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It is with honour that I write the introduction to one of the most beautiful wine collections ever to come up for auction; The Dr A. Botenga Collection: Six Decades of Collecting Part I.

This is a very personal history of over sixty years of collecting the finest wines. Dr Allard Botenga's life has been spent discovering the world of wine and amassing one of the world's great wine collections. This has been done by study and research, meticulously selecting and tasting many of the twentieth century's landmark wines.

The cellar is full of historic wines such as Lafite-Rothschild 1945, Latour verticals back to the 1930s, La Mission Haut-Brion 1949, Vieux-Château-Certan 1971, La Tâche 1978, Henri Jay, Vosne-Romanée Cros Parantoux 1980 and many, many more. This collection also includes the most wonderful collection of half bottles I have ever seen. In short, walking into the Botenga cellars is a wine lover's dream!

Dr Botenga was born in 1934 and started tasting wine back in a time when the wine world as we know it today didn't exist. Cultivating close relationships with the various Châteaux in Bordeaux and Domains in Burgundy, many of the wines he enjoyed were bought directly from the producers or via respected importers in Holland. Most of the original invoices have been kept and a small selection are featured in this catalogue.

In pursuit of the finest bottles, Dr Botenga frequently drove to France or flew to London to attend dinners and auctions, frequently driving home with a car full of wine, pleased with the vinous treasures he had managed to acquire.

He quickly recognized the quality of the 1961 vintage in Bordeaux of which he has accumulated an extensive collection from a huge range of Châteaux. While preparing for this auction, we shared many 1961's and what struck me was the consistent quality even from less famed names such as a Croizet-Bages 1961. I have learned a lot about this vintage from Dr Botenga.

In December 1979 Dr Botenga attended the Clarence Dillon auction at Christie's in London, where he was able to buy some of the greatest vintages of Haut-Brion in perfect condition and to this day the 1926 is one of the best wines he has ever tasted.

Soon the cellar beneath his house became too small and so under two other houses in The Hague, he dug out large cellars to make space for his ever-expanding collection with each cellar being meticulously organised.

Dr Botenga had the foresight to purchase wines directly from Henri Jay, in an era when only those in the know knew to follow the Domaine. An anecdote shared over lunch which is sure to amuse wine lovers was that after a visit and tasting at the Domaine, as Dr Botenga placed the wines he had ordered into his car and was about to leave, Henri came walking out with an additional case, asking whether Dr Botenga wanted to buy this case as well. Since the trunk was already full, he refused, a decision he later regretted, as the wines became more difficult to come by.

During his travels, he met a lot of wine producers over great lunches and dinners. His strong memory for taste and details brought him into an interesting conversation with Aubert de Villaine, whom Dr Botenga reminded of the greatness of La Tâche 1980. Aubert acknowledged that this vintage was

overlooked and was pleased that Dr Botenga had brought this to his attention again.

With his keen eye for detail, Dr Botenga kept a record of the level of each bottle, noting the exact distance between the cork and the wine, which sometimes meant lifting the capsule when he couldn't see the cork. All the cases were numbered and organized according to their level and he would keep the higher levels and start drinking the wines with the lowest levels, this way maintaining his collection at the highest quality.

He never bought wine with a view to invest; every bottle was added to the collection to one day be enjoyed, for the pleasure and stimulation they could bring rather than for their rarity or price. To this day he enjoys a good glass of wine with his meals.

From the end of March, Dr Botenga and I started preparing the selection of wines for this auction. Whilst inspecting each bottle and over our lunches, he generously shared a selection from the cellar which made for interesting conversations and it was wonderful to hear firsthand from one of the great connoisseurs of wine.

We have split the auction and the first part will be offered in Hong Kong on the 24th November, followed a week later by another selection of finest and rarest wines in London on the 1st December.

I hope you enjoy browsing through the catalogue as much as we enjoyed selecting the bottles from the cellars. Good luck with your bids, I hope you will be able to acquire a piece of unprecedented wine history.

Tasting notes of the wines Edwin Vos tasted together with Dr Botenga while working on the auction selection.

Latour 1967

Refined, deep dark fruits. At first still reserved. Fine floral notes.

Good texture and lively expression. Just a touch of maderization on the mid followed by an explosive berry fruit aroma on the after taste. This is very good. March 2023. EV

Latour 1968

A very nice half bottle. Fine nose, touch of warm fruit followed by good energy on the nose. Fresh vanilla, beetroot, refined currant aroma on the finish. Spicy note from the cask aging still present, yet well integrated. Fine fresh acidity leading to an elegant mid palette. Remarkable 55-year-old half. A glass of refinement, a true Latour in an elegant setting. Very well aged. August 2023. EV

Pichon Baron 2009

Beautiful expression of deep dark fruits with floral notes and distinctive vanilla aroma. Napa style Cab. Broad palette with long tannins. Very nice intensity. Strong dark chocolate. A youngster. Impressive. April 2023. EV

Calon Segur 1961 in half bottle

Expressive, bright, fine and long. Very lively nose of purity.

