavy bottomed bottles with a shield-shaped label which bore the inscription "Champagne especially shipped fro Simon Bros and Co's Centenary 1835-1935". The bottles were sent to the importer's 150 best customers - the vintage inside was the 1926. Word of this luxury cuvée soon spread amongst affluent American society, reveling in the post-prohibition era, and there was great demand for such a Champagne. In response to requests, 100 cases were shipped to New York in November 1936, this time using the finer and more mature 1921 vintage. Not being able to use the same inscription on the label as used the previous year in London, Moët decided to name this cuvée Dom Pérignon after Champagne's founding father. The 1921 vintage, and subsequent vintages up to 1943, underwent secondary fermentation in a regular bottle being transferred into the custom made bottles that we still know today for Dom Pérignon.

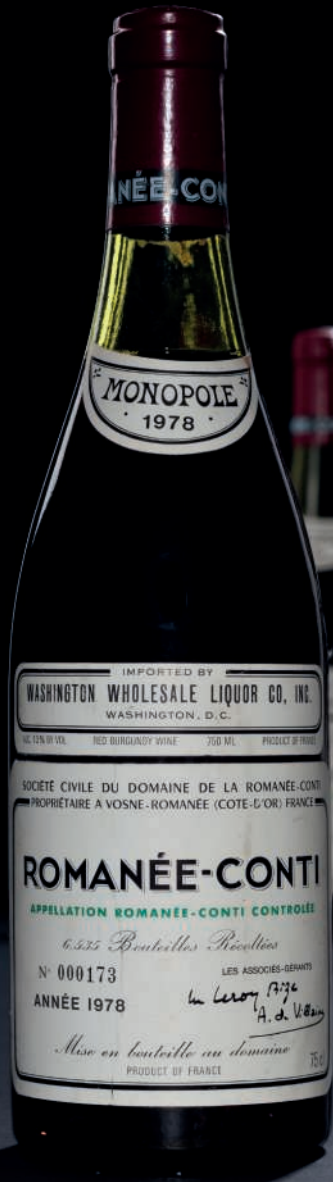

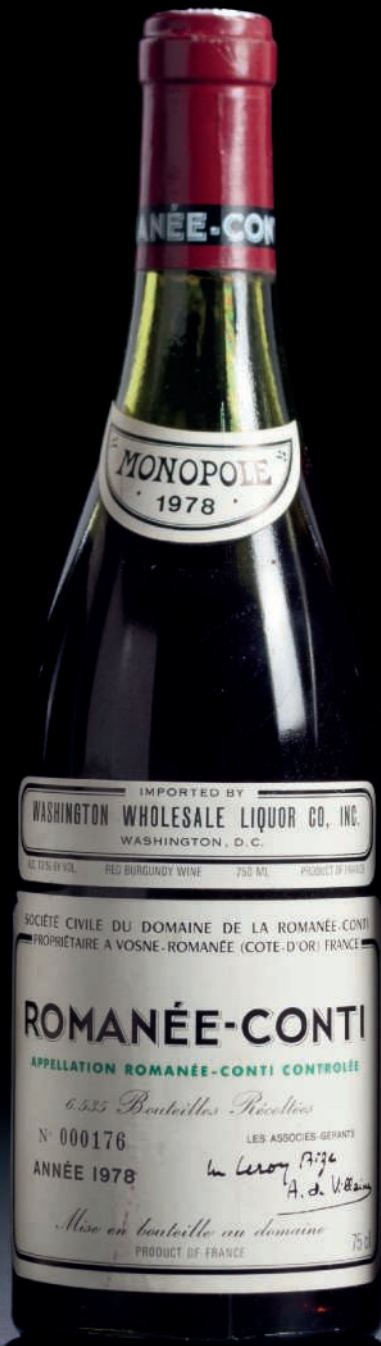
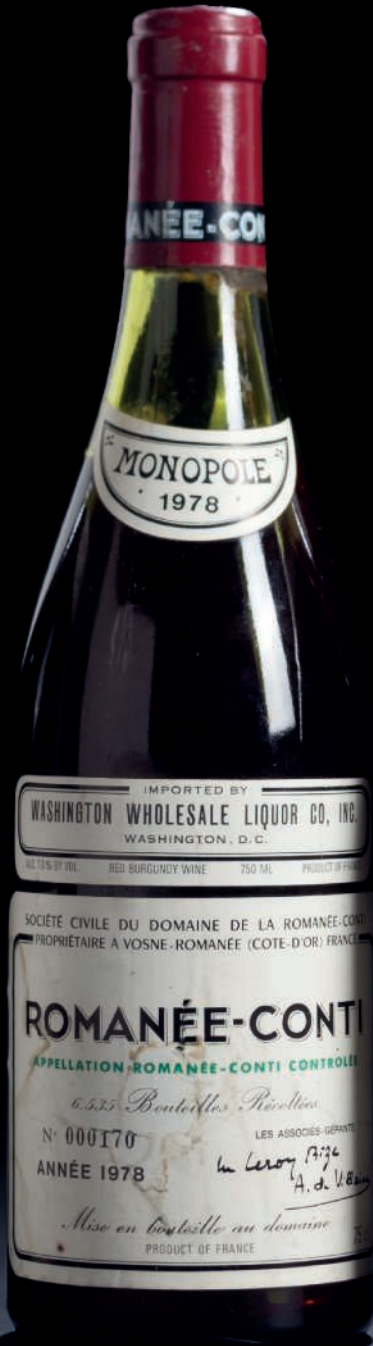

