David joined Christie's Wine Department in 1985, going on to become one of our finest auctioneers and later, our leader as International Head of Wine Sales at Christie's from 2003-2017.

## A SUPERLATIVE COLLECTION FROM A CONTINENTAL CELLAR

Christie's is delighted to present the following 484 lots. This collection represents one of the finest and most comprehensive collections of Burgundy and Champagne from the modern era that we have offered at auction in recent years.

The collection comes directly from the cellar of a sophisticated European art collector, connoisseur and businessman. What is extraordinary about the collection, is not only the exceptional quality of the wines offered, but the condition and provenance of the bottles we will offer.

Over a period of collecting reaching back more than four decades, the collector has been able to forge extremely close bonds with some of the greatest winemakers and estates across Europe. He always bought his wines directly from the source, or through the official importer of the wines in question. The link between creator and consumer has rarely been so direct as it is here.

The cellar in which the wines have always been stored is cool and with perfect humidity, kept constantly between 10-12 degrees. The level of care and precision involved in the guardianship of these bottles is rarely seen.

The collection is expansive in scope, but also precise in its definition. Burgundy is where the collection's magnificent riches are focused, but first mention should go to the singular offering of champagne and in particular - Salon le Mesnil. This is possibly the finest offering to market in decades. The consignor of this collection has been close to the owners of Salon le Mesnil for thirty years, and acquired his wines directly from the producer. The collection covers the period 1979-2002 and offers collectors the opportunity to acquire these perfect examples of one of the world's greatest champagnes in bottles and magnums from legendary vintages such as 1982, 1985 and 1990.

The Burgundy on offer across the collection truly is a roll-call of the finest names in the region, and also offers fascinating insights into winemaking skills and styles, by presenting wide ranges of wines from different producers' portfolios. Roumier, Rousseau, DRC, Denis Mortet, Claude Dugat, Comte Liger-Belair and Thibault Liger-Belair form highlights for red Burgundy, while Roulot, Domaine Leflaive, Coche-Dury and Ramonet form a vanguard of whites.

Other areas to note are fine Bordeaux, iconic Barolos from Rinaldi and Bartolo Mascarello and a range of great wines from the Northern Rhône. This is a truly stellar collection which leads our November sale, a collection we are proud to bring to market and which will be spoken of in reverential terms for years to come.

### SALON LE MESNIL

Champagne Salon makes only one wine, a rare vintage, tête de cuvée Blanc de Blancs. First comes the hyper-selection of grapes: Much of Salon's extraordinary style - perfumed nose, exquisite balance, multiple layers of flavour, firm structure, tiny mousse, long-finish, etc. are determined by the grapes from three distinct micro-regions in this appellation. Salon makes the wine only in the greatest of years, when the grapes develop the ideal combination of rich fruit, sugar and high acidity. Salon uses only the first pressing, gaining the highest acidity and best quality of the grape and never puts its wine through malolactic fermentation. This retains the refreshing crispness and profound depth of flavour that are the hallmarks of Salon

**DENIS MORTET**

Domaine Denis Mortet has approximately 11 hectares of vineyards over fourteen different appellations in Burgundy, including two Grands Crus; Clos-de-Vougeot and Chambertin. The Domaine was started in the early 1990's and meticulous care in the vineyards is one of the hallmarks of the Domaine. Weed killer is never used, and healthy ripe grapes combined with rigorous sorting on tables introduced at the winery in 1993 produces wines with great intensity and depth of colour that are very highly regarded and sought after. Tragically Denis Mortet died in 2006, and his son Arnaud has assumed control and continues to make superb Burgundy.





In 1924 Georges Roumier took over the Domaine which had previously belonged to his wife's family in Chambolle Musigny. His son Jean-Marie succeeded in 1957 and his grandson Christophe took over in 1992. The Domaine consists of approximately 13 hectares of vineyards spread over nine separate appellations. Their holdings include 0.1 hectares of Le Musigny Grand Cru, 0.2 hectares of Corton Charlemagne, 1.60 hectares of Bonnes-Mares and 3.07 hectares of Chambolle-Musigny. The grapes are sorted in the vineyard with a *table de tri* and depending on the vineyard and vintage, they are mostly destemmed then placed in wooden fermenters. Use of oak is restrictive, with new oak being limited to 15-25 percent for villages wines and no more than 50% for the Bonnes Mares. These wines are now regarded as some of the most precise in Burgundy.

The Cape Fine & Rare Wine Auction, previously the Nederburg Auction, was established in 1975 and is South Africa's most prestigious wine auction. 2019 heralds a reinvention of the auction to create an industry led platform that will showcase the finest and rarest South African wines locally, and provide unique buying opportunities for wine enthusiasts, investors and collectors worldwide.