Exceptional black fruits, long acidity, refined with an amazing long life ahead.

Remarkable half bottle with such an energy and time in hand. April 2023. EV

Batailley 1961 in half bottle

English bottled half with a low shoulder level. Since there were only two halves we didn't include them in the auction and instead tasted them over a light lunch. I have added this note to show the very good cellaring conditions. On the nose aromas of beetroot, reserved in character. The taste shows its suave berry fruit with a fine acidity to follow. Distinctive Batailley grip. 1961 quality in half as an example of the greatness of the collection and this vintage. June 2023. EV

Croizet Bages 1961

Very fine nose. Elegant, rich fruits with a fine bacon aroma.

Broad refined taste with great depth. Black fruits. This is so remarkable in its complexity. Showing the character of the vintage well. This is fantastic. Mid palette of black currants, so suave with a purity of fruit. Impressive after 62 years of age. Great balance. A memorable Croizet, arguably the best ever made. Approaching second Grand Cru level. August 2023. EV

Cheval Blanc 1961

A wonderful nose of black currants, pine wood spices, gently perfumed, with a certain density. The taste has a particular depth and fruit intensity compatible to a vintage port. For me this reminds me of the same style of fruit intension like the 21.

Broad mouth filling with a great structure still with such a concentration.

On the finish smooth and still so seductively silky texture with a fantastic balance. After a magnum of 1949 Veuve Clicquot we enjoyed this bottle over a dinner.

Very impressive! Bravo! June 2023. EV

La Gaffelière 1970

Nice red fruits, berry's on the nose. The taste at first was a bit tight, with time showing more fruit on the mid palette. Clearly needing time to unfold, still a direct and fully mature wine. Drink now. August 2023. EV

Petrus 1976

Warm inviting nose of beetroot, dried currants and balsamic richness. Slight spicy note, grilled meat, cacao followed by a beautiful minty aroma. Beautiful multilayered nose, with Burgundian finesse.

Suave silky start of taste, creamy with refined fresh cherry fruit appearing from the structure. Soft, mouth filling with a slight smoky note. Beautiful after taste with good grip. Strong. The taste evolves nicely. Refined with a beautiful intensity. Impressive. A very good Petrus, the hand of Jean Claude Berrouet shows. July 2023. EV

L'Evangile 1979

The 1979 tasted earlier this year with Dr Botenga was fantastic, fine texture and length. EV

DRC Richebourg 1972

Fine nose which unfolded nicely with time in the glass. All on the elegant reserved side yet so intriguingly seductive. Subtle orange fruit tone in the beautiful light red fruits. Like a flower opening up. Multi layered. The taste was like the nose at first somewhat shy and reserved, developing well over time showing the greatness of Richebourg. Beautiful fine lingering acidity. Great wine. June 2023. EV

MESSAGE FROM DR A. BOTENGA

The start of my wine life was back in 1956, during my third year of study as co-director of the Utrecht Student Society Placet Hic Requiescere Muis. The bottle in question was the Léoville-Las-Cases 1947, then – and partly still – a dream of a wine.

The initial modest additions to the wine collection gradually increased in the sixties, each time after careful consideration, study and repeated tastings. Every bottle was bought with the intention of being drunk at some stage, after a long rest period, which was determined by its quality. Never with the purpose of investment.

My greater desire, maybe even obsession, could gradually be fulfilled when my position of Pediatric Radiologist provided increasingly more financial support in the seventies and eighties. So over time and continued growth, by the nineties and into the new millennium my collection extended over 50,000 bottles. It has become apparent this is just a bit too much really, and despite daily attempts, the quantity in my cellar is just still too much.

The auction is a tough one since every bottle I have carefully selected and has a place in my heart. My hope is a fellow wine lover will be able to place these special bottles in their own cellar.



On the first fine wine he tasted in 1956, Léoville-Las-Cases 1947:

“The bouquet of this wine had such a great depth, astonishing that a little piece of fruit can bring such a taste sensation”.

“You could say; I have lost my life to wine. But it’s given me a lot of joy. Wine is to me of a similar esthetical value like a Rembrandt painting; Romance and passion all together. Wine is emotion.”

In that case, the **reserve** will be set at the amount of the irrevocable bid. Lots which are subject to a third party guarantee arrangement are identified in the catalogue with the symbol •♦.

