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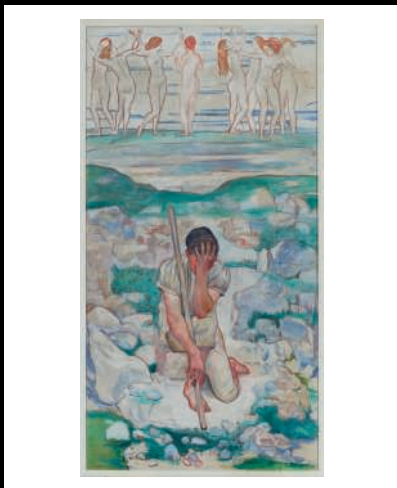

CHRISTIE'S SWITZERLAND - FIVE DECADES OF OPULENCE... AND COUNTING



The appeal of Switzerland is hard to match; a visually stunning country with sprawling natural beauty, charming small towns amidst cutting-edge cities, nurturing an internationally acclaimed financial hub.

Against this ideal backdrop, we opened our first Swiss office and the then only saleroom in continental Europe at 16 rue du Marché, Geneva in 1967. We held our inaugural auction on 7 June 1968, presenting a rare collection of Meissen porcelain from a royal European family. Our first success brought CHF1,140,000

A second, greater triumph followed less than a year later. Our Chairman in London won a peerless consignment of jewellery, but there was a catch. The collection was in Paris and importing it to London would incur exorbitant taxes; import friendly Geneva was the perfect solution. So, on 1 May 1969, 800 collectors crowded into Hotel Richemond to bid on the awe-inspiring collection of Nina Dyer. The sale realized over US\$1 million, an unprecedented sum at the time. It also launched Geneva as Christie's key international saleroom for the finest and rarest.

Spurred by the momentum, we quickly presented another Jewellery auction in November, relocated to the old town into a majestic 16th century building once used as dormitory for monks; and from there the ball continues to roll... and roll.

From the 1970's onwards, Geneva has been a blooming auction centre for Christie's, prolifically hosting sales of jewels, watches, wines, silver, Russian works of art, objects of vertu, porcelain, furniture, paintings, vintage cars, stamps, and even historic arms and armor.

We also expanded our geographical reach within the country. In 1978, we opened our office in Zurich as a consignment center for Impressionist, Modern and Contemporary art, and from 1991 onwards a saleroom for Swiss art. From here, Ferdinand Hodler's "Der Holzfäller" made its way to the Musée d'Orsay in 2005, and Hodler's "Traum des Hirten" found a new home at the Metropolitan Museum in New York in 2013. We also orchestrated annual auctions in St Moritz from 1990 to 2007, beginning with the jewels of Suzanne Belperron and Rene Boivin, the first of 18 important auctions.

As Christie's adapts to changing times and tastes, we fine-tuned our operation in Geneva to focus on jewels, watches and wine, as our story continues...

...with the legendary collections of the most illustrious tastemakers of our time: Mrs Lily Safra, Mrs James A de Rothschild, Mohamed Shah Aga Khan III, Mouna Ayoub, Helene Rochas.

...with the world's most memorable gems: The Oppenheimer Blue, The Orange, The Art of De Grisogono, The Sweet Josephine, Winston Legacy, The Archduke Joseph Diamond, The Grand Mazarin.

...with the extraordinary horological wonders that shone at Christie's: the 18K gold perpetual calendar chronograph wristwatch with moon phases and tonneau-shaped case by Patek Philippe (CHF6,260,000, May 2010), the extremely rare 18K gold precision watch with two movements by Breguet & Fils (CHF4,340,000, May 2012), and never to be forgotten, the mid-17th century blue enamel and diamond watch created in Paris, presented in 1986 and hailed by experts as "the most beautiful watch ever seen."

...and with the most coveted wines: Bouchard Père & Fils La Romanée 1865 (CHF37,500), Chartreuse Blanche, 1878 to 1903 (CHF22,325), Madeira from 1740 (CHF20,400).

As we continue to focus on paintings in Zurich...

...with the numerous prestigious Swiss art collections we introduced: "Works from the Zumsteg Collection" in 2006 (CHF12,000,000), the Swiss Art Collection of Ernst Beyeler for the benefit of the Fondation Beyeler in 2011, the charitable sale of properties from the Estate of the late Bruno Giacometti in 2012, and Fischli Weiss' "Der Lauf der Dinge", the reigning world record for any contemporary Swiss artist sold at auction in Switzerland, at CHF1,020,000 achieved in 2008.

So, to sum up our 50 marvelous years in Switzerland - the exquisite jewels, watches, wines and art we presented, the many price records we created, the generations of connoisseurs we served, the support and friendship we enjoyed in this mecca of beauty and refinement. Our commitment to Switzerland has been an amazing and rewarding journey. We look forward to the coming decades with the greatest anticipation.