'Romanée-Conti,' as the local proverb goes, 'is the central pearl of the Burgundian necklace.' This minuscule vineyard gives its name to the most famous Domaine in the world, commonly referred to as 'D.R.C.' or, more reverentially, as The Domaine.

This pearl, this small jewel, just under 5 acres, was coveted by a famous collector of jewelry, Madame de Pompadour, but she was outbid by the Prince de Conti, hence the name. The King's minister won against the King's mistress! In 1868 the vineyard passed to the de Villaine family and is still, today, managed by Aubert de Villaine.

One thing strikes me forcibly: these five sites prove unquestionably that the French notion of terroir is not a fancy figment of Gallic imagination for the differences between each of the wines is marked, so consistent. Yet all five of the DRC burgundies are made, traditionally, in the same cellars from grapes of the same variety, Pinot Noir. Romanée-Conti itself has a unique concentration, La Tâche has a different sort of intensity, each having a superb yet vividly contrasting bouquet. Richebourg, next door, has a broader character, and so on. So what produces those differences: slight variations in subsoil, slope and drainage, fractionally, virtually imperceptible microclimate. Who knows. But fermented and élevé identically, the final wines are different.

Another thing I have discovered. They keep so well. The 1937 Romanée-Conti is still magnificent, the 1945 La Tâche has an almost pristine depth of color and fragrance. The wine opens up in the mouth fanning out like a peacock's tail. Even curious vintages like 1951 and 1954 can be surprisingly good. And do they change! Sometimes unconvincingly when young, they take on color and depth. They are not wines for an instant sniff; they open up in the glass.

COMTE GEORGES DE VOGÜE

Domaine du Comte Georges de Vogüé has 12 hectares under vine including 2.5 hectares (almost 20%) of Bonnes Mares, 0.5 hectares of Chambolle-Musigny Les Amoureuses and 2 hectares of Chambolle-Musigny. The domaine owns an incredible 7.25 hectares of the fabled Le Musigny vineyard which constitutes 80% of the whole site. According to Anthony Hanson, "Musigny comes from an astonishing and fabulous terroir". The average age of vines in Le Musigny is 40 years old and all is labelled as Vieilles Vignes. The Domaine can trace its history back to 1450 and it is considered by many as the greatest estate in Chambolle Musigny. Today it is the 20th generation of the family that head the domaine; Claire de Causans and Marie de Ladoucette, the grand-daughters of the late Comte Georges de Vogüé who passed away in 1987. The domaine is run by the estate manager Jean-Luc Pépin, winemaker François Millet (who became the wine maker in 1985) and Eric Bourgogne in the vineyards. The domaine is considered amongst the very best in Burgundy, producing rich, perfumed and deliciously complex wines that at their best can age for half a century or more.

LAFITE

The name Lafite comes from the Gascon language term "la hite", which means "hillock". The estate is situated at the northern end of Pauillac, close to Cos d'Estournel which is just over the border in St.-Estèphe. The vineyard consists of three major areas: the hillsides around the Château, the adjacent Carruades plateau to the west, and 4.5 hectares in neighboring Saint-Estèphe. Lafite is renowned for its finesse and subtlety and is often considered as more accessible young than a Château Latour or Mouton Rothschild, as Stephen Brook in his book, *The Complete Bordeaux* summarized; "for elegance choose Lafite."

