
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
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

GOLDEN RULES TO BEAT AUCTION INTIMIDATION

LOOK FOR THE "RIGHT" CAR

The first question anyone in the market for a collector car should have is: What will I do with the car? Will it be a Saturday night cruiser, a daily driver, a track toy, or a concours-quality show car? It seems like a simple question, but it's the foundation for the purchase.

So, follow the adage, "The right tool for the right job." A classic Corvette is likely not the best choice for your sixteen-year-old's daily driver. Similarly, acquiring a vintage Mustang for a weekend road race might end up costing far more than buying an example with the correct equipment already installed.

ESTABLISH A BUDGET

Always have a budget in mind before you arrive at the auction. It's ideal to include a 10 percent cushion, but stick to your budget.

Purchasing a collector car on the big stage can be a thrilling experience. For those who enjoy the excitement and frenzied pace of the collector car auction, Donnie Gould, Car Specialist, offers up the following "Seven Golden Rules" to make your auction experience a positive one.

Your budget should be based on some basic solid research. Seek out resources such as the *Hagerty Price Guide*, which covers collectible and classic automobiles. Classified pages in trade magazines also provide a great resource.

DO YOUR HOMEWORK

If you're attending an auction, review the consignments online or in a printed catalogue prior to the sale. Then, create a short list of targets and research them. Contact the auction house directly to speak with a car specialist; car clubs and associations can also be helpful.

DO A PERSONAL INSPECTION

If possible, attend the auction where your dream car is being offered; it is much easier to evaluate a car in person. Bring your short list, vehicle checklist, and date code book, and if possible, an objective expert with you. It is also important to take time to meet an auction specialist and seek out their expertise and any additional background



they can provide, as well as to review all the paperwork. You're making a significant purchase, so don't be afraid to crawl under the car for a thorough inspection.

Once you have narrowed down your choices, you need to be near the car when it begins its journey to the block. The vehicle will typically sit in the staging lanes for 30–60 minutes before it hits the podium. This will give you time to evaluate the car when it starts, when it's under power, while it's idling, and with repeated starts and stops. Ask the driver of the auction house to turn on the radio, work the locks, move the power top, etc. Inquire about how the clutch, steering, and brakes feel. This is your chance to ensure that everything operates properly.

PREPARE TO BID

The auction ring is an electrifying atmosphere; some thrive on the excitement, while others prefer to let a representative place their bids. If you have never participated in an auction, consider bringing a friend who can moderate your exuberance should the pressure become too intense.

Before the car rolls onto the block, move into position to watch the auction, ensure you can hear the auctioneer and signal your bids. It's also critical to let one of the bid spotters know that you plan on bidding on a particular lot. Find a bid spotter just prior to the car rolling across the block; you can get their attention by providing an opening bid on a car that you're interested in.

Remember to hold firm on your budget and be patient. Serious buyers often wait until the bidding slows to jump in.

CHECK THE BOXES

Once the euphoria of a successful purchase subsides, it's time to return to your checklists. This step is as critical as the pre-sale work.

What paperwork, memorabilia, etc., is accompanying your vehicle? Understand what you need to collect, and if you are shipping the car, consider taking those items with you personally if you can, or place them in the trunk of the car for safe keeping.

Carefully go through the paperwork with the auction company clerk and determine when you will receive the title. Every auction house's policy varies, so make sure you are fully versed on their processes. It's also important that you triple-check the address where key documents like titles should be sent.





uilt to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Ford Motor Company, the GT has been a heavily sought-after modern classic ever since the first model rolled off the production line in 2004. The vehicle's design is a modern homage to the immensely successful GT40 that achieved four consecutive Le Mans victories from 1966 to 1969. Sharing nearly every crease and line, the modern GT was made to invoke grand images of Ford's most triumphant moment for any gearhead in the know. Just like the original Le Mans race car, the new model had to be a world-beater, but most importantly, it had to best the boys from Maranello.





Maintaining the spirit of the original GT, the contemporary interpretation was powered by Ford's all-aluminum 5.4-liter Modular V-8. The 32-valve cylinder heads from the Mustang SVT Cobra R were modified with a thicker wall casting in the exhaust port, and a new camshaft provided increased lift and duration. On top sits a Lysholm twin-screw supercharger feeding a maximum 11.7 psi of boost into the engine. From the factory, power is rated at 550 hp and 500 foot-pounds of torque. Four piston aluminum Brembo calipers with cross-drilled and ventilated rotors on all four wheels made sure to bring the vehicle to a rapid stop from any speed. Most impressively, a top speed of 205 mph and a 0–60 time of 3.3 seconds place the GT in closer competition to the Porsche Carrera GT and Mercedes-McLaren SLR rather than the benchmarked Ferrari 360.