In association with Christie's, the auction is hosted at the Rupert Museum in Stellenbosch. Housing a collection of work by some of South Africa's most celebrated artists, the Museum provides the perfect backdrop to showcase this selection of South Africa's vinous treasures. Nederburg has always been a champion of South African fine wine and the heritage inherent to it. It is in this spirit that Nederburg proudly continues its sponsorship of the event, as one of the world's five most recognized wine auctions, alongside the auctions of Hospices de Beaune in France and Kloster Eberbach in Germany.

There's very little that wine critics agree about: the subject matter of their contemplations coupled with the nature of those who rise to the pinnacle of the profession make consensus an unlikely outcome. Yet the modern day Cape wine industry seems to have produced this most improbable result. The major international wine writers are unanimous in their unstinting enthusiasm for what South Africa's finest winemakers have achieved in the past few years. Jancis Robinson MW's review of the recent South African "New Wave" tasting in London opened with "for the first time ever in my experience, tasters had to queue for up to half an hour .... so popular are these wines with the UK wine trade."

"This is my seventh annual report about the South African wine scene," writes Tim Atkin MW, "and I remain as enthusiastic and positive as ever..... I'm still convinced that the best Cape wines are world class and represent outstanding value for money. Ever creative, ever evolving, the wine industry continues to surprise and delight me."

Neal Martin (formerly the Robert Parker specialist on South Africa and now writing for Vinous) says much the same "I reiterate my claim that no country, no wine region has been as dynamic, progressive or indeed, as exciting as South Africa."

Critics' scores reflect this enthusiasm and, by extension, the value proposition. Tim Atkin MW, who uses the 100 point system, scored his top 100 Cape wines between 95 and 99 in 2019 (and awarded Kanonkop 100 points in 2018 for its 2015 Paul Sauer blend). Jancis Robinson MW works with the 20 point system and her top 50 Cape wines garner 17 points and above. For wine drinkers seeking to buy at these ratings in long established appellations the investment would probably have to exceed GBP 150 per bottle.

There are many other reasons to chase down the two "Superlots" of South African wine on this auction: the variety of styles on offer, the personality of the wines, the nuances which distinguish and differentiate wines made from the same varieties by different winemakers and from different sites, the potential upward price movement of these vinous collectables which are only now entering the investment market. However, the strongest reason remains the sheer pleasure the wines will afford: this, taken together with the prospective pricing, guarantees an experience unparalleled in the world of wine.

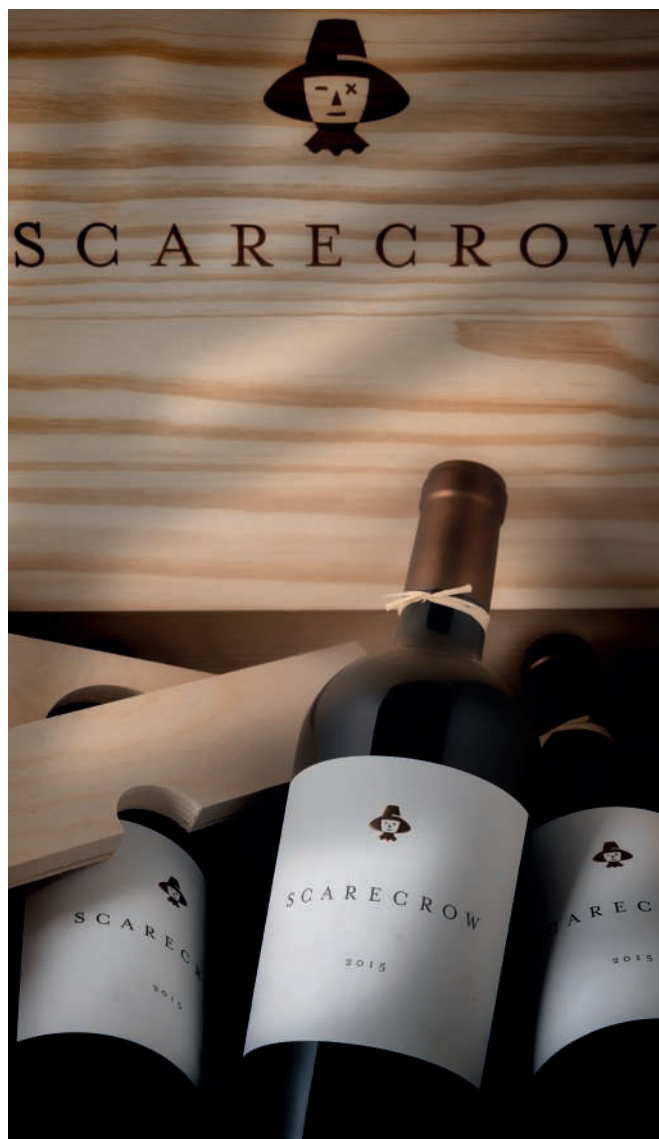

Champagne Boërl & Kroff was created by two friends Patrick Sabaté and Stéphane Sésé and debuted with the release of their 1995 vintage. Boërl & Kroff produce stunning Champagnes from three small vineyard plots each planted mainly with old vine Pinot Noir in the Aube region, near Urville. The vines are planted with an ideal southerly exposure and their finest parcels of Pinot Noir are managed according to biodynamic principles.

