CHRISTIE'S SWITZERLAND – FIVE DECADES OF OPULENCE... AND COUNTING



The appeal of Switzerland is hard to match; a visually stunning country with sprawling natural beauty, charming small towns amidst cutting-edge cities, nurturing an internationally acclaimed financial hub.

Against this ideal backdrop, we opened our first Swiss office and the then only saleroom in continental Europe at 16 rue du Marché, Geneva in 1967. We held our inaugural auction on 7 June 1968, presenting a rare collection of Meissen porcelain from a royal European family. Our first success brought CHF1,140,000

A second, greater triumph followed less than a year later. Our Chairman in London won a peerless consignment of jewellery, but there was a catch. The collection was in Paris and importing it to London would incur exorbitant taxes; import friendly Geneva was the perfect solution. So, on 1 May 1969, 800 collectors crowded into Hotel Richemond to bid on the awe-inspiring collection of Nina Dyer. The sale realized over US\$1 million, an unprecedented sum at the time. It also launched Geneva as Christie's key international saleroom for the finest and rarest.

Spurred by the momentum, we quickly presented another Jewellery auction in November, relocated to the old town into a majestic 16th century building once used as dormitory for monks; and from there the ball continues to roll... and roll.

From the 1970's onwards, Geneva has been a blooming auction centre for Christie's, prolifically hosting sales of jewels, watches, wines, silver, Russian works of art, objects of vertu, porcelain, furniture, paintings, vintage cars, stamps, and even historic arms and armor.

We also expanded our geographical reach within the country. In 1978, we opened our office in Zurich as a consignment center for Impressionist, Modern and Contemporary art, and from 1991 onwards a saleroom for Swiss art. From here, Ferdinand Hodler's "Der Holzfäller" made its way to the Musée d'Orsay in 2005, and Hodler's "Traum des Hirten" found a new home at the Metropolitan Museum in New York in 2013. We also orchestrated annual auctions in St Moritz from 1990 to 2007, beginning with the jewels of Suzanne Belperron and Rene Boivin, the first of 18 important auctions.

As Christie's adapts to changing times and tastes, we fine-tuned our operation in Geneva to focus on jewels, watches and wine, as our story continues...

...with the legendary collections of the most illustrious tastemakers of our time: Mrs Lily Safra, Mrs James A de Rothschild, Mohamed Shah Aga Khan III, Mouna Ayoub, Helene Rochas.

...with the world's most memorable gems: The Oppenheimer Blue, The Orange, The Art of De Grisogono, The Sweet Josephine, Winston Legacy, The Archduke Joseph Diamond, The Grand Mazarin.

...with the extraordinary horological wonders that shone at Christie's: the 18K gold perpetual calendar chronograph wristwatch with moon phases and tonneau-shaped case by Patek Philippe (CHF6,260,000, May 2010), the extremely rare 18K gold precision watch with two movements by Breguet & Fils (CHF4,340,000, May 2012), and never to be forgotten, the mid-17th century blue enamel and diamond watch created in Paris, presented in 1986 and hailed by experts as "the most beautiful watch ever seen."

...and with the most coveted wines: Bouchard Père & Fils La Romanée 1865 (CHF37,500), Chartreuse Blanche, 1878 to 1903 (CHF22,325), Madeira from 1740 (CHF20,400).

As we continue to focus on paintings in Zurich...

...with the numerous prestigious Swiss art collections we introduced: "Works from the Zumsteg Collection" in 2006 (CHF12,000,000), the Swiss Art Collection of Ernst Beyeler for the benefit of the Fondation Beyeler in 2011, the charitable sale of properties from the Estate of the late Bruno Giacometti in 2012, and Fischli Weiss' "Der Lauf der Dinge", the reigning world record for any contemporary Swiss artist sold at auction in Switzerland, at CHF1,020,000 achieved in 2008.

So, to sum up our 50 marvelous years in Switzerland - the exquisite jewels, watches, wines and art we presented, the many price records we created, the generations of connoisseurs we served, the support and friendship we enjoyed in this mecca of beauty and refinement. Our commitment to Switzerland has been an amazing and rewarding journey. We look forward to the coming decades with the greatest anticipation.



DOMAINE HAEGELEN-JAYER

The Domaine dates back to the early 70s when Alfred Haegelen arrived from Alsace and married Madeleine Jayer, a niece of the great Henri. As the later's domaine, Haegelen-Jayer was based in Vosne-Romanée, in the heart of Burgundy's best climats. Vines were purchased in the 70s and also came from the family: Echezeaux, Clos de Vougeot and Chambolle-Musigny. Vinification methods were classic, with long cuvaison and low yields producing wines "full without being robust and wines rich and concentrated: indeed, this is extremely being robust and wines rich and concentrated: indeed, this is extremely succulent, nicely long-lasting Pinot Noir. This is a good source, especially for the Clos de Vougeot." (Clive Coates in The Wines of Burgundy, 2008). The wines produced were mostly sold to private clients, thus explaining why they were so rarely seen on the market. 2009 was the last vintage produced, since Alfred Haegelen then retired with none of his children becoming a winemaker like him. The parcel from which the wine on offer was made is located at the very top of the Clos de Vougeot slope, among the best plots of the Cru and a few metres from Grands Echezeaux just on the other side of the road. As stated by Robert Parker in his book Burgundy, 1990: "Not surprisingly, this is an extraordinary source of Clos de Vougeot. to