DOMAINE HAEGELEN-JAYER

The Domaine dates back to the early 70s when Alfred Haegelen arrived from Alsace and married Madeleine Jayer, a niece of the great Henri. As the later's domaine, Haegelen-Jayer was based in Vosne-Romanée, in the heart of Burgundy's best climats. Vines were purchased in the 70s and also came from the family: Echezeaux, Clos de Vougeot and Chambolle-Musigny. Vinification methods were classic, with long cuvaision and low yields producing wines "full without being robust and wines rich and concentrated: indeed, this is extremely succulent, nicely long-lasting Pinot Noir. This is a good source, especially for the Clos de Vougeot." (Clive Coates in *The Wines of Burgundy*, 2008). The wines produced were mostly sold to private clients, thus explaining why they were so rarely seen on the market. 2009 was the last vintage produced, since Alfred Haegelen then retired with none of his children becoming a winemaker like him.

The parcel from which the wine on offer was made is located at the very top of the Clos de Vougeot slope, among the best plots of the Cru and a few metres from Grands Echezeaux just on the other side of the road. As stated by Robert Parker in his book *Burgundy*, 1990: "Not surprisingly, this is an extraordinary source of Clos de Vougeot, to the extent that one is able to find the wines".

Clos de Vougeot is arguably one of the most famous Grand Cru in Burgundy, being the larger in surface with close to 50 hectares and symbolising the birthplace of Burgundian winemaking tradition. Vineyards were purchased or, as regularly seen in Burgundy, donated to Cistercian monks from the close Abbaye de Citeaux, from as early as the 12th century. A wall has been then built around the Clos, which boundaries have remained the same since 14th century. The Château du Clos de Vougeot, with its non-definable charm, has been built from 1551 and serves nowadays as headquarters of the famous Confrérie des Chevaliers du Tastevin, which promotes wines of Burgundy.

Tasting note: This is why we buy Burgundy. Poured a glass upon opening and let the bottle be while I prepared dinner. It was much more in sync after an hour, which is when I wrote this note:

Wafting complex aroma of dried dark berries, iron, earth and a touch of mace with a sweet floral perfume haunting the edges of perception. Deep, rich, velvety iron infused dark berry flavors with an earthiness on the mid palate and semi tart red currant, with its brambles, and cranberries joining on the rear. The finish shows darker fruits again and is very long with blackberry-mineral-violet-mace all revolving over the palate. Tannins show at the end giving a bit of an edginess, but smooth out completely with another 30 - 45 minutes time. Very complex, masculine style Burg that defines delicious while never veering towards yumminess. (94 pts.) Robert Parker.

DOMAINE ARMAND ROUSSEAU

The Domaine was started at the beginning of the 20th century by Armand Rousseau who came from a family of vignerons and wine-merchants. He had inherited through marriage several plots of vineyards in Gevrey Chambertin in the Côte de Nuits at the turn of the century. Gradually he increased the size of the Domaine with acquisitions of vineyards in Charmes Chambertin in 1919, Clos de la Roche and Chambertin in 1920 and 1921, Mazy-Chambertin in 1937, Mazoyeres-Chambertin in 1940 and the esteemed 1er Cru Clos Saint Jacques in 1954. Following Armand's tragic death in a car crash in 1959, his son, Charles Rousseau, who had studied law and then oenology at Dijon University assumed control. Charles Rousseau instigated many improvements and investments, such as building two new cellars to increase storage capacity. Charles's son Eric and daughter Corinne have subsequently become involved at the Domaine and are responsible for producing some of the finest expressions of Pinot Noir coming out of Burgundy's world-famous Côte de Nuits.

The Domaine currently owns approximately 14 hectares of vineyards planted only with Pinot Noir, including 8 hectares of Grand Cru vineyards all situated in the communes of Gevrey-Chambertin and Morey-Saint-Denis producing their world famous Grand Crus; Chambertin Clos de Bèze, Chambertin, Mazy-Chambertin, Charmes-Chambertin, and Clos de la Roche; and their Premier Crus; Clos Saint Jacques, Les Cazétiers and Lavaux Saint-Jacques. The vines are old with an average age of between 40 and 45 years and a planting density of 11,000 vines per hectare. Yields are kept low, at between 30 to 40 hectolitres per hectare, with bud removal and green harvesting. No chemical fertilizers are used and harvesting is done completely by hand.

Vinification is traditionally Burgundian with 90% destemming, and fermentation for an average of 18 days in open-topped stainless steel vats with regular pumping over and pigeage. Fermentation temperature is controlled and does not exceed 33 degrees. Following alcoholic fermentation the wines are pressed in a pneumatic press, left to settle for 24 hours, and then transferred into oak barrels for the malolactic fermentation to take place naturally. The Chambertin and the Chambertin Clos de Bèze are aged in 100 % new oak with medium toast. The Clos Saint Jacques is put into between 70% and 100% new oak and the other wines are aged in either second or third-fill barrels. Ageing takes approximately 20 to 22 months and the wines are racked between 2 and 3 times. The wines are lightly filtered prior to bottling to retain as many flavour components as possible.

