THE COLLECTION OF MALLARDS, A FAMILY COUNTRY HOUSE CELLAR



This impressive collection of fine wines represents the careful curation by three generations of a wine loving family; the Fakhre family. The central part of the collection, including a wonderful collection of Château Lafite Rothschild, bottles of the famous 1900 vintage, alongside 1947 and 1949, was purchased from Viscount Strathallan in the mid 1980's. Lord Strathallan, son of the Earl of Perth, was a great family friend of the Fakhre household and upon the sale of one of his Scottish homes, he was happy to see his treasured bottles go to such a vinously minded family. The Fakhre's were re-designing a glorious country house in the New Forest, Mallards, on the banks of the Solent. They designed their own cellar, with a capacity for 30,000 bottles and asked the Directors of Berry, Bros & Rudd to inspect the cellar for storage conditions. Berry Bros were so impressed by the cool, dark space that they declared it, over a glass of fine Bordeaux, one of the best cellars they had seen in England. Danny Fakhre continued his father's passion in the 1990's, buying wines from around France and beyond to fill spaces in the vast network of cellars. Danny was great friends with the Janoueix family of Bordeaux and remembers many fine lunches drinking Château La Croix St-Georges. Danny's children are now great wine lovers and Danny's son Farid is a devoted foodie, using the glorious kitchen of their Arts and Crafts home to create Asian inspired dishes to match the wines brought up from the cellars.

The fine collection of wines from Domaine Bouchard is worth noting with Grand Cru such as Le Corton 1971, Musigny 1972 and Clos de la Roche 1973 appearing. Champagne is offered, Bollinger Vieilles Vignes Françaises 1970, alongside Taittinger Comtes de

Champagne Rosé 1975 in magnum. Vintages of Penfolds, Grange made by the great Don Ditter are notable highlights, the 1978, 1979, 1982 and 1983 vintages. A selection of port from top houses such as Warre and Fonseca is worth noting and the modern vintages of Bordeaux, 1992 Le Pin and 1981 and 1982 Petrus, the latter in magnum are rare finds. The labels for the wines, as with any from great country house cellars, bear the marks of history and storage in a cool, dark cellar. This collection is the chance for passionate wine lovers, who appreciate provenance and aged vintages to acquire bottles from a cellar which has taken a great deal of care and curation to build.

