Christie's Wine Department will offer two remarkable auctions, A Study in Distinction Evening Sale & Finest Wines and Spirits, Featuring an Exceptional Collection and Rarities Direct from the Cellars of Champagne Charles Heidsieck.

Champagne Charles Heidsieck is releasing an extensive collection of rare vintages directly from their cenothèque in Reims to be sold as part of our auctions in London and New York. The wines will be auctioned on December 7 in London and on December 9 in New York, to the delight of champagne lovers across the world. The collection includes wines dating back to the late 1970s, including the much-celebrated Champagne Charlie from multiple vintages. Many of the wines are released as part of La Collection Crayères. The entirety of this 'La Collection Crayères' has been released with brand new labels and packaging and was tasted by Christie's team in September 2016.

The exceptional collection that follows, is a direct continuation from our Evening Sale, A Study in Distinction. This section of the collection is focused on the finest wines of Bordeaux, Burgundy, the Rhône, Champagne and Italy. The collector bought many of these wines on release and in volume. Extreme care has been taken in storing these wines in perfect conditions. The results of this judicious cellarage shows clearly in the wines - the condition is excellent throughout.

Following on from our recent successes in the category, our sale includes rarest Madeiras that span three centuries and include some of the greatest bottles in existence. The collections come to us from the cellars of three American connoisseurs. Highlights include 1795 Terrantez, 1827 Boal Quinta do Serrado and a small, but magnificent collection of P.P Goelet bottles.

The Rare Spirits section of the catalog features some extraordinary finds. A full, twelve quart case of Overholt Whiskey 1906; a lot which was acquired by the consignor in our sale of whiskey from the Estate of Richard Mellon-Scaife in 2015 is a highlight. This case is joined by one of the oldest and rarest bottles of Cognac that we have ever offered. Vieux Cognac, Clos de Griffier 1788, is a legendary bottle. This Cognac was bottled for Café Anglais in Paris, and acquired by the father of the consignor from La Tour d'Argent in the 1960s. It is a remarkable, historic bottle, the likes of which rarely comes to market.

We are excited to offer an extraordinary, collection of rare Spanish wines from Bodegas Vega Sicilia and Marques de Murrieta. The wines in the collection come directly from the cellars of a notable European collector, who has strong links to both producers. The selection of Murrieta wines goes back to Castillo Ygay Gran Reserva 1925, and includes historic wines from 1942, 1948 and 1954. Vega Sicilia reaches right back to 1921 and includes legendary wines like the 1924, 1942, 1968 and 1970.

Final mention must go to a memorable offering of Sine Qua Non from three American collections. These selections offer a rare insight into the scope and power of these wines, their potential to age and the different ways in which Manfred Krankl has built one of the most singular brands in the world of wine.

CHARLES HEIDSIECK

For the first time in its history, Charles Heidsieck is releasing an extensive collection of rare vintages directly from their Œnothèque in Reims to be sold at auction. They will be auctioned on Thursday 7th December 2017 in London and on 9th December in New York, to the delight of champagne lovers across the world.

For the launch of the 'Collection Crayères', Charles Heidsieck is collaborating with Christie's, the celebrated auction house. Anthony Hanson MW, has said of this release; "It is incredibly unusual to be able to offer a stunning range of old vintage champagnes at auction, directly from their cellars in Reims. These pristine Charles Heidsieck vintages have lain untouched in the house's 2000-year-old underground chalk-pit cellars, since their original bottlings."

Fine Champagne enthusiasts will be delighted to have access to the much celebrated 'Champagne Charlie', including the '81, '82 in magnum,'83 and '85. The house's highly awarded blanc de blancs, 'Blanc des Millénaires', will be available from the '83, '81 and '90 vintages, while the historic Cuvée Royale will be available from the 1981 vintage. Vintage rosé admirers will find a series of Rosé Millésimé from the 1980s and for fans of large formats there will be twelve jeroboams of Millésimé 1989, of which Anthony Hanson MW commented; "It is an absolutely astonishing wine, to my mind one of the best large format champagnes in existence, with perfect provenance."