3 AUCTIONEER'S DISCRETION

The **auctioneer** can at his sole option:

(a) refuse any bid;

(b) move the bidding backwards or forwards in any way he or she may decide, or change the order of the **lots**;

(c) withdraw any **lot**;

(d) divide any **lot** or combine any two or more **lots**;

(e) reopen or continue the bidding even after the hammer has fallen; and

(f) in the case of error or dispute related to bidding and whether during or after the auction, to continue the bidding, determine the successful bidder, cancel the sale of the **lot**, or reoffer and resell any **lot**. If you believe that the **auctioneer** has accepted the successful bid in error, you must provide a written notice detailing your claim within 3 business days of the date of the auction. The **auctioneer** will consider such claim in good faith. If the **auctioneer**, in the exercise of his or her discretion under this paragraph, decides after the auction is complete, to cancel the sale of a **lot**, or reoffer and resell a **lot**, he or she will notify the successful bidder no later than by the end of the 7th calendar day following the date of the auction.

The **auctioneer's** decision in exercise of this discretion is final. This paragraph does not in any way prejudice Christie's ability to cancel the sale of a **lot** under any other applicable provision of these Conditions of Sale, including the rights of cancellation set forth in section B(3), E(2)(i), F(4) and J(1).

4 BIDDING

The **auctioneer** accepts bids from:

(a) bidders in the saleroom;

(b) telephone bidders, and internet bidders through 'Christie's LIVE™' (as shown above in Section B6); and

(c) written bids (also known as absentee bids or commission bids) left with us by a bidder before the auction.

5 BIDDING ON BEHALF OF THE SELLER

The **auctioneer** may, at his or her sole option, bid on behalf of the seller up to but not including the amount of the **reserve** either by making consecutive bids or by making bids in response to other bidders. The **auctioneer** will not identify these as bids made on behalf of the seller and will not make any bid on behalf of the seller at or above the **reserve**. If **lots** are offered without **reserve**, the **auctioneer** will generally decide to open the bidding at 50% of the **low estimate** for the **lot**. If no bid is made at that level, the **auctioneer** may decide to go backwards at his or her sole option until a bid is made, and then continue up from that amount. In the event that there are no bids on a **lot**, the **auctioneer** may deem such **lot** unsold.

6 BID INCREMENTS

Bidding generally starts below the **low estimate** and increases in steps (bid increments). The **auctioneer** will decide at his or her sole option where the bidding should start and the bid increments. 7 CURRENCY CONVERTER

The saleroom video screens (and Christie's LIVE™) may show bids in some other major currencies as well as sterling. Any conversion is for guidance only and we cannot be bound by any rate of exchange used. Christie's is not responsible for any error (human or otherwise), omission or breakdown in providing these services.

8 SUCCESSFUL BIDS

Unless the **auctioneer** decides to use his or her discretion as set out in paragraph C3 above, when the **auctioneer's** hammer strikes, we have accepted the last bid. This means a contract for sale has been formed between the seller and the successful bidder. We will issue an invoice only to the registered bidder who made the successful bid. While we send out invoices by post and/or email after the auction, we do not accept responsibility for telling you whether or not your bid was successful. If you have bid by written bid, you should contact us by telephone or in person as soon as possible after the auction to get details of the outcome of your bid to avoid having to pay unnecessary storage charges.

9 LOCAL BIDDING LAWS

You agree that when bidding in any of our sales that you will strictly comply with all local laws and regulations in force at the time of the sale for the relevant sale site.

D THE BUYER'S PREMIUM AND TAXES

1 THE BUYER'S PREMIUM

In addition to the **hammer price**, the successful bidder agrees to pay us a buyer's premium on the **hammer price** of each **lot** sold. On all **lots** we charge 26% of the **hammer price** up to and including £700,000, 20% on that part of the **hammer price** over £700,000 and up to and including £4,500,000, and 14.5% of that part of the **hammer price** above £4,500,000.

Exception: the buyer's premium for Wine, Spirits and Cigars is 25% of the **hammer price**. For all **lots** VAT is payable on the premium at the applicable rate. VAT will be added to the buyer's premium and is payable by you. The VAT may not be shown separately on our invoice because of tax laws. You may be eligible to have a VAT refund in certain circumstances if the **lot** is exported. Please see the "VAT refunds: what can I reclaim?" section of 'VAT Symbols and Explanation' for further information.

2 TAXES

The successful bidder is responsible for all applicable tax including any VAT, sales or compensating use tax or equivalent tax wherever such taxes may arise on the **hammer price** and the **buyer's premium**. VAT charges and refunds depend on the particular circumstances of the buyer. It is the buyer's responsibility to ascertain and pay all taxes due. VAT is payable on the **buyer's premium** and, for some lots, VAT is payable on the **hammer price**. Following the departure of the UK from the EU (Brexit), UK VAT and Customs rules will apply only.

