

A FINE SELECTION OF OLD POL ROGER VINTAGES

1949

Of average quantity, the 1949 harvest was the product of an initially difficult growing season, saved by a long, hot summer. The 1949 has more noticeable acidity than the 1947, contributing to a fine intensity of fruit and notably lingering finish. Pol Roger has the reputation to have made one of the best wines of the vintage.

1979

Pol Roger is a superbly elegant wine which combines great intensity of flavor with a spare, finely balanced frame. The harvest was late, beginning on October 3, and the grapes were picked in excellent condition. From the start the young wines showed a racy acidity which has extended their aging. Pol Roger 1979 is often described as a classical vintage.

1982

Memorably described at their launch by Christian de Billy as "quite simply stupendous", the appeal of the Pol Roger 1982s (as in 1975 and 1979 a full range of cuvees including the "Cuvee Sir Winston Churchill", were produced) derives from grapes picked in virtually perfect condition. The brut 1982 is maturing superbly and retains its original charm.

1985

This is one of the smaller vintages of the eighties and one of the best. The Pol Roger 1985s are powerful, sturdy vins de garde, which were only entering their prime in the late nineties.

The growing season began with a bitter winter which destroyed many vines. The ripening was late and there was even a rare second harvest in October as autumn gave way to an Indian summer. The balance of the wines is excellent, with plump, ripe fruit matched by good acidity.

1986

The 1986 Pol Rogers are lighter racier wines than the 85s, more accessible when young and inevitably faster maturing. Nevertheless, the cuvees were considered sufficiently well-constituted for a Churchill vintage to be declared. By the late 1990s, the "Cuvee Sir Winston Churchill" 1986 was developing into a nutty, elegant maturity.

1988

The 1980s ended with that rarity in Champagne of three excellent vintages in a row. Some consider 1988 the finest. It will be fascinating to see which, between 1988 and 1990, will last longer. The Pol Roger 1988s (a full range of cuvees were made) have a classical poise and balance. Austere when young, the severity has mellowed with adolescence and the underlying richness of the fruit has been increasingly revealed. This is a very fine vintage.

1989

The 1989 Pol Roger is an open charming vintage with lovely floral scents and creamy, well integrated palate, the product of an unusually early harvest which started on September 4th.

Reminiscent of the 1982, but without its opulence and weight. Showing a fine rounded palate of buttery soft flavors. At present a joy to drink with the balance to make this fine Champagne last for years to come.

Undoubtedly the most fashionable vintage, and arguably the finest overall, 1990 has an almost oriental opulence. Despite spring frosts, an extended flowering and the hottest summer in thirty years, punctuated by timely showers, the grapes were picked in perfect condition. As in any truly great vintage, the balance in the musts was found to be ideal. When first released a brilliant buttery golden tone in the 1990 indicated the ripeness of the fruit within. The vivacity of the mousse, the intensity of the palette and the crispness and length of the finish are pointers to a long life ahead. One of the great classic vintages.

Tasting note: Nearly 30 notes, yet despite the varying occasions and contexts, what is remarkable is the relatively little bottle variation. Just about every note refers to a glorious fragrance which seems to unravel itself after 15 to 20 minutes in the glass. Most recently: another faultless bottle: lovely soft colour; classic bouquet, sweet, touch of iron, fragrant, developed richly; also sweet on the palate, mouthfilling flavour, life-preserving tannin still evident. Spectacular aromatics offer jammy cherry and black fruits intertwined with lead pencil, mineral, and smoky wood scents. Powerful for a Lafite, this wine unfolds to reveal extraordinary richness, purity, and overall symmetry in addition to stunning flavour depth and persistence. The finish lasts for nearly a minute. Plenty of tannin remains, and the wine displays a vibrancy and youthfulness that belie its 18 years of age. The modern day equivalent of Lafite-Rothschild's immortal 1959, the 1982 will enjoy another 30-70 years of life! An amazing achievement! Anticipated maturity: 2007-2070. Robert Parker. Tasting note: Well, well, well - Lafite Rothschild does it again. Ever since manager Charles Chevalier was transferred from his beloved Sauternes property of Rieussec (also owned by the Rothschilds) to Lafite in 1994, there has been a succession of profound wines to emerge from this noble estate. The 2000 Lafite Rothschild, a blend of 93.3% Cabernet Sauvignon and 6.7% Merlot (only 36% of the crop made the grade) has an opaque ruby/purple colour, followed by an extraordinary aromatic expression of liquid minerals/ stones interwoven with the tell-tale graphite notes. mulberry, black currants, caramel, and tobacco. In the mouth, it is remarkably light on its feet, but somehow seems to pack intense flavours into layer upon layer of fruit and richness that cascade over the palate. A compelling wine, with extraordinary precision, great intensity, and a seamlessness in spite of what are obviously elevated levels of tannin, this wine was provocatively open and beautiful when tasted in January and February, but I am sure it will soon close down. The finish lasted a whopping 72 seconds! This is utterly fascinating stuff. Anticipated maturity: 2011-2050. Robert Parker, Wine Advocate 146 (April 2003)

