This is a celebration of quality not quantity, a tribute to the greats and offers collectors around the world a chance to enjoy these historical icons that are becoming so hard to find. And there in lies the heart of Christen's primary focus on his wine collecting: to be shared with friends and fellow wine-lovers over a great meal. To command conversation, discussion and enjoyment!

From walking passed the window on King Street in 1987, to his close friendship with the iconic late Head of Wine, Michael Broadbent MW and more recently sharing a truly spectacular tasting for some of the team. Christie's is honored to have such a long-standing friendship with Christen.

We are proud to be part of Christen's vinous journey and now to continue this with Grand Cru Part III. Giving wine-lovers around the world a chance to obtain some legendary bottles and share them round the table with their own wine loving friends – just how Christen intended!

對於購藏佳釀,Christen Sveaas專注挑選最珍罕上乘的美酒,並對經典年份和波爾多名莊的臻釀情有獨鍾。是次拍賣匯聚年份橫跨 1858至2015年的佳釀,將150多年的葡萄酒歷史呈現眼前。從十九世紀的d'Yquem陳年醇釀,到1920、1940和1950年代的傳奇年份名釀,包括1928年份Latour、1945年份Lafite-Rothschild和 Mouton-Rothschild、1959年份Petrus和1961年份Palmer,這批私人窖藏均經過精挑細選,讓我們深入了解Christen Sveaas的獨到品味和喜好。

這次拍賣不僅頌揚質重於量的理念,更向傳奇人物致敬,並為各地藏家帶來難能可貴的機會,購藏益發稀有難求的陳年名釀。這也是 Christen Sveaas收藏佳釀的目標:與好友和其他愛酒之士一同品嚐美酒佳餚,交流心得,把酒言歡!

Message from Christen Sveaas

My first wine purchase was whilst being a student in St. Gallen in Switzerland. Back in those days, Swiss pharmacists had a licence to sell wine and liquor. In the window of one such pharmacist in Langgasse, there were some older bottles exhibited in the window, I went inside and asked whether he had more old bottles for sale. He took me to his cellar and complained it was impossible to sell these old bottles. I bought the whole lot, around 30 bottles. I did not have any knowledge about which wines were good in what vintages, but remember the bottles being from 1953, 1956 and 1957. I tasted them all and found them interesting and wanting for more. To this day, I still have a few half bottles left of Avery Grand Echezeaux 1957 in my cellar merely as a curiosa. Some years later, in 1982 when my father passed away, I discovered a locked cupboard in his basement with some average Sauternes from the fifties, which triggered a further interest in, and curiosity about wines with age.

Some years later, on a business trip to London in February 1987, I passed the street front windows of Christie's King Street galleries and saw displayed in the window, three cases of 1945 Taylor Vintage Port, that were being offered for sale a few days later. The end-of-war vintage made me very eager to get these bottles, and I succedded in securing them at a fair price. In the same sale, I also ended up buying three cases of 1945 Croft, a case of 1970 Lafite, a 1924 Magnum Latour and some cases of 1963 Taylor Vintage Port. Now I was officially hooked! The thrill that day, the feeling of having made a great purchase and looking forward to drinking these bottles in due course, was what prompted the beginning of a life-long love affair with wine, and which has given me immense pleasure, and more memorable stories than can be recounted on this mere page. I will however try to share some insights or experiences that I have gained over the last thirtyfive or so years as a collector of wine.

The essence I believe is that wine brings a certain magic to a meal, it loosens the tongue and stimulates great conversations about wine, business, politics, culture and other topics. Whilst many forms of collecting can be a deeply personal, intellectual and studious activity, my wine collection is primarily with the purpose of enjoyment and to be shared with friends, wine-lovers and other wine enthusiasts. Being of that opinion, I never drink wine alone. Wine with good food is a social endeavour, and the extraordinary magic of opening a bottle of rare Bordeaux from 1928, 1945 or 1961 should be a shared experience, to be remembered and cherished as these bottles are so rare. Some of these legendary vintages are so youthful and are sure to last for many more decades. To this day, I still remember opening a Magnum of Chateau Margaux 1900 at the estate of Haaken Eric Mathiesen at Eidsvoll in Norway. This 100 point wine was still so young and fresh, and to quote Robert Parker: a winemaking tour de force!