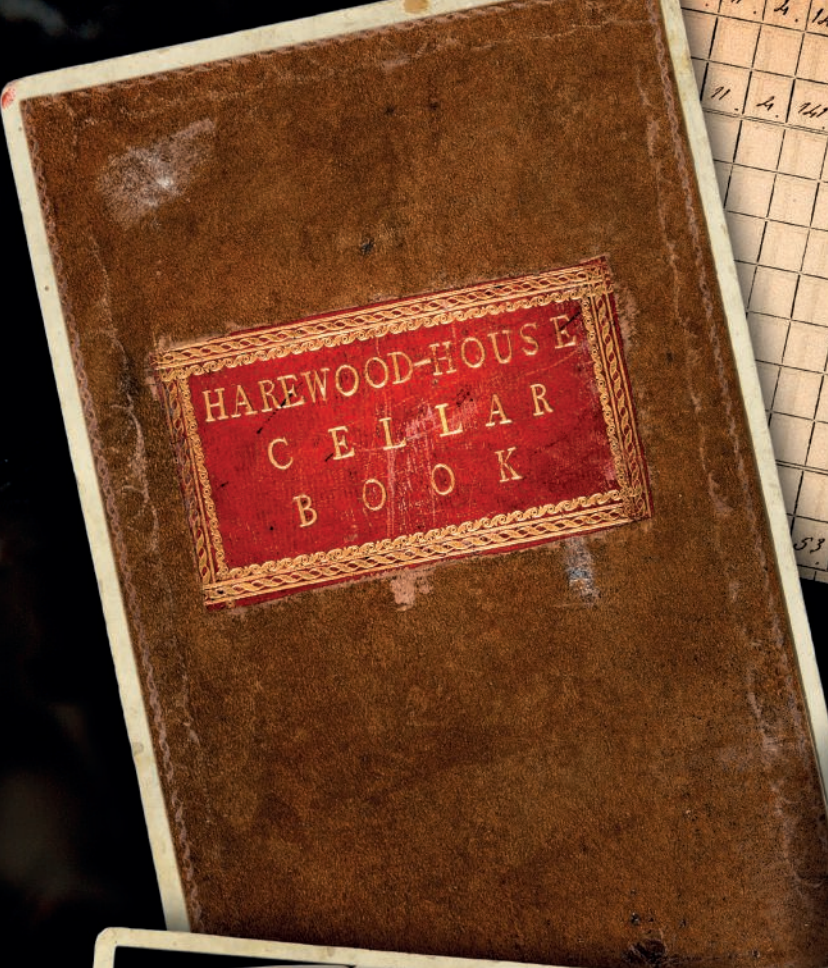

RAREST GRAPPA

Many products claim to be limited production and artisanal, but few truly are. The Grappas that were produced by Romano Levi, can authentically claim to be just that. The grappas which were distilled from the pomace left over from wine making in the region, are known to be some of the finest spirits ever distilled, and were made on a tiny scale by the legendary producer until his death in 2008. Each batch of grappa was produced differently with post-distillation ageing happening in a range of wooden vessels and the aesthetic consideration that sets them apart is that every individual bottle was hand illustrated, no two bottles that Levi made were exactly the same, they are true one-off pieces.

RAREST ABSINTHE

Absinthe is a famous spirit typically distilled to between 45-75% alcohol by volume. Its flavour derives from a variety of herbs and botanicals, most notably wormwood and anise, which gives it its characteristic flavour. The name is derived from "Artemesia Absinthium" which is the principal botanical used in its production. Absinthe is one of the most romantically mythologized alcoholic drinks in the world owing to its close association with the history of literature, poetry and art and its relationship with ideas of liberation, hidden meanings, altered perception and craving for sensation. It figures prominently in the works and lives of poets and authors like Beaudelaire, Rimbaud, Verlaine, Oscar Wilde, Alfred Jarry, James Joyce, Emile Zola and Hemingway.

Its most important artistic association lies with 19th century painters whose many works were the most notable to comment on the social effects of drinking Absinthe. Édouard Manet's first important work was "The Absinthe Drinker" painted in 1859. This was followed by works by artists throughout the remainder of the 19th and early 20th century. For example: Degas; "The Glass of Absinthe" in 1876; Van Gogh; "Absinthe Bottle and Glass" in 1886 and "Night Cafe at Arles" in 1888. Gauguin; "Dans un Cafe a Arles" in 1888. Lautrec; "Van Gogh Drinking Absinthe in a Cafe" in 1887, "The Absinthe drinker" in 1888 and "Monsieur Boileau at the Cafe" in 1893. Albert Maignon; "Green Muse" in 1895.

History

Absinthe as a curative medicine was mentioned in ancient Egyptian texts and in antiquity by Pythagoras, Hippocrates, Pliny the Elder and Galen. In the late 18th century the Henriad sisters were making a distilled spirit of Absinthe sold for its medicinal properties, in the Swiss district of Val-de-Travers. Major Henri Dubied bought the Henriad's recipe in 1797 and together with his son-in-law, Henri-Louis Pernod set up a company in Couvet to distil and market Absinthe as a beverage, transforming Absinthe from a medicinal drink to an aperitif. In 1805 Henri-Louis Pernod opened a factory in Pontarlier, France, founding the first French brand of Absinthe, "Pernod Fils". Major Dubied split from Pernod and sold Absinthe under the name "Dubied Père et Fils". His younger son, Constant, passed "Dubied Père et Fils" to a cousin, Fritz Duval.

The "Age of Absinthe" began in the 1840's when French soldiers who had been given Absinthe as a fever preventative during the Algerian War returned to France bringing the habit of Absinthe drinking with them. During the second half of the 19th century, Absinthe drinking rose steadily. In Parisian cafes like the "Nouvelle Athenes", the "Brassiere des Martyrs", "Lapin Agile", "Le Chat Noir", and numerous others, five o'clock became known as "L'Heure Verte" or the Green Hour, a reference to the colour of Absinthe. The flavour, potency, green colour and the ritual of Absinthe drinking appealed to many people who wished to enjoy life's pleasures. Until the late 1870's Absinthe was relatively expensive by comparison to wine. In the 1880's when phylloxera devastated French vineyards and vastly reduced the availability of wine, the result was an explosive increase in Absinthe drinking. By the 1890's Absinthe was in vogue all around the world. By 1912, France was producing 36 million litres of Absinthe per year. In 1900, Absinthe became the target of the temperance movement and by 1915 it had been banned in Europe and the U.S.A. In less than ten years Absinthe went from being one of the world's most famous drinks to being non-existent, destroyed by temperance zealots, economic interests, fear of social change, and spurious science.