Whether you choose to buy the **lot** in bond or duty paid, VAT will be added to the **buyer's premium** and will be shown separately on our invoice.

Please note that VAT on the **buyer's premium** may be reclaimed by UK VAT registered clients via their own VAT return subject to the normal rules. Outside UK buyers may reclaim the VAT on the **buyer's premium** provided that all refund conditions are met. Clearance VAT is not recoverable. E WARRANTIES

1 SELLER'S WARRANTIES

For each **lot**, the seller gives a **warranty** that the seller:

(a) is the owner of the **lot** or a joint owner of the **lot** acting with the permission of the other co-owners or, if the seller is not the owner or a joint owner of the **lot**, has the permission of the owner to sell the **lot**, or the right to do so in law; and

(b) has the right to transfer ownership of the **lot** to the buyer without any restrictions or claims by anyone else.

If either of the above **warranties** are incorrect, the seller shall not have to pay more than the **purchase price** (as defined in paragraph F1(a) below) paid by you to us. The seller will not be responsible to you for any reason for loss of profits or business, expected savings, loss of opportunity or interest, costs, damages, **other damages** or expenses. The seller gives no **warranty** in relation to any **lot** other than as set out above and, as far as the seller is obliged by law, all **warranties** from the seller to you, and all other obligations upon the seller which may be added to this agreement by law, are excluded.

2 AUTHENTICITY WARRANTY IN RELATION TO WINES AND SPIRITS

(a) Subject to the obligations accepted by Christie's under this **authenticity warranty**, none of the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents is responsible for the correctness of any statement as to the authorship, origin, date, age, attribution, genuineness or provenance of any **lot**, for any other error of description or for any fault or defect in any **lot**. Further, no warranty whatsoever is given by the seller, Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any lot and any express or implied condition or **warranty** is hereby excluded.

(b) If (1) within twenty-one days of the date of the auction, Christie's has received notice in writing from the buyer of any **lot** that in his view the **lot** was at the date of the auction short or ullaged or that any statement of opinion in the catalogue was not well founded,

(2) within fourteen days of such notice, Christie's has the **lots** in its possession in the same condition as at the date of the auction and (3) within a reasonable time thereafter, the buyer satisfies Christie's that the **lot** was notified in writing by the buyer (as above) and that the buyer is able to transfer a good and marketable title to the **lot** free from any lien or encumbrance, Christie's will set aside the sale and refund the buyer any amount paid by the buyer in respect of the **lot** provided that the buyer shall have no rights under this condition if:

(i) the defect is mentioned in the catalogue, or

(d) the benefit of this **authenticity warranty** shall not be assignable and shall rest solely and exclusively with the buyer who shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by Christie's in respect of the **lot** when sold and who has since the sale retained uninterrupted and unencumbered ownership thereof.

3 YOUR WARRANTIES

(a) You **warrant** that the funds used for settlement are not connected with any criminal activity, including tax evasion, and you are neither under investigation, nor have you been charged with or convicted of money laundering, terrorist activities or other crimes.

(b) where you are bidding as agent on behalf of any ultimate buyer(s) who will put you in funds before you pay Christie's for the **lot(s)**, you **warrant** that:

(i) you have conducted appropriate customer due diligence on the ultimate buyer(s) and have complied with all applicable anti-money laundering, counter terrorist financing and sanctions laws;

(ii) you will disclose to us the identity of the ultimate buyer(s) (including any officers and beneficial owner(s) of the ultimate buyer(s) and any persons acting on its behalf) and on our request, provide documents to verify their identity;

(iii) the arrangements between you and the ultimate buyer(s) in relation to the **lot** or otherwise do not, in whole or in part, facilitate tax crimes;

(iv) you do not know, and have no reason to suspect that the ultimate buyer(s) (or its officers, beneficial owners or any persons acting on its behalf) are on a sanctions list, are under investigation for, charged with or convicted of money laundering, terrorist activities or other crimes, or that the funds used for settlement are connected with the proceeds of any criminal activity, including tax evasion; and

(v) where you are a regulated person who is supervised for anti-money laundering purposes under the laws of the EEA or another jurisdiction with requirements equivalent to the EU 4th Money Laundering Directive, and we do not request documents to verify the ultimate buyer's identity at the time of registration, you consent to us relying on your due diligence on the ultimate buyer, and will retain their identification and verification documents for a period of not less than 5 years from the date of the transaction. You will make such documentation available for immediate inspection on our request.

