EXCEPTIONAL PRIVATE COLLECTION OF GREAT BORDEAUX AND BURGUNDY

All wines were bought after release from a noted Northern European wine importer and stored in the temperature and humidity controlled wine cellar of the owner. After inspection by Christie's staff, the collection was transported to the Christie's warehouse.

This collection is unique because it offers a chance to acquire a vast range of highest quality wines in the best possible condition.

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

Château Lafite Rothschild, owned by the Rothschild family for five generations, was acquired by Baron James de Rothschild in 1868. The existence of Lafite as a medieval fief dates back to the 14th century; at the beginning of the 18th century Lafite's wine was already being sold in London, where it was a favourite of the Prime Minister, Robert Walpole. In France, Lafite soon became known as the "King's wine", after being introduced to the Court at Versailles by Maréchal Richelieu. The classification of the Grands Crus Classés, prepared on the occasion of the 1855 Universal Exhibition in Paris, officially ranked Château Lafite as the "Premier des Premiers".

The 112 hectare vineyard consists of three main areas: the slopes around the Château, the adjacent Carruades plateau to the west and a 4.5 hectare plot in the neighbouring commune of Saint Estèphe. The vines are planted in well-drained and well-exposed soil made up of fine, deep gravel, mixed with aeolian sand on a subsoil of tertiary limestone. The grape varieties are Cabernet Sauvignon (70%), Merlot (25%), Cabernet Franc (3%) and Petit Verdot (2%). The average age of the vines is 45 years for the Grand Vin; the oldest plot, "La Gravière", was planted in 1886.

By its 10th birthday, though still deep and intense, the inimitable bouquet was developing beautifully, spicy and powerful.

In the second half of the 1990s decade, its fragrance, harmony and length a major feature. By 2001, mouthfilling, so much on show, so much more to come. Most recently, double decanted and served 5 hours later: still deep and velvety, with a virtually opaque core; the bouquet already aroused and holding its fragrance; medium-sweet, delicious flavour and persistence.

CHÂTEAU LATOUR

Château Latour is situated in the heart of the Médoc wine region, about 50 km north-west of Bordeaux, where the legend of the vineyards of Bordeaux began. The Château's prime terroir, l'Enclos, overlooks the estuary of the Gironde river which, over the centuries, has given the vineyard its geological complexity and, on a daily basis, ensures a mild climate.

Most of Château Latour's vines are planted on gravelly hilltops that stand 12 to 16 meters above the Gironde estuary. The fortunate combination of the Gironde, layers' of gravel on the surface and clay subsoil gives Château Latour's terroir advantages that few other vineyards can claim. The vineyard currently consists of 90 hectares in production; it is the grapes from the 47 hectares that surround the Château, known as l'Enclos that may potentially be used in the production of the Grand Vin. The estate is planted with about 80% of Cabernet Sauvignon, 18% of Merlot and 2% of Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot.

In the years since 1993, under the leadership of François Pinault and his family, the estate's owners, significant changes have been made with a view to maintaining Château Latour's pursuit of excellence in the wines that it produces.

In 1998, Frédéric Engerer, who joined the estate early in 1995, was appointed President. Major works started in November 1999 and continued until September 2003. A total renovation of the winery, vat room, wine making facilities and storage areas enabled even greater precision in the production of the wines. A new technical team was also created.

The 90 hectares of the estate are locally managed by Frédéric Engerer and his team. Today, the men and women working at Château Latour in the vineyard and in the cellar are motivated by a search of perfection. Numerous experiments are continuously being carried out in order to judge the suitability of new procedures. This might for example involve biodynamic methods or new traceability systems, their quest is always for precision, quality and awareness of new issues.

CHATEAU MARGAUX

Château Margaux has sought to achieve excellence in its wines for over 400 years through painstaking and necessarily long studies of its terroir, through a constant desire to learn and innovate, by remaining sensitive to demanding markets, and above all through a passionate commitment that has been shared by the families that have succeeded each other at the estate. At the end of the 17th century, it became part of the nascent elite "First Growths" – long before being established officially by the Classification of 1855. Since then, Château Margaux has known fame and fortune, seeing by experience how ephemeral both are... Today Corinne Mentzelopoulos, supported by her team, and following in her father's footsteps, devotes her time and energy to radiating her enthusiasm for this wine, whose name is synonymous with greatness, balance and harmony.