The wines are made with the assistance of Michel Drappier. The Boërl & Kroff vintage wines are aged for a minimum of twelve years on the lees. Production is miniscule with only approximately 2,500 to 3,000 magnums produced in only those exceptional years when the quality is deemed high enough for Boërl & Kroff to produce a vintage Champagne, and occasionally much less, such as with the 2002 harvest only 800 magnums from this exceptional year were produced.

Christie's London are thrilled to be offering a selection of Boërl & Kroff in the November London auction coming direct from the private cellar of the Domaine. I have been lucky enough to have tasted the Boërl & Kroff 1998, 2002 and 2006 vintages and they are stunning wines with a perfect balance of concentration, precision and vibrant freshness that is the hallmark of great Champagne. The aromatic and flavour profiles are truly impressive with raspberry and redcurrant Pinot character shining through, and the wines have impressive ageing potential. Since 1997, the vintages that do not fit into the strict criteria and high standards of the vintage Boërl & Kroff make up a wine called "B de Boërl & Kroff".

The name Boërl & Kroff comes from a fusion of two families: Stéphane's grandfather's nickname was Boërl and Kroff is connected to the great-grandfather of Patrick Sabaté.

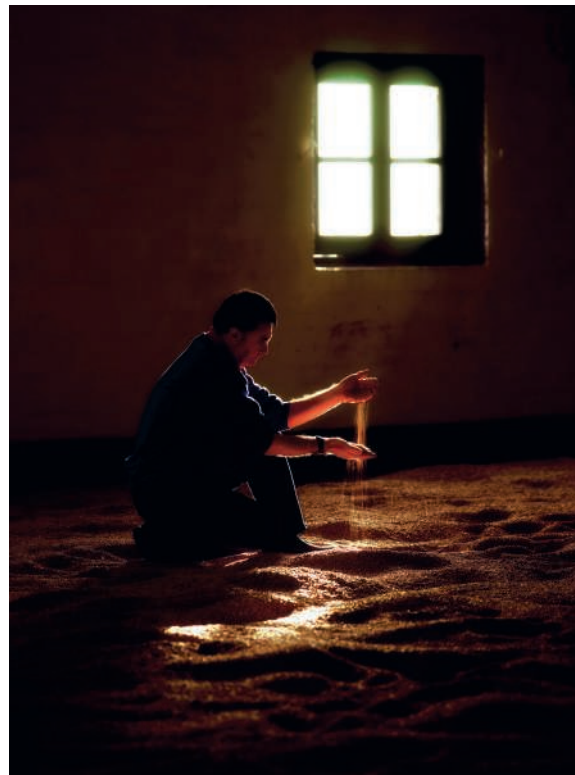

## THE GLENLIVET WINCHESTER COLLECTION 1967

Only 150 bottles of the Glenlivet Winchester Collection Vintage 1967 were produced and Christie's are delighted to be offering the first and last bottles in our autumn 2019 sales. Bottle number 1 is offered in the Hong Kong auction on 23 November and bottle number 150 is offered in the London sale on 28/29 November.

The Glenlivet Winchester Collection 1967 brings together malts from a number of rare oak casks, the youngest of which was filled in December 1967. When whisky is slowly maturing in its cask, a small amount of whisky evaporates through the wood and into the atmosphere, known as the Angel's Share. Each year, roughly 2% of the liquid leaves the cask this way, which means that 50 Year Old whisky casks will generally have lost 60-80% of their liquid. As a result, only a very small amount of precious whisky was left for bottling in June 2018.

The whisky is non-chill filtered at cask strength, and boasts a rich and fruity nose, notes of apricot jam and sweet ripe peaches, and a hint of toasted almonds. It has an incredibly smooth taste with fondant orange and milk chocolate flavours, an amazing velvety texture and a long, and luxuriously sweet finish.

The launch is the third in The Glenlivet Winchester Collection, which celebrates over 40 years of dedication to Scotch from Master Distiller Alan Winchester – and follows the release of Vintage 1966 in 2016 and Vintage 1964 in 2014, two of the most sought-after whiskies in the world.