F PAYMENT

1 HOW TO PAY

(a) Immediately following the auction, you must pay the **purchase price** being:

(i) the **hammer price**; and

(ii) the **buyer's premium**; and

(iii) any duties, goods, sales, use, compensating or service tax or VAT

Please note that the **purchase price** is exclusive of, and the buyer shall be responsible for

(A) any charge for storage from the date of the auction;

(B) any charge for subsequent packing or carriage; and

(C) if you choose to take wines offered in bond duty paid, applicable excise duty and clearance VAT. Payment is due no later than by the end of the 7th calendar day following the date of the auction (the "**due date**").

(b) We will only accept payment from the registered bidder. Once issued, we cannot change the buyer's name on an invoice or re-issue the invoice in a different name. You must pay immediately even if you want to export the **lot** and you need an export licence.

Details of the conditions and restrictions applicable to credit card payments are available from our Post-Sale Services Department, whose details are set out in paragraph (e) below.

If you pay for your purchase using a credit card issued outside the region of the sale, depending on the type of credit card and account you hold, the payment may incur a cross-border transaction fee. If you think this may apply to you, please check with your credit card issuer before making the payment.

Please note that for sales that permit online payment, certain transactions will be ineligible for credit card payment.

(iii) Cash

We accept cash subject to a maximum of £5,000 per buyer per year at our Cashier's Department Department only (subject to conditions).

(iv) Banker's draft

You must make these payable to Christie's and there may be conditions.

(v) Cheque

You must make cheques payable to Christie's. Cheques must be from accounts in pounds sterling from a United Kingdom bank.

2. TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP TO YOU

You will not own the **lot** and ownership of the **lot** will not pass to you until we have received full and clear payment of the **purchase price**, even in circumstances where we have released the **lot** to the buyer.

3 TRANSFERRING RISK TO YOU

The risk in and responsibility for the **lot** will transfer to you from whichever is the earlier of the following:

(a) When you collect the **lot**; or

(b) At the end of the 30th day following the date of the auction, unless we have agreed otherwise with you in writing.

4 WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT PAY

(a) If you fail to pay us the **purchase price** in full by the **due date**, we will be entitled to do one or more of the following (as well as enforce our rights under paragraph F5 and any other rights or remedies we have by law):

(i) to charge interest from the **due date** at a rate of 5% a year above the UK Lloyds Bank base rate from time to time on the unpaid amount due;

(ii) we can cancel the sale of the **lot**. If we do this, we may sell the **lot** again, publicly or privately on such terms we shall think necessary or appropriate, in which case you must pay us any shortfall between the **purchase price** and the proceeds from the resale. You must also pay all costs, expenses, losses, damages and legal fees we have to pay or may suffer and any shortfall in the seller's commission on the resale;

(iii) we can pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by your default in which case you acknowledge and understand that Christie's will have all of the rights of the seller to pursue you for such amounts;

(iv) we can hold you legally responsible for the **purchase price** and may begin legal proceedings to recover it together with other losses, interest, legal fees and costs as far as we are allowed by law;

(v) we can take what you owe us from any amounts which we or any company in the **Christie's Group** may owe you (including any deposit or other part-payment which you have paid to us);

(vi) we can, at our option, reveal your identity and contact details to the seller;

(vii) we can reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the buyer or to obtain a deposit from the buyer before accepting any bids;

(viii) to exercise all the rights and remedies of a person holding security over any property in our possession owned by you, whether by way of pledge, security interest or in any other way as permitted by the law of the place where such property is located. You will be deemed to have granted such security to us and we may retain such property as collateral security for your obligations to us; and

(ix) we can take any other action we see necessary or appropriate.

(b) If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's Group** company, we can use any amount you do pay, including any deposit or other part-payment you have made to us, or which we owe you, to pay off any amount you owe to us or another **Christie's Group** company for any transaction.

(c) If you make payment in full after the **due date**, and we choose to accept such payment we may charge you storage and transport costs from the date that is 30 calendar days following the auction in accordance with paragraphs Gd(i) and (ii). In such circumstances paragraph Gd(iv) shall apply.

5 KEEPING YOUR PROPERTY

If you owe money to us or to another **Christie's Group** company, as well as the rights set out in F4 above, we can use or deal with any of your property we hold or which is held by another **Christie's Group** company in any way we are allowed to by law. We will only release your property to you after you pay us or the relevant **Christie's Group** company in full for what you owe. However, if we choose, we can also sell your property in any way we think appropriate. We will use the proceeds of the sale against any amounts you owe us and we will pay any amount left from that sale to you. If there is a shortfall, you must pay us any difference between the amount we have received from the sale and the amount you owe us.

G COLLECTION AND STORAGE

1 COLLECTION

(a) All wines lie at our third party wine storage facility, London City Bond Vaults, unless otherwise indicated. Once you have made full and clear payment, you must collect the **lot** promptly (**but note that you may not collect any lot until you have made full and clear payment of all amounts due to us**).