The vineyard of Château Margaux covers 202 acres and is situated on soils that are mostly gravelly but also clay-limestone, and whose diversity is surely partly responsible for the complexity of the wines they produce. The first wine, Château Margaux, which makes around one-third of the total crop, is a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon (at least 85%), Merlot (between 5 and 10%) and finally Petit Verdot (around 2%) and a little Cabernet Franc (around 2%). These proportions vary of course according to the vintage, but the Cabernet Sauvignon always remains very predominant, being the "body and soul" of our wine. On average over the last 5 years, they have produced 130,000 bottles of Château Margaux and 115,000 bottles of Pavillon Rouge du Château Margaux (our 2nd wine) per year. Their third wine has been bottled since the 2009 vintage under the name of Margaux du Château Margaux, with an average production of 40,000 bottles since then.

In addition to this, from a gravel plot of 29 acres, Château Margaux has been producing for over a century now around 12,000 bottles a year of Pavillon Blanc du Château Margaux, a white wine made solely from Sauvignon Blanc.

CHÂTEAU HAUT-BRION

Château Haut-Brion has been highly regarded for many centuries, being mentioned in Samuel Pepy's diary in 1663 (as "Ho Bryan") and is the oldest of the Bordeaux classed Growths. In 1935 Haut-Brion was bought by the American banker, Clarence Dillon and since 2008 his great-grandson, His Royal Highness Prince Robert of Luxembourg is the current President. The contribution of the Delmas family should be mentioned as the family have been involved in the property since 1923, when George Delmas was employed to administer the estate. Subsequently he was succeeded in 1961 by his son Jean-Bernard, and then by his son, Jean-Philippe in 2004. Jean-Bernard pioneered the use of stainless steel, and in 1961 Haut-Brion became the first major Bordeaux estate to vinify in stainless steel. Further improvements and investments have been instrumental in retaining its reputation of producing one of the finest wines in the world, of both red and dry white wines. In 1983 the Dillons acquired the next door property La Mission Haut-Brion.

The average age of the vines is over 35 years, with some vines dating from the 1930's, and a vine density of 8,000 vines per hectare. The 48 hectares planted to red grapes consists of 45.4% Merlot 43.9% Cabernet Sauvignon, 9.7% Cabernet Franc and 1% Petit Verdot. The red grapes are sorted in the vineyard, then brought to the winery and destemmed, lightly crushed to break open the skins and pumped into tanks. Indigenous yeasts are used for the alcoholic fermentation and the temperature is carefully controlled. Maceration lasts for approximately 15 days. Malolactic fermentation occurs naturally due to the presence of natural lactic bacteria in the chai. The wines from different vats are blended and then transferred to approximately 80% new oak barrels for between 18 to 22 months. Haut-Brion has its own coo-erage which ensures that the Château has complete control over the toasting of the barrels, which is normally medium-minus. The Haut Brion Blanc is produced from 2.87 Hectares planted with 52.6% Sémillon and 47.4% Sauvignon Blanc. The wine is fermented in oak casks and matured for between nine and twelve months in approximately 50% new oak. Production is very small with between only 450 and 650 cases depending on the vin-tage.

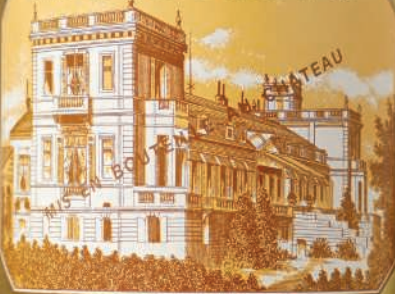

CHÂTEAU MONTROSE

Established as a Second Growth in the 1855 classification, Château Montrose enjoys an exceptional geographical situation in Saint Estèphe, facing the Gironde estuary. Its 95-hectare (235-acre) vineyard thus benefits from the moderating influence of the vast water mass nearby during very hot summers and harsh winters. The vineyard is in a single sweep, a rare and priceless advantage in the region, while the soil, made up of deep gravel, and ensures natural drainage.