The example offered here was ordered in Mark II Black with full body stripes, one of just 182 so-specified in 2006, and has three factory options: the aforementioned racing stripes, forged BBS wheels, and upgraded McIntosh stereo. It was originally shipped to Downtown Ford of Louisville, however, upon arriving at the dealership, the individual who ordered the car declined to take delivery. The GT was purchased by a prominent local Ford collector, with whose family it has now remained since new. The owner notes that it has been driven on average twice a month, and only in the best of weather. It was also displayed at a couple of local shows over the years, including the Louisville Concours d'Elegance at Churchill Downs in 2009. Today it records fewer than 3,800 actual miles and remains in superlative overall condition.

t its debut, the Cord Front-Drive (L-29) was the first major American production car with front-wheel drive. The lack of a driveshaft tunnel allowed for the bodies to be mounted low on the frame, with the result being that the Cord was no taller than a person of average height. Their interiors boasted flat floors, allowing for comfortable, spacious seating. Sadly, the L-29 had the bad luck to have been born at the worst possible moment. It was offered to market just as the Great Depression's crushing weight came down on the automobile industry, and production of the car faded away in late 1931.

The cabriolet offered here, an example of the most popular and desirable L-29 body style, has had its history traced back to 1946, when it was purchased for \$750 by a Mr. Huffey of Cincinnati, Ohio. Following several intervening owners, it was



purchased in 1953 by Jerry Fisher of Piqua, Ohio, largely complete, less its top and several small items, but still wearing original black paint. Hubert Wood of South Charleston, Ohio, performed an amateur restoration in 1969. A new owner acquired the car in 1980 and proceeded to drive it to his private museum in the American West, where it remained until 2013.

In previous ownership, the car was completely disassembled, with the frame sandblasted and powder-coated, and springs and axles disassembled, sandblasted, and painted. A full engine rebuild included new babbitt bearings, pistons, rings, and shell bearings, a new camshaft, the crankshaft polished and balanced, and the block bored and honed, and heads planed. The cooling system, water pump, generator, and starter were rebuilt. The transmission was checked and cleaned, and new clutch and pressure plate



installed. The sheet metal, fenders, and running boards were all properly finished, with new inner woodwork. The brightwork was re-plated to show standards. The dashboard was completely disassembled and rebuilt. Complete new wiring harnesses were made and installed. The wheels were restored and repainted in rich dark red with black accents, including four layers of clear coat. A new leather interior was fabricated to original patterns and piped in dark red, including rumble seat. New top bows were made and a new canvas top with red stitching were fitted.

Still equipped with its original serial number and body tags, this car retains its original chassis, engine, and cabriolet body, just as it was delivered in 1931, and benefits from a fresh and comprehensive restoration. It awaits a new caretaker who will enjoy it just as it has been enjoyed for over 85 years!






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CONSIGNOR(S)' CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

1. Introduction.

- 1.1 Please ensure that you read and understand these Conditions of Business prior to consigning a motor car(s) or any other lot(s) at this or any other RM Auctions, Inc. ("RM") sale.
- 1.2 RM's contractual relationship with the Consignor(s)' are governed by:
 - 1.2.1 These Consignor(s)' Conditions of Business;

- 7.2 The Consignor(s) warrants that the Consignor(s) is the sole and only owner of the motor car(s) and that the Consignor(s) has full right and authority to sell the motor car(s).
- 7.3 The Consignor(s) agrees to provide RM with a good, clear, and transferable Title(s) to the motor car(s) in advance of the auction.
 - 7.3.1 If for whatever reason RM is forced to correct any Title(s) defect(s), the Consignor(s) agrees to pay for any and all reasonable expenses.
- 7.4 In order to facilitate and transfer the Title(s) for the motor car(s), the Consignor(s) agrees to sign a Power of Attorney attached in this Consignment Agreement package.
- Non-Payment by Buyer(s). In the event of non-payment by the Buyer(s), RM will endeavor to use reasonable efforts to enforce payment from the Buyer(s); however, RM shall not be liable to the Consignor(s) for payment. If the Buyer(s) does not pay RM, then at RM's sole discretion, RM may cancel the sale and return the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) to the Consignor(s), enforce payment by the Buyer(s), or take other actions permitted by law. Notwithstanding the preceding sentences, if RM has paid any portion of the purchase price to the Consignor(s), but the purchase price has not been collected from the Buyer(s) of the motor car(s) or any other lot(s), the Consignor(s) hereby agrees, simultaneously with such payment, to assign to RM any and all rights that the Consignor(s) may have against such Buyer(s) to the extent of such payment, whether at law, in equity, or under the Contractual Obligations. - 9.1 The Consignor(s) agrees to accept sole responsibility and liability for any representations made by RM that accurately repeat the information supplied by the Consignor(s) as to the character, features, condition, correctness, authenticity, or history of the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) and to indemnify, defend, and hold RM harmless from any claims that may be made with respect to any such representations.
- 9.2 The Consignor(s) is required to review and approve all catalogue description(s) within two (2) business days of receiving the catalogue description(s) from RM's Research department.


