It is with great sadness that we must announce the passing of our longstanding and much admired colleague, David Elswood. David joined Christie's Wine Department in 1985, going on to become one of our finest auctioneers and later, our leader as International Head of Wine Sales at Christie's from 2003-2017.

David was an exceptional man in all respects. He was an inspiring leader, great friend and a beloved member of, and ambassador for, the fine wine community. We feel he will be missed enormously by those who knew him and worked with him over the years.

We would like to honour David's memory and legacy in our upcoming end-of-season auction catalogues in Geneva, Hong Kong, London and New York with a tribute page, including short comments from a group of leading figures in the international fine wine community. THE ALLURE OF CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

Château Lafite Rothschild is undoubtedly one of the world's most prestigious and collectible wines. Tim Triptree MW helps explain why it's so highly sought-after:

Château Lafite Rothschild has a rich and fascinating history. The first reference dates back to 1234 and the name Lafite derives from the historic language term "fite", which means "mound" or "hillock", and describes their plateau which is one of the highest spots in the appellation. At the beginning of the 18th century Lafite's wine was sold in London, where it was reported to be a favourite of the Prime Minister, Robert Walpole who was reputed to have purchased barrels of 1732 and 1733. In France, Lafite became known as the "King's wine", after being introduced to the Court at Versailles by Maréchal Richelieu. Furthermore Lafite was officially ranked first in the list of the 1855 Classification of the Bordeaux Grands Crus Classification from the Universal Exhibition in Paris in the same year. Wine estates were classified according to a château's reputation and trading price, and ranked in importance from first to fifth growths (crus), with four first growths listed initially (Mouton Rothschild was added in 1973). The Rothschild family association at Lafite began with the acquisition by Baron James de Rothschild in 1868 and since these beginnings wine aficionados have focused on collecting their superlative wines.

Lafite is blessed with a fantastic terroir near to the Gironde estuary in the northern part of Pauillac, close to the border with St-Estèphe. The Pauillac appellation is where the other First Growths Château Latour & Château Mouton Rothschild are located. Today Lafite's 112 hectare vineyard consists of three main areas: the slopes around the Château, the adjacent Carruades plateau to the west and a 4.5 hectare plot in the neighbouring commune of Saint Estèphe, which historically has been allowed into Lafite and thus the Pauillac appellation. The vines are planted in well-drained soil made up of fine, deep gravel, mixed with aeolian sand on a subsoil of tertiary limestone. The grape varieties are Cabernet Sauvignon (70%), Merlot (25%), Cabernet Franc (3%) and Petit Verdot (2%).

In terms of red Bordeaux, or claret as it is also referred to by the British, the wines of Pauillac are classic versions characterised with intense blackcurrant flavours and aromas that develop into pencil lead, cedar and cigar box with age. The wines have a vibrant acidity and a firm tannic structure which enables the wines to age gracefully over many decades in the successful vintages. Amongst these Pauillac wines, Lafite has always held a particular allure. It is undoubtedly one of the very best wines to come out of Bordeaux. For power there are other châteaux, but for elegance and finesse, then Lafite should be your wine. I believe Lafite's popularity, particularly in Asia can be partly attributed to these characteristics of approachability in youth, the finesse and elegance combined with significant ageing potential.

I have been fortunate to taste Lafite on many occasions and the 1982 vintage is one of the best wines I have had the privilege to taste when it is on song with impressive concentration of cassis fruit character with the classic cedar and cigar box aromatics, supremely well balanced and the finish went on and on - a truly impressive wine! Lafite is approachable in youth with a beautiful fragrant fruit character, however it will be fascinating to taste their younger vintages, such as 2009, 2010, 2015 and 2016 when they are fully matured. For me, the magic of Bordeaux requires patience, the wines need time to evolve their complex secondary and tertiary characteristics of cedar, leather and tobacco. The best wines, which Lafite is unquestionably in that category also have a freshness and vibrancy to balance the matured bouquet. These nuances continue to evolve and change through the wine's long life and the type of bottle format will also influence this evolution, as the general rule is that the larger the format the slower the evolution due to less oxygen compared to the volume of wine, so those lucky enough to have magnums, double-magnums, jeroboams or imperials of Lafite can enjoy their wines over a longer drinking window period. Irrespective of whether in bottles or magnums or larger, Lafite should be an important part of your fine wine collection.





DIRECT FROM THE DOMAINE

We at Domaine Fourrier are so happy to offer some of our wines, direct to the consumer through the Christie's Auction in New York in December.