The entirety of this 'Collection Crayères' has been tasted and approved by the wine team at Christie's. Importantly, and what sets this sale apart, is that all the bottles on sale come directly from the Charles Heidsieck chalk cellars in Reims, where they have been stored in the best possible conditions since being bottled – in some cases for more the 50 years. Their provenance is guaranteed. Hanson noted; "Charles Heidsieck had been a Sleeping Beauty amongst Grandes Marques Champagnes... The offering has depth and breadth. Aficionados of old vintage Champagne have thrilling opportunities to acquire legendary bottlings."

Stephen Leroux, Director of the House of Charles Heidsieck, explains "Opening our CEnothèque to the public is both a passion and a powerful act. We want to enable wine lovers to obtain these bottles and have unforgettable experiences; it echoes the House philosophy. What's more, distributing such rare bottles in a responsible manner whilst ensuring a minimum are available for future generations, is an exercise in balance." It is a historic collaboration between Charles Heidsieck and Christie's, celebrating the 'Collection Crayères' – an astonishing release of spectacular older vintages from one of Champagne's most admired houses.

CHAMPAGNE CHARLIE

Charles-Camille Heidsieck earned the friendly nickname "Champagne Charlie" when travelling to the USA at the end of the 19th century. This iconic wine is a tribute to the charismatic founder of the house. Very few vintages were made (1979, 1981, 1982, 1983, and 1985) and in very limited quantities. In magnum, this wine is a true sought after jewel.

The tale of the Cuvée Charlie is directly linked to that of the Cuvée Royale. While the latter met with great success, Charles Heidsieck management - at the end of the 1970s - sensed even more potential on the marketing front for a wine more closely connected to the character and name of the founder, Charles-Camille, In 1978, Daniel Thibault, the emblematic Cellar Master, well-known personality of modern Champagne, took charge of devising an exceptional vintage with more "explosive" and more pronounced aromas than the "standard version" of the same vintage. The very first Champagne Charlie was launched with the 1979 vintage, and 5 harvests were to follow in 1978, 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1985. The incorporation of the House in the Rémy Cointreau group saw the end of the marketing of this vintage, whose rarity has since become an international icon.

MOUTON-ROTHSCHILD 1986

Mouton-Rothschild 1986 is a wine that continues to inspire awe in the minds of collectors, wine-makers and writers. Now at over thirty years of age, some believe that it could still be confused with an en primeur barrel sample! The wine is gargantuan: dense, tannic and seemingly endless. It is an outlier, a wine that is pure Bordeaux when thinking of mouth-drying tannins and noble gait, but at the time, it is exuberant and rich, a ringer for a fine cult Californian Cabernet. The wine is a blend of 80% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Merlot, 8% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot, The powerful structure is what really sets the wine apart: some question whether Mouton 1986 will ever find full maturity - all we can be sure of is that it will be a fascinating journey trying to get there.

MARGAUX

Margaux is unique among the communes of the Médoc: it is the farthest south (isolated from its three famous cousins to the north, Saint-Estéphe, Saint-Julien and Pauillac) and is made up of several non-contiguous parcels of vineyard land. The appellation of Margaux encompasses the village of Margaux, of course, as well as the villages of Cantenac, Soussans, Labarde, and Arsac. Ideally, the limestone, chalk, clay and sand of Margaux combine (especially where gravel dominates, facilitating drainage) to make a fragrant and silky wine. More Margaux properties were included in the famous classification of 1855 than any other commune.

Château Margaux has been occupied since at least the 12th century, with the site occupied by a fortified castle known as Lamothe or La Mothe (from motte, a small rise in the land), and wine under names such as "Margou" and "Margous" was known in the 15th-century. With the arrival of the Lestonnac family in the 16th century that wine production became of particular importance, and in the 1570s Pierre de Lestonnac expanded the property and cleared many of the grain fields to make way for vines.