Taking inspiration from the land that surrounds The Glenlivet distillery, former British Designer of the Year, Bethan Gray, has handcrafted the exquisite bottle and case that hold the 50 year old Scotch, to reflect the craftsmanship and exceptional quality of their contents.

The Glenlivet Master Distiller, Alan Winchester, and Bethan Gray spent many months working closely together sharing their craft and walking the Cairngorms where The Glenlivet distillery sits to produce this newest release.

"The launch of Vintage 1967 is a momentous occasion for The Glenlivet, and a particularly proud one for me personally," says The Glenlivet Master Distiller Alan Winchester. "To have my name associated with one of the finest single malts that money can buy is an honour – what a fantastic way to celebrate more than 40 years in the Scotch whisky industry. By collaborating with the talented Bethan Gray, we have been able to epitomise not only Vintage 1967's luxurious quality but also the craftsmanship that led to its creation. The result is a beautiful and captivating bottle that ensures Vintage 1967 is a feast for the eyes as well the palate."

Bethan Gray's inspiration comes from the land around The Glenlivet distillery, her family history in the area and the complex whisky itself. Bethan's grandfather lived and worked as a forester in the Cairngorms, home of The Glenlivet, and she was inspired by the landscape while exploring the area with Master Distiller Alan Winchester. The layers of mist that gather in the surrounding valleys became inspiration for the unique reinterpretation of her Dhow pattern that surrounds the bottle.

"Everything I do is about collaborating with people to tell stories through craft, so it was a real honour to work with Alan Winchester to create this incredibly special bottle of Scotch whisky", says Bethan Gray. "We're both inspired by spending time in nature, so what better inspiration than the Cairngorms, where The Glenlivet distillery is based?"

The Scotch whisky making process itself was further inspiration for Bethan. The bottle is blown by master glassblower Brodie Nairn to precisely the right size and thickness and then hand-cut, creating an ombré colour effect that mimics the ageing process of the liquid inside. It is then engraved and hand-painted, making each one unique.

The hand-stained birds-eye maple case is made using solid copper overlays that reflect The Glenlivet's charred barrels and copper stills. Created by hand by artisans, the technique used to overlay the delicate copper was invented specifically for this case in its curved form. The mother-of-pearl inlaid into the case reflects the local freshwater pearl mussel shells indigenous to the Spey River.

#### OLD NAVY RUM

The association of rum with the Royal Navy began in 1655 when the British fleet captured the island of Jamaica. With the availability of domestically produced rum, the British changed the daily ration of liquor given to seamen from French brandy to rum. While the ration was originally given neat, or mixed with lime juice, the practice of watering down the rum began around 1740. To help minimize the effect of the alcohol on his sailors, Admiral Edward Vernon directed that the rum ration be watered down before being issued, a mixture which became known as 'grog'. While it is widely believed that the term grog was coined at this time in honour of the cloak Admiral Vernon wore in rough weather, the term has been demonstrated to predate his famous orders, with probable origins in the West Indies, perhaps of African etymology. The Royal Navy continued to give its sailors a daily rum ration, known as a "tot," until the practice was abolished after July 31, 1970. Today the rum ration is still issued on special occasions by H.M. Queen Elizabeth II. Recently, such occasions have been Royal marriages and birthdays, or other special anniversaries. "Splice the main brace", in the days of the daily ration, meant double rations that day.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE

These Conditions of Sale and the Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice set out the terms on which we offer the **lots** listed in this catalogue for sale. By registering to bid and/or by bidding at auction you agree to these terms, so you should read them carefully before doing so. You will find a glossary at the end explaining the meaning of the words and expressions coloured in bold.

Unless we own a **lot** (▲ symbol), Christie's acts as agent for the seller.

## A BEFORE THE SALE

### 1 DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

(a) Certain words used in the catalogue description have special meanings. You can find details of these on the page headed 'Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice' which forms part of these terms. You can find a key to the Symbols found next to certain catalogue entries under the section of the catalogue called 'Symbols Used in this Catalogue'.

(b) Our description of any **lot** in the catalogue, any **condition** report and any other statement made by us (whether orally or in writing) about any **lot**, including about its nature or **condition**, artist, period, materials, approximate dimensions or **provenance** are our opinion and not to be relied upon as a statement of fact. We do not carry out in-depth research of the sort carried out by professional historians and scholars. All dimensions and weights are approximate only.

## 2 OUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

We do not provide any guarantee in relation to the nature of a **lot** apart from our **authenticity warranty** contained in paragraph E2 and to the extent provided in paragraph I below.

## 3 CONDITION

(a) The **condition** of **lots** sold in our auctions can vary widely due to factors such as age, previous damage, restoration, repair and wear and tear. Their nature means that they will rarely be in perfect **condition**. **Lots** are sold 'as is' in the **condition** they are in at the time of the sale, without any representation or warranty or assumption of liability of any kind as to condition by Christie's or by the seller.

