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

As the grandson of a jeweller, with a taste for design, beauty and value that gemstones can convey, it was quite natural for Eric Valdieu to choose to study at the Gemological Institute of America (GIA) in Los Angeles, where he arrived in 1980.

After he graduated from GIA, he began his professional career at Bulgari where he stayed for two years. He then joined Christie's Geneva as a jewellery specialist, became director of the jewellery department in 1987 and Vice-President of Christie's Switzerland in 2003.

In 2010, with 35 years' international experience in the field of gemstones and jewellery, Eric Valdieu established his own business, Valdieu Fine Arts SA, in Geneva. Specialising in diamond and gemstone dealing, he also re-designs and remodels pieces in association with a highly regarded workshop established for more than 20 years and collaborating with the most renowned jewellery houses.

Alongside his work as a dealer, Eric Valdieu has run courses at the University of Geneva for several years for their MA programme in Luxury Marketing, and, between 2012 and 2017, was the co-manager of an investment fund based in Luxembourg specialising in gemstones and jewellery.

After studying gemmology in New York, Manuel Bouvier spent his first years working for Cartier in the High Jewellery department that was to later include the Cartier Museum. Learning what the market was producing in fine gems and discovering the legacy of Cartier period jewels, he developed a taste for unusual and refined designs. He then collaborated with Marina Bulgari, who taught him a certain rigor in designs and fantasy in colours.

In 1992 he set up his own company, assisted by skilled workshops using ancient techniques and modern materials, Manuel Bouvier manufactures one-of-a-kind pieces to enhance the gems he purchases around the world, from the rarest diamonds to the most colourful stones and pearls. He creates bespoke pieces for clients and friends that are wearable and understated. Craftmanship is at the centre of his production.

'It is important for me to try and draw a line between the 'jewellery industry' heavily mechanised and rationalised and high jewellery in the old sense, combining stones and materials either in a moment of shared pleasure with a client or just for pure joy'.

Manuel Bouvier presided over the I.C. Fabergé Foundation.

Located in the heart of historical Geneva his office is a gathering place for gem enthusiasts and collectors.

Golay Fils & Stahl was founded in 1837 in Geneva by Auguste Golay Leresche and sold at the turn of the century to Mr. Stahl, hence the name Golay Fils & Stahl. In 1961, the company was acquired by Jacques Wolfgang, already a business associate of the firm, having supplied it with precious stones since the 1930s.

Between 1860 and 1930, the establishment prospered during this grand and lavish period offering its exclusive creations to the jewellery world. Having a retail store in Paris as well as Geneva, Golay Fils & Stahl benefited from a very international clientele. At the turn of the century, Golay Fils & Stahl was named the official jeweller to the royal family of Romania. King Carol I of Romania, a loyal customer, visited the shop in Geneva regularly from 1896 onward. In old ledgers, there are also mentions of purchases by the Prince Damrong of Siam, as well as the Maharajah of Baroda.

Jesse Wolfgang, the son of Jacques, took over the firm upon his fathers' death in 1976. Having worked within the company since 1968 he was able to lead his team in adding a new dimension to the retail establishment. Golay Fils & Stahl closed its retail sector definitively in 1997, focusing solely on the creation of exclusive jewellery as well as buying and selling diamonds, coloured stones, vintage, antique and signed jewels; a family tradition now spanning six generations and continuing today.

Currently, we employ two Graduate Gemmologists (GIA), and are long-standing members of the Swiss Stone Dealers Association (Association Suisse des Négociants en Pierres Précieuses-ASNP).

Located in the historic lakefront area of Geneva, we welcome collectors, enthusiasts, and novices alike.

Clients are sometimes drawn to the jewellery by the spectacular window displays.