Vineyards were purchased or, as regularly seen in Burgundy, donated to Cistercian monks from the close Abbaye de Citeaux, from as early as the 12th century. A wall has been then built around the Clos, which boundaries have remained the same since 14th century. DOMAINE ARMAND ROUSSEAU

The Domaine was started at the beginning of the 20th century by Armand Rousseau who came from a family of vignerons and wine-merchants. He had inherited through marriage several plots of vineyards in Gevrey Chambertin in the Côte de Nuits at the turn of the century. Gradually he increased the size of the Domaine with acquisitions of vineyards in Charmes Chambertin in 1919, Clos de la Roche and Chambertin in 1920 and 1921, Mazy-Chambertin in 1937, Mazoyeres-Chambertin in 1940 and the esteemed 1er Cru Clos Saint Jacques in 1954. Following Armand's tragic death in a car crash in 1959, his son, Charles Rousseau, who had studied law and then oenology at Dijon University assumed control. Charles Rousseau instigated many improvements and investments, such as building two new cellars to increase storage capacity. Charles's son Eric and daughter Corinne have subsequently become involved at the Domaine and are responsible for producing some of the finest expressions of Pinot Noir coming out of Burgundy's world-famous Côte de Nuits.

The Domaine currently owns approximately 14 hectares of vine-The Domaine was started at the beginning of the 20th century by Ar-

The Domaine currently owns approximately 14 hectares of vine-yards planted only with Pinot Noir, including 8 hectares of Grand Yarus planted only with Find Vol., including a flectales of Grand Cru vineyards all situated in the communes of Gevrey-Chambertin and Morey-Saint-Denis producing their world famous Grand Crus; Chambertin Clos de Bèze, Chambertin, Mazy-Chambertin, Charmes-Chambertin, and Clos de la Roche; and their Premier Crus; Clos Saint Jacques, Les Cazétiers and Lavaux Saint-Jacques. The vines are old with an average age of between 40 and 45 years and a planting density of 11,000 vines per hectare. Yields are kept low, at between 30 to 40 hectolitres per hectare, with bud removal and green harvesting. No chemical fertilizers are used and harvesting is

done completely by hand

one completely by hand. Vinification is traditionally Burgundian with 90% destemming, and fermentation for an average of 18 days in open-topped stainless steel vats with regular pumping over and pigeage. Fermentation temperature is controlled and does not exceed 33 degrees. Following alcoholic fermentation the wines are pressed in a pneumatic press, left to settle for 24 hours, and then transferred into oak barrels for the malo-

settle for 24 hours, and then transferred into oak barrels for the malo-lactic fermentation to take place naturally. The Chambertin and the Chambertin Clos de Bèze are aged in 100 % new oak with medium toast. The Clos Saint Jacques is put into between 70% and 100% new oak and the other wines are aged in either second or third-fill barrels. Ageing takes approximately 20 to 22 months and the wines are racked between 2 and 3 times. The wines are lightly filtered prior to bottling to retain as many flavour components as possible. There is no disputing the quality of their wines. Anthony Hanson writing in his book, Burgundy, stated that Armand Rousseau "is one of Burgundy's great, traditional domains" and the wines are "harmonious, elegant, rich and individual". Neal Martin stated that "Some of the greatest wines I have ever tasted have borne Rousseau's name, in particular outstanding Chambertin and Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Clos Saint Jacques, the premier cru that merits promotion to Grand Cru more than any other. I also adore the Chambertin Clos de Bèze; the 1989 leaving a room full of tasters grasping for superlatives when tasted in 2003".



From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which it owns in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol Δ next to its **lot** number.

O Minimum Price Guarantees

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol onext to the **lot** number.

○◆ Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the lot fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party. In such cases the third party agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the lot. The third party is therefore committed to bidding on the lot and, even if there are no other bids, buying the lot at the level of the written bid unless there are any higher bids. In doing so, the third party takes on all or part of the risk of the lot not being sold. If the lot is not sold, the third party may incur a loss. Lots which are subject to a third party guarantee arrangement are identified in the catalogue with the symbol of.

In most cases, Christie's compensates the third party in exchange for accepting this risk. Where the third party is the successful bidder, the third party's remuneration is based on a fixed financing fee. If the third party is not the successful bidder, the remuneration may either be based on a fixed fee or an amount calculated against the final hammer price. The third party may also bid for the lot above the written bid. Where the third party is the successful bidder, Christie's will report the final purchase price net of the fixed financing fee.



The amount by which level of wine is short of being full; these levels may vary according to age of the wines and, as far as can be ascertained by inspection prior to the sale, are described in the catalogue.

LEVEL/ULLAGE DESCRIPTIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

- into neck: Level of young Exceptionally good in wines 10 years old
- bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- very top-shoulder
- top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.
- mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. I ow estimates
- low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.