LATOUR

Château Latour manages to achieve a rare stylistic balance, in that its wines are internationally known for both their elegance and purity of fruit flavor, and for their power, muscularity and heroic longevity. Few wines age with such grace as those of Château Latour. These wines are highly tannic in youth, and are famously distinctive in the way they mature slowly, stubbornly refusing to succumb to the effects of the natural passing of time. The other great hallmark of Latour is its consistency – the wines are consistently impressive, irrespective of whether the vintage is great, mediocre or even slightly disappointing. And, as Stephen Brook writes in "The Complete Bordeaux"; "No other Médoc wine can match Latour for power, depth of flavour, and grandeur.

MARGAUX

Margaux is unique among the communes of the Médoc: it is the farthest south (isolated from its three famous cousins to the north, St.-Estèphe, St.-Julien and Pauillac) and is made up of several non-contiguous parcels of vineyard land. The appellation of Margaux encompasses the village of Margaux, of course, as well as the villages of Cantenac, Soussans, Labarde, and Arsac. Ideally, the limestone, chalk, clay and sand of Margaux combine (especially where gravel dominates, facilitating drainage) to make a fragrant and silky wine. More Margaux properties were included in the famous classification of 1855 than any other commune. So it comes as no surprise that the wines of the eponymous Château Margaux are celebrated for their elegance and finesse and for their inimitable fragrance. The majority of the vineyards are on deep gravel and gravely clay soils which are ideally suited to Cabernet Sauvignon. Merlot is planted on soils which have higher content of clay and limestone.

MOUTON

In 1853 Baron Nathaniel de Rothschild bought Château Brane-Mouton and renamed it Mouton-Rothschild.

In 1945 to celebrate the 'Année de la Victoire' Baron Philippe de Rothschild commissioned the artist Philippe Juillan to design the label which began the tradition of a different artist designing the label for each vintage that continues to this day (except for 1953 and 1977). Such famous names as Picasso, Kandinsky, Francis Bacon and Andy Warhol have featured and helped to strengthen the reputation of the Château. Artists have never been paid for their work instead being rewarded with bottles of Mouton-Rothschild. Château Mouton-Rothschild was elevated to First-Growth status in 1973. As Stephen Brook in his book *The Complete Bordeaux* wrote "if, as a consumer, one is looking for voluptuousness, toastiness, exoticism and weight, then Mouton would be your first choice"

LYNCH-BAGES

The exceptional quality of wines from Lynch-Bages, beginning in late 1950s and early 1960s clearly indicated the outstanding potential of the property. After sharing a down period of the late 1960s and early 1970s experienced by many properties in Bordeaux, fortunes began a reversal when Jean-Michel Cazes took over the property from his father in 1973. He appointed the talented Daniel Llose as business director in 1976 and culminated massive investment in Lynch-Bages with 25 massive steel vats in 1980 to cleanup and control the winemaking process. The percentage of new oak used the Grand Vin was also more than doubled. This investment was fortuitously evinced by the exceptionally good 1982 and 1983 vintages, both bringing forth the fleshy, generous style of wine healthily promulgated by Lynch-Bages

Vines were planted on the area to become known as the Pichon estate in the late 17th century by Pierre de Rauzan, the father in-law of Jacques de Pichon. Pichon soon inherited the land and due to its close geographical as well as quality proximity to Latour the wine soon garnered an excellent reputation. After the death of Baron Jean-Pierre de Pichon in 1850 at the age of 95, the Pichon estate was divided with three-fifths going to the three daughters, becoming "Lalande" and the remainder to the two sons or the "Baron" side. High percentages of Merlot and Cabernet Franc as well as a good portion of the vineyards lying in St. Julien allow for a complex and supple style with distinctive aromas of olive, crème de cassis and cedar. While concentration and depth are provided for by the relatively high extract in the winemaking as well as the significant Petit Verdot component added to the Cabernet Sauvignon backbone.

The vineyard, well named "beaux cailloux" (the beautiful pebbles), lies on 124 acres of well situated gravelly crests that run parallel to the Gironde. The varieties planted are 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc and 5% Petit Verdot although the latter two varieties do not necessarily end up in the final blend. The resultant wine is famed for a little more subtlety and femininity than the wine of its more northerly neighbor Léoville Las Cases.