There is no disputing the quality of their wines. Anthony Hanson writing in his book, Burgundy, stated that Armand Rousseau "is one of Burgundy's great, traditional domains" and the wines are "harmonious, elegant, rich and individual". Neal Martin stated that "Some of the greatest wines I have ever tasted have borne Rousseau's name, in particular outstanding Chambertin and Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Clos Saint Jacques, the premier cru that merits promotion to Grand Cru more than any other. I also adore the Chambertin Clos de Bèze; the 1989 leaving a room full of tasters grasping for superlatives when tasted in 2003".

CONDITIONS OF SALE

These **Conditions of Sale** and the Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice set out the terms on which we offer the **lots** listed in this catalogue for sale. By registering to bid and/or by bidding at auction you agree to these terms so you should read them carefully before doing so. You will find a glossary at the end explaining the meaning of the words and expressions coloured in bold. Unless we own a **lot** (Δ symbol), Christie's acts as agent for the seller.

A BEFORE THE SALE

1 DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

(a) Certain words used in the catalogue description have special meanings. You can find details of these on the page headed 'Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice' which forms part of these terms. You can find a key to the Symbols found next to certain catalogue entries under the section of the catalogue called 'Symbols Used in this Catalogue'.
(b) Our description of any **lot** in the catalogue, any **condition** report and any other statement made by us (whether orally or in writing) about any **lot**, including about its nature or **condition**, artist, period, materials, approximate dimensions or **provenance** are our opinion and not to be relied upon as a statement of fact. We do not carry out in-depth research of the sort carried out by professional historians and scholars. All dimensions and weights are approximate only.

2 OUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

We do not provide any guarantee in relation to the nature of a **lot** apart from our **authenticity warranty** contained in paragraph E2 and to the extent provided in paragraph I below.

3 CONDITION

(a) The **condition of lots** sold in our auctions can vary widely due to factors such as age, previous damage, restoration, repair and wear and tear. Their nature means that they will rarely be in perfect **condition**. **Lots** are sold 'as is', in the **condition** they are in at the time of the sale, without any representation or **warranty** or assumption of liability of any kind as to **condition** by Christie's or by the seller.
(b) Any reference to **condition** in a catalogue entry or in a **condition** report will not amount to a full description of **condition**, and images may not show a **lot** clearly. Colours and shades may look different in print or on screen to how they look on physical inspection. **Condition** reports may be available to help you evaluate the **condition** of a **lot**. **Condition** reports are provided free of charge as a convenience to our buyers and are for guidance only. They offer our opinion but they may not refer to all faults, inherent defects, restoration, alteration or adaptation because our staff are not professional restorers or conservators. For that reason they are not an alternative to examining a **lot** in person or taking your own professional advice. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have requested, received and considered any **condition** report.

4 VIEWING LOTS PRE-AUCTION

(a) If you are planning to bid on a **lot**, you should inspect it personally or through a knowledgeable representative before you make a bid to make sure that you accept the description and its **condition**. We recommend you get your own advice from a restorer or other professional adviser.
(b) Pre-auction viewings are open to the public free of charge. Our specialists are available to answer questions at pre-auction viewings or by appointment.

5 ESTIMATES

Estimates are based on the **condition**, rarity, quality and **provenance** of the **lots** and on prices recently paid at auction for similar property. **Estimates** can change. Neither you, nor anyone else, may rely on any **estimates** as a prediction or guarantee of the actual selling price of a **lot** or its value for any other purpose. **Estimates** do not include the buyer's premium or any applicable taxes.

6 WITHDRAWAL

Christie's may, at its option, withdraw any **lot** at any time prior to or during the sale of the **lot**. Christie's has no liability to you for any decision to withdraw.

7 WINE

Please see the Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice section of this catalogue for further details. These important notices and explanations form part of these **Conditions of Sale**.

B REGISTERING TO BID

1 NEW BIDDERS

(a) If this is your first time bidding at Christie's or you are a returning bidder who has not bought anything from any of our salerooms within the last two years you must register at least 48 hours before an auction to give us enough time to process and approve your registration. We may, at our option, decline to permit you to register as a bidder. You will be asked for the following:

- for individuals: Photo identification (driving licence, national identity card or passport) and, if not shown on the ID document, proof of your current address (for example, a current utility bill or bank statement);
 - for corporate clients: Your Certificate of Incorporation or equivalent document(s) showing your name and registered address together with documentary proof of directors and beneficial owners; and
 - for trusts, partnerships, offshore companies and other business structures, please contact us in advance to discuss our requirements. For help, please contact our Client Services on +41 22 319 1766.
- (b) We may also ask you to give us a financial reference and/or a deposit as a **condition** of allowing you to bid. For help, please contact our Client Services on +41 22 319 1766.