Absinthe remained banned for 95 years until 2005 when it again became legal to produce; the result of modern science proving it was not more harmful than ordinary spirits. By the early 21st century approximately 200 brands of Absinthe were being produced in more than a dozen countries including Switzerland, France, Germany and the Czech Republic. During those 95 years, remaining stocks of "Pre-Ban Absinthe" have virtually disappeared. Bottles of authentic period Absinthe in excellent original condition are of extreme rarity; one of the last bottles appearing in a Christie's London auction in 1999.

ARTADI

Bodegas ARTADI is today, undoubtedly, a reference point as one of the best Bodegas in Spain. This success is based on their daily work in the vineyards and the search of pure/honest wines tied to the history and the tradition of their ancestors.

The seeds of this renowned winery started in 1981, when its current owner, Juan Carlos López de Lacalle, together with this family and thirteen local growers founded a cooperative. The cooperative focused on the production of Carbonic Maceration wines, very traditional and popular in the Rioja Alavesa region. In 1992, the cooperative was dissolved and Bodegas y Viñedos Artadi de Laguardia, S.A. was established. Step by step during the last 40 years, they have set different challenges and reached goals to discover the great values that are hidden among the vineyards in the region.

VIÑA EL PISÓN

After all his life dedicated to the vine growing and the production of wine, in 1945 Mr. Jenaro San Pedro, made his personal and family dream come true by planting Viña El Pisón. The estate chosen was a piece of land close to the village, with a medieval mill in the centre, located in a natural amphitheatre. He then built a stone wall to get some privacy for him and his special relationship with his vines. In 1963 he passed away, at the age of eighty years old, but his dream did not end with him; his family continued it. In 1991, driven by this admiration to his grandfather, Juan Carlos López de Lacalle took up the torch to pay a tribute to him and produced Viña El Pisón.

The balance between the natural factors that are part of the environment produce a wine full of subtle mineral character, pure fruit, delicate spicy hints and enveloping tannins. A wine with a surprising expression and energy. Natural elegance.

PAGOS VIEJOS

The great balance of the old vineyards makes the authentic spirit of this wine. Low production, together with painstaking elaboration and ageing of the wine within the barrel gives a colourful wine with complex aromas, good backbone and long finish.

I first visited Bodega Artadi back in the summer of 1998, Juan Carlos and Ana were as hospitable and welcoming then as they were on my last visit in March 2017, nearly twenty years later. In that time the winery has been completely transformed, and now almost near completion is the new barrel room, tasting room and dining area. The philosophy in relation to making wine has remained constant, absolute attention to detail and a desire to make a final wine that is a pure expression of the vineyard that produces it. The wines produced at Artadi are classic examples of Tempranillo in its most expressive, pure form.

A BEFORE THE SALE

1 DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

(a) Certain words used in the catalogue description have special meanings. You can find details of these on the page headed 'Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice' which forms part of these terms. You can find a key to the Symbols found next to certain catalogue entries under the section of the catalogue called 'Symbols Used in this Catalogue'.

(b) Our description of any **lot** in the catalogue, any **condition** report and any other statement made by us (whether orally or in writing) about any **lot**, including about its nature or **condition**, artist, period, materials, approximate dimensions or **provenance** are our opinion and not to be relied upon as a statement of fact. We do not carry out in-depth research of the sort carried out by professional historians and scholars. All dimensions and weights are approximate only.

2 OUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR DESCRIPTION OF LOTS

We do not provide any guarantee in relation to the nature of a **lot** apart from our **authenticity warranty** contained in paragraph E2 and to the extent provided in paragraph I below.