HAUT-BRION

Château Haut-Brion has been highly regarded for many centuries, being mentioned in Samuel Pepy's diary in 1663. In 1935 Haut-Brion was bought by the American banker, Clarence Dillon. His grand-daughter, Joan Dillon, is the President and her son, His Royal Highness Prince Robert of Luxembourg, the Vice President and Managing Director. In 1983 the Dillons acquired the next door property La Mission Haut-Brion. Haut-Brion is renowned for the classic Graves earthy and smoky character, combined with the opulent and approachable nature provided by the higher proportion of Merlot in comparison to the other Médoc First Growths.

LA MISSION-HAUT-BRION

Château La Mission Haut-Brion has been in possession of the Dillon family (also the owners of Château Haut-Brion) since 1983. The wine-making team between the two properties is shared. The vineyards of La Mission Haut-Brion are located across the road from Haut-Brion; however there are significant differences between the two properties. The majority of the vineyards at La Mission are located in the Bordeaux suburb of Talence which is slightly flatter and the soil is slightly richer with a gravel soil over a sub-soil of chalky sand. Whereas the vineyards of Haut-Brion are located in nearby Pessac with a slightly lower density of planting. As Stephen Brook wrote in *The Complete Bordeaux* that the major difference is in the wine style with La Mission as "more robust, more virile, more overtly tannic than Haut-Brion, and it doesn't easily match the finesse of the First Growth". Although some critics consider that in certain vintages La Mission outshines its illustrious neighbor.

PETRUS

It is hard to imagine a world without Pétrus, for in the sphere of wine, Pétrus circles and radiates its influence like a celestial body. Yet 50 years ago it was virtually unknown- a small farm of 11.4 hectares nested on a plateau in the highest part of eastern Pomerol. The vineyard is almost entirely made up on clay, perfect for the dark berries of Merlot that flourish there. The vines are famously old and are not replanted until after they reach their 70th year. The wines are hand harvested in the afternoon, fermented in cement and aged in 100% new oak. It is bottled unfiltered after two years in barrel.

CHEVAL-BLANC

Cheval Blanc is estate an estate with history- first conceived in 1832 with vineyard plots that have remained unchanged since 1871. The estate has produced some of the finest wines ever to come from Bordeaux, and their 1947 vintage is a thing of legend. In 1954 the Château was awarded the top rank of Premier Grand Cru Classé A. In 1998 the estate was bought by Bernard Arnault & Albert Frère and the current general manager of the estate is Pierre Lurton who has been working there for two decades. The estate is located in Saint-Emilion very close to Pomerol, and consists of three soil types; gravel over a clay subsoil, deep gravel and sand over clay which creates wines with the opulence and richness from clay soils and the firm structure and tannins derived from gravel soils. The château is most famous for its Cabernet Franc vines, and some of these date from the 1920s. This grape offers complex and elegant aromatics and freshness to the finish on the palate. The average age of vines is over 40 years, and density is high at around 8,000 vines per hectare. Cabernet Franc accounts for 58% of plantings and Merlot 42%, which adds richness and roundness to the blend. The ethos in the vineyard is minimal intervention with limited use of fertilizers and no chemical herbicides. Pruning and green-harvesting limit the crop to five or six bunches per vine so that the vines focus their energy on producing high quality fruit. Yields are limited to between 35 and 40 hectolitres per hectare. Each plot of vines is closely monitored to enable harvesting at optimal ripeness as quickly as possible.