As with wine itself, taste evolves over the years and gets more refined. Even so, I have always been true to and primarily focused on Bordeaux, and awaited patiently these wine's late maturing. The Bordeaux grapes feel better on my palate than the Pinot Noir grapes, whereas of course white Burgundys are absolutely fabulous. Naturally you cannot drink rare wines every day, and so I invariably also enjoy a good Barolo and other Italian and Spanish wines. I am excited about the opportunity that this sale presents to other wine lovers, giving them a chance to taste some exceptionally rare and well kept wines. Finally I have a great admiration for Chateau D'Yquem which is demonstrated by the sale's vertical offering of this outstanding producer. I have been fortunate enough to host Michael Broadbent for dinner on two occassions, in 1996 and then again in 2006. On both occassions I served Yquem, including the 1893 and the 1928, both are also included in this sale and they drink superbly. My good friend Michael Broadbent, and the ex-head of Christie's Wine Department in London, Paul Bowker have been a constant assurance, alongside the very experienced team at Christie's Wine Department. I am therefore very pleased to be conducting this third Grand Cru sale with Christie's and in Hong Kong.

The most memorable wines I have drunk in my life are:

- · Château Lafite 1900 and 1959

- · Château La Mission Huat Brion 1945 incredible wine
- · Château Palmer 1928 and 1961 the latter beating many of the first growths in my tastings
- · Château Gruaud Larose 1928, Château Calon Segur 1947

CHRISTEN SVEAAS 引言

我第一次購買葡萄酒,還是正在瑞士聖加侖讀書期間。那時,瑞士藥劑師擁有售賣葡萄酒和烈酒的牌照。在Langgasse一個藥房的櫥窗內,陳列著一些舊酒瓶。我走進去,詢問有沒有更多的舊酒出售,藥劑師就把我帶到他的酒窖,嘮叨著那些陳年舊酒總是賣不出去。我買下了全部,大約有30瓶。我並不懂哪些是好酒,什麼年份最佳,只記得它們分別產自1953年、1956年和1957年。我一一品嘗,覺得很有趣,而且想擁有更多。時至今日,我的酒窖還保存著幾瓶喝剩半瓶的Avery Grand Echezeaux 1957珍品。幾年後,家父在1982年去世,我在他的地庫中發現一個上了鎖的櫥櫃,內藏一些五十年代的Sauternes,這進一步引發了我對陳年萄葡酒的興趣與好奇之心。

1987年2月,我到倫敦公幹,經過位於國王街的佳士得藝廊,看見櫥窗裏陳列著三箱1945年的Taylor Vintage Port,即將在數天後開售。二戰末期年份的佳釀,讓我十分渴望擁有。我成功地以合理的價格將其收入囊中,並在同場拍賣中,入手三箱1945年的Croft、一箱1970年的Lafite、一箱1924年的1.5公升裝Latour和數箱1963年的Taylor Vintage Port。這時我真的上癮了!當天的興奮、買得心頭好的激動、品嘗這些佳釀的期盼……都開啟了我對葡萄酒的終生熱愛,帶給我無限愉悅,收藏之旅中的難忘回憶遠遠無

法在此序言中——詳述。然而,我仍想與大家分享,過去35年間我作為葡萄酒收藏家的體會與經驗。

美酒能在餐桌上施展魔法,我對此深信不疑。它能放鬆喉舌,引發出美酒、商業、政治及文化等精彩話題。有些收藏深深反映藏家性格、品味見識或卓越學識,而我的葡萄酒收藏,只是純粹為了享受佳釀,旨在與好友、酒友及其他葡萄酒愛好者一同品味與分享。因此,我從不獨飲。葡萄酒配搭美食,就是連繫社會的動力。當你打開一瓶彌足珍貴的1928年、1945年或1961年波爾多葡萄酒時,其無與倫比的魔力,絕對值得公諸同好、珍而重之、銘記於心。有些經典年份的美酒散發著充滿活力的味道,定必能繼續陳年數十載。直至今天,我仍然記得在挪威Eidsvoll的Haaken Eric Mathiesen酒莊,品嘗了Château Margaux 1900的大瓶裝。這瓶上佳的滿分美酒,仍是如此年輕而清新,用Robert Parker的名句作結:釀酒傑作,精彩至極!

同葡萄酒一樣,收藏家的品味亦隨時間流逝而愈發精純。儘管如此,我一直對波爾多紅酒情有獨鍾,矢志不移,耐心地等待著晚熟陳釀。對我來說,波爾多葡萄的口感更勝黑皮諾葡萄,而布艮地的白葡萄就更是絕佳。當然,你無法每天都享用珍罕佳釀,所以我也喜歡優質的Barolo和其他意大利及西班牙葡萄酒。能藉著這次拍賣會,讓其他葡萄酒愛好者品嘗極其罕見且狀況良好的葡萄酒,我深感興奮。最後,我對Château d'Yquem的名釀十分欣賞,本次拍賣中亦涵蓋這一傳奇酒莊的垂直年份名釀。在1996年和2006年,我有幸兩度邀請好友Michael Broadbent共進晚餐,分別暢飲1893年及1928年的Yquem,兩者均將在這次拍賣中現身。Michael Broadbent和佳士得倫敦名酒部前主管Paul Bowker,以及佳士得名酒部經驗豐富的團隊,一直為我頂級葡萄酒收藏的信心保證。因此,我深感欣喜能與佳士得攜手於香港舉辦第三屆特級園拍賣。