2 RETURNING BIDDERS

We may at our option ask you for current identification as described in paragraph B1(a) above, a financial reference or a deposit as a **condition** of allowing you to bid. If you have not bought anything from any of our salerooms in the last two years or if you want to spend more than on previous occasions, please contact our Client Services on +41 22 319 1766.

3 IF YOU FAIL TO PROVIDE THE RIGHT DOCUMENTS

If in our opinion you do not satisfy our bidder identification and registration procedures including, but not limited to completing any anti-money laundering and/or anti-terrorism financing checks we may require to our satisfaction, we may refuse to register you to bid, and if you make a successful bid, we may cancel the contract for sale between you and the seller.

4 BIDDING ON BEHALF OF ANOTHER PERSON

(a) As authorised bidder: If you are bidding on behalf of another person, that person will need to complete the registration requirements above before you can bid, and supply a signed letter authorising you to bid for him/her.

(b) As agent for an undisclosed principal: If you are bidding as an agent for an undisclosed principal (the ultimate buyer(s)), you accept personal liability to pay the **purchase price** and all other sums due. Further, you warrant that:

- you have conducted appropriate customer due diligence on the ultimate buyer(s) of the **lot(s)** in accordance with any and all applicable anti-money laundering and sanctions laws, consent to us relying on this due diligence, and you will retain for a period of not less than 5 years the documentation and records evidencing the due diligence;
- you will make such documentation and records (including originals) evidencing your due diligence promptly available for immediate inspection by an independent third-party auditor upon our written request to do so. We will not disclose such documentation and records to any third-parties unless (1) it is already in the public domain, (2) it is required to be disclosed by law, or (3) it is in accordance with anti-money laundering laws;
- the arrangements between you and the ultimate buyer(s) are not designed to facilitate tax crimes;
- you do not know, and have no reason to suspect, that the funds used for settlement are connected with, the proceeds of any criminal activity including tax crimes, or that the ultimate buyer(s) are under investigation, charged with or convicted of money laundering, terrorist activities or other money laundering predicate crimes.

A bidder accepts personal liability to pay the **purchase price** and all other sums due unless it has been agreed in writing with Christie's before commencement of the auction that the bidder is acting as an agent on behalf of a named third party acceptable to Christie's and that Christie's will only seek payment from the named third party.

5 BIDDING IN PERSON

If you wish to bid in the saleroom you must register for a numbered bidding paddle at least 30 minutes before the auction. You may register online at www.christies.com or in person. For help, please contact the Client Services on +41 22 319 1766.

6 BIDDING SERVICES

The bidding services described below are a free service offered as a convenience to our clients and Christie's is not responsible for any error (human or otherwise), omission or breakdown in providing these services.

(a) Phone Bids

Your request for this service must be made no later than 24 hours prior to the auction. We will accept bids by telephone for **lots** only if our staff are available to take the bids. If you need to bid in a language other than in English, you must arrange this well before the auction. We may record telephone bids. By bidding on the telephone, you are agreeing to us recording your conversations. You also agree that your telephone bids are governed by these **Conditions of Sale**.

(b) Internet Bids on Christie's Live™

For certain auctions we will accept bids over the Internet. Please visit www.christies.com/livebidding and click on the 'Bid Live' icon to see details of how to watch, hear and bid at the auction from your computer. As well as these **Conditions of Sale**, internet bids are governed by the 'Christie's LIVE™' terms of use which are available on www.christies.com.

(c) Written Bids

You can find a Written Bid Form at the back of our catalogues, at any Christie's office or by choosing the sale and viewing the **lots** online at www.christies.com. We must receive your completed Written Bid Form at least 24 hours before the auction. Bids must be placed in the currency of the saleroom. The auctioneer will take reasonable steps to carry out written bids at the lowest possible price, taking into account the reserve. If you make a written bid on a **lot** which does not have a reserve and there is no higher bid than yours, we will bid on your behalf at around 50% of the **low estimate** or, if lower, the amount of your bid. If we receive written bids on a **lot** for identical amounts, and at the auction these are the highest bids on the **lot**, we will sell the **lot** to the bidder whose written bid we received first.

C AT THE SALE

1 WHO CAN ENTER THE AUCTION

We may, at our option, refuse admission to our premises or decline to permit participation in any auction or to reject any bid.

2 RESERVES

Unless otherwise indicated, all **lots** are subject to a reserve. We identify **lots** that are offered without reserve with the symbol Δ next to the **lot** number. The **reserve** cannot be more than the **lot's low estimate**.