Expansive, savory, staggeringly concentrated, and voluptuous as well as wonderfully precise with a hint of minerality, this sensational wine's technical numbers are off the charts. Tasting note: From barrel, this remains one of the greatest wines I have ever tasted. Whether fining and filtration pulled more out of it than was intended, only the proprietor knows. However, the 1982 Petrus turned in a strong performance in Philadelphia in contrast to other tastings when it has been less than spectacular. The colour reveals some amber at the edge. A sweet nose of caramel, roasted herbs, cherry jam, cedar, and smoke is followed by a thick, full-bodied, unctuouslytextured, low acid Petrus that is approaching full maturity. This was a dazzling showing for this 1982, which has performed irregularly since birth. Although abundant tannin remains, the wine is sweet, smoky, and ideal for drinking now and over the next 20-25 years. A bottle drunk in France in March, 2000, was equally sublime. This dense ruby/purple-coloured effort is beginning to hint at the massive richness and full-bodied intensity lurking beneath its wall of tannin. The vintage's sweetness, low acidity, and velvety tannins are present in abundance, and the wine is massive in the mouth as well as incredibly pure and well-delineated. I thought it would be drinkable by now, but it appears another 5-10 years will pass before it begins to reach its plateau of maturity. This wine is capable of lasting at least four more decades. IS MADFIRA'S

These bottles were discovered by OP Brothers in São Vicente. They had original wax seals and corks but were in very poor condition; The bottles were completely covered with dirt and sand. The contents of some bottles had no wine characteristics due to the loss of alcohol, they were refused. All bottles were carefully cleaned and opened. The Madeira was placed in demijohns while the original bottles were cleaned and newly stencilled where necessary. Then the wine was rebottled, recorked and rewaxed. From these bottles we were able to taste a number of wines, our notes are added to the specific lots.

Who J.S. was that made these wines remains uncertain. The stencilling is quite unique in its design and paint. This ink was also used by João Carlos d'Aguiar from Estreito de Câmara de Lobos. They appear to be extremely rare and possibly are from Dr. João Vicente da Silva who was from Estreito de Câmara de Lobos, born around 1803. For about 40 years he was in the service of the City Hall. By his death in 1895 his nephew inherited a collection of old Madeira wines stored in six cellars in the area of Ribeiro Real.

We were unable to receive comfirmation that the J.S. Madeiras in fact were from João Vicente da Silva. Our research continues. Meanwhile we are pleased to offer these historic and very unique bottles.

The 1989 is one of a handful of truly profound wines from a vintage that tends to be overrated, save for the Pomerols, a few St.-Emilions, and some overachievers in the Medoc, However, 1989 was an extraordinary success for Jean Delmas, the administrator of Haut-Brion and La Mission-Haut-Brion. The prodigious 1989 Haut-Brion is one of the greatest first-growths I have ever tasted. It has always reminded me of what the 1959 must have tasted like in its youth, but it is even richer and more compelling aromatically. The wine exhibits an opaque ruby/ purple colour, as well as a sweet nose of jammy fruit, tobacco, spicy oak, minerals, and smoke. Fabulously concentrated, with huge levels of fruit, extract, and glycerin, this wine is nearly viscous because of its thickness and richness. Low acidity gives the wine even more appeal and adds to its precociousness. The wine has not budged in development since it was first bottled, although it has always provided thrilling drinking because of its voluptuous texture. It needs another 5-6 years of bottle age before it will begin to develop Haut-Brion's fabulous fragrance. Expect it to hit its plateau of maturity around 2003-2005 and drink well for 15-25 years. 3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The auctioneer can at his sole option:

- refuse any bid;
- (b) move the bidding backwards or forwards in any way he or she may decide, or change the order of the **lots**;
- (c) withdraw any lot;
- (d) divide any **lot** or combine any two or more **lots**;
- (e) reopen or continue the bidding even after the hammer has fallen; and
- (f) in the case of error or dispute and whether during or after the auction, to continue the bidding, determine the successful bidder, cancel the sale of the lot, or reoffer and resell any lot. If any dispute relating to bidding arises during or after the auction, the auctioneer's decision in exercise of this option is final.

4 BIDDING

8 SUCCESSFUL BIDS

Unless the auctioneer decides to use his or her discretion as set out in paragraph C3 above, when the auctioneer's hammer strikes, we have accepted the last bid. This means a contract for sale has been formed between the seller and the successful bidder. We will issue an invoice only to the registered bidder who made the successful bid. While we send out invoices by post and/or email after the auction, we do not accept responsibility for telling you whether or not your bid was successful. Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any **lot** and any express or implied condition or warranty is hereby excluded:

(b) if. (1) within twenty-one days of the date of the auction. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.

9 LAW AND DISPUTES

This agreement, and any non-contractual obligations arising out of or in connection with this agreement, or any other rights you may have relating to the purchase of a lot will be operaned by Swiss law. 

CHRISTIE'S INTEREST IN PROPERTY CONSIGNED FOR AUCTION

Δ Property Owned in part or in full by Christie's

From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which it owns in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol Δ next to its **lot** number.

Minimum Price Guarantees

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol onext to the **lot** number.

○◆ Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the lot fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party. In such cases the third party agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the lot. The third party is therefore committed to bidding on the lot and even if there are no other bids, buying the lot at the level of the written bid unless there are any higher bids. In doing so, the third party takes on all or part of the risk of the lot not being sold. If the lot is not sold, the third party may incur a loss. 

The amount by which level of wine is short of being full: these levels may vary according to age of the wines and, as far as can be ascertained by inspection prior to the sale, are described in the catalogue.

- into neck: Level of young Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 very top-shoulder
- top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.
- mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.
