

#### LA ROMANÉE

#### THE RAREST GRAND CRU OF THEM ALL

La Romanée is excellently located upslope above Romanée Conti. Its northern neighbor is Richebourg and to the south is La Grande Rue. Further upslope of La Romanée is the premier cru vineyard of Aux Reignots. Here is where some of the most highly regarded Burqundy vineyards are located.

La Romanée is the smallest appellation in France only 0.8452 ha in size, by comparison Romanée -Conti is 1.81ha. From this tiny vineyard only 3000-4.200 bottles are produced each year.

The vineyard of La Romanée has been owned by the Comte Liger-Belair family since the early part of the 19th century. The first parcel was bought in 1815. Over the years nine neighboring parcels were gathered, when in 1827 all the nine parcels where acquired the family applied for them to be named as one; La Romanée.

By the mid 19th century the wines from La Romanée were already held in high regard. Dr Lavalle in 1855 and Dauguy & Aubertin in 1892 both rated it Tete de cuvee, hors ligne. The highest rating to be received by both these, at the time, well regarded writers.

Until 2001 various vignerons were hired to tend the vines and vinify the wines. The Michaudet family was in charge of the vinification from 1933 to 1945. The Forey family looked after the vineyard and made the wines from 1946 to 2001. After 2001 the Comte Liger-Belair family regained total control.

There was virtually no domaine bottling done until 2001. La Romanée was sold in cask to various negociants. These would take care of the upbringing, bottling and distribution. From 1950 onwards there were a number of agents who had the exclusive distribution rights of La Romanée wines a longer period. From 1950-1962 Maison Leroy held this exclusivity and from 1963-1975 this was granted to Maison Bichot. Bouchard Pére et Fils held this exclusivity for the longest period, 1976 to 2001, hence the wines of La Romanée were seen as an integral part of the Bouchard portfolio.

From 2002-2005 all work in the vineyard and vinification was fully done by the Liger-Belair family. After vinification the wine was split between the Domaine and Bouchard Pére et Fils for the upbringing and bottling. So in this period two separate bottlings were made.

In 2006 the lease with Bouchard Pére et Fils ended, all La Romanée is now made and distributed by the Domaine Liger-Belair.

In September 2016 Christie's was honored to organize a historic auction of wines coming directly from the Bouchard Pére et Fils reserves. The auction was an amazing success. During the set-up of this big auction it was decided to keep a great selection of La Romanée aside and offer these separately.

All the La Romanée wines here offered have been selected from the Chateau de Beaune reserves especially

for this auction. The bottles pre 1976 were given a new wax seal and new label from an original design used in the 19th century. These were boxed up in new vintage branded oak cases.

The wines from 1976 to 2005 are packed in new wooden cases of 6, with the bottles having new capsules and new labels. All pristine and in excellent appearance.





We start the collection with the "Wizard of Avize," Jacques Selosse. On offer are the rarest releases never offered before in this quantity and range: Millésime, yes; magnums and half-bottles, yes; Lieux-Dits Assortments. ves: Rosé, ves: Substance, ves!

Of most importance is the spectacular selection of rare Burgundy, the like of which we rarely see. The list of legendary Domaines seems endless: Coche-Dury, DRC, Roumier, Mugnier, Rousseau, Méo-Camuzet, d'Auvenay, Leflaive and Roulot are all worthy of special mention, but many other excellent producers play important roles across this glorious collection. Not to miss are two of the very best producers in Chablis: Raveneau and Dauvsissat. Plenty of Clos, Valmur, Preuses, and Blanchot to supply those endless wine evenings debating on the stylistic differences between the two Domaines

The Rhône valley is well-represented. Magnificent vintages of Pegau's Cuvée da Capo and Saint-Prefert's Charles Giraud sit next to the very best of the Northern Rhône, Chave, Theirry Allemand, and others. Also on offer are rare auction-releases of TBA, BA, and Eiswein from Nahe and Saar legends, Dönnhoff and Egon Müller.

Rounding out this collection are very rare wines from Piemonte. On offer are mature vintages from the legendary Cappellano, magnums of the extremely rare hand-painted labels from the late Bartolo Mascarello, and for collector's looking for something younger, six (yes, six!) bottles of Giuseppe Rinaldi's Brunate 2010 is also offered.

#### THE WIZARD OF AVIZE

Anselme Selosse is one of the most respected and sought-after growers making wine in Champagne today. He studied with winemakers in Burgundy and has adopted a similarly singular method of winemaking (35 of his lieux-dits are even vinified in barrels bought from Domaine Leflaive) and owns 4 hectares of unique plots in Avize, Oger, Cramant, and Aÿ. The wines are rich, but balanced. There is an opulence, born from Selosse's decision to harvest extremely late as well as his use of bâtonnage, a technique more commonly used for Muscadet in the Loire. The wines also maintain a racy acidity due to limited use malolactic fermentation and low dosage. Selosse holds the wines in bottle for up to eight years before disgorgement, because only then are they ready to drink.

