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AN OUTSTANDING EUROPEAN COLLECTION

The following 132 lots come from the private collection of a Northern European connoisseur. Christie's Specialists travelled to the collector's home and noted that the cellar was absolutely impeccable. The wines were all stored in a cold, well-organized and perfectly maintained home cellar. The collection focuses on a small group of producers that sit at the very top of the Burgundian pyramid; in particular Armand Rousseau, Jean Grivot and Jean-Jacques Confuron. The lots in our sale offer some of the finest wines these much-lauded producers have released in recent years.

ARMAND ROUSSEAU

The Domaine was started at the beginning of the 20th Century by Armand Rousseau who came from a family of vignerons and wine-merchants. At the age of 18 he inherited through marriage several plots of vineyards in Gevrey Chambertin.Today the Domaine's vineyards have a surface area of 15.33 hectares and the vines are and average age of between 40 and 45 years. Yields are kept low, at between 30 to 40 hectolitres per hectare, with practices such as bud removal and green harvesting being employed. No chemical fertilisers are used, and harvesting is done completely by hand. Vinification is traditionally Burgundian with 90% destemming, fermentation for an average of 18 days in open-topped stainless steel vats with regular "pumping over" and "pigeage", and a strict control of temperatures with a maximum of 31-34°C. The wine is then aged in 100 % new oak barrels for Chambertin, 90 to 100% for Chambertin Clos de Bèze, 70 to 90% for Clos Saint Jacques and 20% for Clos des Ruchottes. The wines from Domaine Armand Rousseau have developed over the generations but have always kept the same spirit as when Armand and Charles were making them. The "Rousseau touch" is a style of wine instantly recognizable. Their wines are typically Burgundian: fine, elegant and an honest, true expression of the vineyards through the Pinot Noir grape and a little intervention from the winemaker.

'Romanée-Conti,' as the local proverb goes, 'is the central pearl of the Burgundian necklace.' This miniscule vineyard gives its name to the most famous Domaine in the world, commonly referred to as DRC. Domaine de la Romanée-Conti is widely considered to be among the world's greatest wine producers, and has, for many decades, been Burgundy's preeminent Domaine. DRC bottles are among the worlds' rarest, most renowned and most expensive great wines. In 1869 the vineyard passed to Jacques-Marie Duvault-Blochet, ancestor of the current co-owners, the de Villaine family. The Leroy family acquired half ownership in 1942.

The Domaine owns almost 28 hectares of vineyards and this includes sole ownership of the 1.81 hectares of Romanée-Conti Grand Cru and the entire 6.06 hectares of La Tâche. They also own holdings of 3.51 hectares of Richebourg, 5.29 hectares of Romanée-Saint-Vivant, 0.68 hectares of Le Montrachet and cultivate 3.53 hectares of Grands-Echézeaux, with 4.67 hectares of Echézeaux. The Domaine has been at the forefront of viticultural developments, adopting a biodynamic approach and using vine material from their own vineyards for their re-planting. In 2005, the average age of the Romanée-Conti vines was more than 50 years.

There is no disputing the quality of the wines, particularly their highly sought-after and greatly-prized Romanée-Conti. This is very scarce, as on average only 450 cases are produced each vintage. As Michael Broadbent M.W. stated "It never fails to astonish me that the strips of vines which stretch only a modest number of meters up the very gentle slopes from the outskirts of an equally modest, indeed remarkably rural rambling village of Vosne, are capable of producing wines of such world class quality". This wine needs time and through bottle-age evolves with incredible finesse, smoothness, complexity and length of flavour.



Domaine Leroy is regarded by many as one of the finest producers in Burgundy. Michel Bettane wrote in Vins de France that "Domaine Leroy is a welcome reminder of the difference between the very good and the great". And Robert M. Parker stated that "Lalou Bize-Leroy stands alone a the top of Burgundy's quality hierarchy. Because she is a perfectionist, and because she has had the courage to produce wines from low yields and bottle them naturally, without fining or filtration". Domaine Leroy has adhered to the principles of biodynamic viticulture since 1989. They do not use any weed killers, pesticides, fungicides, insecticides or artificial fertilisers in their 23 hectares of vineyards. Incredibly low yields produce wines that are superbly concentrated and highly sought after. Domaine Leroy produce nine Grand Cru wines; Corton-Renardes, Richebourg, Romanee-Saint-Vivant, Clos de Vougeot, Musigny, Clos de la Roche, Latricieres-Chambertin, Chambertin and Corton-Charlemagne ; as well as eight Premier Cru wines such as Vosne-Romanee Les Beaux-Monts and Gevrey-Chambertin Les Combottes, and a further selection of fine red wines such as Pommard and Nuits-Saint-Georges from other Burgundy terroirs.