3 CONDITION

(a) The **condition** of **lots** sold in our auctions can vary widely due to factors such as age, previous damage, restoration, repair and wear and tear. 3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The **auctioneer** can at his sole option:

(a) refuse any bid;

(b) move the bidding backwards or forwards in any way he or she may decide, or change the order of the **lots**;

(c) withdraw any **lot**;

(d) divide any **lot** or combine any two or more **lots**;

(e) reopen or continue the bidding even after the hammer has fallen; and

(b) If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's Group** company, we can use any amount you do pay, including any deposit or other part-payment you have made to us, or which we owe you, to pay off any amount you owe to us or another **Christie's Group** company for any transaction.

(c) If you make payment in full after the **due date**, and we choose to accept such payment we may charge you storage and transport costs from the date that is 30 calendar days following the auction in accordance with paragraphs Gd(i) and (ii). In such circumstances paragraph Gd(viii) shall apply.

5 KEEPING YOUR PROPERTY

1 COLLECTION

No failure or delay to exercise any right or remedy provided under these Conditions of Sale shall constitute a waiver of that or any other right or remedy, nor shall it prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.

9 LAW AND DISPUTES

From time to time, Christie's may offer a **lot** which it owns in whole or in part. Such property is identified in the catalogue with the symbol △ next to its **lot** number. Where Christie's has an ownership or financial interest in every **lot** in the catalogue, Christie's will not designate each **lot** with a symbol, but will state its interest in the front of the catalogue.

○ **Minimum Price Guarantees**

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain lots consigned for sale. This will usually be where it has guaranteed to the Seller that whatever the outcome of the auction, the Seller will receive a minimum sale price for the work. This is known as a minimum price guarantee. Where Christie's holds such financial interest we identify such **lots** with the symbol ○ next to the **lot** number.

○◆ **Third Party Guarantees/Irrevocable bids**

Where Christie's has provided a Minimum Price Guarantee it is at risk of making a loss, which can be significant, if the **lot** fails to sell. 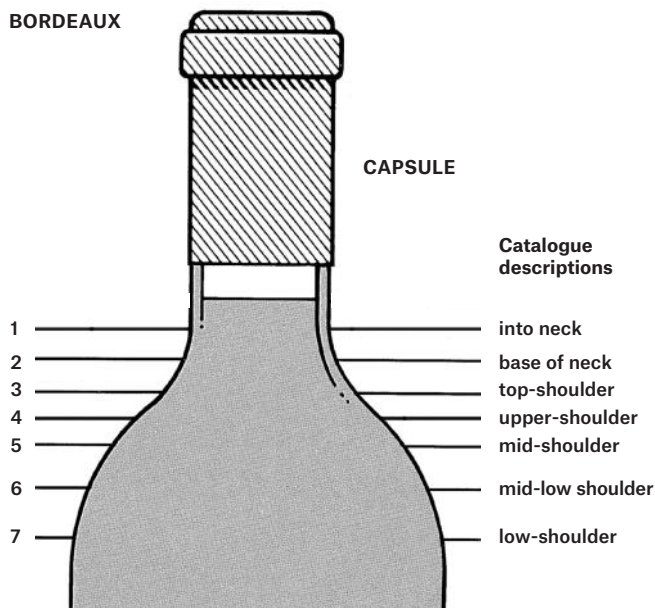

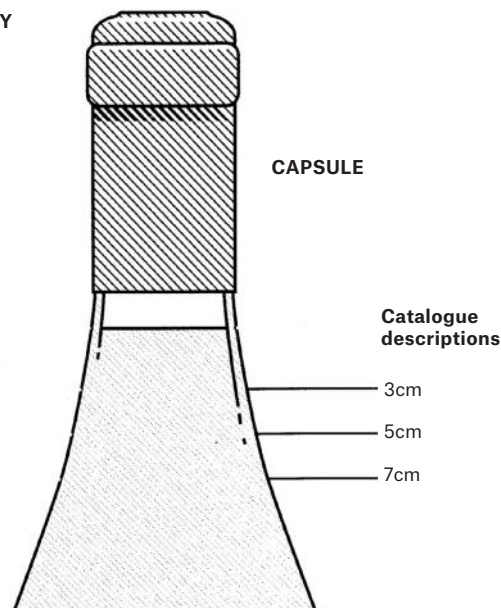

- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 base of neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 4 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.