A Memorable Tasting in Oslo

Oslo had been unseasonably warm in the two days preceding our "nightcap" with Christen Sveaas. On the day of the tasting, a blanket of snow and tangible drop in temperatures arrived; acting as a fitting dramatic backdrop to such an event. As we approached Christen's house, walking through Frogner in the biting, brilliant January night, there was a rare sense of anticipation for what might follow.

When one is invited for a nightcap, a reasonable expectation might be a glass of Cognac, whisky or some other *digestif* to bookend a great meal. This evening's nightcap was cut from different cloth. Had circumstances been different, and our generous host not been committed to dining with dignitaries, our tasting would most likely have been a long dinner, but there are some invitations one cannot turn down, not even to share bottles of Petrus 1945 and Latour-à-Pomerol 1961. So instead, we were invited for a nightcap, and not just one, which started at midnight and involved an exceptional six-course seasonal menu and featured some of the greatest, rarest Bordeaux ever bottled.

The group of tasters met shortly after 11pm in Christen's apartment, congregating in rooms filled with some of the great works in the artistic canon – from Munch to Condo, and started the evening with magnums of Dom Pérignon and oscietra caviar, to whet our palates for the extraordinary vinous experiences that were to follow.

The legendary vintages from Bordeaux's finest châteaux certainly lived up to their stellar reputations and provided one of the most memorable nights ever for the very fortunate attendees. Our host, a skilled raconteur, held the attention of the assembled tasters with tales of beautiful, bygone bottles of 19th century d'Yquem and ancient Petrus served *en magnum* to an enraptured Michael Broadbent MW. We sit there sharing stories and these irreplaceable bottles until the early hours, before wandering out into the frozen Oslo night, it's like waking from an extraordinary dream.

The night's incredible tasting is testament to our host's generosity and the quality of what is one of the world's great cellars! We cannot thank Christen enough.

令人難忘的奧斯陸品酒會

與名酒藏家Christen Sveaas「晚間小酌」前兩天,奧斯陸異常地和暖,但在品酒會當天卻下了一場雪,氣溫明顯驟降,為活動提供了 最迷人的背景。在寒風刺骨而明朗的1月晚上,我們沿弗朗納信步前往Christen的家,並對聚會懷著一份莫名的期待。

獲邀與朋友把酒夜談時,通常會想起干邑、威士忌或其他餐後酒,為盛宴作結,但這一晚卻與別不同。若熱情的主人家沒有答應與重要的客人共晉晚餐,相信品酒會應會以一頓悠長晚宴的形式進行,但始終有些邀請無法推卻,即使一同品嚐1945年份Petrus和1961年份Latour-a-Pomerol 1961美酒的良機亦要稍候。因此,Christen邀請我們在晚上相聚淺酌,並從午夜開始一邊品嚐六道時令美食,一邊細味難得一見的波爾多珍釀。

各賓客在晚上11時到Christen的寓所後,被帶往放滿孟克(Munch)和康多(Condo)等藝術巨匠精彩傑作的房間,先品嚐1.5公升裝的Dom Pérignon香檳和奧西特拉鱘魚子醬,繼而準備迎接緊隨其後的品酒盛會。

來自波爾多頂級名莊的傳奇年份美酒果然不負所望,為有幸獲邀出席的客人帶來極難忘的一夜。擅長說故事的主人家分享了他向葡萄酒大師邁克爾·布羅德本特(Michael Broadbent MW),奉上1.5公升裝十九世紀d'Yquem和陳年Petrus佳釀的精彩故事,令出席品酒會的人士心馳神往。我們促膝長談,共嚐珍罕美酒直至夜深後,徘徊於奧斯陸的寒夜之中,感覺恍如從美夢中醒來。

這場與眾不同的品酒會不但反映主人家的慷慨,也展示全球其中一個經典窖藏的非凡品質,實在非常感謝Christen。

19 January 2023. Tim Triptree MW and Noah May

1893 Château d'Yquem. This 1893 Château d'Yquem certainly lives up to the stellar reputation of the 1893 vintage in Sauternes. Very deep golden amber colour with very intense aromatics that leapt from the glass; rich marmalade, honey, crème brûlée and barley sugar with subtle hints of toasted hazelnuts and a touch of volatile acidity adding to the intensity of the bouquet. Full bodied and medium sweet with a fantastic balance of the sweetness with freshness, vibrancy and concentration of flavours. Rich flavours of ripe peach, dried apricots with a very long and persistent moreish finish. Absolutely delicious and a truly impressive Yquem with amazing power and longevity. Now-2050. 99 Points. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