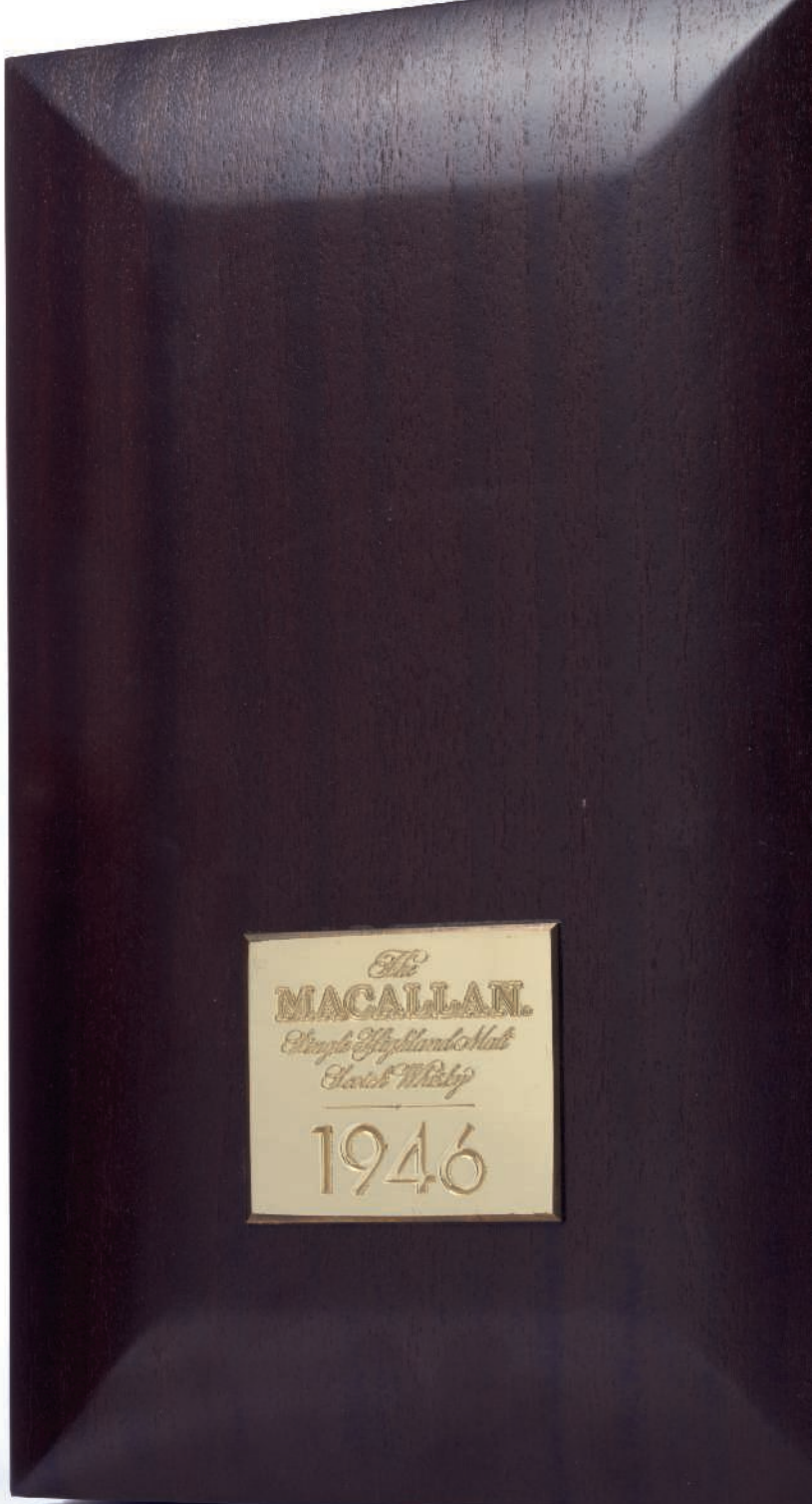

What happens when you combine French winemaker Christian Moueix of Pétrus fame with Napanook, one of Napa Valley's most famous vineyards? In the words of Hugh Johnson, if Rioja producers Marqués de Riscal and Marqués de Murrieta are analogous to Château Lafite Rothschild and Château Mouton Rothschild, in Bordeaux then “Vega Sicilia is the Latour; but Latour of a vintage that has raised the grapes and fired the picking crews,” referencing the warmer growing conditions of Ribera del Duero. Vega Sicilia, like the best Spanish producers, ages wine for decades, until they deem it ready to drink. The winery’s gran reserva bottling, Unico, is typically released ten to fifteen years after the vintage. This rare bottling accounts for less than a third of Vega Sicilia’s production and is not even made in what are considered lesser vintages.

Two words that sum up all the patience and daring that this art demands: patience in relation to nature which presides; daring for the winemaker, who observes, chooses and assists. These are the words that represent the Chapoutier ethos. Michel Chapoutier is one of the most highly regarded winemakers in France. Taking over the family firm founded in 1808, at age 26, Michel Chapoutier was in 1990 at the end of a long line of succession. Under his stewardship he transformed a rather traditional and commercial enterprise into a leading Rhône Valley producer recognized the world over. He combines the modern and the traditional: crusading for biodynamic winemaking, while expanding operations around the globe and experimenting with cutting edge winemaking techniques. Chapoutier now produces the most diverse and complex wines to be found in the northern Rhône. All the vineyards are now run on biodynamic principles, with the grapes in Hermitage and Châteauneuf du Pape being totally destemmed prior to fermentation. Previously, Chapoutier wines were criticized for the length of time they spent in old wood - Michel Chapoutier has thrown out the old chestnut foudres and now the wines spend a maximum of 18 months in small oak casks, up to a third of which are new. Chapoutier's wines are bottled unfiltered and unfiltered to help preserve their character.