HAUT BRION

Château Haut-Brion has been highly regarded for many centuries, being mentioned in Samuel Pepy's diary in 1663. In 1935 Haut-Brion was bought by the American banker, Clarence Dillon. His descendants still own the estate in the form of his grand-daughter Joan Dillon who is the President and her son, His Royal Highness Prince Robert of Luxembourg, the Vice President and Managing Director. In 1983 the Dillons acquired the next door property La Mission Haut-Brion.

Haut-Brion is renowned for the classic Graves earthy and smoky character, combined with the opulent and approachable nature provided by the higher proportion of Merlot in comparison to the other Médoc First Growths.



LA MISSION HAUT-BRION

Created by the noble Lestonnac family (sister and brother in law of Jean de Pontac, the owner of Château Haut-Brion) this Château owes its name and its reputation to the Prêcheurs de la Mission. The Bordeaux branch of the Congrégation de la Mission de Saint-Lazare, a missionary order, commonly known as the Lazarists, who owned the property from 1682 until 1789. The estate was awarded a Gold Medal at the 1862 International Exhibition in London.

CALON-SEGUR

With its name derived from the "calones", Château Calon Ségur's history could date back to the Gallo-Roman era. It is also one of the rarest examples of consistency over terroir after the 1855 classification. Known for its heart shaped label, it is designed in the memory of Nicolas-Alexandre, Marquis de Ségur. The Marguis once said that "I make wine at Lafitte and Latour but my heart is at Calon Ségur." Hence Calon was later on known as Calon Ségur. Calon Ségur is known for its authentic wines with lovely softness and amazing intensity.

PICHON-LONGUEVILLE, BARON

Pichon Baron is considered to be one of the finest 'super seconds' within the Pauillac 2eme Cru Classe of Bordeaux. Within their 73 hectares they grow 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc. Pichon Baron is well known for a deeply layered and full bodied wine, which should be aged at least 10 years before appreciation. They have performed very well in all of the top vintages in recent years.

LEOVILLE-LAS-CASES

Château Léoville-Las-Cases is the most northerly of the Saint Julien properties and closest to the vineyards of Pauillac. The richness and power of their wines means that Léoville-Las-Cases are often mistaken for a top Pauillac. The estate has 97 hectares of vines divided into 125 parcels, the largest and most important is the 50 hectare walled vineyard called Grand Clos.

The vineyards are generally planted with 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. The grapes are entirely hand-harvested and fermentation which takes place in a mix of wooden. cement and stainless steel vats lasts for between 12 and 24 days at temperatures between 24°C and 28°C. The wine is then aged for between 18-20 months in sixty to 100% new oak depending on the vintage.

PETRUS

Within the world of fine wine appreciation, there is something of an 'ultra-elite,' an inner-circle that few wines will ever enter. This is a group of maybe five or six, almost exclusively French wines, whose prices and reputations exceed those of all others. In the best vintages few wines compare in terms of price or critical acclaim, these wines are best known for their power, concentration and multi-layered complexity. Pétrus is the ultimate expression of the opulence and charm that right bank wines can deliver when at their best.

The vineyard is located in Pomerol on a plateau dominated by iron-rich (crasse de fer) clay soils that give the wines their structure and power. They are well drained due to a gentle slope. The clay content retains some water which reduces hydric stress and creates a cooler mesoclimate that is ideally suited to the early ripening Merlot. The average age of the vines is 45 years.

LA FLEUR PETRUS

Jean-Pierre Moueix, who established his wine merchant business in Libourne in Libourne in 1937, purchased La Fleur-Pétrus in 1950. This historic estate, situated directly between Château La Fleur and Pétrus on the plateau of Pomerol, was his first vineyard acquisition. The visionary négociant recognized in this vineyard a pure expression of Pomerol's unique terroir, a realization that inspired him to devote his career to establishing the international reputation of the appellation.

The vineyard is made up of three parcels on the plateau of Pomerol located within a range of 500 meters, with altitudes averaging 33 to 38 meters above sea level. The pebbly soils from the northern parcel yield a wine of great elegance with notes of black cherries. The centre plot, known for its summer heat (the area is called "Tropchaud"), produces a wine of tremendous suppleness with a hint of plum. Wine from the southern parcel is particularly velvety, dense, structured, with a pronounced rose of blackcurrant.