The Chatila family takes a hands-on approach to business; dealing personally with clients, directing the style of jewellery created in its workshops and supervising the stringent standard of quality control over the jewellery before it can be made available for purchase. All participate in the selection and evaluation of unique and rare gemstones: Chatila has had phenomenal stones pass through its ownership, such as the 57 carat "Rangoon Splendor" ruby, the legendary "Hapsburg" 87 carat D Flawless diamond, the "Indore Pears," each weighing approximately 45 carats, and the "Archduke Joseph" 76.45 carat cushion-shaped diamond.

Creating jewellery is very much an art form, and every little aspect of an item of jewellery has to be carefully planned to ensure that its ultimate wearer feels the pleasure of owning Chatila jewellery. As soon as a piece of jewellery is created by the Chatila craftsmen it undergoes rigorous standards of quality control. The Collection of Mireille and James Lévy is a celebration of graceful and poetic forms. The jewels offered in the Magnificent Jewels auction demonstrate the strong taste and colourful character of this couple. Further jewels from the collection will be offered in the New York Magnificent Jewels auction on 8th December 2020.

While building their remarkable collection, the couple also had a desire to share their love of art with a wider audience. They donated works from their art collection both to major international museum collections and lesser known European institutions; from The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, to the Musée cantonal des Beaux-Arts, Lausanne, the Lévys' generosity was transformational to these institutions' collections. Now, their largesse continues, as the proceeds from the sale of these works will continue their legacy of extraordinary philanthropy.





AN EXQUISITE ART DECO 'DRAGON' VANITY CASE, BY CARTIER

Cartier's achievements in integrating Asian influences, using themes from myths and fairy tales, began in the 1920s and ever since has marked an important chapter in the decorative arts and design world. Distinctive of this style, the Maison often incorporates Chinese elements, using materials such as jade, lacquer panels, lapis lazuli and more. Their red ground enamelling, as seen on lot 293, which was adopted from the Far East at the beginning of the 20th century, is without a doubt the perfect example to demonstrate how Cartier had mastered this technique, intended to imitate Chinese lacquer.

Chinese dragons and Chinese-influenced patterns, such as the repeated scrolls on this vanity case, had so permeated the Cartier design repertoire that they are to be found in enamel or engraved gold on boxes and vanity cases by Cartier throughout their heritage collection. According to Chinese legend, the dragon was honoured and venerated as an almighty natural force. And in the history of China, the dragon has always been seen as protector to the Emperor, often seen sewn in gold thread on the front and back of the Emperor's imperial court robes. This exquisite vanity case, with dragon and Chinese pattern motifs, truly showcases some of the very finest techniques, craftsmanship and designs in the history of Cartier.



Cecilie Auguste Marie of Mecklenburg (1884-1954) was the last Crown Princess of the German Empire. She was the daughter of Great Duke Freidrich Franz III of Mecklenburg and Great Duchess Anastasia Michailowna Romanowa, as well as the great granddaughter of Czar Nicholas I, Emperor of Russia (1825-1855) and the last King of Poland (1825-1930).

During her life, Duchess Cecilie contributed hugely to society by actively organising charity works and promoting education for women; as well as being recognised as one of the most popular, elegant and stylish women of her time.

In 1905 Cecilie married her great love, Wilhelm von Preussen (last Crown Prince of Germany). The superb diamond necklace offered as lot 310 was gifted to Cecilie on the occasion of her wedding by her grandfather Grand Duke of Russia Michael Nikolajewitsh Romanov. The year following the wedding all the gifts were publicly exhibited at the Kunstgewerbe Museum in Berlin.

Grand Duke Michael commissioned lot 310 at Bolin. The necklace bears maker's marks for Vladimir Finikov as well as Russian assay marks for Saint Petersburg, 1899-1904. The house of Bolin was established in Saint Petersburg in the late 18th century, quickly becoming the jewellers to the Imperial Court. Their elegant and finely crafted jewels were also retailed in Paris by houses such as Boucheron. In the beginning of the 20th century the firm relocated to Sweden, where they still exist today, and are jewellers to His Majesty King Carl XVI Gustav of Sweden.