(b) Any reference to **condition** in a catalogue entry or in a **condition** report will not amount to a full description of **condition**, and images may not show a **lot** clearly. ## B REGISTERING TO BID

### 1 NEW BIDDERS

(a) If this is your first time bidding at Christie's or you are a returning bidder who has not bought anything from any of our salerooms within the last two years you must register at least 48 hours before an auction to give us enough time to process and approve your registration. We may, at our option, decline to permit you to register as a bidder. You will be asked for the following:

(i) for individuals: Photo identification (driving licence, national identity card or passport) and, if not shown on the ID document, proof of your current address (for example, a current utility bill or bank statement).

(ii) for corporate clients: Your Certificate of Incorporation or equivalent document(s) showing your name and registered address together with documentary proof of directors and beneficial owners; and

(iii) for trusts, partnerships, offshore companies and other business structures, please contact us in advance to discuss our requirements.

(b) We may also ask you to give us a financial reference and/or a deposit as a condition of allowing you to bid. For help, please contact our Credit Department on +44 (0)20 7839 9060.

### 2 RETURNING BIDDERS

We may at our option ask you for current identification as described in paragraph B1(a) above, a financial reference or a deposit as a condition of allowing you to bid. If you have not bought anything from any of our salerooms in the last two years or if you want to spend more than on previous occasions, please contact our Credit Department on +44 (0)20 7839 9060.

## 3 IF YOU FAIL TO PROVIDE THE RIGHT DOCUMENTS

If in our opinion you do not satisfy our bidder identification and registration procedures including, but not limited to completing any anti-money laundering and/or anti-terrorism financing checks we may require to our satisfaction, we may refuse to register you to bid and if you make a successful bid, we may cancel the contract for sale between you and the seller.

## 4 BIDDING ON BEHALF OF ANOTHER PERSON

(a) **As authorised bidder.** If you are bidding on behalf of another person, that person will need to complete the registration requirements above before you can bid, and supply a signed letter authorising you to bid for him/her.

(b) **As agent for an undisclosed principal:** If you are bidding as an agent for an undisclosed principal (the ultimate buyer(s)), you accept personal liability to pay the **purchase price** and all other sums due. By bidding on the telephone, you are agreeing to us recording your conversations. You also agree that your telephone bids are governed by these Conditions of Sale.

### (c) Written Bids

You can find a Written Bid Form at the back of our catalogues, at any Christie's office or by choosing the sale and viewing the **lots** online at [www.christies.com](http://www.christies.com). We must receive your completed Written Bid Form at least 24 hours before the auction. Bids must be placed in the currency of the saleroom. The **auctioneer** will take reasonable steps to carry out written bids at the lowest possible price, taking into account the **reserve**. If you make a written bid on a **lot** which does not have a **reserve** and there is no higher bid than yours, we will bid on your behalf at around 50% of the **low estimate** or, if lower, the amount of your bid. If we receive written bids on a **lot** for identical amounts, and at the auction these are the highest bids on the **lot**, we will sell the **lot** to the bidder whose written bid we received first.

## C CONDUCTING THE SALE

### 1 WHO CAN ENTER THE AUCTION

We may, at our option, refuse admission to our premises or decline to permit participation in any auction or to reject any bid.

### 2 RESERVES

Unless otherwise indicated, all **lots** are subject to a **reserve**. We identify **lots** that are offered without **reserve** with the symbol ▲ next to the **lot** number. The reserve cannot be more than the **lot's low estimate**.

### 3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The **auctioneer** can at his sole option:

- refuse any bid;
- move the bidding backwards or forwards in any way he or she may decide, or change the order of the **lots**;
- withdraw any **lot**;
- divide any **lot** or combine any two or more **lots**;
- reopen or continue the bidding even after the hammer has fallen; and
- in the case of error or dispute related to bidding and whether during or after the auction, to continue the bidding, determine the successful bidder, cancel the sale of the **lot**, or reoffer and resell any **lot**. If you believe that the **auctioneer** has accepted the successful bid in error, you must provide a written notice detailing your claim within 3 business days of the date of the auction. The **auctioneer** will consider such claim in good faith. If the **auctioneer**, in the exercise of his or her discretion under this paragraph, decides after the auction is complete, to cancel the sale of a **lot**, or reoffer and resell a **lot**, he or she will notify the successful bidder no later than by the end of the 7th calendar day following the date of the auction. The **auctioneer's** decision in exercise of this discretion is final. ## 4 BIDDING

The **auctioneer** accepts bids from:

- bidders in the saleroom;
- telephone bidders, and internet bidders through 'Christie's LIVE™' (as shown above in Section B6); and
- written bids (also known as absentee bids or commission bids) left with us by a bidder before the auction.