I A SPINETTA

La Spinetta in Castagnole Lanze was founded by Giuseppe and Lidia Rivetti in 1977. In 1995 La Spinetta produced the first Barbaresco Gallina and the first bottle to carry the rhino label, which resulted into some confusion, since Gallina, the name of the vineyard, is also the Italian word for chicken. La Spinetta has actually no relationship to the Rhino at all, other than an aesthetic one. In 1996 La Spinetta began to produce Barbaresco Starderi and Barbera d'Alba Gallina, in 1997, Barbaresco Valeirano and in 1998 Barbera d'Asti Superiore. In 2000, the estate purchased 8 hectares of Nebbiolo vineyards in Barolo, and started making Barolo. The first vintage of Barolo Campè was 2000.





GOELET MADEIRA

The Goelet family, originally hardware merchants, were socially prominent for generations in Victorian New York. The 1887 Goelet Building at the southeast corner of 20th Street and Broadway was put up by the brothers Robert and Ogden Goelet.

The family were collectors of Madeira in the 19th century. Many of the bottles' names refer to the ships that they arrived on, names like "Brig Twins", "Frances" and "Juno".

VEGA SICILIA

In a ranking of the world's leading top quality wines Vega Sicilia would surely be listed in the top 20. This unique estate has been known for producing great wine ever since their first release of 1915. Vega Sicilia has been famous for over 100 years though only from the early 1980's have the Vega Sicilia wines been widely distributed.

Though the founding date of Bodega Vega Sicilia is 1864 it all started a little earlier in 1859 when Don Elroy Lecanda was given an estate by his father which included 2 adjacent parcels of land in Valbuena de Duero, one of them being Vega Sicilia.

Before Don Elroy's arrival the estate was devoted to livestock husbandry and production of cereals. Ever since the legendary 1855 Bordeaux classification new wine making techniques were imported from France. Elroy had an admiration for these Bordeaux wines and bought 18.000 vine shoots of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Malbec, Carmener and Pinot Noir from Beguerie & Co. Of these varietals now only Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Malbec remain, the offspring of the original vines have adapted themselves well to the soil and climate in Ribera del Duero.

By 1890 the Lecanda family was forced to sell the majority of shares to the Herrero family. In this period the bodega was first known as Bodegas de Lecanda only in the early 20thcentury becoming Bodega Vega Sicilia.

During the difficult period of the last decade of the 19th century the family decided to lease the bodega to the Palacio family for 10 years. From 1901 on all the wine made at the estate was shipped to the other wineries of the family, probably ending up in a Rioja blend under the Palacio label.

In 1905 the Palacio family hired Txomin Garramiola to look after the vinification and bring out the true potential of the estate. It was under his wing that Vega Sicilia really began to develop the quality of its wines. When the lease came to an end Txomin was hired by the Herreros to continue his job.

The 1915 was the first wine bottled under the Vega Sicilia name. In a way he is the godfather of the Vega Sicilia as we know it today.

The Vega Sicilia wines achieved great acclaim in the 1920's, winning many prizes. It was already in this early period of estate bottled wines that Vega Sicilia made its reputation as one of the greatest wines in the world. The bodega chanced ownership again in 1952 and 1966 until it finally came in the capable hands of the Alvarez family in 1982.

Up until the late seventies most wines were sold to a selective group of wealthy private clients and some restaurants in the Madrid region. Therefore old bottles of Unico are hard to find and are well sought after by collectors.

Of the wines produced at the bodega Unico is the wine for which Vega Sicilia is most known, a Gran Reserva only to be released when of the finest quality. Unico spends a minimum of 4 years in cask and 3 years in bottle, though this varies with every vintage. For instance the 1970 was aged for 16 years in cask and only released in 1995 in fact the magnums 1970 were not released until 2000!

The varietal blend of Unico varies little over the years and mostly about 70% Tinto Fino, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Merlot and 5% Malbec.