An extensive renovation programme with very strict environmental objectives has been carried out at the estate since it was acquired by Martin and Olivier Bouygues in 2006, reflecting the new owners' determination to perpetuate the quality of the wine and make Château Montrose a model of skilled winemaking and sustainable development.

Under the direction of Hervé Berland since 2012, the estate has 60 employees in the vineyard and winery, all of whom share the same philosophy: respect for the terroir and a constant quest for excellence. That philosophy is manifested in meticulous vineyard practices, very precise parcel selection and use of only the best grapes to make the premium wine, Château Montrose. The other selections are used to make the second wine, La Dame de Montrose, and the third wine, Le Saint Estèphe de Montrose.

CHÂTEAU LÉOVILLE LAS CASES

One of the oldest Medoc estates, Domaine de Léoville belonged to some of the wealthiest and most influential noble French families before it was acquired by the Las Cases family. The estate was split up between 1826 and 1840 as a result of the French Revolution and the three Léovilles that we know today came into being. Léoville Las Cases represents 3/5 of the former estate. The Grand Vin's current terroir has therefore been at the historic heart of the original terroir since the 17th century. Pierre Jean, Adolphe and Gabriel de Las Cases were successive heirs to the property until 1900, when Théophile Skawinski purchased a share in the estate and became its manager. Léoville Las Cases has now been managed by the same family since the late 19th century and is today represented by Jean-Hubert Delon, sole owner of the Château and proprietor of Château Potensac in the Médoc and Château Nénin in Pomerol.

The Clos encases a terroir of very great complexity. It is mainly composed of Quaternary gravel ("graves") over gravelly- sand and gravelly clay subsoils. There are clays which are variably deep and compact, but which sometimes break through to the surface. The proximity of the Gironde River has created the wide diversity of soils, formed over various geological periods by successive superimpositions. The river also creates a special microclimate that enables very early ripening of the grapes and protects the vineyards from frost.

This cameo of geological combinations influences the growth of the vine and the composition of the grapes: regular but restricted water supply and a very low intake of nutrients bring out the best in the great Cabernet Sauvignons and Cabernet Francs which usually achieve their full potential whatever the vintage. The incomparable terroir gives this great wine its unique personality.

The Grand Vin is the product of exceptional terroirs from the former Léoville estate. These terroirs are located mainly in the Clos Léoville Las Cases, which you pass as you leave Saint-Julien village for Pauillac. They extend over nearly 60 hectares producing Cabernet Sauvignons and Cabernet Francs with a complex, polished expression and characteristics which are totally unique to the Grand Vin of Léoville du Marquis de Las Cases and have been widely recognized for years.

PETRUS

The name Petrus is synonymous with rarity, luxury and excellence and the meteoric rise of this world-famous wine producer has everything to do with the brilliance of the opulent red wines they produce from their small (for Bordeaux) 11.5 hectare estate in Pomerol. Annual production is approximately 30,000 bottles and thus is extremely hard to find particularly for mature vintages. Christie's are delighted to be able to offer this extremely rare and unique collection of vintages from 1958 through to 2012.

The extremely limited allocations of Petrus makes an offer of 400 bottles even more exceptional.

Petrus has become world famous over recent decades largely since the Moueix family became involved in the 1940's. Prior to that in the 19th Century, Petrus belonged to the Arnaud family until 1917 when La Société Civile du Château Petrus was founded, in which Madame Loubat owned a few shares and by 1939 she was the outright owner. In 1943 Jean-Pierre Moueix became their agent and in 1961 bought a majority share. His son Christian Moueix and Jean-Claude Berrouet and subsequently Jean-Francois Moueix and most recently Jean Moueix and Olivier Berrouet have been involved with the management and wine-making respectively.