This is an exceptional wine by any metric; one of the greatest vintages of d'Yquem I have tasted and a perfect example of this legendary wine. Deep mahogany-tinged gold. Majestic, intense aromas of marmalade, dried apricots, figs, cacao and Oolong tea. Incredible concentration, balanced by beautiful, lifted acidity which leaves a long, bewitching finish that's kaleidoscopic in range. A deeply moving wine. (Noah May)

1900 Château Lafite. Bottled by Barton & Guestier. Recorked in 1999: Pale ruby with garnet and mahogany hints, showing significant evolution of colour. Fully evolved nose dominated by tertiary notes such as mocha, hints of mushroom and truffle, leather and an earthy and smoky tobacco character. On the palate, medium-bodied and still fresh and lively with subtle red and black cherry fruit character with refined soft tannins with a moderate persistent finish. A delicate fully matured 1900 with the classic Lafite "elegance". Drink soon. 92 Points. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

Pale ruby/garnet, showing age in the glass, but there is a brightness which perhaps speaks of the re-corking. Fully mature, with notes of leather, mocha, earth and meaty, wild game animale aromas. A savoury wine on the palate, some dark fruits and torrefaction, a little short on the finish, with slight astringency. (Noah May)

1945 Château La Mission Haut-Brion. A fantastic La Mission Haut-Brion more than living up to the legendary status of the superlative 1945 vintage in Bordeaux. Medium deep ruby with garnet hints, showing evolution of colour. Very complex and expressive nose; smoke, cedar and cigar with leather and spice with a dried herbal nuance. On the palate, very intense and explosive flavours, with impressive concentration of black cherry and cassis fruit with a fabulous depth of flavour and richness and a supremely long lingering finish. Refined yet firm tannic structure in perfect harmony with the vibrant acidity and concentrated fruit flavours. Very impressive. At peak drinking now, but with the power and depth to go on for another decade at least. 99 Points. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

I noted down a quote from Christen at dinner "A wine like 1945 LMHB takes you away, shows you things about love, respect and humility. How could something like this come from a grape"

Christen's sentiment summed up this wine for me, the 1945 LMHB is a singular and beautiful wine. Medium ruby/garnet, light, translucent in the glass. Suave, understated, and at almost 80 years of age, a testament to the longevity and nuanced charms of this property. Intense ripe cassis, mocha, truffle, violets, and Chinese tea on the nose, something primal, the aromatics defy characterisation. The palate is ripe, intense and with the broad structure of the vintage, coupled with a softness and lingering sweetness. Returning to the glass later, there is more Asian spice: clove, anise and an impression of truffle. (Noah May)

1947 Château Cheval Blanc. Norwegian-bottled: Medium deep ruby with garnet hints, showing evolution of colour. High toned with volatile acidity on the nose, with complex aromatics such as fennel, aniseed and liquorice notes. On the palate full bodied with rich black and red cherry flavours and impressive depth and concentration and a long persistent finish. At peak drinking window but will remain so for another decade. Lacking the "sweetness" of fruit and port-like opulence of previous Chateaubottled examples, but still a very impressive wine. 97 Points. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

This wine seems a little volatile on first opening, (a characteristic of the vintage), with air the bottle opens into a wine with enveloping, herbal/floral aromatics of iris and rose a notable sweetness which speaks of the peculiarities of the vintage. Ripe, black cherry on the palate, smoke, and game meats. The concentration of other examples I've tasted isn't there in this bottle, but there is something here that couldn't easily be replicated. (Noah May)

1945 Petrus. Rebouche in 1995. Medium-deep ruby with garnet hints, showing colour evolution. Multi-layered complex nose with cedar and truffle intermingled with cinnamon and exotic spice, roasted coffee beans with a delightful meaty savoury nuance. Well-balanced with generosity on the palate; an opulent richly flavoured wine with mouth filling ripe black cherry and plum flavours. Very intense and powerful wine with fine yet firm tannins and a long persistent finish. Drinking superbly now, but has the tannic structure, vibrant fruit and depth of flavour to be able to age, although don't decant too far ahead of serving. 96 Points. 19 January 2023. (Bottle 1 had touch of cork taint/ TCA on nose, so opened bottle 2) (*Tim Triptree MW*)