(b) Information on collecting **lots** from London City Bond is set out on the storage and collection page and on an information sheet which you can get from the bidder registration staff or Christie's Post-Sale Services Department on +44 (0)20 7752 3200.

1 TRANSPORT AND SHIPPING

We will enclose a transport and shipping form with each invoice sent to you. You must make all transport and shipping arrangements. However, we can arrange to pack, transport and ship your property if you ask us to and pay the costs of doing so. We recommend that you ask us for an **estimate**, especially for any large items or items of high value that need professional packing before you bid. We may also suggest other handlers, packers, transporters or experts if you ask us to do so. For more information, please contact Christie's Art Transport on +44 (0)20 7839 9060. We will take reasonable care when we are handling, packing, transporting and shipping a **lot**. However, if we recommend another company for any of these purposes, we are not responsible for their acts, failure to act or neglect.

2 EXPORT AND IMPORT

Any **lot** sold at auction may be affected by laws on exports from the country in which it is sold and the import restrictions of other countries. Many countries require a declaration of export for property leaving the country and/or an import declaration on entry of property into the country. Local laws may prevent you from importing a **lot** or may prevent you selling a **lot** in the country you import it into. We will not be obliged to cancel your purchase and refund the purchase price if your **lot** may not be exported, imported or it is seized for any reason by a government authority. (b) You alone are responsible for any applicable taxes, tariffs or other government-imposed charges relating to the export or import of the **lot**. If Christie's exports or imports the **lot** on your behalf, and if Christie's pays these applicable taxes, tariffs or other government-imposed charges, you agree to refund that amount to Christie's.

(c) Lots made of protected species

Lots made of or including (regardless of the percentage) endangered and other protected species of wildlife are marked with the symbol – in the catalogue. This material includes, among other things, ivory, tortoiseshell, crocodile skin, rhinoceros horn, whalebone certain species of coral, and Brazilian rosewood. You should check the relevant customs laws and regulations before bidding on any **lot** containing wildlife material if you plan to import the **lot** into another country. (d) US import ban on African elephant ivory

The USA prohibits the import of ivory from the African elephant. Any **lot** containing elephant ivory or other wildlife material that could be easily confused with elephant ivory (for example, mammoth ivory, walrus ivory, helmeted hornbill ivory) can only be imported into the US with results of a rigorous scientific test acceptable to Fish & Wildlife, which confirms that the material is not African elephant ivory. Where we have conducted such rigorous scientific testing on a **lot** prior to sale, we will make this clear in the lot description. In all other cases, we cannot confirm whether a **lot** contains African elephant ivory, and you will buy that **lot** at your own risk and be responsible for any scientific test or other reports required for import into the USA at your own cost. If such scientific test is inconclusive or confirms the material is from the African elephant, we will not be obliged to cancel your purchase and refund the **purchase price**.

(e) Lots of Iranian origin

Some countries prohibit or restrict the purchase and/or import of Iranian-origin 'works of conventional craftsmanship' (works that are not by a recognised artist and/or that have a function, for example: carpets, bowls, ewers, tiles, ornamental boxes). The seller's **warranties** contained in paragraph E1 are their own and we do not have any liability to you in relation to those **warranties**.

(b) (i) We are not responsible to you for any reason (whether for breaking this agreement or any other matter relating to your purchase of, or bid for, any **lot** other than in the event of fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation by us or other than as expressly set out in these conditions of sale; or