3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The auctioneer can at his sole option:

- refuse any bid;
- move the bidding backwards or forwards in any way he or she may decide, or change the order of the **lots**;
- withdraw any **lot**;
- divide any **lot** or combine any two or more **lots**;
- reopen or continue the bidding even after the hammer has fallen; and
- in the case of error or dispute and whether during or after the auction, to continue the bidding, determine the successful bidder, cancel the sale of the **lot**, or reoffer and resell any **lot**. If any dispute relating to bidding arises during or after the auction, the auctioneer's decision in exercise of this option is final.

4 BIDDING

The auctioneer accepts bids from:

- bidders in the saleroom;
- telephone bidders, and internet bidders through Christie's LIVE™ (as shown above in Section B6); and
- written bids (also known as absentee bids or commission bids) left with us by a bidder before the auction.

5 BIDDING ON BEHALF OF THE SELLER

The auctioneer may, at his or her sole option, bid on behalf of the seller up to but not including the amount of the reserve either by making consecutive bids or by making bids in response to other bidders. The auctioneer will not identify these as bids made on behalf of the seller and will not make any bid on behalf of the seller at or above the reserve. If lots are offered without reserve, the auctioneer will generally decide to open the bidding at 50% of the **low estimate** for the lot. If no bid is made at that level, the auctioneer may decide to go backwards at his or her sole option until a bid is made, and then continue up from that amount. In the event that there are no bids on a lot, the auctioneer may deem such lot unsold.

6 BID INCREMENTS

Bidding generally starts below the **low estimate** and increases in steps (bid increments). The auctioneer will decide at his or her sole option where the bidding should start and the bid increments. The usual bid increments are shown for guidance only on the Written Bid Form at the back of this catalogue.

7 CURRENCY CONVERTER

The saleroom video screens (and Christie's LIVE™) may show bids in some other major currencies as well as Swiss Francs. Any conversion is for guidance only and we cannot be bound by any rate of exchange used. Christie's is not responsible for any error (human or otherwise), omission or breakdown in providing these services.

8 SUCCESSFUL BIDS

Unless the auctioneer decides to use his or her discretion as set out in paragraph C3 above, when the auctioneer's hammer strikes, we have accepted the last bid. This means a contract for sale has been formed between the seller and the successful bidder. We will issue an invoice only to the registered bidder who made the successful bid. While we send out invoices by post and/or email after the auction, we do not accept responsibility for telling you whether or not your bid was successful. If you have bid by written bid, you should contact us by telephone or in person as soon as possible after the auction to get details of the outcome of your bid to avoid having to pay unnecessary storage charges.

9 LOCAL BIDDING LAWS

You agree that when bidding in any of our sales that you will strictly comply with all local laws and regulations in force at the time of the sale for the relevant sale site.

D THE BUYER'S PREMIUM AND TAXES

1 THE BUYER'S PREMIUM

In addition to the **hammer price**, the successful bidder agrees to pay us a **buyer's premium** on the **hammer price** of each lot sold. On all lots we charge 25% of the **hammer price** up to and including CHF 250,000, 20% on that part of the **hammer price** over CHF 250,000 and up to and including CHF 4,000,000, and 12.5% of that part of the **hammer price** above CHF 4,000,000.

Exception: the **buyer's premium** for Wine and Cigars is 20% of the **hammer price** sold.

For all lots VAT is payable on the **buyer's premium** at the applicable rate.

2 TAXES

The successful bidder is responsible for any applicable tax including any VAT, sales or compensating use tax or equivalent tax wherever they arise on the **hammer price** and/or the **buyer's premium**. It is the buyer's responsibility to ascertain and pay all taxes due. You can find details of how VAT and VAT refunds are dealt with in the section of the catalogue headed 'VAT Symbols and Explanation'. VAT charges and refunds depend on the particular circumstances of the buyer so this section, which is not exhaustive, should be used only as a general guide. In all circumstances EU and Swiss law takes precedence. If you have any questions about VAT, please contact Client Services on +41 22 319 1766.

For lots Christie's ships to the United States, a state sales or use tax may be due on the **hammer price**, **buyer's premium** and shipping costs on the lot, regardless of the nationality or citizenship of the purchaser. Christie's is currently required to collect sales tax for lots it ships to the state of New York. The applicable sales tax rate will be determined based upon the state, county or locale to which the lot will be shipped. Successful bidders claiming an exemption from sales tax must provide appropriate documentation to Christie's prior to the release of the lot. For shipments to those states for which Christie's is not required to collect sales tax, a successful bidder may be required to remit use tax to that state's taxing authorities. Christie's recommends you obtain your own independent tax advice with further questions.

E WARRANTIES

1 SELLER'S WARRANTIES

For each lot, the seller gives a **warranty** that the seller:

(a) is the owner of the lot or a joint owner of the lot acting with the permission of the other co-owners or, if the seller is not the owner or a joint owner of the lot, has the permission of the owner to sell the lot, or the right to do so in law; and

(b) has the right to transfer ownership of the lot to the buyer without any restrictions or claims by anyone else. If either of the above warranties are incorrect, the seller shall not have to pay more than the **purchase price** (as defined in paragraph F1(a) below) paid by you to us.