A legendary wine that was central to creating the modern reputation of Petrus. Dark ruby/garnet, almost unctuous, heavy with fruit and extract. The nose exhibits a multifarious, exotic character: clove, leather, sandalwood, "incense in an old Duomo". Opulent dark fruits on the palate, with some balsamic flavours. A powerful, seductive, exotic wine and very exciting to taste, a unique expression of Merlot. Waning slightly now, but what a joy to taste. (Noah May)

1961 Château Palmer. This fabulous bottle of 1961 Château Palmer certainly lived up to its reputation as the finest vintage ever of Palmer and arguably the best of the 1961's: Medium-deep

ruby with garnet hints, showing evolution of colour. Wow, what a nose with pronounced and intense cassis, blackberry and black cherry fruit intermingled with black truffle, sweet spices and mocha with subtle fragrant violet perfume nuances. Delightful hints of eucalyptus and green bell pepper, giving notice of the proportion of Cabernet Sauvignon in the blend. Full bodied red with concentrated blackberry, plum and cherry flavours, silky refined fine-grained tannins with mouth-watering acidity and a supremely long and lingering finish. An incredible wine with perfect balance of fruit concentration, multi-layered complexity due to the bottle age and vibrant refreshing acidity. Has the structure to age for another two decades. Very impressive Palmer 1961, combining power and finesse. 100 Points . 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

Late, Mahler-Besse release. Absolutely magnificent. Bright, luminous ruby in the glass. The first of two wines that come close to perfection, and defy categorisation. The Palmer 1961 is clearly the wine of the left bank in this vintage and the greatest Margaux wine I've ever tasted. Layer upon layer of character start to show with time in decanter/glass. The wine is marked by its floral character, on the nose there is rose, iris, violet, aromas redolent of the great wines of the Cote de Nuits or even those the great wines of Piedmont. This is a wine that shape-shifts and moves through various stages in the glass, the length in the mouth is extraordinary. It is a pleasure to keep returning to, as it is never the same. Quite simply one of the greatest wines ever bottled. (Noah May)

1961 Château Latour a Pomerol. This superlative bottle of 1961 Latour a Pomerol certainly lived up to its legendary reputation as one of the very best wines ever produced in Bordeaux and undoubtedly vying with Château Palmer as the best of the 1961's. Medium-deep ruby with garnet hints, showing colour evolution. Extraordinarily complex and evolved aromatics with leather and liquorice with hints of spice and black truffle. On the palate incredibly opulent and generous with mouth filling flavours of black cherry, plum, blueberry and mulberry with fine silky velvety tannins. Plush and ripe fruit with a perfect balance of concentration of flavours and refreshing mouth-watering acidity and an incredibly long persistent finish that goes on and on..... An honour and privilege to taste such a powerful, complex and complete Pomerol. At peak drinking now and will drink well over the next 10 to 15 years. 100 Points. 19 January 2023. (Tim Triptree MW)

"Wow" is the opening statement to be made here. This is a wine for the ages. A legend that sits in a tiny microcosm of the rarest and most sought out wines in Bordeaux. A wine that's known to be much copied, so real and well-stored examples are about as rare as it gets these days. This bottle which came from the collection of Dr. Aziz Khan via Zachys in 2013, lived up to the considerable legend. Deep, dense ruby, glycerol slides down the sides of the glass, and ripples extravagantly. The nose is explosive in the purest, most rarefied sense - mulberry, Perigord truffle, sous bois, leather, sandalwood and smoke. So pure, yet marked with a enveloping richesse, that is hard to achieve at 60+ plus. This wine stands alone. It combines everything that great, well-stored Pomerol looks to encompass at this mature juncture. (Noah May)

1959 Château Mouton Rothschild. Deep ruby with garnet rim. A touch of bottle stink at first with a possible light contamination of cork taint, but under that and with time in glass, the nose

revealed the classic Pauillac bouquet of cedar, pencil lead and cigar box. Medium-bodied red with bright cherry and cassis flavours. Combines finesse and elegance with generous and opulent fruit. Fine silky soft tannins. 94 Points. Drink over the next decade. Not at its stellar best, but still a lovely bottle of 1959 Mouton. 19 January 2023. (Tim Triptree MW)

Dark ruby/garnet with youthful appearance. On the nose the wine exhibits such vivacity – cassis, menthol, leather, eucalyptus/cigar box aromas someone at the table describes as "an apothecary's wallet" This is the quintessential Pauillac, so much complexity, if anything this wine hasn't reached its peak yet. (Noah May)

1959 Château Margaux. Deep ruby with garnet hints, showing evolution of colour. Evolved bouquet with nuances of tobacco and spice with complex notes of mocha and savoury cured meats. Full bodied with fine silky tannins and a great balance of vibrant acidity and fruit concentration and a long finish. 95. Drink over the next decade. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

