Since its inception, the model has evolved. Not only are they made as wristwatches, but also as pendant and pocket watches. The present example in white gold is highly complicated and lavishly decorated with a mother of pearl motif and dial, adorned with baguette-cut rubies and both round and baguette-cut diamonds. Complemented by its white gold and ruby-set chain, this rare watch is an excellent example of the evolution of the 'Reverso' model.

Ulysse Nardin has a rich legacy of producing complicated watches with repeaters and automatons. The attention to detail the firm places on each of their pieces is extremely evident here with this limited edition Jungle Repeater.

The dial comprises of two separate cloisonné dials, giving it a three dimensional appearance. This technique adds depth to the scene, down to the smallest detail of a fish leaping from the water behind a rock in the foreground towards the left side of the dial.

Craftsmen used the cloisonné enameling technique to delicately render each creature, tree, and flower that feature in this jungle scene. The smaller the motif, the more difficult it is for the artisan to place each cloison. The cloisonné work is exceptional given the time consuming and precise artistry needed to render each detail.

When the wearer activates the minute-repeating slide, the jungle scene truly comes alive. The tiger waves its paw, and the toucan rocks back and forth with each chime.

The Jungle Repeater was produced as an extremely limited edition, with only 18 pieces each made in yellow gold, pink gold, and platinum.







From 1919 to 1936, Cartier created some of the world's most extraordinary clocks. Cartier's Art Deco period creations took inspiration from Egyptian, Persian, Indian, Chinese and Japanese cultures and motifs. They were highly imaginative and fanciful, using a full arsenal of fine jewels and precious stones.

When Cartier re-opened their jeweled clock department in the 1970s, it was no surprise that it was extremely well received. Many popular designs and techniques of the Art Deco period were re-imagined for the modern client. Indeed, the present lot emulates with striking similarity details to a desk timepiece from 1926, illustrated in Barracca, J., Negretti, G., Nencini, F., Le Temps De Cartier, 1989, p. 167. Prior to their acquisition, Patek Philippe ordered many of their dials from Stern Frères SA, arguably the finest dial makers in the world.

The present example is with an extremely well preserved dial, probably by Stern Frères. The dial is particularly interesting for its unusual enamel dial with a highly engraved gold center field in the *Empire style* and hand painted Breguet numerals.

The Empire style of design came about in the early 19th century and takes its name from the period of the First French Empire and the rule of Napoleon Bonaparte. The neo-classical aspects of the style were very popular throughout Europe and its themes were revived again and again in the decades that followed.

Julius C. Walk began his career as a watchmaker and jeweler at age 14 in Indianapolis. In 1867, he began working for a high end jewelry store, and eventually became partner of Bingham and Walk in 1877. Once his business partner died, he re-named the firm Julius C. Walk & Sons. The firm was an agent for high end watch makers, such as Patek Philippe.

There has been much debate over the origins of the self-winding watch. The Swiss maker A-L. Perrelet developed the first system in 1770, while around the same period, the Jaquet Droz developed another. However, it is through the followers of the Jaquet Droz that the most significant advancement in commercialization of the self-winding system occurred (see: Jean Claude Sabrier, *The Self-Winding Watch* pp.117, 161-191.) The present lot, though unsigned can be attributed to one of these followers. For similar examples see (Sabrier, p.166, figs.115 a, b, 116 a, b, and p, 172 figs.125a, b.)

Another characteristic of the Swiss self-winding watches were their decorative enamel dials with center seconds and the hours and minute dial at 6 o'clock. The script on the dial reads:

"Le temps passe passe passe comme ce fil entre mes doigts: bis: il est à nous autant qu'au roi :bis", translating to "Time passes passes passes like a thread between my fingers, it belongs to us as much as to the king."

This line comes from a comedy entitled "Les Moissonneurs," presented for the first time in 1768. It reminds the viewer that time passes equally for everyone, no matter their station at birth

The development of the self-winding watch was not exclusive to Switzerland. In England in 1780, Louis Recordon patented his design (see: Joseph Flores, *Antiquarian Horology*, autumn 1995). While in France Breguet developed his self-winding system around the same time as Recordon and his patent. Indeed, the earliest known self-winding watch signed by Breguet is numbered 1 and is dated AD 1781.