On occasion, Christie's has a direct financial interest in the outcome of the sale of certain **lots** consigned for sale. 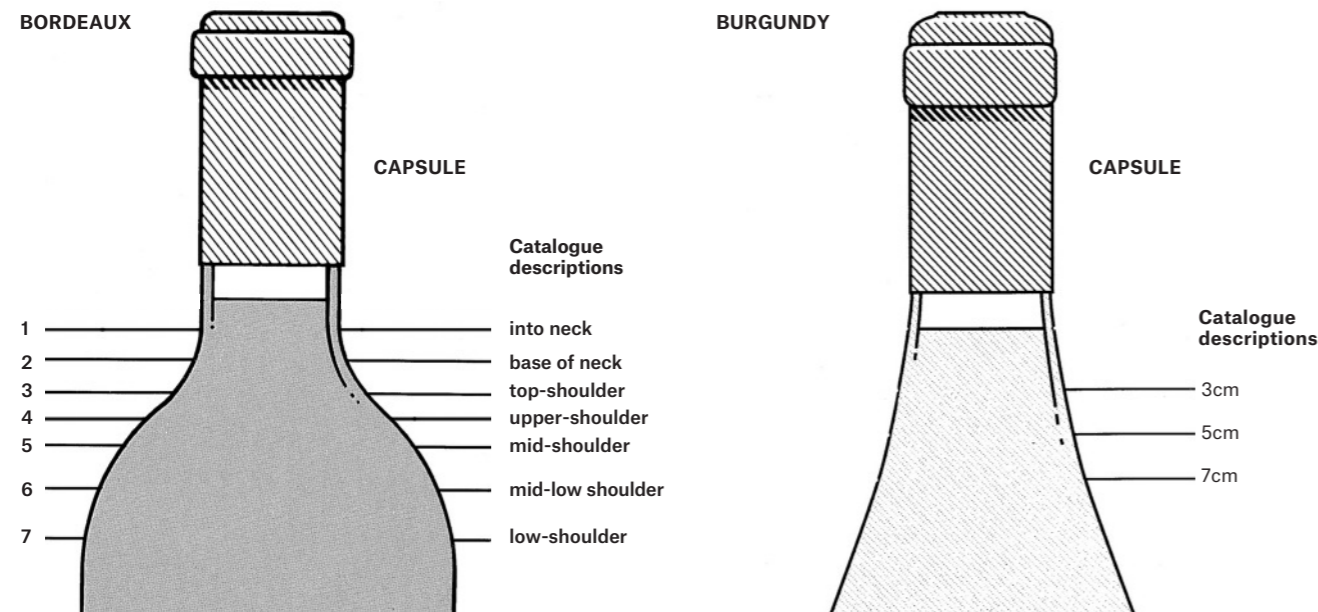

The amount by which level of wine is short of being full: these levels may vary according to age of the wines and, as far as can be ascertained by inspection prior to the sale, are described in the catalogue.

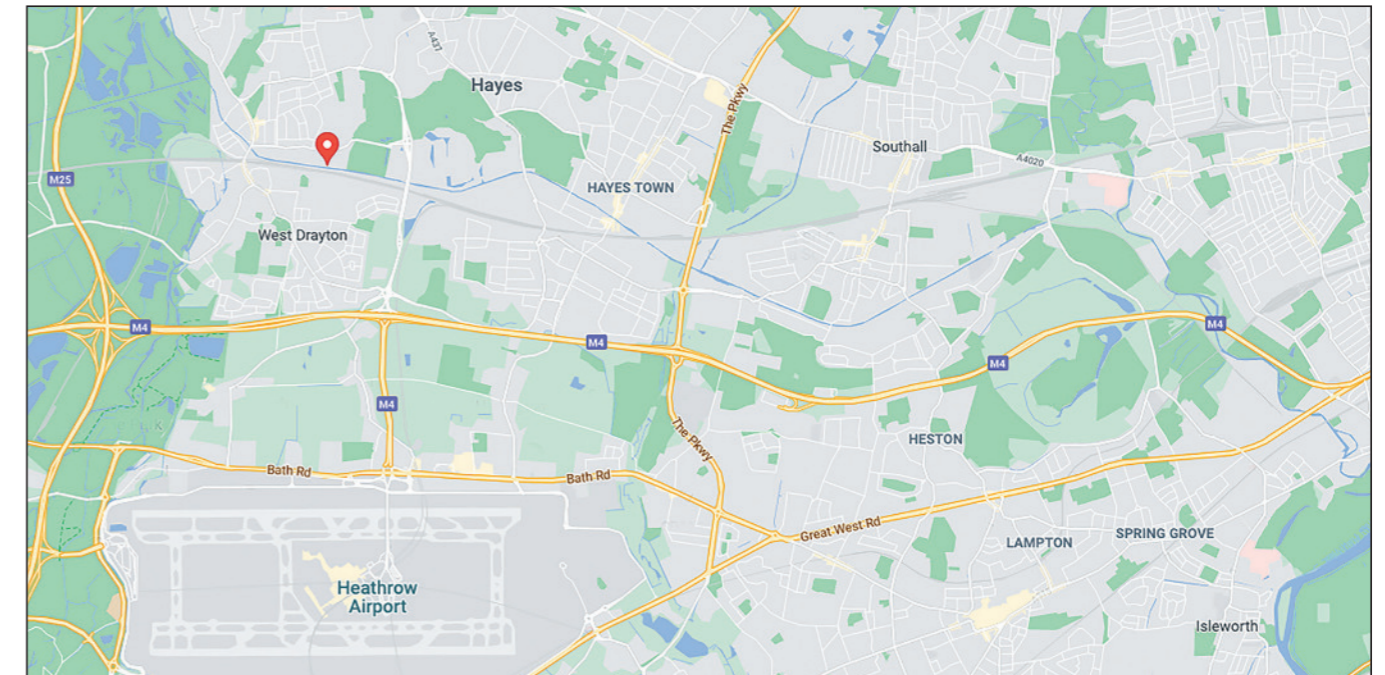
- 1 into neck: Level of young wines. Exceptionally good in wines over 10 years old.
- 2 base of neck: Perfectly good for any age of wine. Outstandingly good for a wine of 20 years in bottle, or longer.
- 3 top-shoulder: Normal for any claret 15 years old or older.
- 4 upper-shoulder: Slight natural reduction through the easing of the cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Usually no problem. Acceptable for any wine over 20 years old. Exceptional for pre-1950 wines.