Ruby/garnet, showing some maturity. Subtlety on the nose – light, soft and resolved – tertiary aromas – torrefaction, wild mushroom, charcuterie, and something notably mineral. A classic Margaux style, lighter, more delicate than other wines. (Noah May)

1959 Château Latour. A glorious bottle of Latour 1959 living up to its reputation as an outstanding and powerful complete wine. Deep ruby with garnet hints, showing some evolution of colour but surprisingly deep, almost opaque hue. Incredible powerful and complex multifaceted nose with spice, cedar, cigar box and truffle nuances over rich cassis and blackberry fruit. On the palate very intense concentrated flavours of black cherry, blackberry and cassis with firm yet fine dusty tannins, mouthwatering vibrant acidity and a very long persistence of flavour. A classic and utterly delicious Latour. 99 Points. Will hold for another few decades at least. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

A monumental Latour. More classic than the 1961, with more obvious savoury character. The colour is almost purple, so youthful is its gait. The nose is pure cassis, blackberry, graphite and leather. You'd struggle to place this wine its mid-60s, it is as vital and brilliant as any 1982. On the palate, an edge of ferrous heft, vies with pure elegance, pure Latour, a beautiful bruiser, a wine with decades to evolve. (Noah May)

1964 Château La Fleur, St Emilion. Deep ruby with garnet hints, showing surprisingly little evolution of colour. Complex nose with earthy dusty tea leaf aromatics with mocha and truffle. Full bodied, lush and generous on the palate with rich ripe red and black cherry and plummy flavours. Fine supple tannins with a good balance of refreshing acidity and depth of flavour and length on the finish. 94 Points. Drink over the next 5-8 years. 19 January 2023. (*Tim Triptree MW*)

This wine from the lesser-known, Ch. La Fleur in St. Emilion, proved an impressive underdog here, in such extolled company. the wine pours an almost purple shade of ruby. Fresh and youthful on the nose – ripe blueberry, boysenberry, wet stones, and smoky lapsang souchong tea. The wine is bright and youthful on the palate, well-balanced and delicious. The wine lacks the intensity and length of some of its brethren here, but very good for a 60 year old St. Emilion. (Noah May)

CHATEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

Château Lafite Rothschild, owned by the Rothschild family for five generations, was acquired by Baron James de Rothschild in 1868. The existence of Lafite as a medieval fief dates back to the 14th century; at the beginning of the 18th century Lafite's wine was already being sold in London, where it was a favourite of the Prime Minister, Robert Walpole. In France, Lafite soon became known as the "King's wine", after being introduced to the Court at Versailles by Maréchal Richelieu. The classification of the Grands Crus Classés, prepared on the occasion of the 1855 Universal Exhibition in Paris, officially ranked Château Lafite as the "Premier des Premiers". The 112 hectare vineyard consists of three main areas: the slopes around the Château, the adjacent Carruades plateau to the west and a 4.5 hectare plot in the neighbouring commune of Saint Estèphe. The vines are planted in well-drained and well-exposed soil made up of fine, deep gravel, mixed with aeolian sand on a subsoil of tertiary limestone. The grape varieties are Cabernet Sauvignon (70%), Merlot (25%), Cabernet Franc (3%) and Petit Verdot (2%). The average age of the vines is 45 years for the Grand Vin; the oldest plot, "La Gravière", was planted in 1886.

拉菲莊1868 年由詹姆斯羅斯柴爾德男爵買下,至今已在家族中傳承五代。早在14 世紀,拉菲莊就是中世紀的封地;18 世紀初,拉菲莊葡萄酒已經在倫敦有售,當時被譽為是首相羅伯特·沃波爾的至愛佳釀。在法國,自從黎塞留將拉菲莊引入凡爾賽宮宮廷,拉菲莊很快就成為「皇帝御用佳釀」。等級評定制度於1855 年巴黎世界博覽會中誕生,並將拉菲莊正式評定為「一等一」葡萄酒。葡萄園佔地112 公頃,由三個主要地區組成:酒莊附近的山坡,隔鄰向西面伸延的珍寶高地,以及鄰近聖艾斯岱夫地區一塊面積4.5 公頃葡萄田。葡萄藤生長在容易疏水、陽光充足的土地上,土壤由第三系石灰岩基土混合風沙、深層精細砂礫土組成。葡萄品種為赤霞珠(70%)、梅洛(25%)、品麗珠(3%)、小維多(2%)。正牌的葡萄藤平均45 歲,當中最老的一株「La Gravière」,於1886年種下。