Ferdinand Berthoud (1727-1807) was born in the Swiss Jura and left for Paris following a three year apprenticeship to his brother, Jean Henri. After arriving in France, it is thought that he worked for the great horologist, Julien LeRoy (1686-1759). At the early age of 25, Berthoud made a

clock with perpetual calendar that also indicated mean and solar time, which he presented to the Académie des Sciences. Their approval helped Berthoud establish himself as a highly acclaimed horologist. His output of clocks, watches and marine chronometers was astonishing, as was his insatiable appetite for writing on the subject.

Berthoud received the title of Master Watchmaker in 1754, and dedicated the rest of his life to studying and developing accurate marine chronometers. In 1764, he received the title of Horologer de la Marine; a post particularly esteemed at a period when the race to construct a timepiece capable of finding longitude at sea was of critical importance. His new title was accompanied by a handsome salary, which helped support his continued experimentation on precision clocks.

King Louis XV appointed him to visit London to observe John Harrison's famous H4. Harrison, suspicious that Berthoud would use his knowledge for the benefit of the French Navy, only showed him H1, H2, and H3. Regardless of this set-back, Berthoud established several key relationships on this trip, and on his second visit in 1765, met with Thomas Mudge, who described the working principles of H4 without showing it to him.

Berthoud returned to France with an understanding of the new British technology. and designed two marine clocks which were successfully used on a number of voyages by the French Navy. From then on, he produced all marine clocks and watches used on the King's ships, dedicating nearly 50 years to the study of accurate marine chronometers. He experimented with multiple design variants, beginning early on with weight driven chronometers, and then moving to spring-powered chronometers. He later built compensating mechanisms into the balance itself. In all, Berthoud produced between 70 and 80 marine chronometers, of which several important examples reside in the Conservatorie des Arts et Métiers, in Paris. For detailed information on Berthoud's life and work see Hans Von Bertele, Marine and Pocket Chronometers. pp. 42-43, and Rupert T. Gould, The Marine Chronometer, pp.126-166.



The presently offered marine chronometer is a remarkable appearance of what seems to be a previously unknown Ferdinand Berthoud Marine Chronometer. Its specific variation on temperature compensation and the unusual numbering system employed highlight this as a truly rare piece.

The temperature compensation employed is seen on some of Berthoud's pieces, and includes what appears to be an original large bimetallic compensation blade across the top of the movement, designed to provide a rotative action on a pivoting curb on the balance spring when the temperature changes, and is thought to be based on one of Berthoud's earlier compensation systems.

Of further note is the fact that this chronometer has a roman numeral serial number suggesting that Berthoud may have used two separate numbering systems for his chronometers; one series using Arabic numerals, and another using Roman numerals. No. XXXII, a Berthoud chronometer in the permanent collection of the Conservatorie des Arts et Métiers in Paris, shares some of the same features as the present piece, including dial layout, temperature compensation set-up and numbering sequence. For an illustration of no.XXXII, see Hans Von Bertele, *Marine and Pocket Chronometers*, p. 140, figs. 120 a & b.

Accompanied by Breguet Certificate number 4511 dated 24 April 2018, recording the sale of no.106 Montre Marine in an octagonal case to "Monsieur Ducom (Breguet's Bordeaux Agent)" on 11 January 1816, for the price of 2000 Francs. The certificate further records the ebauches was made by Samuel Roy before 1800.

Breguet's earliest marine chronometers are numbered 104, 105, and 106 (the present lot). No. 106 has the distinction of being the maker's earliest known recorded sale of a marine chronometer in 1816. Its sale predates those of Nos. 104 and 105, which occurred in 1817 and 1818 respectively, each selling for 2000 Francs. Of the three, No. 106 is thought to be the only known survivor. Work on the chronometers was believed to have started prior to Breguet's exile to Switzerland in 1793.

The construction of these three early pieces testifies to the influence of the work of English watchmaker John Arnold. Indeed, like many of Arnold's marine chronometers, they are housed in octagonal mahogany boxes, see Sotheby's London, *The George Daniels Horological Collection* 6, November 2012, lot 101.





The two makers became aware of each other's work when they met during Breguet's first visit to London in 1789. Their friendship and mutual admiration for each other's work lead to the apprenticeship of Breguet's son, Antoine-Louis, with Arnold in London. At the same time, Arnold sent his son, John Roger Arnold to apprentice for Breguet. Unfortunately, the apprenticeships were interrupted when Breguet had to flee France in 1793 due to the Reign of Terror.