- 5 mid-shoulder: Probably some weakening of the cork and some risk. Not abnormal for wines 30/40 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- 6 mid-low-shoulder: Some risk. Low estimates.
- 7 low-shoulder: Risky and usually only accepted for sale if wine or label exceptionally rare or interesting. Always offered with low estimate.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured and catalogued in centimetres.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

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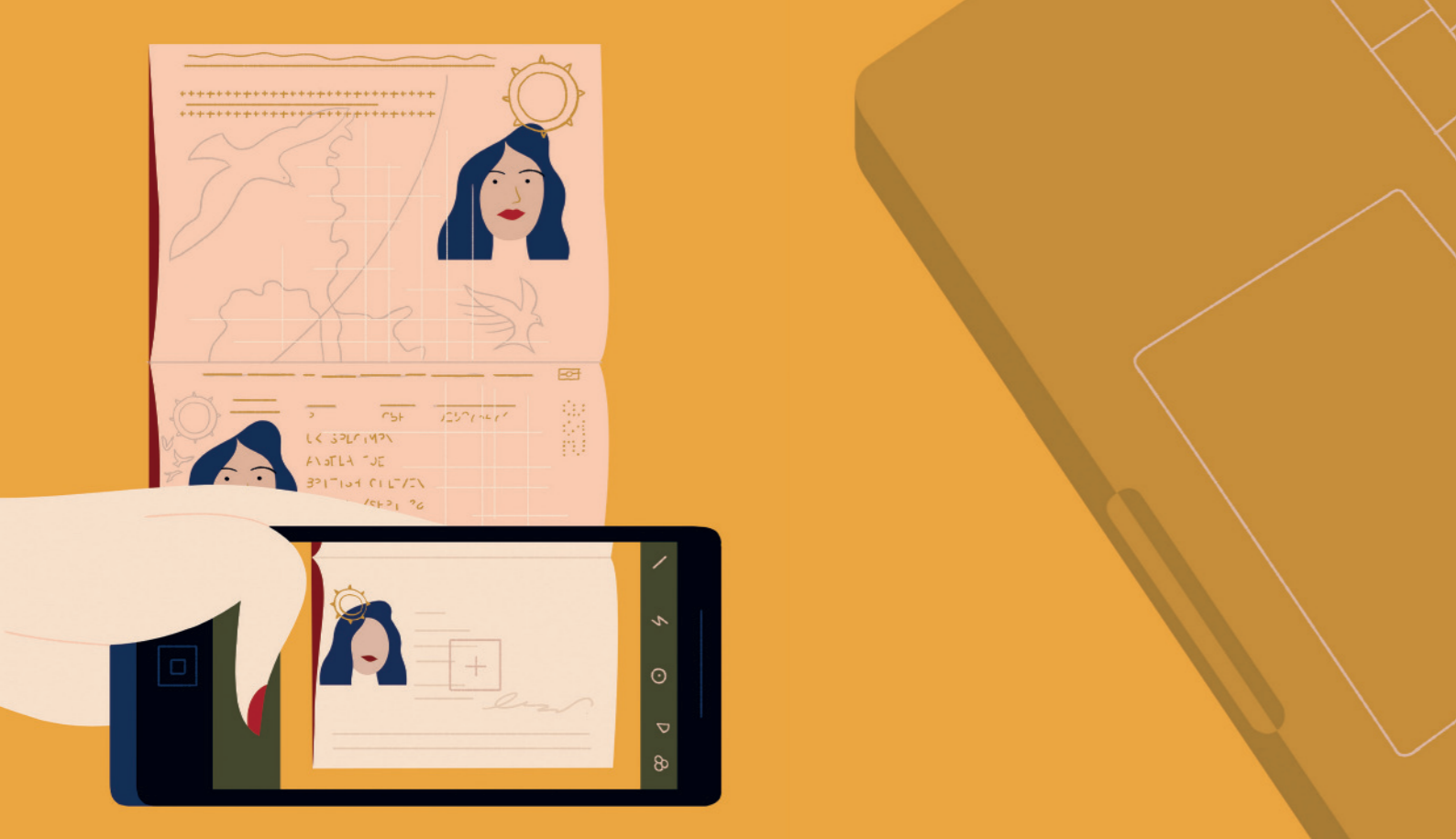