- 5 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 6 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 7 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

- magnum = two regular bottles
- marie-jeanne = three regular bottles
- double-magnum = four regular bottles
- jeroboam = four regular bottles (Burgundy, Champagne)

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

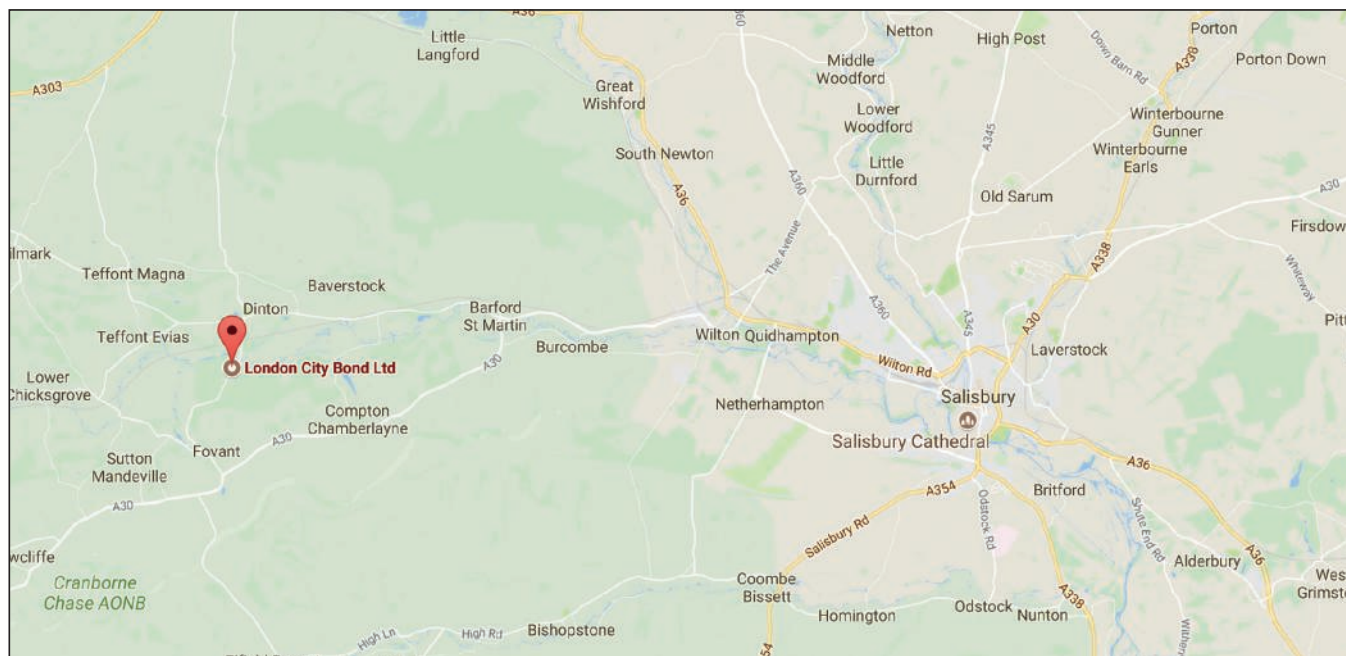

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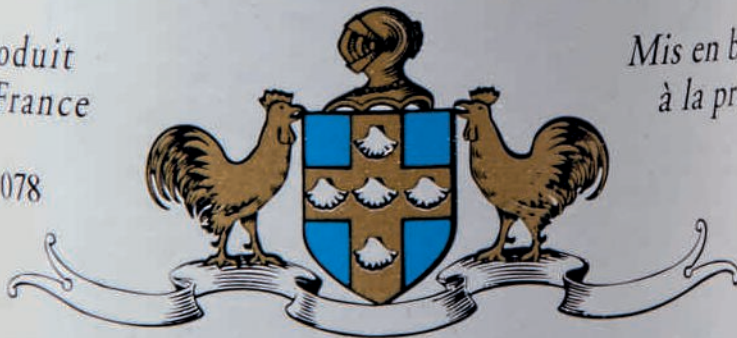
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