George Daniels, considered to be the Modern Day Breguet, wrote about No. 106, "The external appearance is remarkably like the early 1790s work of John Arnold. This further emphasizes the ties which existed between the two men," see George Daniels, *The Art of Breguet*, 1974, p. 84 and illustration of the present lot p.157.

In 1815, Breguet received the title of Horologer de La Marine. Shortly thereafter, he sold No. 106. From 1818, Breguet's production of marine chronometers was well under way.


The Breguet certificate records that the ebauche for No.106 was supplied by Samuel Roy. Roy was a Swiss clockmaker from La Chaux-de-Fonds, and was known to supply Breguet with ebauches per Breguet's designs. He is also thought to have supplied the ebauche for Breguet's three wheel clocks, see George Daniels, *Op.Cit*, p. 80, for a discussion of Roy's work for Breguet.

Of further interest is that the Certificate also mentions the sale of the piece to his agent Ducom in Bordeaux. Ducom represented Breguet in the port city of Bordeaux to sell his Marine Chronometers. For another Breguet Marine Chronometer also sold to Ducom De Bordeaux see, Sotheby's Geneva, 12 November 2013, lot 328.

The presently offered lot is, to the best of our knowledge, the only known reunited pair of consecutively numbered Four-Colored Gold Frères Rochat Singing Bird Snuff Boxes.

Miniature marvels, such as the present lot, became exceedingly popular during the late 18thcentury, and appealed greatly to the Chinese Market. The Emperor of China and his court were as fascinated by European mechanical novelties as the Europeans were by Chinese works of art. The Jesuit priest, Matthew Ricci was allowed to enter the forbidden city of Peking with gifts of chiming clocks for the Emperor in 1600 (Alfred Chapuis, *La Montre Chinoise*, p.23). The Portuguese trading port of Macao (founded in 1514), and later established warehouses by European merchant companies in Hong Kong solidified a strong platform for trade with the Chinese Market through Canton.

It had long been traditional to send objects to China in pairs. According to Alfred Chapuis, Le Miroir de la Séduction, Musée Patek Philippe, Geneva, 2010, pp.28, 'the Chinese love symmetry; all gifts to a superior, and above all the Emperor,

were given in pairs." It has been said that many pairs of Chinese Market watches and boxes were split up as a result of looting by the British and French during the raid on the Summer palace in Peking in 1860, when 'every soldier must have his singsong.' It is thus a rare event to present this reunited pair of singing bird boxes.

Pairs of singing bird boxes are virtually unknown, especially in such astounding condition. The Patek Philippe Museum in Geneva houses excellent examples of surviving pairs of Chinese Market pocket watches. Rarer still, are pairs of snuff boxes with musical elements.

To the best of our knowledge, the only other pair of singing bird boxes known was sold with movements by Jaquet –Droz & Leschot, and the cases by Guidon, Rémond, Gide & Co. (see: Sotheby's London sale of *Treasures, Princely Taste*, lot 23, July 6, 2011, sold for nearly \$1,200,000 USD.) Since then, collectors have not seen another pair of singing bird boxes offered at auction, and further, we do not know of any other pairs owned and exhibited in major museums globally.

The firm of Frères Rochat (1718-1806), began as David Rochat & Son in Le Brassus, and renamed Frères Rochat by the Rochat brothers after their father's passing. Rochat and his sons worked for the firm of Jaquet –Droz & Leschot, famous for its complicated singing bird movements and a variety of complex novelties that included singing birds in mirrors, snuff boxes, needle cases and pistols.

The Rolex Turn-O-Graph debuted in 1953 with the reference 6202, and the present lot is an example of the reference 6609, introduced in 1954, and in production until 1960 within the DateJust family. The new reference included many design changes from the original model including a cyclops date window at 3 o'clock, and a fine engine turned bezel with compressed markers every five minutes instead of every minute. Richard Mille's RM008 is arguably the magnum opus of their entire collection, and to this day, one of the most complicated objects ever made.

Inspired by Formula 1 racing and composed of over 500 parts, the split second chronograph function is extremely desirable among racing aficionados, as it enables the wearer to simultaneously time two distinct events.