Sita Devi Maharani of Baroda (1917-1989) had a passion for natural pearls, emeralds, rubies and diamonds. Her many commissions at Cartier and Van Cleef & Arpels show her love for spectacular jewellery. After her wedding to the Maharaja Pratapsingh Gaekwar of Baroda, she received jewels from the Baroda treasury to add to her collection. These gemstones and jewels dated back to the Mughal era. It included a magnificent seven-strand natural pearl necklace and a superb three-row diamond necklace that suspended the Star of the South diamond of 128.80 carats and the English Dresden of 78.53 carats.

Her strong personality was only matched by a poised elegance and her very impressive collection of jewels contributed to her glamorous lifestyle. Legend has it that she would come to Paris and stay at the famous Ritz Hôtel, right on Place Vendôme, and that she would be seen crossing the square to go to Van Cleef & Arpels, followed by some of her aids, carrying bags of gems to be remounted by the French house.

During the 1950s, she developed a reputation for living an extravagant lifestyle in Paris. The Maharani had many of her traditional Indian jewels reset to fit the latest Western trends, most of which was handled by the workshops of Van Cleef & Arpels.

It is interesting to note that lot 316 was designed by Verger Frères, a firm that used to work with Parisian Maisons such as Van Cleef & Arpels, Boucheron or Cartier amongst others. These bracelets, along with 46 other pieces from her collection, were first sold by the Crédit Municipal de Monaco on 16 November 1974.

VAN CLEEF & ARPELS' 'ZIP' NECKLACE

It was first unveiled by Van Cleef & Arpels at the beginning of the 1950s; its pioneering design becoming an immediate success. Never before had it been possible to create such a jewel; entirely gem-set and yet with a movable zip mechanism. It had taken many years since the concept had first been imagined by Renée Puissant in the 1930s for the firm to be able to produce such an extraordinary feat of miniature engineering and skill. The House has continued to manufacture these jewels ever since. This necklace, a brilliant tribute to the retro 'Zip' necklace from the 1950s, was illustrated on the cover of the Van Cleef & Arpels catalogue in 2003. It has also been seen on the red carpets on several occasions, worn by actresses Cate Blanchett, Hillary Swank or Eve Best, when portraying the Duchess of Windsor in the movie 'The King's Speech'.

The pomp and splendor of the court of Versailles was viewed as the epitome of grandeur at the turn of the century which desired to recapture the elegance of this bygone era through masquerades, hunting parties and balls. This period, called la belle époque in France and the Edwardian era in England, bygan in the 1890's and lasted until World War I. Cartier's jewelry from this period, known as the garland style, was inspired by models from French history, taken from the eighteenth century pattern books and architectural ornamentation from such historic buildings as the Petit Trianon. Characteristic motifs included swags, bows, ribbons, tassels, and festoened fruit garlands, while backgrounds closely followed lace, Islamic grilles and European wrought ironwork.

Under the direction of Louis Cartier, Cartier created elegant diamond tiaras, dog collars and bodice fewelry in the garland style which dazzled the eye when seen under Thomas Edison's new electrically powered lights. Although based on the court jewelry of Marie Antoinette, Cartier's jewelry did not become a pastiche of eighteenth century designs but was considered a new fashion due to the latest developments in the use of platinum.

Fashion in clothes followed the new trend with gowns trimmed in roses and lilies in the garland style with extravagant décoletté necklines providing a backdrop for the popular bodite jewelry. Their general shape followed the outline of the bodice and could either be sewn directly on to dresses by means of small eyes in the mannner of the eighteenth century or attached in the conventional way by a pin.

In 1907, Cartier designed corsage ornaments with a central plaque from which were attached perpendicular strands of diamonds (see illustration). By 1910, the popularity of bodice jewelry had waned as a result of Paul Poiret's new fashions which eliminated the plunging neckline.