Their unique terroir of the iron-rich clay vineyard in Pomerol is ideally suited to the earlier ripening Merlot and reputedly gives the wines their power and ability to evolve and improve for decades. The oldest vines are over 60 years old having been survived the severe frost in 1956. Utmost care is taken in the vineyard; severe pruning, regular ploughing, and a manual harvest. The harvest date is crucial and grapes are picked when perfectly mature while retaining acidity to provide freshness, finesse, elegance and longevity to the wines. Fermentation is carried out in temperature-controlled concrete tanks and then aged in 50% new oak barrels for 12 to 18 months, depending on the vintage.

Petrus, unusually for Bordeaux is almost entirely Merlot as in practice Cabernet Franc is rarely included in the blend (recent exceptions include 1998, 2001, 2003, 2010). Since 2011 the vineyard is 100% Merlot. Petrus is the ultimate expression of Merlot and is a wine that proves the grape has the potential to show elegance, longevity and multifaceted complexity to rival that of any Cabernet-based wines.

CHÂTEAU AUSONE

Ausone is undoubtedly one of the leading properties in the whole of Bordeaux and arguably the finest of the Right Bank. The 7 hectare property is located very close to the town on St-Emilion and is at the top of the classification as a Premier Grand Cru Classé A (along with Cheval Blanc and the newly promoted Pavie and Angelus). Part of the vineyards are located on the soils of the limestone plateau and the remainder are on clay-limestone slopes. The east-south-east exposure protects the vines from the cool northerly winds and enables the grapes to reach optimal maturity.

The name Ausone is derived from the Roman poet Ausonius who is believed to have owned a villa on the site. Ausone has had a long and distinguished history. Its fine reputation was enhanced significantly when in 1892 the property was inherited by Edouard Dubois (who later married and changed his surname to Dubois-Challon) and then was passed to his children Cécile Vauthier and Jean Dubois-Challon. The estate produced some exceptional wines in the twentieth century, such as the 1921, 1947 and 1949 to name just a few. Ausone's outstanding reputation has been growing further in recent years. In 1997 the Vauthier family took full control of the estate and have invested considerable sums and energy into improvements, such as repairing the terrace walls, installing a new drainage system and replanting vines where necessary and are increasing the proportion of Cabernet Franc in the vineyards, which now stands at 55% with 45% Merlot.

CHEVAL BLANC

Located in the commune of Saint-Emilion, but bordering on Pomerol, the estate consists of 39 hectares divided into forty-five plots. Each one is, to a certain extent, treated like a separate vineyard because of the differences in the age of the vines, grape variety, soil type, etc. The combination of these many facets accounts for Cheval Blanc's great complexity.

What makes Cheval Blanc so unusual is three main soil types – fine textured with clay, more coarsely textured with gravel, and large gravel with sand – that constitute a veritable patchwork. This singular terroir is made up primarily of clay and large-size gravel in certain plots and sandy soil with smaller gravel in other parts. Some estates in Saint-Emilion have excellent gravelly soil, while others in Saint-Emilion and Pomerol have very good clay soils. Cheval Blanc, on the other hand, is blessed with both types of soil in fairly equal proportions.

The most is made of this natural advantage thanks to an original combination of grape varieties: 49% Cabernet Franc, 47% Merlot, and 4% Cabernet Sauvignon. Each plot has its own specific profile due to the age of the vines, surface area, kind of soil, type of rootstock and grape variety, etc. Therefore, it only follows that the wine produced from each plot has its own profile too. The ones from clay soil are powerful with velvety tannin, while the ones from gravel soil are more aromatic and elegant. A blend of both results in a wine that is both powerful and elegant with expressive aromatics as well as the complexity of the greatest wines.

Experiments have been conducted with every possible permutation of soil types and the three grape varieties. Soil temperatures were measured throughout the growing season in the context of this research, as well as the water supply and mineral absorption by the vines.

