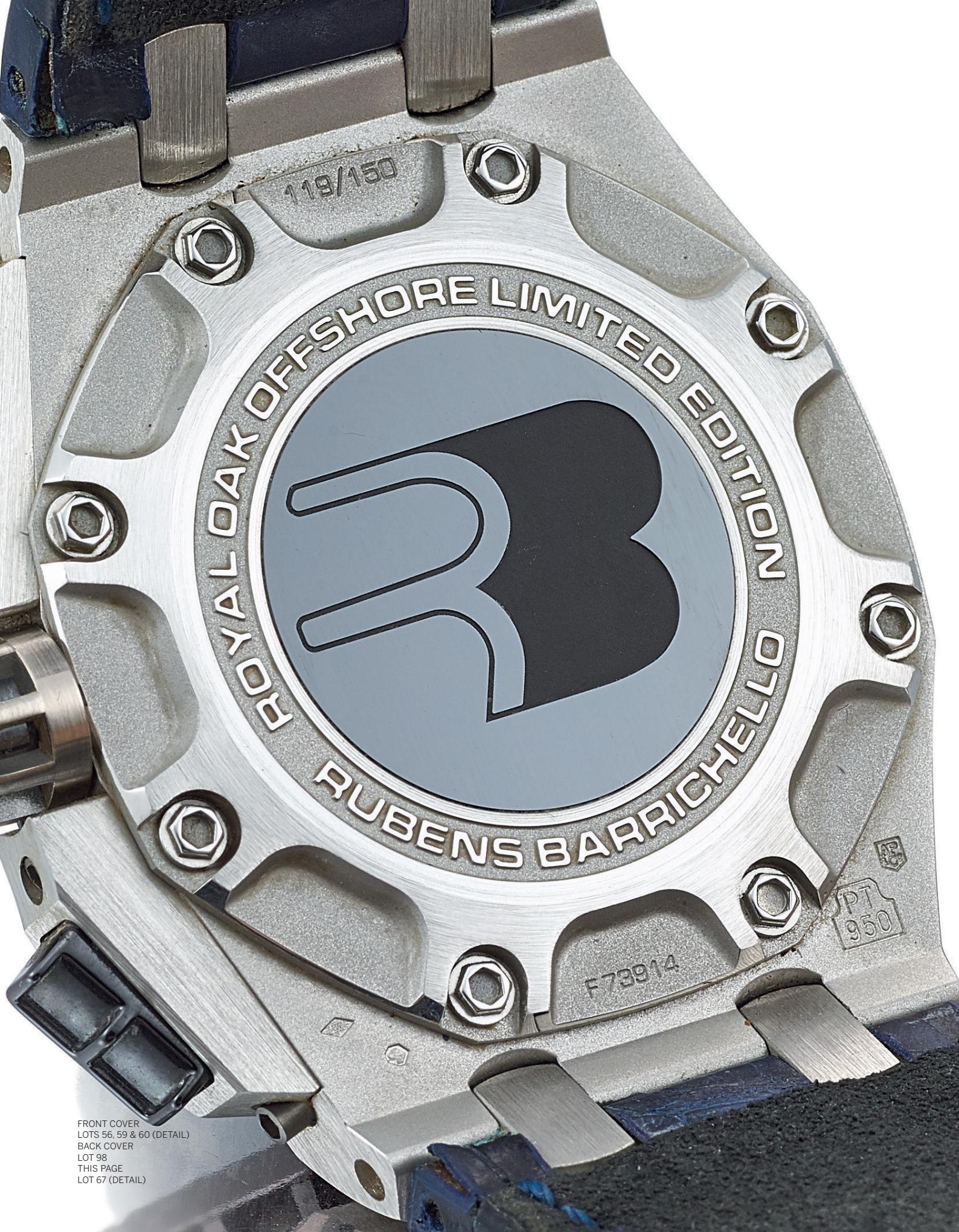

Saud bin Abdul Aziz was the son of the founder of Saudi Arabia and the country's first King, Abdul Aziz Al Saud (1876-1953), also known as King Ibn Saud. Saud bin Abdul Aziz succeeded his father as King of Saudi Arabia from 1953 to 1964.

Reference 2481 was introduced by Patek Philippe in 1950 and was one of the largest wristwatches ever made by the brand. The standard reference is fitted with silvered dial but exceptions were made and beautifully rare cloisonné enamel dials depicting portraits of celebrities, landscapes or continents for special order were manufactured.

According to our research, the present model was made in a limited edition of about 250 pieces in pink gold and was produced as part of a special order from the Patek Philippe retailer in Saudi Arabia to honor the King Ibn Saud.

The present watch is not only in excellent original condition, but also fitted with a rare pink gold original bracelet produced by Gay Frères and signed Patek Philippe.