A bit about the history & philosophy of Domaine Fourrier.....

We are a small family Domaine in Burgundy of 5 generations, and we have 10 hectares of vineyards, which cover 4 different villages. From these 10 hectares, we make 14 different wines ranging from Bourgogne Rouge through to Grand Cru.

We are extremely lucky that all of our vineyards are between 85 and 109 years old. With their extensively deep root system, they can offer us in the glass a myriad of different minerals and richness from the soil and a true expression of terroir. Also as the vines are not so vigorous at this age, they give us some tiny berries that translate in the glass into beautiful smooth tannins, rich color, and concentrated aromas.

Jean-Marie is in charge of the Domaine today and has been since he took over the winemaking in 1984 after finishing his studies at the Wine School in Beaune and studying Oenology at Dijon university. He developed his knowledge further by working with Henri Jayer in Vosne Romanée and with Drouhin in Oregon. From these experiences came a passionate respect for "Mother Nature" and for Terroir.

Grapes are harvested by hand and put into cases of 30 kilos, 100 percent destemmed, and then put into the cuvées using a moving stairwell. Everything is done so that the grapes are still whole once they are in the cuvée, enabling us to use the most minimal amounts of sulfur. Most of the sorting of the berries is done in the vineyards, but we also have a vibrating sorting table which eliminates any damaged dried up grapes and allows our team of around 6 people to double check that everything that goes into the destemmer is perfect.

4 to 5 days cold maceration, followed by fermentation of between 12 to 14 days. During this time, the only method of extraction is pigéage which is done between 2 to 4 times a day, depending on the vintage.


The grapes are pressed using a pneumatic press which is very gentle, and the juice is put into vats for 24 hour débourbage, where the heaviest sediment falls to the bottom. The juice is then put into barrels in the cellar using gravity where it will stay for 18 months on its original lees.

We don't do any racking for two reasons:

We like to keep high levels of carbonic gas, so as not have to use any sulfur during the élevage if at all possible. The CO2 is a natural protectant which, if the wine is racked and given oxygen, would have to be replaced by SO2.

The autolysis of the yeast: One of the micro proteins of the dead yeast is glycerol which during the malolactic fermentation is suspended into the wine and fixes, giving a lovely fatness and roundness in mouth.

In spring, the wine is blended in vats for a few weeks before to be put into bottle with our care with no fining and no filtration. We use 20 percent new oak for every wine.



GRIOTTE-CHAMBERTIN

This is actually the third smallest Grand Cru in the Côte de Nuits with a total surface of 2,6 hectares. We have just 0,26 hectares of this and from this we make between 3 and 5 barrels per year, depending on the vintage (which translated into bottles is 900 – 1500 bottles for the world). The vineyards were originally planted in 1928, and the name Griotte comes from the old French word « criotte » which means chalk. This translates into the glass as a very fine, extremely elegant wine.

GEVREY-CHAMBERTIN, CLOS-ST-JACQUES, 1ER CRU

Nearly 110 years old, this vineyard was originally planted in 1910 has a total surface of 6 hectares, of which we have 0,89 hectares. Beautifully positioned on the slope, south facing, right up in the north of Gevrey, many consider the "Clos St Jacques" to be a Grand Cru. Indeed, it nearly was after the 1st World War, but unfortunately at the time it was owned by a royalist, who inconvenienced the judges of the INAO with an unfortunate cigar at the time of classification! The wine from the north of Gevrey tends to be more masculine and with darker fruits as opposed to the wines in the south. There, along the Route des Grands Crus, the wines are more feminine, with more red fruits. Every year this amazing vineyard never fails to give such tiny grapes, we like to call the "caviar."

LATOUR

Château Latour manages to achieve a rare stylistic balance, in that its wines are internationally known for both their elegance and purity of linear fruit flavor, and for their power, muscularity and heroic longevity. Few wines age with such consummate grace as those of Château Latour. These wines are highly tannic in youth, and are famously distinctive in the way they mature slowly, and on their own terms; stubbornly refusing to succumb to the effects of the natural passing of time. The other great hallmark of Latour is its consistency – the wines are consistently impressive, irrespective of whether the vintage is great, mediocre or even slightly disappointing.