DOMAINE DE LA ROMANÉE-CONTI

Domaine de la Romanée-Conti (often abbreviated to DRC) is widely considered to be among the world's greatest wine producers, and has, for many decades, been Burgundy's pre-eminent Domaine. DRC bottles are among the world's rarest, most renowned and most expensive great wines. It takes its name from the Domaine's most famous vineyard, Romanée-Conti. The boundaries of this vineyard were established back in the 16th century, and over time, its name changed from Cros des Cloux, to La Romanée, to Romanée-Conti, after its purchase by King Louis XV's cousin, the Prince de Conti. In 1869 the vineyard passed to Jacques-Marie Duvault-Bloch, ancestor of the current co-owners, the de Villaine family. The Leroy family acquired half ownership in 1942. The Domaine is today jointly managed by representatives of these two families: Aubert de Villaine and Henri-Frédéric Roch.

The Domaine owns almost 28 hectares of vineyards and this includes sole ownership of the 1.81 hectares of Romanée-Conti Grand Cru and the entire 6.06 hectares of La Tâche. They also own holdings of 3.51 hectares of Richebourg, 5.29 hectares of Romanée-Saint-Vivant, 0.68 hectares of Le Montrachet and cultivate 3.53 hectares of Grands-Echézeaux, with 4.67 hectares of Echézeaux. Occasionally the Domaine produces a Vosne-Romanée Premier Cru Cuvée Duvault-Bloch from younger vines in their Grand Cru vineyards. The Domaine has also started producing Corton from the 2009 vintage after they leased 2.28 hectares of vineyards including parcels in Corton Clos du Roi, Bressandes and Renardes. The Domaine has been at the forefront of viticultural developments and has adopted the biodynamic approach. The Domaine uses vine material from their own vineyards for their re-planting. In 2005, the average age of the Romanée-Conti vines was more than 50 years.

The Domaine regularly vinifies with a high proportion of whole, Pinot bunches, following a strict sorting to eliminate any sub-standard fruit. The musts may be cold-macerated prior to temperature-controlled fermentation. The wines are entirely matured in new French oak, made from carefully-chosen staves which have been weathered extra-long in the open air. The white grapes from Le Montrachet are often picked relatively late, resulting in richly-structured, opulent and expressive wines, which are perfectly balanced with refreshing acidity.

There is no disputing the quality of the wines, particularly their highly sought-after, greatly-prized Romanée-Conti. This is very scarce, as on average only 450 cases are produced each vintage. As Michael Broadbent M.W. stated "It never fails to astonish me that the strips of vines which stretch only a modest number of meters up the very gentle slopes from the outskirts of an equally modest, indeed remarkably rural rambling village of Vosne, are capable of producing wines of such

world class quality". This wine needs time and evolves incredible finesse, smoothness, complexity and length of flavour, with bottle-age.

RARE VINTAGE MADEIRA

AN INTRODUCTION TO MADEIRA

Madeira is a fortified wine made by a unique method. Traditionally after the addition of grape alcohol to the not completely fermented wine is transferred to oak barrels called pipes.

These pipes are aged on the island of Madeira under the influence of the subtropical climate.

This unusual method of aging the wine has been discovered in the 17th and 18th century when wine was taken on sea voyages to the Far East and America as ballast. Upon return the wine tasted much better as it was now more concentrated after being exposed to the hot temperatures on board while crossing the tropics.

The Madeira island is located in the Atlantic Ocean about 380 miles west of Morocco and Portuguese territory.

Madeira was discovered in 1419 by the Portuguese mariner Goncalves Zarco. He was sent out to explore the west coast of Africa but got of course. After his return he mentioned an island with dense woods and various mountains. He named his island: Madeira, after the Portuguese word for wood.

Fairly soon after his discovery Zarco was ordered by Prince Henry to go to Madeira and plant sugarcane and vineyards. Both did very well in the volcanic soil and mild climate.

In 1445 the first Madeira wine was produced. Quickly the production of wine became the most important product of the island. The exports took a rapid jump after 1665.