The seller will not be responsible to you for any reason for loss of profits or business, expected savings, loss of opportunity or interest, costs, damages, other damages or expenses. The seller gives no **warranty** in relation to any lot other than as set out above and, as far as the seller is allowed by law, all warranties from the seller to you, and all other obligations upon the seller which may be added to this agreement by law, are excluded.

2 AUTHENTICITY WARRANTY IN RELATION TO WINES AND SPIRITS

(a) Subject to the obligations accepted by Christie's under this **authenticity warranty**, none of the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents is responsible for the correctness of any statement as to the authorship, origin, date, age, attribution, genuineness or provenance of any lot, for any other error of description or for any fault or defect in any lot and no warranty whatsoever is given by the seller. Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any lot and any express or implied condition or warranty is hereby excluded.

(b) If, (i) within twenty-one days of the date of the auction, Christie's has received notice in writing from the buyer of any lot that in his view the lot was at the date of the auction short or ulaged or that any statement of opinion in the catalogue was not well founded, (2) within fourteen days of such notice, Christie's has the lot in its possession in the same condition as at the date of the auction and (3) within a reasonable time thereafter, the buyer satisfies Christie's that the lot was notified in writing by the buyer (as above) and that the buyer is able to transfer a good and marketable title to the lot free from any lien or encumbrance, Christie's will set aside the sale and refund the buyer any amount paid by the buyer in respect of the lot provided that the buyer shall have no rights under this **authenticity warranty** if:

(i) The defect is mentioned in the catalogue, or

(ii) the catalogue description as the date of the auction was in accordance with the then generally accepted opinion of scholars or experts fairly indicated there to be a conflict of such opinion, or

(iii) it can be established that the lot was notified in writing by the buyer (as above) only by means of a scientific process not generally accepted for use until after the publication of the catalogue or by means of a process which at the date of the auction was unreasonably expensive or impracticable or likely to have caused damage to the lot. (See also notes on ullages and corks in the Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice section of this catalogue);

(c) the buyer shall not be entitled to claim under this **authenticity warranty** for more than the amount paid by him for the lot and in particular shall have no claim for any loss, consequent to the loss, or damage whether direct or indirect suffered by him;

(d) the benefit of this **authenticity warranty** shall not be assignable and shall rest solely and exclusively with the buyer who shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by Christie's in respect of the lot when sold and who has since the sale retained uninterrupted, unencumbered ownership thereof.

F PAYMENT

1 HOW TO PAY

(a) Immediately following the auction, you must pay the **purchase price** being:

- the **hammer price**; and
- the **buyer's premium**; and
- any amounts due under section D2 above; and
- any duties, goods, sales, use, compensating or service tax or VAT.

Please note that the **purchase price** is exclusive of, and the buyer shall be responsible for

- any charge for storage from the date of the auction;
- any charge for subsequent packing or carriage; and
- if you choose to take wines offered in bond duty paid, applicable excise duty and clearance VAT.

Payment is due no later than by the end of the seventh calendar day following the date of the auction (the **due date**).

(b) We will only accept payment from the registered bidder. Once issued, we cannot change the buyer's name on an invoice or re-issue the invoice in a different name. You must pay immediately even if you want to export the lot and you need an export licence.

(c) You must pay for lots bought at Christie's in Switzerland in the currency stated on the invoice in one of the following ways:

We accept most major credit cards subject to certain conditions. You may make payment via credit card in person. You may also make a 'cardholder not present' (CNP) payment by calling Christie's Post-Sale Services Department on +41 22 319 1780 or, for some sales, by logging into your MyChristie's account and going to: www.christies.com/mychristies. Details of the conditions and restrictions applicable to credit card payments are available from our Post-Sale Services Department, whose details are set out in paragraph (E) below.

If you pay for your purchase using a credit card issued outside the region of the sale, depending on the type of credit card and account you hold, the payment may incur a cross-border transaction fee. If you think this may apply to you, please check with your credit card issuer before making the payment. We reserve the right to charge you any transaction or processing fees which we incur when processing your payment.

Please note that for sales that permit online payment, certain transactions will be ineligible for credit card payment.

- Cash

We accept cash subject to a maximum of CHF 12,500 per buyer per year at our Post-Sale Services Department only (subject to conditions).

- Banker's draft

We do not accept banker's drafts for sales in Switzerland.

- Cheque

We do not accept personal or company cheques for sales in Switzerland.

(d) You must quote the sale number, the lot number(s), your invoice number and Christie's client account number when making a payment.

2. TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP TO YOU

If you make the highest bid accepted by the auctioneer, you will be the buyer of the lot. The striking of the auctioneer's hammer marks the conclusion of a contract of sale between the seller and you. However, ownership in the lot will only transfer from the seller to you once we have received full and clear payment of the **purchase price**. The lot will not be released until we have received full payment of the **purchase price**.

3 TRANSFERRING RISK TO YOU

The risk in and responsibility for the lot will transfer to you from whichever is the earlier of the following:

- When you collect the lot or

(b) At the end of the 30th day following the date of the auction or, if earlier, the date the lot is taken into care by a third party warehouse as set out on the page headed 'Storage and Collection', unless we have agreed otherwise with you.

4 WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT PAY

(a) If you fail to pay us the **purchase price** in full by the **due date**, we will be entitled to do one or more of the following (as well as enforce our rights under paragraph F5 and any other rights or remedies we have by law):

(i) to charge interest from the **due date** at a rate of 1% per month on the unpaid amount due;

(ii) we can cancel the sale of the **lot**. If we do this, we may sell the **lot** again, publicly or privately on such terms we shall think necessary or appropriate, in which case you must pay us any shortfall between the **purchase price** and the proceeds from the resale. You must also pay all costs, expenses, losses, damages and legal fees we have to pay or may suffer and any shortfall in the seller's commission on the resale;

(iii) we can pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by your default in which case you acknowledge and understand that Christie's will have all of the rights of the seller to pursue you for such amounts;

(iv) we can hold you legally responsible for the **purchase price** and may begin legal proceedings to recover it together with other losses, interest, legal fees and costs as far as we are allowed by law;

(v) we can take what you owe us from any amounts which we or any company in the **Christie's group** may owe you (including any deposit or other part-payment which you have paid to us);

(vi) we can, at our option, reveal your identity and contact details to the seller;

(vii) we can reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the buyer or to obtain a deposit from the buyer before accepting any bids;

(viii) to exercise all the rights and remedies of a person holding security over any property in our possession owned by you, whether by way of pledge, security interest or in any other way as permitted by the law of the place where such property is located. You will be deemed to have granted such security to us and we may retain such property as collateral security for your obligations to us; and

(ix) we can take any other action we see necessary or appropriate.

(b) If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's group** company, we can use any amount you do pay, including any deposit or other part-payment you have made to us, or which we owe you, to pay off any amount you owe to us or another **Christie's group** company for any transaction.

(c) If you make payment in full after the **due date**, and we choose to accept such payment we may charge you storage and transport costs from the date that is 30 calendar days following the auction in accordance with paragraphs Gd(i) and (ii). In such circumstances paragraph Gd(iv) shall apply.

5 KEEPING YOUR PROPERTY

If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's group** company, as well as the rights set out in F4 above, we can use or deal with any of your property we hold or which is held by another **Christie's group** company in any way we are allowed to by law. We will only release your property to you after you pay us or the relevant **Christie's group** company in full for what you owe. However, if we choose, we can also sell your property in any way we think appropriate. We will use the proceeds of the sale against any amounts you owe us and we will pay any amount left from that sale to you. If there is a shortfall, you must pay us any difference between the amount we have received from the sale and the amount you owe us.

G COLLECTION AND STORAGE

1 COLLECTION

(a) All wines lie at our third party wine storage facility, Fert & Cie, unless otherwise indicated. We ask that you collect purchased **lots** promptly following the auction (but note that you may not collect any **lot** until you have made full and clear payment of all amounts due to us).

(b) Information on collecting **lots** from Fert & Cie is set out on the storage and collection page and on an information sheet which you can get from the bidder registration staff or Christie's Post Sale Services Department +41 22 319 1780.

(c) If you do not collect any **lot** promptly following the auction we can, at our option, remove the **lot** to another Christie's location or an affiliate or third party warehouse.

(d) If you do not collect a **lot** within the period set out in the storage and collection page then, unless otherwise agreed in writing:

(i) we will charge you storage costs from that date.

(ii) we can, at our option, move the **lot** to or within an affiliate or third party warehouse and charge you transport costs and handling fees for doing so.

(iii) we may sell the **lot** in any commercially reasonable way we think appropriate.

(iv) the storage terms shall apply.

(v) Nothing in this paragraph is intended to limit our rights under paragraph F4.

H TRANSPORT AND SHIPPING

1 TRANSPORT AND SHIPPING

We will enclose a transport and shipping form with each invoice sent to you. You must make all transport and shipping arrangements. However, we can arrange to pack, transport and ship your property if you ask us to and pay the costs of doing so. We recommend that you ask us for an **estimate**, especially for any large items or items of high value that need professional packing before you bid. We may also suggest other handlers, packers, transporters or exporters if you ask us to do so. For more information, please contact Christie's Art Transport on +41 (0)22 319 1717. See the information set out at www.christies.com/shipping or contact us at shippinggeneva@christies.com. We will take reasonable care when we are handling, packing, transporting and shipping a **lot**. However, if we recommend another company for any of these purposes, we are not responsible for their acts, failure to act or neglect.