10. Motor Car(s) or Any Other Lot(s) Operation.

- 10.1 The Consignor(s) warrants that the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) are in a safe, operable condition to be driven or moved by RM's employees or representatives. The Consignor(s) acknowledges that it is the Consignor(s)' responsibility to maintain sufficient insurance coverage to permit such driving or moving, and the Consignor(s) specifically agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold RM harmless, as provided in this agreement, from any liability that may result from such driving or movement of the motor car(s) or any other lot(s).

12. No-Sale of Motor Car(s) or Any Other Lot(s).

- 12.1 At the termination of this agreement due to a no-sale, the Consignor(s) is required to remove their non-sold motor car(s), including motorcycle(s), boat(s), and trailer(s), from the auction site by the next business day by three PM (3:00 p.m. EST) in the jurisdiction where the auction was held ("Removal Deadline").
 - 12.1.1 Contingent upon clause 12.1 being satisfied, the motor car(s) Title(s) (as long as the Consignor(s) do not owe RM any money) will be returned to the Consignor(s) within sixty (60) business days.



RM money, and to apply any money due or to become due to the Consignor(s), to the outstanding money the Consignor(s) owes to RM.

13. Cancellation/Rescission of Auction.

- 13.1 RM will use reasonable efforts to avoid cancellation/rescission; however, RM has the sole discretion to cancel/rescind the auction and will not be liable to the Consignor(s) for any losses or damages resulting from the cancellation/rescission if RM believes the following events have occurred or have a reasonable probability of occurring:
 - 13.1.1 Force Majeure events including, but not limited to:
 - 13.1.1.1 Natural disaster, which despite reasonable efforts, restricts RM from holding the auction;
 - 13.1.1.2 Structural damage to the auction venue prior to the auction, which despite reasonable efforts, restricts RM from holding the auction; and
 - 13.1.1.3 Terrorist event, which despite reasonable efforts, restricts RM from holding the auction.

- 16. Odometer Statement. The Consignor(s) agrees to provide a duly executed odometer statement on or before the first day of

17. Reserve(s).

- 17.1 The reserve price(s) noted in the fillable section of the Auction Consignment Agreement is the lowest bid acceptable to the Consignor(s). The reserve(s) may be lowered at any time by the Consignor(s), either verbally or in writing, but they may not be raised. The reserve(s) do not include commissions to RM. RM has the right to sell the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) at a price below the agreed verbal or written reserve(s) provided that the Consignor(s) receives the same net proceeds as the Consignor(s) would have received had the reserve(s) been met. If no reserve(s), indicate clearly by writing "NONE" in the space provided in the fillable section of the Auction Consignment Agreement.
- 17.2 If RM contributes to the hammer price to meet the reserve(s), the reserve(s) for the respective motor car(s) or any other lot(s) become the hammer price plus RM's contribution for purposes of commissions.
- Insurance. 
19. Withdrawn Motor Car(s) or Any Other Lot(s).

- 19.1 The Consignor(s) acknowledges that RM has incurred and will incur significant costs preparing, advertising, marketing, and promoting the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) for the auction.

The law of the jurisdiction in which the auction is held shall govern the provisions of this agreement.
- **21. Marketing Fee.** The marketing fee is non-refundable and is not credited toward the sales commission.
- 22. Bidding Restrictions. The Consignor(s) hereby agrees not to bid on his/her/their motor car(s) or any other lot(s). Although the auctioneer shall be entitled to bid on the Consignor(s)' behalf up to the amount of the reserve(s) (if applicable), the Consignor(s) shall neither instruct nor permit any other person to bid on behalf of the Consignor(s) for his/her/their motor car(s) or any other lot(s). If, however, in violation of the foregoing, the Consignor(s) (or his or her agent) bids on his/her/their motor car(s) or any other lot(s) and becomes the successful Bidder(s), the expenses, entry fee, repair expenses, Buyers' Premium, and Sellers' Commission on the hammer price shall be payable by the Consignor(s). If the Consignor(s) does not pay in accordance with this clause, his/her/their motor car(s) or any other lot(s) may be sold without reserve(s).

23. Motor Car(s) or Any Other Lot(s) Batteries. If the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) arrives at the auction with a dead battery, or shows signs of a draining battery, an automatic \$200.00 (USD) (or the local currency equivalent) replacement fee will be charged to the Consignor(s).