KASHMIR SAPPHIRES

The mines of Kashmir were discovered in 1881 when a landslide in the northwestern Himalayas unearthed sapphire-bearing rocks. Majority of the world's most beautiful and highest-valued sapphires were mined in the region. They are reputed for their rich, cornflower blue colour, a velvety blue reminiscent of the gorgeous hue of a peacock's neck, giving them a legendary status. By 1887, the initial mine was exhausted and since then there has only been sporadic activity. Today, while there are fine stones on the market, their supply is very limited and gem-quality Kashmir sapphires, such as lot 322, are extremely rare.

A MAGNIFICENT ART DECO 'TUTTI FRUTTI' BRACELET, BY CARTIER

Few jewels have captured the imagination and enthusiasm of connoisseurs and collectors alike the Tutti-Frutti creations by Cartier. It was in occasion of Queen Victoria's commission in 1901 that Cartier started to design Oriental style jewellery. The Queen called away the Parisian jewellers to her royal court to create an Indian necklace as a gift for her daughter-in-law, Queen Alexandra. This commission set forth the beginning not only of a long support from English royal court but also of Cartier's journey in Oriental culture.

At a time when the coronation of George V and Queen Mary was being celebrated at the Delhi Durbar, and accompanied by Maurice Richard, the Parisian maison's pearls expert, Jacques Cartier was the first of the family to trip to India in 1911 in an effort to establish Cartier's reputation among the Indian elite. He first grew enamoured of Indian jewels at the turn of the 19th century. As the director of Cartier London, he was exposed to the lavish jewels of the Indian princes who often visited Britain. This Indian journey had a profound effect on the jewels produced by the firm throughout the 1920s and 30s and indirectly affected the entire field of jewellery design which Cartier so strongly influenced. Alongside the rather severe, geometric Art Deco style, mainly executed in diamonds, Cartier produced vibrant Tutti Frutti jewels, full of colour and flowing naturalistic design. Named as Hindu Jewels and then, in 1970s, Tutti Frutti, this iconic design owes its fame to the carved gems, where rubies, sapphires and emeralds cut as leaves and blossoms rule the roost. The incorporation of Indian influences and gemstones into jewels was one of Cartier's greatest innovations in the Art Deco period.



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BIOGRAPHIES

RENÉ BOIVIN

René Boivin was born in February 1864 in Paris. An excellent designer and engraver, he began a career in the jewellery field at a young age. During the 1890s he purchased several workshops and established himself at rue St. Anastase. In 1893 he married Jeanne Poiret, sister of the famous couturier Jean Poiret. They worked together to create some of the most bold and daring fashions of the early 1900s. After Boivin's death in 1917, Jeanne decided to assume control of the firm and established herself in the avenue de l'Opéra alongside her daughter Germaine Boivin, and designer Juliette Moutard. The three worked together for forty years, joined between 1921 and 1932 by Suzanne Belperron, creating such signature pieces as the Starfish (1936). Their jewels, inspired by animals and nature, became well-known. Upon Jeanne Boivin's death in 1959, the house was taken over by Louis Girard. In April 1991, the company became part of the Asprey Group. The brand was recently purchased by a new company.

BOUCHERON

Frédéric Boucheron opened his first jewellery salon at the Palais Royal in 1858, and soon acquired fame as an expert in precious stones, a masterful technician and a creator of beautiful jewellery. In 1893 he became the first jeweller to move to Place Vendôme, where he continued to serve the social elite, and from where the firm still operates successfully today. Over the years, Boucheron opened branches from Moscow and London, to Japan and the Middle and Far East, Boucheron exhibited in many international expositions, including the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial, the 1889 and 1900 World Fairs in Paris, the 1893 World's Colombian Exposition in Chicago and the 1925 International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts in Paris. Boucheron was acquired in May 2000 by Kering, one of the world's leading multibrand luxury goods company.