There's Meursault and then there's Coche-Dury. Although the introverted winemaker Jean-François has difficulty accepting the burgeoning popularity of the Domaine's wines, when pressed, he credits his attention to detail and respect for traditional winemaking practices for their success. Coche-Dury plants almost nine hectares of vineyards on minuscule parcels over six communes: Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Auxey-Duresses, Monthelie, and Volnay. No clones of any kind are planted and the vinifications is extended with extended lees contact. The resulting wines are rich, but with an uplifting acidity, a rare and age-worthy combination.

#### WEINGUT JOH, JOS, PRÜM

This 20 hectare estate was founded in 1911 and has over the decades has become one of the top producers of refined Mosel Riesling wines. Though JJ Prum owns various vinevards their best wines come from Wehlener-Sonnenuhr, located on the opposite bank of the Mosel river from the family house.

Herr Manfred Prüm is now assisted by his friendly daughter Katharina. As with most great wine estates it all sound very easy; late harvest, severe selection and great vineyards. JJ Prum's wines are rightfully legendary even in the lower quality steps. A Wehlener-Sonnenuhr Kabinett 1982 was still fresh and lively when tasted in December 2012.

Very pure elegant wines with finesse and great balance, which take time to shed of their initial closed faze. JJ Prum's wines belong in every serious wine collection.

#### UNDERSTANDING "GOLDCAPSULE"

"Goldcapsule" is not defined by German wine laws, rather it is a means used by estates to distinguish higher-quality wines within one Prädikat, especially the Auslese category, from their basic lots. To understand the background better, it is very helpful to look back a few decades. Before 1971, there were four recognized levels of Auslese wines in Germany. You could find wines labelled as "Auslese", "Feine Auslese", "Feinste Auslese", and "Hochfeine Auslese". The longer the name the higher the concentration - usually achieved by botrytis - and the smaller the production. In an effort to simplify the universal marketing of German wines. the government stepped in and revised the Prädikat system to allow for only one Auslese category. The new rule was met with frustration by the high-qualityconscious winemakers, mostly those from the Mosel, who had perfected the art of selective harvesting and now were deprived of the traditional means to express the different levels. The issue with Auslese in particular is that it is the Prädikat level with the widest Oechsle range (in Germany, the natural concentration of the grapejuice at harvest is measured in degrees Oechsle). On one end of the spectrum is a style closer to Spätlese and on the other end is Beerenauslese. So with just Auslese on the label how would a customer know if it was closer to Spätlese style or closer to a BA? Since the 1971 law forbid use of wording to denote special bottlings within a Prädikat, estates developed other means of identification. The most acknowledged method - and the one also used by Joh. Jos. Prüm estate - is a golden capsule, in contrast to the white capsule used for the "basic" Auslese. A short gold capsule usually means a presence of botrytis and a long gold capsule represents a remarkably higher percentage of botrytis and consequently concentration.

Unfortunately, there was no uniform solution by all estates found after the change of law in 1971. Instead of the Goldcapsule, some estates opted to use a star system on the label and still others use a cask number. Also, there are some wineries that use golden colored capsules on all their wines, and there are again others

that produce Goldcaps not only in the Auslese but also in the Spätlese category.

What are the characteristics of a Goldcapsule and why buy such a wine? Think of them as limited edition, rather small production lots of the best Auslese of a vintage. They are made from intensely selected grapes containing higher concentrated juice, usually affected by a certain amount of botrytis/noble rot; capable of aging even remarkably longer than "basic" Auslesen, lasting for many decades. In the course of time, they lose some of their sweetness, gain more and more elegance and harmony and the complex profile and depth come to the forefront.

Goldcapsules are not made every year. Due to an overall higher ripeness of the grapes in the more recent past, there were more chances to produce such wines than in earlier days, however, for instance, vintage 2004 allowed only a very small quantity to be produced which was only offered at the VDP Mosel auction in

Finally, the JJ Prum wines of the highest quality categories, i.e. Beerenauslesen, Trockenbeerenauslesen and Eisweine, are always "decorated" with a Long Goldcapsule. In these high levels, there is no differentiation, capsule-wise.

We may at our option ask you for current identification as described in paragraph B1(a) above, a financial reference or a deposit as a **condition** of allowing you to bid. #### 3 IF YOU FAIL TO PROVIDE THE RIGHT DOCUMENTS

If in our opinion you do not satisfy our bidder identification and registration procedures including, but not limited to completing any anti-money laundering and/or anti-terrorism financing checks we may require to our satisfaction, we may refuse to register you to bid, and if you make a successful bid, we may cancel the contract for sale between you and the seller.

Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any lot and any express or implied condition or warranty is hereby excluded:

(b) if. #### 2. TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP TO YOU

#### 9 LAW AND DISPUTES

However, we will have the right to bring proceedings against you in any other court.



#### △ Property Owned in part or in full by Christie's

From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which it owns in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol  $\Delta$  next to its **lot** number.

#### Minimum Price Guarantees

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol onext to the **lot** number.

#### ○ ◆ Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the lot fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party, in such cases the third party agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the lot. 

- into neck: Level of young Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 very top-shoulder
- top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.
- mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates
- low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.