MOUTON-ROTHSCHILD

In 1853 Baron Nathaniel de Rothschild bought Château Brane-Mouton and renamed it Mouton Rothschild. Baron Philippe de Rothschild became involved in the estate following the death in 1920 of Laura-Thérèse who had run the property after becoming widowed by Baron Nathaniel de Rothschild. Baron Philippe de Rothschild worked tirelessly and drove innovations such as commissioning the artist Jean Carlu in 1924 to design a new label. In the same year he also bottled the entire vintage at the Château, a practice that had up until then been virtually unheard of, and is now universally adopted for all the Grand Vins. In 1945 to celebrate the 'Année de la Victoire' he commissioned the artist Philippe Juillan to design the label which began the tradition of featuring a different artist on the label for each vintage that continues to this day (except for 1953 and 1977). Such famous names as Picasso, Kandinsky, Francis Bacon and Andy Warhol have featured on the labels and helped to strengthen the reputation of the Château.

Artists have never been paid for their work, but have received Mouton Rothschild wine. Baron Philippe de Rothschild's main goal and achievement was the promotion of Château Mouton Rothschild to First-Growth status in 1973. For the Grand Vin the average age of vines is 44 years with a density of 10,000 per hectare planted on gravel soils. Vinification takes place in oak vats for between 15 and 25 days followed by maturation in oak barriques for between 19 and 22 months, the percentage of new barrels depends on the vintage. Annual production is approximately 300,000 bottles.

MARGAUX

Margaux is unique among the communes of the Médoc: it is the farthest south (isolated from its three famous cousins to the north, St.-Estèphe, St.-Julien and Pauillac) and is made up of several non-contiguous parcels of vineyard land. The appellation of Margaux encompasses the village of Margaux, of course, as well as the villages of Cantenac, Soussans, Labarde, and Arsac. Ideally, the limestone, chalk, clay and sand of Margaux combine (especially where gravel dominates, facilitating drainage) to make a fragrant and silky wine. More Margaux properties were included in the famous classification of 1855 than any other commune.



HAUT-BRION

Château Haut-Brion has been highly regarded for many centuries, being mentioned in Samuel Pepy's diary in 1663. In 1935 Haut-Brion was bought by the American banker, Clarence Dillon. His descendents still own the estate in the form of his grand-daughter Joan Dillon who is the President and her son, His Royal Highness Prince Robert of Luxembourg, the Vice President and Managing Director. In 1983 the Dillons acquired the next door property La Mission Haut-Brion. Haut-Brion is renowned for the classic Graves earthy and smoky character, combined with the opulent and approachable nature provided by the higher proportion of Merlot in comparison to the other Médoc First Growths.

LA MISSION-HAUT-BRION

Created by the noble Lestonnac family (sister and brother in law of Jean de Pontac, owner of Château Haut-Brion owes its name and its reputation to the Prêcheurs de la Mission. The Bordeaux branch of the Congrégation de la Mission de Saint-Lazare, a missionary order, commonly known as the Lazarists, who owned the property from 1682 until 1789. The estate was awarded a Gold Medal at the 1862 International Exhibition in London. This mythical wine was named as the unofficial "Sixth First Growth" of Bordeaux in the 2009 classification by Liv-Ex, the world's leading exchange for fine wine. This ranking revisited the 1855 Classification in order to create a new hierarchy reflective of the current market reality.



COS D'ESTOURNEL

Château Cos d'Estournel is named after its 19th century owner, Louis-Gaspard d'Estournel. The word "Cos" derives from the Gascogne language, meaning "hill of pebbles". In 1917 the property was purchased by Fernand Ginestet, whose daughter Arlette married into the Prats family which is how the Château came into the hands of Bruno Prats who managed Cos d'Estournel until 1998 when it was sold to the Taillan Group. His son Jean-Guillaume Prats has remained as general manager and in 2000 the estate was bought by Michel Reybier, and since 2004 the technical director has been Dominique Arangoits.

Cos d'Estournel is located in the south of the St-Estèphe appellation, on the border with Pauillac. The vineyards are superbly sited on a south-facing gravel ridge with a high clay content, just north of Lafite-Rothschild, separated by the La Jalle de Breuil tributary stream. The 91 hectare estate is planted with 60% Cabernet Sauvignon and 40% Merlot. The average age of vine is 35 years at a density of 8,000 to 10,000 per hectare and only vines over 20 years of age end up in the Grand Vin.