BULGARI

The firm was founded by Sotirio Bulgari, who was born in 1857 in Greece and was descended from a family of silversmiths. In 1884 he opened his first shop in Rome on the Via Sistina, and then in 1905 he moved to the Via dei Condotti. Upon Sotirio's death in 1932 his sons, Giorgio and Costantino, took over the business. They are credited with creating the highly distinctive 'Bvlgari' style, inspired by Greek and Roman classicism, the Italian Renaissance, and the 19th century Roman school of goldsmiths. The 1970s marked the beginning of Bulgari's international expansion with the opening of stores in New York (the first overseas), Paris, Geneva and Monte Carlo. It was also in this decade that Bulgari introduced the 'Bvlgari-Bylgari' which was to become a successful watch classic. Bulgari Time was established in the early 1980s in Neuchâtel, Switzerland, for the creation and production of all Bulgari watch lines. In 2001, Bulgari formed a joint venture with 'Luxury Group' to create a new luxury hotel brand, Bulgari Hotels & Resorts. In 2011, Bulgari was acquired by LVMH

CARTIER

Cartier was founded in Paris in 1847 by Louis-François Cartier. It was his three grandsons, Louis, Pierre and Jacques, who were responsible for establishing the famous world-wide empire. Louis retained responsibility for the Paris branch, moving it to the rue de la Paix in 1899. Jacques took charge of the London operation in 1906, which had opened in 1902, eventually moving it to the current location on New Bond Street. Pierre established the New York branch in 1909, relocating it in 1917 to the current location at 653 Fifth Avenue. Branches were opened in Moscow and the Persian Gulf in 1910, followed by openings in Cannes and Monte Carlo. In 1964, following the death of Pierre, Cartier Paris, London and New York were sold by the family. Cartier Paris was purchased by two American investors. In 1972 Silver Match lighter owner Robert Hocq and a group of investors led by financier Joseph Kanoui purchased Cartier Paris, followed by Cartier London In 1974 and Cartier New York In 1976, reuniting the three original branches. The Cartier Collection was created in 1983, allowing Cartier to hold successful public exhibitions of vintage Cartier jewels, clocks and objects In museums around the world. Today, Cartier is part of the Richemont group, with more than 200 boutiques around the world.

CHAUME1

Chaumet was founded in 1780 by Marie-Etienne Nitot who, with his son, Francois Regnault Nitot, became the official jeweller to Napoleon during the Consulate and the Empire. Among their achievements were the Consular sword, the tiara of Pius VII and the grand parures ordered by the Empresses Josephine and Marie-Louise. After the fall of Napoleon, the business continued under the direction of Jean-Baptiste Fossin and his son, Jules, both artists, who succeeded in capturing the spirit of Romanticism in jewellery just as Nitot & Fils had done for the Empire. In 1848, Jules Fossin set up a London branch in partnership with J.V. Morel, who was assisted by his son, Prosper. On his return to Paris in 1854, Prosper Morel joined Jules Fossin, whom he succeeded in 1868. Prosper Morel's daughter married Joseph Chaumet in 1875. Chaumet had begun his jewellery career at the age of fifteen, working in his parents' jewellery shop in Bordeaux. Upon moving to Paris, he was hired by his future father-in-law. By 1885, he assumed management of the firm. In 1889, Chaumet took over the company, simultaneously changing the name. Under his direction, the firm won prizes at all of the international exhibitions and supplied jewellery to many of the Royal houses of Europe. In 1907 he moved the company to 12, Place Vendôme. He also opened boutiques in London in 1905, and in New York in the 1920s. The latter closed in 1934 due to the Depression. In 1999 the firm was acquired by the luxury group LVMH.

MICHELE DELLA VALLE

Born in Rome, Michele della Valle began designing costume jewellery at the age of 16. He purchased his first stone in Burma in 1976, and took the gem to Christie's on the advice of renowned Swiss gem dealer Roger Varenne. There, he met Christie's Head of Jewellery Hans Nadelhoffer, who motivated Della Valle to become a gem dealer and jewellery designer. After a stint with Fürst Jewellers, the representing Harry Winston in Rome, he opened his workshop in Rome in 1978, traveling regularly to Asia for precious stones and beginning a collaboration with Bylgari on special orders for the film and opera stars of Italy. In 1987, he moved to Geneva, and developed a line of jewellery which now bears his name.