- 26. No Legal or Tax Advice. This agreement is an important legal document. The Consignor(s) acknowledges that the Consignor(s) has had the opportunity to consult an attorney before signing this agreement and has signed this agreement after having the opportunity to consult with an attorney of their own choosing. Notwithstanding any references to any transactions or arrangements in this agreement, or any contemporaneous written, oral, or implied understandings of the Parties relating to the subject matter of this agreement, RM has not provided legal or tax advice or tax planning services to the Consignor(s) or for the Consignor(s)' benefit in connection with the transactions contemplated by this agreement, and no one at RM has acted as the Consignor(s)' attorney or tax advisor.
- 27. Money Laundering. The Consignor(s) agrees to provide all information and assistance reasonably requested by RM to comply with RM's internal Anti-Money Laundering process and to comply with any and all Money Laundering Laws and Regulations in force in the jurisdiction in which the auction is held.
- 28. Photography, Videography, and Illustrations. All photographs, videography, and illustrations commissioned by RM for the motor car(s) or any other lot(s) are the absolute property of RM and RM shall have the absolute right to use the photographs, videography, and illustrations as RM deems fit.





BIDDER(S)' CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

1. Introduction.

- 1.1 Please ensure that you read and understand these Conditions of Business prior to bidding on a motor car(s) or any other lot(s) at this or any other RM Auctions, Inc. ("RM") sale. Please note that the winning Bidder(s) becomes the Buyer(s) who is also bound by these Conditions of Business.
- 1.2 RM's contractual relationship with the Bidder(s)' are governed by:
 - 1.2.1 These Bidder(s)' Conditions of Business;
 - 1.2.2 The Conditions of Business displayed in the auction salesroom;
 - 1.2.3 The Conditions of Business displayed on RM's website; and
 - 1.2.4 In each case as amended by any salesroom notice or auctioneer's announcement at the auction.

(clauses 1.2 to 1.2.4 together "Contractual Obligations")

- 1.3 As auctioneer, RM acts as agent for the Consignor(s), and a sale contract is made directly between the Consignor(s) and Buyer(s).

- 4.5 By participating in the sale, the Bidder(s) represent and warrant that any bid(s) placed by them, or on their behalf, are not the product of any collusive or other anti-competitive agreement and are otherwise consistent with federal and state antitrust law. RM may require such necessary financial references, guarantees, deposits, and/or such other security, at their absolute discretion, as security for their bid(s). 5. Purchase Price.

- 5.1 The Purchase Price shall consist of the following:

(clauses 5.1 to 5.1.2 together "Purchase Price")

6. Buyers' Premium.

Notwithstanding any references to any transactions or arrangements in this agreement, or any contemporaneous written, oral, or implied understandings of the Parties relating to the subject matter of this agreement, RM has not provided legal or tax advice or tax planning services to the Bidder(s) or for the Bidder(s)' benefit in connection with the transactions contemplated by this agreement, and no one at RM has acted as the Bidder(s)' attorney or tax advisor. It is the Bidder(s)' responsibility to satisfy themselves and comply with all applicable tax, duty, or any and all other payments associated with the purchase of motor car(s) or any other lot(s) at an RM auction.


9. Payment.

- 9.1 Subject to fulfillment of the Contractual Obligations, on the fall of the auctioneer's hammer or equivalent device or mechanism ("Hammer Price"), the contract between the Consignor(s) and the Bidder(s) is concluded and payment is due in full on or before 5:00 p.m. of the next business day ("Payment Deadline"), and payment is to be made to RM.

The Bidder(s) hereby authorizes RM to deduct the Purchase Price plus applicable taxes from the Bidder(s)' cash deposit or to charge this amount to the credit card that the Bidder(s) has provided. If the Bidder(s)' cash deposit and/or credit card payment does not cover the Purchase Price plus applicable taxes, in addition to other remedies available by law, RM reserves the right to impose, from the Payment Deadline until the full Purchase Price plus applicable taxes has been made by the Buyer(s), a late charge of ten percent (10%) interest per annum on the (1) Purchase Price plus applicable taxes; (2) maximum published Sellers' Commission; (3) applicable expenses; (4) any collection costs, attorney fees, and court costs incurred to enforce payment; and (5) other damages.

 - 14.1.2 RM opines that physical damage to the motor car(s) or any other lot(s), which cannot be sufficiently repaired prior to the auction, occurred after this agreement was signed;
 - 14.1.3 RM is served with a lawsuit from a third party in relation to the motor car(s) or any other lot(s);
 - 14.1.4 RM faces significant reputational damages which would cause monetary damages for selling the motor car(s) or any other lot(s);