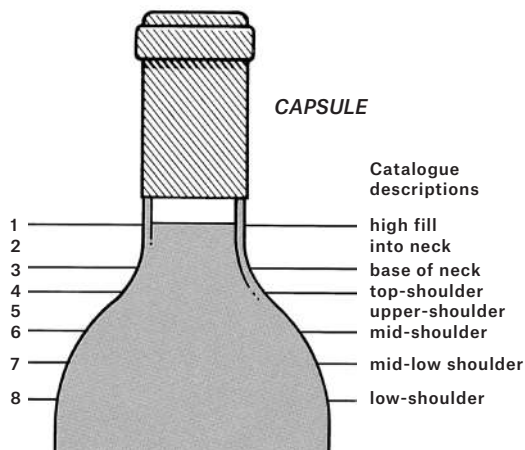

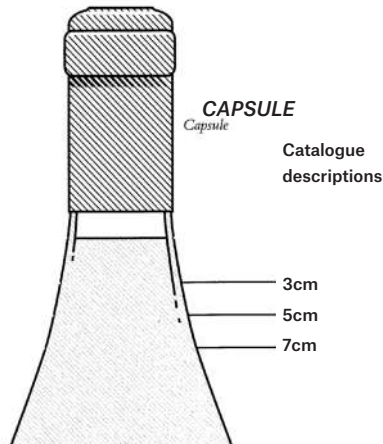

- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 very top-shoulder
- 4 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 5 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.

- 6 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 7 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 8 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over twenty years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

Absentee bids submitted on "no reserve" lots will, in the absence of a higher bid, be executed at approximately 50% of the low pre-sale estimate or at the amount of the bid if it is less than 50% of the low pre-sale estimate.

(i) Auctioneer's discretion

4. AFTER THE SALE

(b) Payment and passing of title
Immediately following the sale, the buyer must provide us with his or her name and permanent address and, if so requested, details of the bank from which payment will be made. The buyer must pay the full amount due (comprising the hammer price, buyer's premium and any applicable taxes) not later than 4.30pm on the seventh calendar day following the sale. This applies even if the buyer wishes to export the lot and an export license is, or may be, required. The buyer will not acquire title to the lot until all amounts due to us from the buyer have been received by us in good cleared funds even in circumstances where we have released the lot to the buyer.

(c) Collection of purchases
We shall be entitled to retain items sold until all amounts due to us, or to Christie's International plc, or to any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, have been received in full in good cleared funds or until the buyer has satisfied such other terms as we, in our sole discretion, shall require. (d) Packing, handling and shipping

(e) Export license
Unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, the fact that the buyer wishes to apply for an export license does not affect his or her obligation to make payment within seven days nor our right to charge interest or storage charges on late payment. We shall not be obliged to rescind a sale nor to refund any interest or other expenses incurred by the buyer where payment is made by the buyer in circumstances where an export license is required.

(f) Remedies for non payment
If the buyer fails to make payment in full in good cleared funds within the time required by paragraph 4(b) above, we shall be entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other rights or remedies available to us by law):

- (i) to charge interest at such rate as we shall reasonably decide;
- (ii) to hold the defaulting buyer liable for the total amount due and to commence legal proceedings for its recovery together with interest,

legal fees and costs to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law;

- (iii) to cancel the sale;
- (iv) to resell the property publicly or privately on such terms as we shall think fit;
- (v) to pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by the defaulting buyer;
- (vi) to set off against any amounts which we, or Christie's International plc, or any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, may owe the buyer in any other transactions, the outstanding amount remaining unpaid by the buyer;
- (vii) where several amounts are owed by the buyer to us, or to Christie's International plc, or to any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, in respect of different transactions, to apply any amount paid to discharge any amount owed in respect of any particular transaction, whether or not the buyer so directs;
- (viii) to reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the buyer or to obtain a deposit from the buyer before accepting any bids;
- (ix) to exercise all the rights and remedies of a person holding security over any property in our possession owned by the buyer, whether by way of pledge, security interest or in any other way, to the fullest extent permitted by the law of the place where such property is located. The buyer will be deemed to have granted such security to us and we may retain such property as collateral security for such buyer's obligations to us;
- (x) to take such other action as we deem necessary or appropriate.