FASANO

Gioielleria Fasano, located on Via Roma, was established in 1928 in Turin by Mario Fasano in collaboration with his wife Stella. They crafted flowers and animals from gems, enamel, gold and steel. Their son Dario joined the firm in 1957 and carried on the family tradition after Mario's death in 1968..

EDED

Argentinian born and bred, Fred Samuel (1908-2006) founded in 1936 the jewellery firm which bears his name at 6 rue Royale in Paris, creating jewellery for such screen luminaries as Marlene Dietrich and Douglas Fairbanks. After the war, business resumed its pre-war pace, and introduced bolder, more contemporary designs to complement his trademark pearl jewellery. He expanded to the United States in 1977 in Beverly Hills, then Houston, and Costa Mesa in 1995, along with salons in Cannes, Monte Carlo and Tokyo. In 1995, the firm was acquired by the LVMH group.

FURST

At the end of World War II, Maurizio Fürst opened two boutiques in Italy, one in Torino and one in Rome. He quickly rose to fame and in 1960 he moved his shop in Rome from Via Bissolati to the famous Via Veneto, where he began to represent Harry Winston. Upon his death, the business was run by his family for a few years. The family eventually moved to Caracas, Venezuela, where they run a boutique.

M. GÉRARD

Louis Gérard founded M. Gérard in 1968 at 8 Avenue Montaigne in Paris. Within nine years he has become one of the largest French exporter of fine jewellery. In November 1985 he sold the company to a group of American investors, but managed it until his retirement, when the company closed. In September 1988 Louis Gérard reopened the firm renamed Louis Gérard, Joaillier International. It closed for good in December 1991.

GRAFF

In 1960, Laurence Graff founded Graff, a London based, vertically integrated enterprise that design, manufacture and retail distribution of jewellery and watches. It is considered today a global leader in Haute Joaillerie, said to have handled more diamonds of notable rarity and beauty than any other jeweler in the world; gem legends such as the Idol's Eye, the Emperor Maximilian, the Lesotho Promise, the Wittelsbach-Graff and the Letšeng Star. Graff's flagship store is located on London's New Bond Street with boutiques on Sloane Street and in Harrods. There are now over 55 Graff locations around the world, including Shanghai, Geneva, Hong Kong, Paris, Monte Carlo, Moscow and New York. In 2013. Mr Laurence Graff was awarded OBE (Officer of the Order of the British Empire) for his 5 decades at the pinnacle of the jewellery industry.

JAR

After graduating from Harvard in 1965, Joel Arthur Rosenthal moved to Paris and started with his partner Pierre Jeannet a tiny boutique on rue de l'Universite, creating needlepoint art with wool threads of unexpected colors, a niche endeavor which earned him early fame. Subsequently he applied the same artisanal spirit to jewelry, and opened a salon with Jeannet in Place Vendome named JAR after his initials. Shy by nature, he lives an almost anonymous existence in the creative universe of his atelier, for a most exclusive clientele, producing only 70-80 pieces a year. He is admired for his sculptural work, inseparable from that ingenious pave work, juxtaposing stones with the sense of color that is his alone. There has been three solo exhibitions: in 1987 at the National Academy of Design in New York, at Somerset House in London in 2002, and in November 2013 at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. The last exhibition was an important salute to Rosenthal's talents, as he was the first living jewelry designer to be accorded a dedicated retrospective in the history of the Met.

Marina Bvlgari hails from the famous Bvlgari family, and created jewellery for the firm until the mid-1970s. After her father's death, she started her own eponymous brand, Marina B. in Geneva. Almost immediately, her iconic designs, based on bold colour combinations, adorned movie stars like Sophia Loren, and women of international high society. In June 2010, her firm was acquired by Windsor Jewelers Inc. In June 2017, it was again acquired by French American designer Guy Bedarida, formerly of Van Cleef & Arpels and John Hardy, acting also as the brand's artistic director.