Madeira wine became an important part of American life, way before Bordeaux became popular it was Madeira that most people drank. In fact after the Declaration of Independence was signed all attendants toasted with a glass of Madeira to celebrate this important moment in history.

It was Georges Washington who claimed: "Drink a pint of Madeira at dinner daily". Remarkable is that the English learned to appreciate Madeira from the Americans.

Currently 440 ha of vineyards are planted on the island, so production remains relatively small. Of these only 20% are noble varieties like Sercial, Verdelho, Bual and Malvasia.

The following nobles grape varieties are used for the great vintage Madeira's:

Sercial:

This is the driest Madeira style which up to 1807 was very scarce. Always thought to be related to the Riesling variety but this has proven to be wrong. The grapes ripen late and have high natural acidity. It's this acidity that needs to soften by age and so the best Sercials are aged for a long time in cask.

I personally have a soft spot for these wines as I love the fine lingering acidity of a great Sercial Madeira.

Verdelho:

A half dry Madeira quite popular as this is a most attractive style. Mostly grown on the north side of the island where the climate is slightly cooler and the grapes ripen later. In a great Verdelho the natural fruit sugars balance the acidity.

Bual or Boal:

Bual is a half sweet madeira. The vineyards are spread out over the south part of the island.

Malvasia or Malmsey:

The sweetest madeira style. Malvasia vineyards are located all around the island, planted at the lower elevations towards the ocean. Malmsey production has always been small and as a result the vintage Malmsey's are very sought after.

Terrantez:

In style Terrantez wines mostly fall just between Verdelho and Bual, so a balance between dry and sweet. Some of the most legendary wines are made from Terrantez. Already of limited production in the 19th century, this variety nearly disappeared from the island after phylloxera attacked Madeira from 1845-1855.

Fortunately recently more Terrantez has been planted, though the total annual production is still only about 3,500 liters. Old Terrantez wines are very rare.

Bastardo:

Produced in even smaller quantities than Terrantez. Ever since I first tasted the great Blandy Bastardo 1954 I have had a crush for this grape. Like Terrantez Bastardo was almost wiped out by phylloxera. Currently the production is so small that it's hardly bottled on its own but blended with Tinta Negra. Contrary to the other above mentioned varieties Bastardo is a red grape variety. Extremely rare.

HISTORY OF THIS COLLECTION:

In December 2013 we closed the London wine auction season with a successful sale where we offered a range of rare Madeira's. The interest for these bottles exceeded our expectations and came from various nationalities.

A few months later we were back on Madeira and while talking to some old Madeira families we came up with the idea to put together a special unique selection of wines for an auction at Christie's New York. We all loved the idea of bringing these rare wines to a country which has always embraced Madeira wine and has a special historic connection with the island. This resulted in two fine offerings in our December New York auctions of 2014 and 2015.

During the set-up of these collections we travelled around the island visiting a number of old families which often had a history of Madeira wine production themselves. We were very happy that they were open to offer some rare bottles from their already small reserves. When discussing and tasting these wines together with the owners it was as if going back in time and what a great heritage Madeira has.

Last February while discussing our offer for the London December 2016 sale we came to the idea to offer a small very high quality selection in our Geneva sale. It is with pride that we offer this collection. All wines offered here have never been moved from the island before and were inspected and packed by Christie's staff on the island and again after arrival in our Geneva warehouse.

As the space in our catalogue is limited a lot of stories remain untold but who knows this might result in a later publication. Feel free to contact us with additional enquiries and we wish you all the luck with your bids.

- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 very top-shoulder
- 4 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 5 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.

- 6 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 7 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 8 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

3 CONDITION

any express or implied condition or warranty is hereby excluded:

If we do this, we may sell the **lot** again, publicly or privately on such terms we shall think necessary or appropriate, in which case you must pay us any shortfall between the **purchase price** and the proceeds from the resale. You must also pay all costs, expenses, losses, damages and legal fees we have to pay or may suffer and any shortfall in the seller's commission on the resale;

(iii) we can pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by your default in which case you acknowledge and understand that Christie's will have all of the rights of the seller to pursue you for such amounts;