## 5 BIDDING ON BEHALF OF THE SELLER

The **auctioneer** may, at his or her sole option, bid on behalf of the seller up to but not including the amount of the **reserve** either by making consecutive bids or by making bids in response to other bidders. The **auctioneer** will not identify these as bids made on behalf of the seller and will not make any bid on behalf of the seller at or above the **reserve**. If **lots** are offered without **reserve**, the **auctioneer** will generally decide to open the bidding at 50% of the **low estimate** for the **lot**. If no bid is made at that level, the **auctioneer** may decide to go backwards at his or her sole option until a bid is made, and then continue up from that amount. ## 6 BID INCREMENTS

Bidding generally starts below the **low estimate** and increases in steps (bid increments). ## 8 SUCCESSFUL BIDS

Unless the **auctioneer** decides to use his or her discretion as set out in paragraph C3 above, when the **auctioneer's** hammer strikes, we have accepted the last bid. This means a contract for sale has been formed between the seller and the successful bidder. We will issue an invoice only to the registered bidder who made the successful bid. While we send out invoices by post and/or email after the auction, we do not accept responsibility for telling you whether or not your bid was successful. If you have bid by written bid, you should contact us by telephone or in person as soon as possible after the auction to get details of the outcome of your bid to avoid having to pay unnecessary storage charges.

## 9 LOCAL BIDDING LAWS

You agree that when bidding in any of our sales that you will strictly comply with all local laws and regulations in force at the time of the sale for the relevant sale site.

## D THE BUYER'S PREMIUM AND TAXES

### 1 THE BUYER'S PREMIUM

In addition to the **hammer price**, the successful bidder agrees to pay us a **buyer's premium** on the **hammer price** of each **lot** sold. On all **lots** we charge 25% of the **hammer price** up to and including £225,000, 20% on that part of the **hammer price** over £225,000 and up to and including £3,000,000, and 13.5% of that part of the **hammer price** above £3,000,000.

Exception: the **buyer's premium** for Wine and Cigars is 22.5% of the **hammer price**. For all **lots** VAT is payable on the premium at the applicable rate. VAT will be added to the **buyer's premium** and is payable by you. The VAT may not be shown separately on our invoice because of tax laws. You may be eligible to have a VAT refund in certain circumstances if the lot is exported. Please see the "VAT refunds: what can I reclaim?" section of "VAT Symbols and Explanation" for further information.

### 2 TAXES

The successful bidder is responsible for all applicable tax including any VAT, sales or compensating use tax or equivalent tax wherever such taxes may arise on the **hammer price** and the **buyer's premium**. #### 1 SELLER'S WARRANTIES

For each **lot**, the seller gives a **warranty** that the seller:

Further, no warranty whatsoever is given by the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any **lot** and any express or implied condition or **warranty** is hereby excluded;

### F PAYMENT

#### 1 HOW TO PAY

(viii) to exercise all the rights and remedies of a person holding security over any property in our possession owned by you, whether by way of pledge, security interest or in any other way as permitted by the law of the place where such property is located. You will be deemed to have granted such security to us and we may retain such property as collateral security for your obligations to us; and (ix) we can take any other action we see necessary or appropriate.

(b) If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's Group** company, we can use any amount you do pay, including any deposit or other part-payment you have made to us, or which we owe you, to pay off any amount you owe to us or another **Christie's Group** company for any transaction.

(c) If you make payment in full after the **due date**, and we choose to accept such payment we may charge you storage and transport costs from the date that is 30 calendar days following the auction in accordance with paragraphs Gd(i) and (ii). In such circumstances paragraph Gd(iv) shall apply.

### 5 KEEPING YOUR PROPERTY

If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's Group** company, as well as the rights set out in F4 above, we can use or deal with any of your property we hold or which is held by another **Christie's Group** company in any way we are allowed to by law. We will only release your property to you after you pay us or the relevant **Christie's Group** company in full for what you owe. We will use the proceeds of the sale against any amounts you owe us and we will pay any amount left from that sale to you. If there is a shortfall, you must pay us any difference between the amount we have received from the sale and the amount you owe us.

### G COLLECTION AND STORAGE

#### 1 COLLECTION

(a) All wines lie at our third party wine storage facility, London City Bond Vaults, unless otherwise indicated. Once you have made full and clear payment, you must collect the **lot** promptly **(but note that you may not collect any lot until you have made full and clear payment of all amounts due to us)**.