The years Unico was bottled, though the bodegas records are not conclusive on the earlier vintages:

The 1960 was the first time Vega Sicilia used a painting to illustrate the label. All paintings were bought by the Alvarez family.

Apparently before the Alvarez family took over at Vega Sicilia no large formats were bottled, making the 1960 one of the earliest large format Unico's to become available.

MARQUES DE MURRIETA

Marques de Murrieta is the most iconic bodega of the Rioja and is together with Vega Sicilia seen as one of Spain's First Growth wineries.

Marqués de Murrieta's foundation is linked to the origins of the Rioja wines. The founder of the winery, Luciano Murrieta, introduced the winemaking techniques from Bordeaux to the Rioja. In 1852 he was the first to commercialize and export Rioja wine. For his innovative work in the Rioja, Luciano, was appointed Marquis by the King Amadeo of Savoy. Luciano de Murrieta died in 1911 leaving the winery under the care of his relatives.

In 1983 the winery was sold to Vicente Cebrián Sagarriga, tenth Count of Creixell. He modernized the winery and with his entrepreneurial vocation he continued the legacy of Marqués de Murrieta. After his death his eldest son, Vicente D. Cebrián-Sagarriga, current Count of Creixell, assumed together with his sister Cristina the management of the winery, accompanied by a young and qualified team. Over the years, the Count of Creixell's family has become the perfect continuity to maintain the balance between tradition and modernity positioning Marqués de Murrieta in the 21st century in a privileged position in the world.

Today Marques de Murrieta has 300 hectares of vineyards. Unusually for Rioja, their wines are made entirely from grapes nurtured on their own lands. Many vines are old, some as much as ninety years old. Carefully tended, these old vines produce excellent quality grapes, with inordinate depth and intensity of flavor. As their winemaker, Maria Vargas says, "Great wines are made in the vineyard."

THE WINES

The winery produces today a wide range of wines, both traditional and more modern in style. Since the very beginning the Ygay "Etiqueta blanca" (white label) Reserva or Crianza (today labeled as Ygay Gran Reserva and Reserva) has been at the centre of the production. Because the winery only wanted to sell the best wine under the Ygay label, up until the 1970's not every vintage produced a Ygay wine. The best vintages for the Ygay "Etiqueta blanca" Reserva are the 1948, 1954, 1960, 1964, 1968, 1970, 1973, 1975, 1978, 1981, 1982 and 1985.

At the peak of the bodega's production is the Castillo Ygay (Gran) Reserva Especial, a blend of Tempranillo, Garnacha, Manzuelo and Graciano, a wine which again is only released when of the finest quality. In the 20th century the Castillo Ygay was produced in 1917, 1925, 1934, 1942, 1952, 1959, 1964, 1968, 1970, 1973, 1975, 1978, 1985, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1994 and 1998. Tasting old vintages of Murrieta (pre-1980) is one of the wine world greatest pleasures, and these represent a style of winemaking that is unlikely ever to be practiced again: the 1925, 1934 and 1942 Castillo Ygay spent 35 to 40 years in barrel and finally came onto the market in the 1970's. Its longevity is partly explained by its high acidity and very low pH. Decanter magazine praised the 1925 Castillo Ygay as a true Wine Legend and the wine received, together with the 1934 and 1942 vintages, the highest marks by many acclaimed wine critics.

THE WHITES WINES OF MARQUES DE MURRIETA

Incredible and impossible to find are old vintages of the white wines Ygay Reserva and the Castillo Ygay (Gran) Reserva Especial. Like the red Castillo Ygay, the white Castillo Ygay is only produced once or twice per decade and at only 1/10 of the quantity of the red wine. If the red can age easily 80-100 years, it seems that the white Castillo Ygay has eternal life. The older vintages of Castillo Ygay blanco is the stuff of dreams, a truly unique style of wine that cannot be found anywhere else. At a tasting held at the winery in 2016, Luis Gutierrez, the critic responsable for reviewing Spanish wines in Robert Parker's Wine Advocate gave the 1919 and 1932 100 points.