LEOVILLE-LAS-CASES

Château Léoville-Las-Cases is the most northerly of the Saint Julien properties and closest to the vineyards of Pauillac. The richness and power of their wines means that Léoville-Las-Cases are often mistaken for a top Pauillac. The estate has 97 hectares of vines divided into 125 parcels, the largest and most important is the 50 hectare walled vineyard called Grand Clos. The vineyards are generally planted with 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. The grapes are entirely hand-harvested and fermentation which takes place in a mix of wooden, cement and stainless steel vats lasts for between 12 and 24 days at temperatures between 24°C and 28°C. The wine is then aged for between 18-20 months in sixty to 100% new oak depending on the vintage.

PICHON-LONGUEVILLE LALANDE

Vines were planted on the area to become known as the Pichon estate in the late 17th century by Pierre de Rauzan, the father in-law of Jacques de Pichon. Pichon soon inherited the land and due to its close geographical as well as quality proximity to Latour the wine soon garnered an excellent reputation. After the death of Baron Jean-Pierre de Pichon in 1850 at the age of 95, the Pichon estate was divided with three-fifths going to the three daughters, becoming "Lalande" and the remainder to the two sons or the "Baron" side. The modern era and rebirth of Pichon-Lalande was ushered in when Madame May-Elaine de Lenscquesaing assumed majority control bringing on exacting controls, numerous improvements and personally leading the blind tasting during assemblage. High percentages of Merlot and Cabernet Franc as well as a good portion of the vineyards lying in St. Julien allow for a complex and supple style with distinctive aromas of olive, crème de cassis and cedar. While concentration and depth are provided for by the relatively high extract in the winemaking as well as the significant Petit Verdot component added to the Cabernet Sauvignon backbone.

LYNCH-BAGES

The out of date nature of the 1855 classification system is clearly demonstrated when reflecting on the quality of Château Lynch-Bages, originally deigned a fifth growth. Tremendous wines in the late 1950s and early 1960s clearly indicated the outstanding potential of the property. After sharing a down period of the late 1960s and early 1970s experienced by many properties in Bordeaux, fortunes began a reversal when Jean-Michel Cazes took over the property from his father in 1973. He appointed the talented Daniel Llose as business director in 1976 and culminated massive investment in Lynch-Bages with 25 massive steel vats in 1980 to cleanup and to control the winemaking process. The percentage of new oak used the Grand Vin was also more than doubled. This investment was fortuitously evinced by the exceptionally good 1982 and 1983 vintages, both bringing forth the fleshy, generous style of wine healthily promulgated by Lynch-Bages.

PAVIE

Château Pavie's history goes back to Roman times. The first vines in Saint Emilion were planted on the slopes of Ausone and Pavie in the 4th century AD. At the time, the limestone plateau was devoted to mixed farming. Up until the 18th century, "pavies" or clingstone vineyard peaches with red flesh were grown here. Over the years, the peach trees gradually disappeared, and were replaced by vines. The outstanding quality of the terroir on the famous south-facing Côte de Pavie was revealed over generations, and became widely-acknowledged by the mid-twentieth century.

Impressed by the estate's history, geographical location, and terroir, Gérard Perse acquired Château Pavie in 1998. Château Pavie has 37 hectares of vines in a single block with three different terroirs: clay-limestone plateau, clay slope, and gravel and clay soil at the foot of the slope. The blend of wine from these different terroirs, combined with low yields and the separate fermentation of grapes from each individual plot in temperature-controlled oak vats, produces a wine of unique complexity. Displaying marvelous structure and elegance, Château Pavie is made in magnificent facilities renovated in 2013

Gérard Perse shares this passion for viticulture and winemaking with his daughter, Angelique and her husband, Herique Da Costa, both of whom are involved in managing the estate. "In September 2012, Château Pavie was promoted to Premier Grand Cru Classé "A" status, joining the closed circle of the ten greatest estates in Bordeaux. This was the ultimate recognition of the efforts mae by my team over the years in the vineyard and cellars. Life is too short to drink bad wine!" Mr Gérard Perse, owner of Château Pavie.

Araujo Estate Wines dedicates a large portion of its 38 acre Eisele vineyard, which has been organically farmed since 1998 and soon thereafter began being farmed bio-dynamically, to its Cabernet Sauvignon, its flagship wine which represents the culmination of its efforts. Small lots of grapes are transported to the winery within minutes of being picked, where they are sorted, moved without pumping, and aged in French oak barrels kept in the depths of a cave complex designed by Araujo specifically to vinify only Eisele Vineyard grapes, wherein the temperature and humidity are ideal for the ageing of wine.