If we resell the property under paragraph (iv) above, the defaulting buyer shall be liable for payment of any deficiency between the total amount originally due to us and the price obtained upon resale as well as for all costs, expenses, damages, legal fees and commissions and premiums of whatever kind associated with both sales or otherwise arising from the default. If we pay any amount to the seller under paragraph (v) above, the buyer acknowledges that Christie's shall have all of the rights of the seller, however arising, to pursue the buyer for such amount.

(g) Failure to collect purchases
Where purchases are not collected within seven calendar days from the date of the sale, whether or not payment has been made, we shall be permitted to remove the property to a third party warehouse at the buyer's expense, and only release the items after payment in full has been made of removal, storage, handling, insurance and any other costs incurred, together with payment of all other amounts due to us.

Neither the seller, Christie's, nor Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits nor any of their officers, employees or agents, are responsible for the correctness of any statement of whatever kind concerning any lot, whether written or oral, nor for any other errors or omissions in description or for any faults or defects in any lot. Except as stated

below, neither the seller, Christie's, nor Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits, nor any of their officers, employees or agents, give any representation, warranty or guarantee or assume any liability of any kind in respect of any lot with regard to merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, description, size, quality, condition, attribution, authenticity, rarity, importance, medium, provenance, exhibition history, literature or historical relevance. Except as required by local law any warranty of any kind whatsoever is excluded by this paragraph. Notwithstanding any other terms of these Conditions of Sale, if within 30 days after the sale, Christie's and Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits have received from the original buyer of any property notice of a claim in writing that any lot is short or has suffered breakage, then Christie's and Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits in their sole discretion will decide any such claim as between the consignor and the buyer and may rescind the sale and refund the purchase price received.

The benefits of the warranty are not assignable and shall apply only to the original buyer of the lot as shown on the invoice originally issued by Christie's and Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits when the lot was sold at auction.

The original buyer must have remained the owner of the lot without disposing of any interest in it to any third party.

The buyer's sole and exclusive remedy against Christie's, Columbus Circle Wines and Spirits and the seller, in place of any other remedy which might be available, is the cancellation of the sale and the refund of the original purchase price paid for the lot. 7. SEVERABILITY

If any part of these Conditions of Sale is found by any court to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part shall be discounted and the rest of the conditions shall continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.

8. LAW AND JURISDICTION

The rights and obligations of the parties with respect to these Conditions of Sale, the conduct of the auction and any matters connected with any of the foregoing shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the jurisdiction in which the auction is held. 1. Crafts Council (a charity registered in the UK with registered number 280956) is offering the opportunity to purchase an exclusive 75cl bottle of The Glenlivet Winchester Collection 1966 whisky (the "1966 Whisky") and a 75cl bottle of The Glenlivet 50 year old whisky from a cask laid down in 2016 aged for a minimum of 50 years (the "2066 Whisky"), both produced by Chivas Brothers Limited ("CBL"). The 1966 Whisky and the 2066 Whisky shall together be referred to as the "Whiskies".

2. A copy of these special terms & conditions will be supplied to all potential purchasers of the Whiskies prior to the auction. By participating in the auction of the Whiskies (the "Auction") the buyer of the Whiskies (as confirmed by Christie's) (the "Buyer") is deemed to have accepted and consented to these terms.

3. After paying the full purchase price (including buyer's premium and applicable taxes), the Buyer will receive the 1966 Whisky and a purchase certificate with a description of the 2066 Whisky to which the Buyer is entitled ("Purchase Certificate") in accordance with Christie's Conditions of Sale, Buying at Christie's. The Buyer acknowledges that in order to redeem the 2066 Whisky, they must provide CBL with the Buyer's name and current residential address.

4. The Buyer will also be invited to visit The Glenlivet Distillery for a tour and to see the selection of casks of The Glenlivet laid down in 2016 from which the 2066 Whisky will be taken. Such visit will be scheduled in November or December 2016 on a date to be mutually agreed. The trip will include return business class flights from Scotland to the Buyer's country of residence, a tour of The Glenlivet Distillery, two nights' accommodation in a hotel specified by CBL, and transfers between the airport in Scotland and the accommodation). The Buyer shall be responsible for all other costs relation to the trip, included obtaining documentation for travel, transport from their originating airport, meals and travel insurance.

5. The 2066 Whisky will only be redeemable on presentation of the original Purchase Certificate. The Buyer should keep the Purchase Certificate and a copy of these terms in a secure place. If the Buyer loses the Certificate CBL will be under no obligation to supply the 2066 Whisky. If the Certificate becomes damaged, CBL may provide a replacement at its discretion.