The RM008 movement went through subtle changes in the pursuit of horological precision. Richard Mille intended for the individual pieces of the powerful chronograph movement to move in sync, with consistent and isometric movements to avoid the negative impacts of inertia - specifically the impact of starting and stopping the chronograph function due to the mass of the hands and gears. Small adjustments to the movement combined with new materials and new technologies led to a second version of the RM008, which virtually eliminates the jumping action of the chronograph hands.

Though changes to the RM008 were minimal, they did widely affect the production run of the model. The present lot, with the movement number 13, represents one of less than 30 RM008 V1 models to the best of our knowledge. With this significant change in production,

V1 models are extremely rare dating from 2006 or earlier.

Vacheron Constantin has long mastered the making of coin watches in many variations, from ultra thin, to concealed watches, to wristwatches. The firm first achieved the design in 1850, when Vacheron Constantin was commissioned to create a watch concealed within a Russian coin. Since then, they have integrated a variety of coins from around the world in their designs for these pieces.

The present lot is especially unique for its provenance and design. Inspired by Persian medals commemorating the Twelve Laws of the White Revolution issued in 1962, this watch is beautifully rendered with an open faced dial, and bezel with chased star motif. The timepiece was likely a special commission from the Royal court

of Iran, made in 1970. Depicting Mohammad-Reza Pahlavi, the second and last monarch of the House of Pahlavi, the Iranian government often gifted commemorative pieces like this. Indeed, the present lot comes to us from the original owner, who received the timepiece from the former Minister of Foreign Affairs of Iran upon his visit to Washington, DC in 1971.

The timepiece likely commemorates the White Revolution, a far-reaching series of modern reforms launched under the leadership of Mohammad-Reza Pahlavi which promoted rapid industrial, military, and economic modernization, and liberating social reforms for women.

During the 1920s and 1930s, jump hour watches were not popular. There production was low, and are therefore today considered quite rare.

Jump hour models substitute the hour hand with an underdial hour disk with numerals 1 through 12. When the minutes advance from 59 to 0 at the beginning of a new hour, the hour disk rotates one increment so the new hour is displayed through the aperture. Rather than progressing over the course of 60 minutes as in the analog display, the hour indication 'jumps' at the last minute of the hour, as suggested by the description.

In 1926, Breguet patented the design of a watch with jumping hours and a revolving dial. With this new design, the central portion of the dial revolves fully every hour, so that the minutes are indicated by the arrow. As the aperture for hour is located at the tip of the arrow, and thus circumnavigates the dial, this feature is known as a 'wandering' hour.

The Vanderbilts are instantly recognizable as one of the wealthiest families of America's Gilded Age. Indeed, Cornelius Vanderbilt was the richest man in America until his death in 1877. 

The Autavia chronograph is one of many firsts for Heuer: the first chronograph to have a model name, the first chronograph to incorporate a revolving bezel, and the first wristwatch designed by Jack Heuer at only 30 years of age. The Autavia was creatively named for its target markets AUTOmotive, and AVIAtion, and unveiled in 1962 with great success.

The Heuer reference 2446C is particularly special within the development of the Autavia line for its limited production (1968-1971), transitional dial and case configuration. The reference was aptly named for its updated case developed by E. Piquerez SA. The C applied to the reference 2446C, represents the compressor design back which allowed the case back to tighten as the watch is subjected to water pressure. 

Indeed the present lot was personally engraved for Daniel Putnam Brown, Jr. a team member who sailed the Constellation to victory in 1964.

Within the Submariner family, the Reference 5513 stands as a highly important early model, and remains one of the longest Rolex references in production, for nearly 30 years. The Rolex Ref. 4500 is one of the very few Oyster chronograph models to feature only two subsidiary dials, for constant seconds, and 30-minute register. As a result, the dial is rendered more symmetrical, and along with its round pushers and screw down case back, bears similarities to Patek Philippe's celebrated Reference 1463.

The present example is particularly unusual for its pulsations scale. The pulsometer scale is an uncommon calibration designed for medical professionals to count the exact number of heartbeats per minute. According to our research, an extremely limited number of vintage Rolex chronographs with Oyster cases featuring pulsations dials were produced, and less than four 4500s have appeared to market with these scales.

Reference 4500 was launched in the 1940s and was available in yellow gold, pink gold, stainless steel and in stainless steel and gold.

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