CHATEAU LATOUR

Château Latour is situated in the heart of the Médoc wine region, about 50km north-west of Bordeaux, where the legend of the vineyards of Bordeaux began. The Château's prime terroir, l'Enclos, overlooks the estuary of the Gironde river which, over the centuries, has given the vineyard its geological complexity and, on a daily basis, ensures a mild climate. Most of Château Latour's vines are planted on gravelly hilltops that stand 12 to 16 meters above the Gironde estuary. The fortunate combination of the Gironde, layers' of gravel on the surface and clay subsoil gives Château Latour's terroir advantages that few other vineyards can claim. The vineyard currently consists of 90 hectares in production; it is the grapes from the 47 hectares that surround the Château, known as "l'Enclos" that may potentially be used in the production of the Grand Vin. The estate is planted with about 80% of Cabernet Sauvignon, 18% of Merlot and 2% of Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. In the years since 1993. under the leadership of François Pinault and his family, the estate's owners, significant changes have been made with a view to maintaining Château Latour's pursuit of excellence in the wines that it produces. In 1998, Frédéric Engerer, who joined the estate early in 1995, was appointed President. Major works started in November 1999 and continued until September 2003. A total renovation of the winery, vat room, wine making facilities and storage areas enabled even greater precision in the production of the wines. A new technical team was also created. The 90 hectares of the estate are locally managed by Frédéric Engerer and his team. Today, the men and women working at Château Latour in the vineyard and in the cellar are motivated by a search of perfection. Numerous experiments are continuously being carried out in order to judge the suitability of new procedures. This might for example involve biodynamic methods or new traceability systems, their quest is always for precision, quality and awareness of new issues.

酒莊位於波爾多西北面50公里的梅鐸產區中央,是波爾多葡萄 酒傳奇的發源地。酒莊的风土主要源自朗克洛葡萄园,眺望吉倫 特河口,數百年以來形成複雜的地質結構,而氣候則溫和宜人。 拉圖酒莊大部份葡萄樹均種植在吉倫特河口上方12至16米的碎 石山頂上,毗鄰吉倫特河的地理位置,加上泥土表面的礫石層及 黏土底土,造就與眾不同的風土特色。葡萄園目前有90 公頃種 植葡萄樹,其中圍繞酒莊的朗克洛區園地佔地47公頃,此範圍 種植的葡萄可釀製特級葡萄酒。葡萄園內約八成為赤霞珠,18% 為美樂葡萄,其餘2% 為品麗珠及小維多葡萄。弗朗索‧皮諾在 1993年成為莊主後,為保持葡萄酒的出眾品質,他於經營上作 出重大的變革。恩傑爾在1995 年初加入酒莊,並於1998 年擔任 總裁。在1999 年11 月至2003 年9 月期間,酒莊展開多項大型 工程,包括全面翻新釀酒廠、酒桶貯存室、釀酒設備及貯酒庫, 務求令釀酒過程更加精準。另外,酒莊亦設立新的技術團隊。拉 圖酒莊佔地90 公頃,由弗雷德裡克·恩傑爾及其團隊管理。時 至今日,無論是葡萄園還是酒窖的員工,皆致力精益求精,力臻 完美。為測試新釀酒程序的成效,酒莊不斷進行實驗,例如採用 生物動力方法或新穎的溯源系統,務求品質優良精準,並及時解 決各種問題。







These Conditions of Sale and the Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice set out the terms on which we offer the **lots** listed in this catalogue for sale. By registering to bid and/or by bidding at auction you agree to these terms, so you should read them carefully before doing so. You will find a glossary at the end explaining the meaning of the words and expressions coloured in **bold**.

Unless we own a **lot** (Δ symbol), Christie's acts as agent for the seller.

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(a) Certain words used in the catalogue description have special meanings. You can find details of these on the page headed "Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice" which forms part of these terms. You can find a key to the Symbols found next to certain catalogue entries under the section of the catalogue called "Symbols Used in this Catalogue".

(b) Our description of any **lot** in the catalogue, any **condition** report and any other statement made by us (whether orally or in writing) about any **lot**, including about its nature or **condition**, artist, period, materials, approximate dimensions or **provenance** are our opinion and not to be relied upon as a statement of fact. We do not carry out in-depth research of the sort carried out by professional historians and scholars. All dimensions and weights are approximate only.

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We do not provide any guarantee in relation to the nature of a **lot** apart from our **authenticity warranty** contained in paragraph E2 and to the extent provided in paragraph I below.

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(a) The **condition** of **lots** sold in our auctions can vary widely due to factors such as age, previous damage, restoration, repair and wear and tear. Their nature means that they will rarely be in perfect **condition**. **Lots** are sold "as is" in the **condition** they are in at the time of the sale, without any representation or warranty or assumption of liability of any kind as to **condition** by Christie's or by the seller.