THE HISTORY OF THIS COLLECTION

This offering comes straight out of the cellar of the official dealer for Marques de Murrieta responsible for the distribution in the province of Galicia (Spain). In the late 1980's the dealer retired and ceased distribution. Having kept a small stock of the wines in his underground cellar to enjoy with his family he now decided the time was right to offer the remaining wines through Christie's. This is a rare opportunity to acquire perfectly stored bottles of Castillo Ygay but also of the great Ygay Reserva 1954 and 1960, great vintages for the Rioja region and ages in barrel for up to 15-20 years and other vintages. SINE QUA NON

My formative wine career began as so often they do, working a shop floor in Los Angeles. It was the mid-1990s, I had recently graduated University and fell in love with the wine industry. Little did I know I had entered the industry during the rise of cult wines, wunderkind winemakers and surging release prices.

The notion of a revolving artistic or artist's label was nothing new. Several producers had them over the decades, most notably Château Mouton-Rothschild in Bordeaux or closer to home examples like Kenwood Vineyards (1978) and Santa Barbara Winery (1985). But nothing in the industry had arrived in the shop with quite the impression – more like no impression – as did Manfred Krankl's 1994 Sine Qua Non, Queen of Spades released in 1996/7 as I recall. At first the impressions were literally between us Salespersons – our clientele barely knew anything at the time. To us Manfred was the manager at Campanile's, the only serious place in town serving Austrian wine for dinner service.

On the sales floor, none of us quite knew how to indorse Manfred's wine to clients. His wine would just sit on the salesfloor until we could find a willing buyer. His big, unctuous, over-the-top style had yet to catch on with average consumers. It wasn't until the big Aussie wines started to arrive in 1998-99 that the style found a viable and consistent constituency. It was too soon for any of us to see what Manfred was on to. He had something to say in this wine industry and nothing that came before him was quite like what which was to come.

By the late 1990s Sine Qua Non, its idiosyncratic labels and iconoclastic wine making style had established a feverish, cult-like following at the shop. What once occupied floor space for months on end now had to be kept "off-floor" in allocated wine storage. Shop customers who were not already on the winery's mailing list were offered tiny allocations out of our stocks. Sine Qua Non was a viable brand and a smashing local success.

What is it about Manfred and Sine Qua Non that attracts such fervent loyalty from his fan base? Is it the minuscule allocations, sometimes no more than a few bottles or none at all? Could it be he idiosyncratic newsletters that draw his readers into his world and for a moment each year allow you to see behind the Wizard of Oz's curtain? Or is it the insanity of knowing that each year's release will be done in yet another unique bottle that will be a nightmare to fit into your cellar racking? I suspect it is all of the above.

For many years, I have pursued the "mythical" definitive SQN collection. Such collections are increasingly difficult to locate for they would need to have the earliest vintages on hand, like 1992's Black & Blue, alas only 26 lots ever offered at auction and I know a few have been consumed. SQN's popularity is beyond even what the winery can serve (not all wines are equitably distributed to the winery's vast client base) many of the allocations are minuscule, 1 or 6 bottles in most instances. The three collections before you are the closest I've come to assembling a broad selection in many years.

The selections before you hail from three Los Angeles collections, two of which represent all but 4 lots. Given the nearly universal storage, 99% from same professional facility in Glendale, the fact that each collection was exclusively purchased off the highly-allocated winery mailing list, we chose to depart from our normal lotting by collector. As best we are able to we organized the following chronologically.

The following Sine Qua Non selection represent one of the largest ever single offerings in a Live auction. A total of 91 lots valued at over \$140,000, spanning 1997 Twisted & Bent to 2014 Piranha Waterdance.

THE INAUGURAL

The label is Manfred's handwritten wine name on one of two juxtaposed colors, simple and direct. 2003 represented a new starting point for the winery. This is the first inception of 100% Estate Vineyard bottling. Manfred's emphasis with Rothko like simplicity of label design is to focus all attention on the contents, not so much the packaging. Although both the Grenache and Syrah are released in specially created bottles, the Grenache is distinguished by a G nested inside a star at the base of its label.