(b) (i) We are not responsible to you for any reason (whether for breaking this agreement or any other matter relating to your purchase of, or bid for, any **lot**) other than in the event of fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation by us or other than as expressly set out in these conditions of sale; or

(ii) give any representation, warranty or guarantee or assume any liability of any kind in respect of any **lot** with regard to merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, description, size, quality, condition, attribution, authenticity, rarity, importance, medium, provenance, exhibition history, literature, or historical relevance. Except as required by local law, any warranty of any kind is excluded by this paragraph.

(c) In particular, please be aware that our written and telephone bidding services, Christie's LIVE™, **condition** reports, currency converter and saleroom video screens are free services and we are not responsible to you for any error (human or otherwise), omission or breakdown in these services.

(d) We have no responsibility to any person other than a buyer in connection with the purchase of any **lot**.

(e) If, in spite of the terms in paragraphs (a) to (d) or E2(i) above, we are found to be liable to you for any reason, we shall not have to pay more than the **purchase price** paid by you to us. We will not be responsible to you for any reason for loss of profits or business, loss of opportunity or value, expected savings or interest, costs, damages, or expenses.

## J OTHER TERMS

### 1 OUR ABILITY TO CANCEL

In addition to the other rights of cancellation contained in this agreement, we can cancel a sale of a **lot** if we reasonably believe that completing the transaction is, or may be, unlawful or that the sale places us or the seller under any liability to anyone else or may damage our reputation.

### 2 RECORDINGS

### 5 TRANSFERRING YOUR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

This agreement will be binding on your successors or estate and anyone who takes over your rights and responsibilities.

We will hold and process your personal information and may pass it to another **Christie's Group** company for use as described in, and in line with, our privacy notice at [www.christies.com/about-us/contact/privacy](http://www.christies.com/about-us/contact/privacy).

### 8 WAIVER

No failure or delay to exercise any right or remedy provided under these Conditions of Sale shall constitute a waiver of that or any other right or remedy, nor shall it prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.

### 9 LAW AND DISPUTES

This agreement, and any non-contractual obligations arising out of or in connection with this agreement, or any other rights you may have relating to the purchase of a **lot** will be governed by the laws of England and Wales. Before we or you start any court proceedings (except in the limited circumstances where the dispute, controversy or claim is related to proceedings brought by someone else and this dispute could be joined to those proceedings), we agree we will each try to settle the dispute by mediation following the Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution (CEDR) Model Mediation Procedure. We will use a mediator affiliated with CEDR who we and you agree to. ### CHRISTIE'S INTEREST IN PROPERTY CONSIGNED FOR AUCTION

#### △ **Property Owned in part or in full by Christie's**

From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which it owns in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol △ next to its **lot** number. Where Christie's has an ownership or financial interest in every **lot** in the catalogue, Christie's will not designate each **lot** with a symbol, but will state its interest in the front of the catalogue.

#### ○ **Minimum Price Guarantees**

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol ○ next to the **lot** number.

#### ○◆ **Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids**

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the **lot** fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party who agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the **lot**. If there are no other higher bids, the third party commits to buy the **lot** at the level of their irrevocable written bid. In doing so, the third party takes on all or part of the risk of the **lot** not being sold. **Lots** which are subject to a third party guarantee arrangement are identified in the catalogue with the symbol ○◆.

In most cases, Christie's compensates the third party in exchange for accepting this risk. 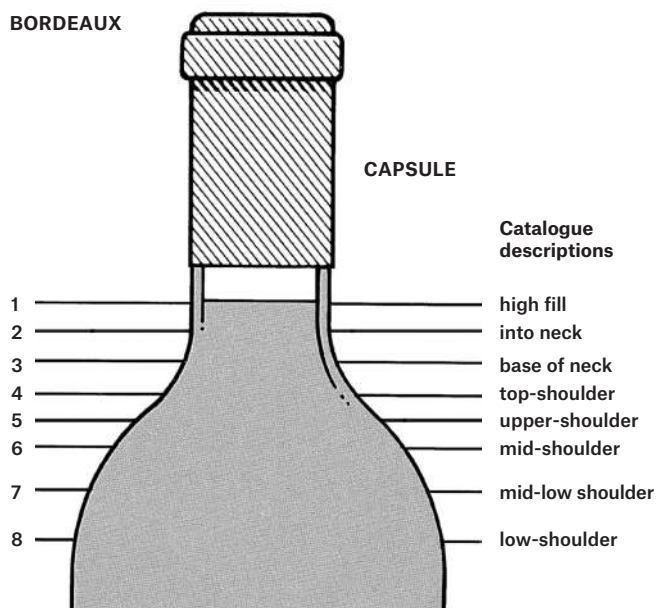

