Sullivans Cove is delighted to partner with Christie's to offer one of the few remaining bottles of the World's Best Single Cask Single Malt, with all proceeds going to charity. The bottle offered for auction is number 88 of the winning cask, #HH0351, at the 2018 World Whiskies Awards.

This bottle has never left the distillery in Cambridge, Tasmania, and has been carefully cellared there since bottling. Presented in a hand-made Tasmanian Blackwood display box, bottle number 88 will also come with a framed official certificate from the World Whiskies Awards. This is one of the rarest single malt whiskies in the world, and a true piece of global whisky history.

Cask #HH0351 was distilled in June 2000 and decanted in January 2017, making it 16 years and 5 months old. It was matured in a 200L American Oak ex-bourbon barrel and produced only 136 bottles, most of which were sold long before the award was announced. As a single cask whisky, the exact flavour profile of this bottling is impossible to repeat, as each cask has its own unique character.

Sullivans Cove Distillery, located in Tasmania, Australia, is a craft producer of single malt whiskies from 100% Tasmanian barley. This year's award places the distillery in a tiny group of rarefied producers ever to win two such awards, following their win for "World's Best Single Malt Whisky" in 2014.

OLD NAVY RUM

Hima Cuanda Chamananna Cannaa 1070

The association of rum with the Royal Navy began in 1655 when the British fleet captured the island of Jamaica. With the availability of domestically produced rum, the British changed the daily ration of liquor given to seamen from French brandy to rum. While the ration was originally given neat, or mixed with lime juice, the practice of watering down the rum began around 1740. To help minimize the effect of the alcohol on his sailors. Admiral Edward Vernon directed that the rum ration be watered down before being issued, a mixture which became known as 'grog'. While it is widely believed that the term grog was coined at this time in honour of the cloak Admiral Vernon wore in rough weather, the term has been demonstrated to predate his famous orders, with probable origins in the West Indies, perhaps of African etymology. The Royal Navy continued to give its sailors a daily rum ration, known as a "tot," until the practice was abolished after July 31, 1970. Today the rum ration is still issued on special occasions by H.M. Queen Elizabeth II. Recently, such occasions have been Royal marriages and birthdays, or other special anniversaries, "Splice the main brace". in the days of the daily ration, meant double rations that day.

Interestingly, when I visited this chateau in January, proprietor Jean-Hubert Delon offered me two samples, one where the cork had been pulled immediately prior to tasting, and another that had been decanted four hours earlier. Both were superb, but the wine that had had extended aeration was clearly the finer offering. The opaque purple-hued 2006- only 40% of the crop made it into the final blend- exhibits a personality that mimics the superb 1996. The wine has not budged in development since it was first bottled, although it has always provided thrilling drinking because of its voluptuous texture. It needs another 5-6 years of bottle age before it will begin to develop Haut-Brion's fabulous fragrance. Expect it to hit its plateau of maturity around 2003-2005 and drink well for 15-25 years. BODEGAS Y VIÑEDOS ARTADI ALAVA, ESPAÑA

Bodegas Artadi is today, undoubtedly, a reference point as one of the best Bodegas in Spain. This success is based on our daily work in the vineyards and the search of pure/honest wines tied to the history and the tradition of our ancestors. The seeds of this renowned winery started in 1981, when its current owner, Juan Carlos López de Lacalle, together with this family and thirteen local growers founded a cooperative. The cooperative focused on the production of Carbonic Maceration wines, very traditional and popular in the Rioja Alavesa region. In 1992, the cooperative was dissolved and Bodegas y Viñedos Artadi de Laguardia, S.A. was established. Step by step during the last 37 years, they have set different challenges and reached goals to discover the great values that are hidden among the vineyards in the region.


In 1990 they decided, being aware of the importance of the age of the vineyards, to select and produce a wine from the old Tempranillo vineyards that they owned in the region: the wine Artadi Pagos Vieios

In 1991, Juan Carlos López de Lacalle produced the first vintage of his family's single vineyard: Viña El Pisón In 1994, Artadi Grandes Añadas was released, paying attention to the relevance and singularity of the best vintages. During these first years, they produced wines based around Villages, Plots and Vintages, very basic concepts, but very important and full of meaning. This has meant, at Artadi, these three pillars are used to produce wines tied to the Great Values and, consequently, to Great Wines.


Nowadays, they manage 70 hectares of vineyards under organic farming. All their efforts are directed to the search of the personal character of small historical vineyards, which reflect unique wines.

This respectful intervention in the vineyards improves the expression of the soils, which linked to the purity of the Tempranillo grape, reinforce the personal character of the wines. Definitely, we are talking about "Terroir" a concept that is full of meaning Artadi wines. The wines take on the attributes of personality and identifying them with the true origin of Villages and Plots. They are products of their locality. "The many awards that the Specialist wine press has granted us in this nearly forty years, support our work for the search of the personality in the wines and position Artadi, undeniably, as a cellar of reference in the development of Spanish viticulture and winemaking in the last decades."





- mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates
- low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux, For example, a 5 to 7 cm, ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.