2 EXPORT AND IMPORT

Any **lot** sold at auction may be affected by laws on exports from the country in which it is sold and the import restrictions of other countries. Many countries require a declaration of export for property leaving the country and/or an import declaration on entry of property into the country. Local laws may prevent you from importing a **lot** or may prevent you selling a **lot** in the country you import it into. We will not be obliged to cancel your purchase and refund the **purchase price** if your **lot** may not be exported, imported or it is seized for any reason by a government authority. It is your responsibility to determine and satisfy the requirements of any applicable laws or regulations relating to the export or import of any **lot** you purchase.

(a) You alone are responsible for getting advice about and meeting the requirements of any laws or regulations which apply to exporting or importing any **lot** prior to bidding. If you are refused a licence or there is a delay in getting one, you must still pay us in full for the **lot**. We may be able to help you apply for the appropriate licences if you ask us to and pay our fee for doing so. However, we cannot guarantee that you will get one. 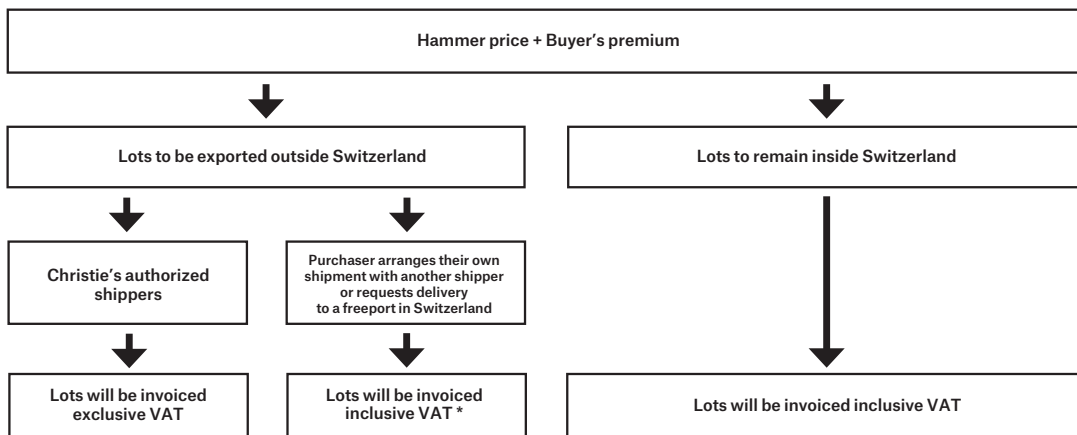

▲ Property Owned in part or in full by Christie's

From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which is owned in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol ▲ next to its **lot** number.

◊ Minimum Price Guarantees

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol ◊ next to the **lot** number.

◆ Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the **lot** fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party. In such cases the third party agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the **lot**. The third party is therefore committed to bidding on the **lot** and, even if there are no other bids, buying the **lot** at the level of the written bid unless there are any higher bids. 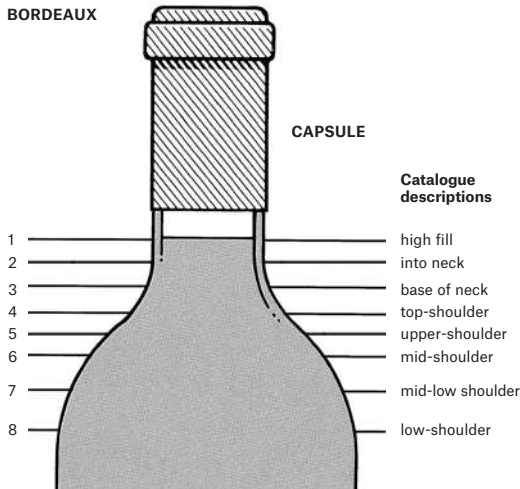

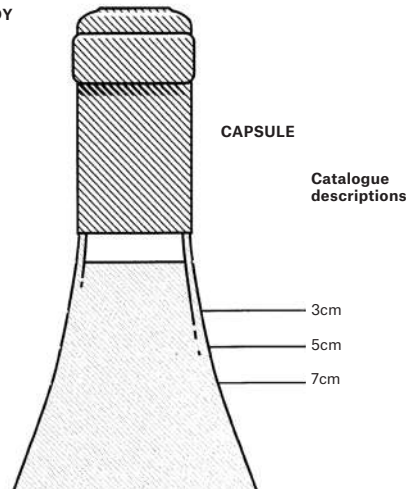

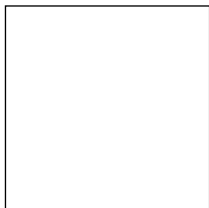