DENIS MORTET

Domaine Denis Mortet has approximately 11 hectares of vineyards over fourteen different appellations in Burgundy, including two Grands Crus; Clos-de-Vougeot and Chambertin. The Domaine was started in the early 1990's and meticulous care in the vineyards is one of the hallmarks of the Domaine. Weed killer is never used, and healthy ripe grapes combined with rigorous sorting on tables introduced at the winery in 1993, produces wines with great intensity and depth of colour that are very highly regarded and sought after. Tragically Denis Mortet died in 2006, and his son Arnaud has assumed control and continues to make supurb Burgundy.

DOMAINE JACQUES-FRÉDÉRIC MUGNIER

Domaine Jacques-Frédéric Mugnier is a family owned Domaine founded in 1863 by Frédéric Mugnier with the purchase of the Château de Chambolle-Musigny from the Marey-Monge family and vines in Chambolle-Musigny and Nuits-Saint-Georges. Today, the Domaine is based in Chambolle-Musigny and run by Frédéric Mugnier. In 2004 Frédéric Mugnier took back the monopole Clos de la Maréchale in Nuits-St.-Georges which had been leased to Domaine Faiveley for the 50 previous years. The Domaine owns 13.5 hectares of vineyards, including 1.13 hectares of Le Musigny, 0.35 hectares of Bonnes-Mares, the 10 hectares of Clos de la Maréchale in Nuits Saint Georges, and 4 hectares in Chambolle-Musigny. Frédéric Mugnier's approach to both viticulture and wine-making is aimed at preserving in the wines the purest expression of nature with minimal interference from technological practices. JF Mugnier is perhaps best known for their superlative Musigny, but they should also be praised for their Bonnes Mares, Chambolle-Musigny Premier Cru Les Amoureuses, Clos de la Maréchale and a range of other excellent wines from Chambolle and Nuits.

DOMAINE GEORGES ROUMIER

In 1924 Georges Roumier took over the Domaine which had previously belonged to his wife's family in Chambolle Musigny. His son Jean Marie succeeded in 1957 and his grandson Christophe took over in 1992. The Domaine consists of approximately 13 hectares of vineyards spread over nine separate appellations. Their holdings include 0.1 hectares of Le Musigny Grand Cru, 0.2 hectares of Corton Charlemagne, 1.60 hectares of Bonnes-Mares and 3.07 hectares of Chambolle-Musigny. The grapes are sorted in the vineyard with a table de tri and depending on the vineyard and vintage, they are mostly destemmed then placed in wooden fermenters. Use of oak is restrictive, with new oak being limited to 15-25 percent for villages wines and no more than 50% for the Bonnes Mares. These wines are now regarded as some of the most precise in Burgundy.

VEGA-SICILIA

Vega-Sicilia was founded in 1864 by Eloy Lecanda on 2000 hectares of land that his father bought off the Marguis of Valbuena, and where he planted 18,000 cuttings of Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec, Merlot and Pinot Noir he had brought over from Bordeaux. In 1982 the Alvarez family acquired Vega-Sicilia, beginning the stage of expansion that has culminated in over 5500 clients in 115 countries. The meticulous attention paid to the excellence of the wine translates into a low number of bottles on sale, though each one guarantees an unforgettable tasting experience. The Vega-Sicilia winery is located in Valbuena de Duero. The vineyards cover 250 hectares, with soils of clayeylimestone, with brown-grey streaks and an alluvial area. Around 80% of the Vega-Sicilia vineyards are planted with Tempranillo, while the remaining 20% are split between Cabernet-Sauvignon, Merlot and Malbec.



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

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such lots with the symbol ^o next to the lot number.

Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the lot fails to sell. Christie's therefore sometimes chooses to share that risk with a third party who agrees prior to the auction to place an irrevocable written bid on the lot. 

ULLAGE

The amount by which level of wine is short of being full: these levels may vary according to age of the wines and, as far as can be ascertained by inspection prior to the sale, are described in the catalogue.

LEVEL/ULLAGE DESCRIPTIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

(see notes below)



- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 base of neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 4 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.
- 5 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 6 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 7 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.