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4 VIEWING LOTS PRE-AUCTION

(a) If you are planning to bid on a **lot**, you should inspect it personally or through a knowledgeable representative before you make a bid to make sure that you accept the description and its **condition**. We recommend you get your own advice from a restorer or other professional adviser.

If in our opinion you do not satisfy our bidder identification and registration procedures including, but not limited to completing any anti-money laundering and/or anti-terrorism financing checks we may require to our satisfaction, we may refuse to register you to bid, and if you make a successful bid, we may cancel the contract for sale between you and the seller. 3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The auctioneer can at his sole option:

- (a) refuse any bid;

2 TAXES

2 OUR AUTHENTICITY WARRANTY

We warrant, subject to the terms below, that the **lots** in our sales are **authentic** (our **authenticity warranty**"). If, within 5 years of the date of the auction, you give notice to us that your lot is not **authentic**, subject to the terms below, we will refund the **purchase price** paid by you. The meaning of **authentic** can be found in the glossary at the end of these Conditions of Sale. The terms of the **authenticity warranty** are as follows:

(a) It will be honoured for claims notified within a period of 5 years from the date of the auction. After such time, we will not be obligated to honour the authenticity warranty.

(b) It is given only for information shown in UPPERCASE type in the first line of the catalogue description (the "Heading"). It does not apply to any information other than in the Heading, even if shown in UPPERCASE type.

(c) The authenticity warranty does not apply to any Heading or part of a Heading which is qualified. Qualified means limited by a clarification in a lot's catalogue description or by the use in a Heading of one of the terms listed in the section titled Qualified Headings on the page of the catalogue headed "Important Notices and Explanation of Cataloguing Practice". For example, use of the term "ATTRIBUTED TO....." in a Heading means that the lot is in Christie's opinion probably a work by the named artist but no warranty is provided that the lot is the work of the named artist. Please read the full list of Qualified Headings and a lot's full catalogue description before bidding.

(d) The **authenticity warranty** applies to the **Heading** as amended by any **Saleroom Notice**.

We will not, in any circumstances, be required to pay you more than the **purchase price** nor will we be liable for any loss of profits or business, loss of opportunity or value, expected savings or interest, costs, damages, **other damages** or expenses.

(j) Books. Where the lot is a book, we give an

additional **warranty** for 14 days from the date of the sale that if on collation any **lot** is defective in text or illustration, we will refund your **purchase price**, subject to the following terms:

(a) This additional warranty does not apply to:

 the absence of blanks, half titles, tissue guards or advertisements, damage in respect of bindings, stains, spotting, marginal tears or other defects not affecting completeness of the text or illustration;

(ii) drawings, autographs, letters or manuscripts, signed photographs, music, atlases, maps or periodicals;

(iii) books not identified by title;

(iv) lots sold without a printed estimate;

(v) books which are described in the catalogue as sold not subject to return; or

(vi) defects stated in any **condition** report or announced at the time of sale.

(b) To make a claim under this paragraph you must give written details of the defect and return the **lot** to the sale room at which you bought it in the same **condition** as at the time of sale, within 14 days of the date of the sale.

In these categories, paragraph E2 (b) – (e) above shall be amended so that where no maker or artist is identified, the **authenticity warranty** is given not only for the **Heading** but also for information regarding date or period shown in **UPPERCASE type** in the second line of the **catalogue description** (the "**Subheading**"). Accordingly, all references to the Heading in paragraph E2 (b) – (e) above shall be read as references to both the **Heading** and the **Subheading**.

(a) Subject to the obligations accepted by Christie's under this **authenticity warranty**, none of the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents is responsible for the correctness of any statement as to the authorship, origin, date, age, attribution, genuineness or **provenance** of any **lot**, for any other error of description of for any fault or defect in any **lot** and no **warranty** whatsoever is given by the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any **lot** and any express or implied **condition** or **warranty** is hereby excluded;

(b) If, (1) within twenty-one days of the date of the auction, Christie's has received notice in writing from the buyer of any lot that in his view the lot was at the date of the auction short or ullaged or that any statement of opinion in the catalogue was not well founded. (2) within fourteen days of such notice. Christie's has the lots in its possession in the same condition as at the date of the auction and (3) within a reasonable time thereafter, the buyer satisfies Christie's that the lot was as notified in writing by the buyer (as above) and that the buyer is able to transfer a good and marketable title to the lot free from any lien or encumbrance. We may also suggest other handlers, packers, transporters or experts if you ask us to do so. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.

9 LAW AND DISPUTES







Δ: Property in which Christie's or another Christie's Group company has an ownership or financial interest

From time to time, Christie's may offer a lot in which Christie's or another Christie's Group company has an ownership or financial interest. 