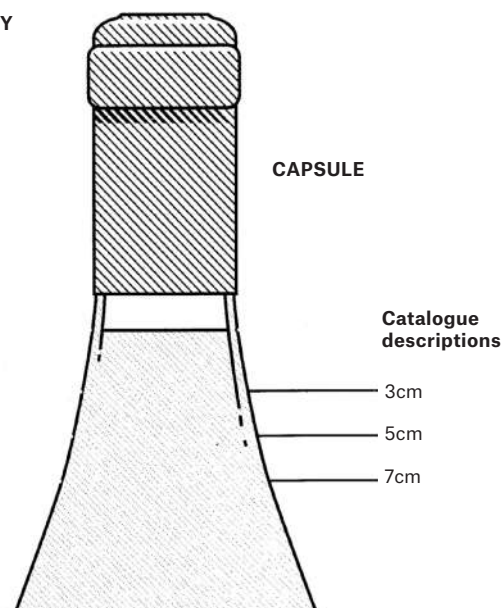

## BURGUNDY



- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 bottom neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 very top-shoulder
- 4 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 5 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.

- 6 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 7 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 8 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

### BOTTLE SIZES

- magnum = two regular bottles
- marie-jeanne = three regular bottles
- double-magnum = four regular bottles
- jeroboam = four regular bottles (Burgundy, Champagne)
- jeroboam = six regular bottles (Bordeaux) (or 5 litres)
- impériale = eight regular bottles (Bordeaux)
- methuselah = eight regular bottles (Burgundy)

### SPECIAL NOTICE

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

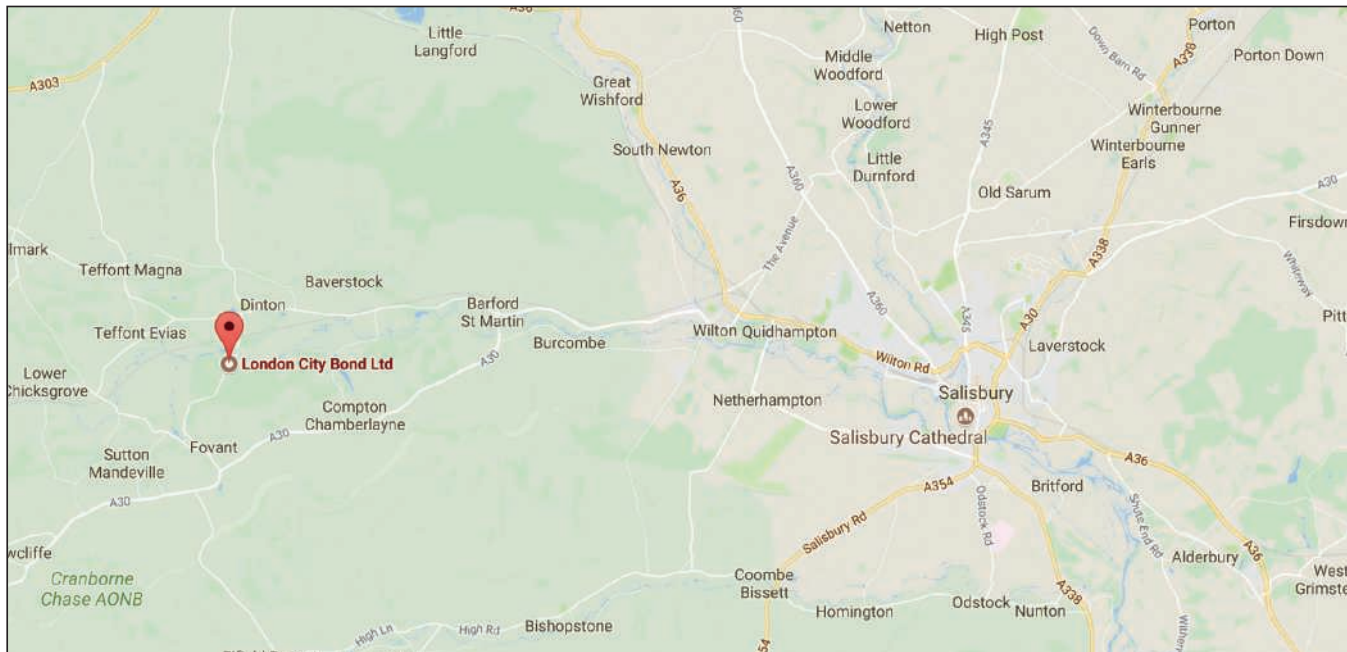
We therefore repeat that there is always a risk of cork failure with old wines and due allowance must be made for this.

Important note regarding opening of cases and listing of levels: Christie's general policy is to open all wood cases and to describe levels. Bidders must make allowances for reasonable variations in ullage which may be encountered in cases from the 1984 vintage and older. Additionally, all wine from vintages 1985 and younger have levels bottom neck or better unless otherwise noted.