Bill Harlan's goal throughout the past quarter century has remained constant—to create an American first growth by expressing the genius of one particular site. With his keen eye for real estate, Harlan identified a property near the town of Oakville that had never been planted, and purchased the 23-acre nucleus of this property in 1984. Additional purchases and land trades eventually increased the total to 240 acres that reach an elevation of 1225 feet. Harlan Estate vineyards, however, are limited to a steeply terraced band between 350-550 feet elevation in order to keep the grapes cool. Being a perfectionist, Harlan and his team (the formidable duo of winemaker Robert Levy and consulting oenologist Michel Rolland) rejected two vintages as unworthy before deciding to release the 300 case production of the 1990 vintage. Since this time, production has climbed, but still hovers at just 1,800 -2,000 cases per vintage. All truly great wines have an essential nature that is difficult to pin down, since one of their common characteristics is great complexity—and Harlan is no exception. Stand-out vintages offered here include the 1997 and 2002.







DOMINUS

What happens when you combine French winemaker Christian Moueix of Petrus fame with Napanook, one of Napa Valley's most famous vineyards? You get Dominus, a wine that shares a terroir with the legendary wines of the Inglenook Vineyards era.

Dominus is a "Bordeaux blend," made up of primarily Cabernet Sauvignon with a dash of Petit Verdot, Merlot and Cabernet Franc. In France, a Cabernet Sauvignon-heavy blend like this would be found on the left bank, whereas Moueix is famous for his right bank wines: Pétrus, Trotanoy and Magdelaine. In typical Moueix style, Dominus is made in a very "French fashion:" serious attention to the vineyard health, three weeks of fermentation, 18 months in barrel, egg-white fining and no filtration. The first vintage for Dominus was in 1983.



DERMOT BOLGER OF TORRE BELLA COLLECTION

The vast Torre Bella estate can trace its origin all the way back to the first settlers who discovered Madeira. Some of the best vineyards on the island belonged to Torre Bella, mostly in Campanário, Camara de Lobos, Ribeira Brava and Arco da Calheta. They had "lagares" in São Roque (Funchal), Ca Lobos, Campanário and Arco da Calheta, where they used to make wine. Over the centuries they supplied shippers with fine wines, though hardly ever bottled under the Torre Bella name. Only small quantities were bottled and stored in the family house.

Noel Cossart describes the Torre Bella wines of a specific character: "The Wines, which are mostly from the Câmara de Lobos and Arco da Calheta vineyards, are full, rich, well-balanced wines with an attractive acid finish."

Back in 1864, Christie's sold the private Madeira collection of Russell Manners Gordon, Visconde de Torre Bella. The estate was inherited over time by Mr. Dermot Bolger. At the time of his death, the family estate owned about 10.5% of the island. Dermot Bolger was also responsible for the revival of Malvasia Candida by replanting this variety in 1940. Back then, only a few plants remained, which is surprising as Malvasia Candida was always highly sought-after and producing some of the finest Madeiras ever made.

All of the bottles in this collection came from the old Bolger family cellar and were bottled from their original old demi johns of about 20 liters. While preparing this auction, Christie's specialists had the opportunity to taste most of these Torre Bella D. Bolger wines. Tasting notes are added where available.

The excellent quality was clear, making it easy to understand why the family kept these wines behind for family use. We are delighted to offer a fine selection of these wines in this sale for wine collectors to have a chance to enjoy these historic wines.



OVERHOLT RYE WHISKEY

Old Overholt is one of the oldest distilleries in America that is still running today. Abraham Overholt began distilling his Rye Whiskey in 1810, and by 1812 had established a commercial distillery in West Overton, Pennsylvania where he produced Old Farm Pure Rye Whiskey. In 1860, Jacob Overholt, Abraham's son and his cousin Henry Overholt built a second distillery in nearby Broad Ford, and it was here that the first Rye whiskey bearing the Overholt brand was distilled.

Old Overholt is a Straight Rye Whiskey, aged at least four years, but in the case of these older examples which were distilled before the commencement of prohibition, it is likely that the whiskey spent much longer in cask, leading to a richer style of whiskey.

Old Overholt is one of the most consistent styles of whiskey in America, and in the minds of many, was one of the most characterful and elegant Rye whiskies that were distilled at the beginning of the 20th century. The whiskey was distilled in a large, wooden three chamber still (a hybrid between a pot and column still) from a mash bill of rye and barley malt and aged in heated warehouses.

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

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

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


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