VAN CLEEF & ARPELS

The history of the famous Parisian jewellery house began in 1896 with the marriage of Estelle Arpels to Alfred Van Cleef. The company was founded in 1906 by Alfred and his brother-in law, Charles Arpels at 22. Place Vendôme, Julien Arpels joined the family business in 1908, and Louis Arpels in 1913. The oldest son of Julien Arpels, Claude, joined in 1932, followed by his brothers Jacques and Pierre in 1936 and 1944. An American boutique was opened by Claude in Rockefeller Center in New York in 1939, soon relocating to its definitive address at 744 Fifth Avenue. The 1930s saw some of the company's most iconic designs: the house's arguable trademark, the Mystery Setting - where the mounting of the gemstones is cleverly hidden behind the continuous calibré-cut ruby and sapphire surface of the jewel - was invented in 1933; and the concept of the Minaudière, made in honour of Florence Jay Gould, was invented in 1930 by Charles Arpels. In the following decades the firm upheld its reputation. for innovation with the zip necklace of the 1950s and the Alhambra theme of the 1970s. Today, Van Cleef & Arpels is part of the Richemont Group with more than 45 boutiques around the world.

VERGER

Georges Verger was one of the most famous clock designers of the 1920s. He was particularly known for his innovative use of precious materials in clocks, stands, frames and watches. He worked with all of the great jewellers of the day, among them Van Cleef & Arpels, Janesich, Lacloche and Boucheron in Europe, and Tiffany, Black, Starr & Frost and J. E. Caldwell in the United States.

DAVID WEBB


In 1941, at the age of 16, David Webb travelled from his birthplace, Asheville, North Carolina, to New York City, where his special gifts as a jeweller and designer quickly became apparent. He was noticed by Antoinette Quilleret, a French socialite living in Manhattan, with exquisite taste. In 1948, with her backing, he formed David Webb Inc., setting up shop on 57th Street. At the height of production, his two fulltime workshops employed 200 jewellers and 37 setters. David Webb's designs of the 1950s and early 1960s showcased endless variations on animals, flowers and organic forms. His love of nature took shape in jewels of all sizes and varieties. He then adopted a new vocabulary of hammered gold, enamel, colours, textures and shapes, synthesised into geometric motifs that reflected the spirit of the 1970s. By his untimely death in 1975, David Webb had established himself as "the" jeweller in Manhattan. In addition, he was also dedicated to creating special order pieces for New York society members who flocked to him. After his death, the company was managed for 35 years by Nina Silberstein, David Webb's business partner and later, her son, Stanley. Over this period, they oversaw the firm's expansion into new markets such as Beverly Hills, Houston and Kuwait. In 2010, it was purchased by New York jewellery dealers Mark Emanuel and Robert Sadian. Under this new ownership, David Webb's tradition of design and craftsmanship is being actively maintained, with older pieces remade according to their original drawings and archives.

HARRY WINSTON

Harry Winston (1896-1978) bought his first emerald at the age of eight. By the age of 24 he founded his first business in New York City: the Premier Diamond Company. In 1932 he incorporated under his own name and shortly thereafter began to manufacture and retail jewelry. Proclaimed the King of Diamonds in 1947 by Cosmopolitan magazine, Harry Winston owned at one time or another as many as a third of the famous diamonds in the world. He was also responsible for donating perhaps the most famous of all diamonds, the Hope diamond to the Smithsonian Institution where it stands to today as the centerpiece of the United States' national gem collection. Upon Mr. Winston's death in 1978, his son Ronald assumed control of the company and in 2004 Aber Diamond Corporation acquired a controlling interest in the company taking it public in 2007 under the name Harry Winston Diamond Corporation. In 2013 the Swatch Group acquired the retail arm of Harry Winston while the mining group under separate ownership is now the Dominion Diamond Corporation. Today, Harry Winston retail salons located throughout the US, Europe and Asia.