Upon release Elaine and Manfred noted that guantities were extremely limited, especially for the Grenache. The newsletter that year cautioned allocations of the Grenache would be severe, not everyone on the mailing list would be getting one.

FLEVEN CONFESSIONS ESTATE

The name is very much from the mind of Manfred Krankl, as 11 different scions are planted on the estate and as they begin to produce they will eventually "speak the truth" of their terroir. As Manfred notes, they must "Confess" their secrets, and consumers will get to be their judge.

The Estate consists of 22 acres located in the cool Santa Rita Hills appellation. It was planted in 2001 and is made up of primarily Syrah and Grenache, but also some Roussanne and a tiny bit of Viognier. Because the climate is rather cool, they regularly experience very late harvests; seldom before the end of October and frequently well into November. This means very long "hang time" and full flavored, but never over-ripe or raisined fruit. Although the vineyard is densely planted with 2,420 vines per acre, they typically have very low vields of less than 1.5 tons per acre or more importantly around 1 lb. of fruit per vine.

ATI ANTIS

Atlantis, the fictional island mentioned within an allegory on the hubris of nations in works by Plato. The mythical city that besieges Athens, and eventually succumbs under the disfavor of deities of the ancient world and sinks below the Atlantic Ocean that once provided it sanctuary.

Fe2O3, ferric oxide, one of the three main oxides of iron. As the mineral, it is the main source of iron for the steel industry. Its common name is "rust".

In the syntax of Sine Qua Non suffixes 1a, 1b, 1c are reference the three different images used for the Syrah bottling. Accordingly, the three Grenache labels are afforded similar nomenclature. 2a. 2b. 2c. This scheme of serialized vocabulary would continue into the following year's release of The Raven series.

The images found on the labels belong to an abandoned Shell Oil industrial facility that in 2005 was very near the SON winery. These images that follow demonstrate the slow decline of once permanent forces. Buildings slowly being broken down over time, oxidizing, being reabsorbed into the world with the assistance of Mother Nature all around. As Manfred explored this abandoned place he understood that he held an underlying beauty. A beauty belonging only to the beholder, a subjective experience relative to every individual. Perhaps not unlike our approach to wine.

In a reaction to the unfortunate marketing patter, misinformation and stream of useless myth making offered by winemaking contemporaries Manfred sought to "SHOOT FIVE" of these distortions of truth in wine marketing. They are:

Each of these supposed marketing gems are in the words of Manfred, "...gibberish masquerading as some sort of implied quality marker." California, in a wine making context is by extension an unencumbered land free of hand-me-down traditions, where the intellect is freed of bureaucratic constraints and the "ART of winemaking" is permitted express itself. Therefore to counterbalance the rather "uncharacteristically vitriolic" tone of this offering Manfred chose to juxtapose a double entendre of meaning with images of naked bodies to adorn his dual offering. Each wine is a cuvée of five varietals

MEO-CAMUZET

Domaine Méo-Camuzet was founded by Etienne Camuzet at the start of the 20th century. The domaine passed to his daughter Maria Noirot, however she did not have children, so then subsequently passed to a distant relative, Jean-Méo in 1959. The domaine is currently run by Jean-Méo's son, Jean-Nicolas. Up until the year 1988 much of Méo-Camuzet's production was leased to share croppers, the most famous and lauded of all being the great Henri Jayer.

Today Méo-Camuzet owns approximately 14 hectares of vineyards, including 3 hectares of Clos de Vougeot, 0.45 hectares of Corton and 0.35 hectares of Richebourg. The domaine's focus is on minimal intervention in the vineyard, allowing the expression of their fine terroirs to shine through in the wines, combined with low yields and strict selection of only the healthiest grapes. They produce some of the very finest wines in Burgundy, characterised by sublime concentration, intensity of aromas and flavours, and rich, powerful wines with significant ageing potential.



- into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years 1 old.
- bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer. 2
- very top-shoulder
- top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 4 years old or older.
- upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.
- mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

If the buyer fails to make payment in full in good cleared funds within the time required by paragraph 4(b) above, we shall be entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other rights or remedies available to us by law);