In 1967 Rolex launched the Sea-Dweller, the first ever sports watch to feature the integration of a helium escape valve (HEV). This design allowed divers to dive deeper without worrying that the watch might fail. When initially released, Rolex was still working towards the patent for this new technology and the early Sea-Dwellers were engraved with the wording "Patent Pending Rolex Oyster Gas Escape Valve" on the case back. This Patent Pending reference 1665 is a very fine and early example. Dating from 1967, the dial is a Mark 2 (Mk2) type with the double red printed Sea-Dweller on the first line and Submariner 2000 on the second. The Mark 2 dial is identified by the long and skinny cornet with the letters "D" and "W" for the word "Sea-Dweller" almost touching. What is also very charming is the uniform way that the lumes and hands have aged consistently and the warm ivory tone they have become. Striking still, is the black finish of the dial that has started to turn a very subtle shade of brown that can be identified in certain lights. The inside case back is stamped IV.67 and the watch is fitted with an Oyster bracelet, with a rare "Pat Pend"-signed extension piece. Finally, one would assume that the name engraved to the case back Douglas H. Joyce is that of the original owner and his social security number 409-78-8026 stamped beneath it.

It is interesting to note that a very similar Double Red Sea-Dweller with patent pending case and mk2 dial bearing the case number 1'720'913 was sold at public auction in December, 2012. According to literature, only around 150 examples of these early examples were made with serial numbers ranging between 1.7 million and 2.2 million.

(b) As auctioneer, Sotheby's acts as agent for the Seller. A sale contract is made directly between the Seller and the Buyer. However, Sotheby's may own a lot (and in such circumstances acts in a principal capacity as Seller) and/or may have a legal, beneficial or financial interest in a lot as a secured creditor or otherwise.

2. COMMON TERMS IN THESE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

In these Conditions of Business:

"Bidder" is any person considering, making or attempting to make a bid, by whatever means, and includes Buyers;

"Buyer" is the person who makes the highest bid or offer accepted by the auctioneer, and includes such person's principal when bidding as agent;

"GCC" means the Gulf Cooperation Council;

"Hammer Price" is the highest bid accepted by the auctioneer by the fall of the hammer (in the case of wine, as

apportioned pro-rata by reference to the number of separately identified items in that lot), or in the case of a post-auction sale, the agreed sale price;

"Purchase Price" is the Hammer Price and applicable Buyer's Premium, VAT and duties;

"Reserve" is the (confidential) minimum Hammer Price at which the Seller has agreed to sell a lot;

"Seller" is the person offering a lot for sale including their agent (other than Sotheby's), executors or personal representatives;

4. EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY TO BUYERS

5. BIDDING AT AUCTION

Bidders act as principal unless they have Sotheby's prior written consent to bid as agent for another party. Bidders are personally liable for their bid and are jointly and severally liable with their principal if bidding as agent.

(a) store the lot at its premises or elsewhere at the Buyer's sole risk and expense;

(c) The Bidder and/or Buyer undertakes that none of the Purchase Price will be funded by any Sanctioned Person(s), nor will any party involved in the transaction including financial institutions, freight forwarders or other forwarding agents or any other party be a Sanctioned Person(s) nor owned (or partly owned) or controlled by a Sanctioned Person(s), unless such activity is authorized in writing by the government authority having jurisdiction over the transaction or in applicable law or regulation.

10. FAILURE TO COLLECT PURCHASES

(a) If the Buyer pays the Purchase Price and Buyer's Expenses but fails to collect a purchased lot within thirty (30) calendar days of the auction, the lot will be stored at the Buyer's expense (and risk) at Sotheby's or with a third party.

12. GENERAL

(e) The Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 is excluded by these Conditions of Business and shall not apply to any contract made pursuant to them.

(f) The materials listed in Condition 1(a) above set out the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. It is agreed that, save in respect of liability for fraudulent misrepresentation, no party has entered into any contract pursuant to these terms in reliance on any representation, warranty or undertaking which is not expressly referred to in such materials.

13. DATA PROTECTION

We will hold and process your personal information and may share it with another Sotheby's Group company for use as described in, and in line with, our Privacy Policy published on our website at www.sothebys.com or available on request by email to enquiries@sothebys.com.

14. LAW AND JURISDICTION

Governing Law These Conditions of Business and all aspects of all matters, transactions or disputes to which they relate or apply (including any online bids in the sale to which these Conditions of Business apply) shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with English law.

In our opinion a work by an unknown hand in the studio of the artist which may or may not have been executed under the artist's direction.

4 CIRCLE OF GIOVANNI BELLINI

In our opinion a work by an as yet unidentified but distinct hand, closely associated with the named artist but not necessarily his pupil.

5 STYLE OF.....; FOLLOWER OF GIOVANNI BELLINI