6. The Buyer must update CBL should his/her name or contact details change.

7. The 2066 Whisky shall be from a cask held at The Glenlivet Distillery and aged for a minimum of 50 years from 2016, and shall be bottled in 2066 or within 2 years of the end of 2066. The precise date of bottling shall be decided at CBL's discretion.

8. In the event that the whisky from the pool of designated casks laid in 2016 is not deemed suitable by CBL for bottling or consumption, CBL shall have the right to substitute the 2066 Whisky for an alternative product in its possession, custody or control which CBL considers to be the closest available equivalent whisky to the 2066 Whisky in terms of age and quality.

9. Once the liquid has been bottled and is ready for delivery, CBL will contact the Buyer to notify him/her using the last contact details provided to CBL.

10. CBL will attempt to contact the Buyer twice following the bottling of liquid using the last contact details provided to CBL. If CBL receives no response from the Buyer within 30 days of the second attempt to contact him/her, CBL shall no longer be obliged to supply the 2066 Whisky to the Buyer and shall be entitled to supply the 2066 Whisky to any other person or entity at CBL's discretion.

11. CBL shall have the right to add any labels to the 2066 Whisky as may be required at the time of delivery or collection to comply with legal or regulatory requirements or CBL processes at the time.

12. Once the Buyer receives notification that the 2066 Whisky is ready for delivery:

- a. he/she must provide the original Purchase Certificate to CBL within a reasonable period (copies of the Purchase Certificate will not be accepted);
- b. upon receipt of the original Purchase Certificate, CBL will ask the Buyer to provide a delivery address and a number of suitable dates for the delivery. CBL will not be obliged to take steps to verify whether the person presenting the Purchase Certificate (if not the Buyer) is a valid successor, assign or representative of the Buyer;
- c. CBL will then arrange for delivery of the 2066 Whisky to the Buyer on an agreed date.

13. CBL will cover the cost of delivery of the 2066 Whisky to the delivery address provided by the Buyer and the cost of insurance against loss, theft or damage of the 2066 Whisky during transit up to the value of the price paid at the Auction by the Buyer.

14. The 2066 Whisky should be examined by the Buyer at the time of receipt and the Buyer should notify CBL of any damage. CBL accepts no liability for loss of, or damage to, the 2066 Whisky in transit unless the Buyer notifies CBL within 30 days of receiving the 2066 Whisky. The Buyer should notify CBL if the 2066 Whisky has not been received within 14 days of notification of despatch. CBL does not undertake to replace lost or damaged goods if it has not been notified in accordance with this paragraph.

15. So far as is permitted by the applicable tax provisions of the relevant countries, CBL will pay the duties, VAT and any other taxes that may be due on release of the 2066 Whisky.

16. If there are changes in licensing laws, duties or other legislation that mean CBL cannot legally bottle or deliver the 2066 Whisky to the Buyer at the address requested, CBL shall not be obliged to supply the 2066 Whisky to the Buyer.

17. The Buyer's interest in the 2066 Whisky shall not be assignable or otherwise transferable unless agreed by CBL in writing, or received through inheritance. All references to "Buyer" in these terms include the Buyer's permitted successors or assigns for the sole purpose of redeeming the 2066 Whisky.

18. CBL shall keep clear and accurate records which notify any successor operator of The Glenlivet Distillery of the Buyer's right to redeem the 2066 Whisky.

19. IN NO EVENT WILL CBL'S LIABILITY TO THE BUYER EXCEED THE ORIGINAL PURCHASE PRICE PAID BY THE BUYER AT THE AUCTION. NOTHING IN THESE

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS SHALL HAVE THE EFFECT OF EXCLUDING OR LIMITING ANY LIABILITY FOR DEATH OR PERSONAL INJURY CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE, FOR FRAUD OR FRAUDULENT MISREPRESENTATION, OR FOR BREACH OF THE TERMS IMPLIED BY SECTION 2 OF THE SUPPLY OF GOODS AND SERVICES ACT 1982.

20. The Buyer may be requested to be photographed at the Auction or following the Auction and may be named as the Buyer of the Whiskies in press releases or other promotional material. The Buyer confirms that he/she consents to such photographs and use of his/her name, and grants all necessary permissions and consents to CBL to use and store such photographs and to use his/her name, in any media in promotional material and press releases relating to the Auction, the Whiskies and The Winchester Collection.

All wines are held at Christie's facility at The Wine Cellarage. Buyers are expected to remove their property within 7 calendar days of the auction.
