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

A DISTINGUISHED SWISS PRIVATE COLLECTION

This glorious collection of ready-to-drink, top flight wine comes to sale at the time of the year when many of us in the fine wine trade are tasting the new vintage of the greatest Bordeaux châteaux. Even while we assess these infant cask samples, we are aware that many years of patience will be required before such wines will be at their best, developing infinite dimension and complexity as they slumber in bottle. When a mature cellar such as this comes to auction, we know that it will be the answer to the prayers of those who love classic wines at the point when they show their maximum beauty and potential. Altruistically, the wine-loving owner of this collection has done all the original work of acquiring and storing (impeccably) these great crus and now finds that he can divest himself of a splendid selection of these treasures

In the interests of accuracy, it must be said that this consignor thought in terms of the First Growths when he was buying Bordeaux - and, in all honesty, who can blame him, for these are the wines by which others are measured. Perhaps more importantly, they are also the châteaux that receive the reverence they are due for their wonderful capacity to age and come into their own. They have proved themselves over the centuries, sometimes with changed ownership and with natural vintage variation, but always with the same base material, which is the land itself. So, here, in all their majesty, are the Premiers Crus of the Left Bank and their equivalents from the Right Bank, just waiting to reveal their true selves and lure us in to vinous bliss.

The vintages come from the two decades of the Eighties and Nineties, with all their landmarks and superstars, some of them powerful and deep, others elegant and charming. Recently, for example, we have been enjoying a range of 1986s and 1988s, years that were judged as 'needing time' when in their youth, due to their tannic structure, but which now have opened up to generous richness. And, of course, the 1989s and 1990s are always fascinating,

sometimes reversing their positions as favourites, necessitating constant reassessment. The added joy is that this can be done in bottle or magnum form. I particularly like magnums in the lighter years as the 'mass' of wine in the larger format seems to bestow greater volume to the wine.

Then comes the ultimate 'bonne bouche', a breathtaking run of Grands Crus from one of Burgundy's most illustrious, and sought after, estates. Domaine Armand Rousseau. It is almost as if this wine-loving consignor felt that only this domain could rival Bordeaux's First Growths! As a lifetime admirer of this superlative house, I cannot fault his perfect taste. Charles Rousseau was at the helm during the Eighties and Nineties, making the vintages that dominate in this fabulous selection, and here you can see the magic in full swing, with the emphasis on bringing out the individual character of each vineyard, judicious use of new oak and great attention always paid to picking time to retain the acidity/fruit balance. You can often guess a Rousseau wine on the scent alone, as it perfumes the room, but then there is the allure of the lingering taste and the way the wine dances on the palate. A truly exciting element to this amazing line-up is the existence of magnums as they are a rare breed in Burgundy.

So, Bordeaux First Growths and the legendary Burgundies of Charles Rousseau are at the heart of this extraordinary collection, with a few other gems nestling in amongst them. The wines in this sale are aristocrats of the vineyard, worthy of our respect and admiration. Happily, they are also ready to make the journey into your cellars and, ultimately, your glasses, which is what wine appreciation is all about.

CHATEAU LAFITE

Throughout the centuries, Lafite has proved that this is a wine that ages in the most ethereal way. Lafite combines elegance, breed and scent with sustained power, a miracle of balance and nobility. The extraordinary terroir and position in Pauillac have always been matched by the Rothschilds' sense of quality and vision, resulting in a wine that has mythical status. Continuity is vital in producing a great wine and the wine-making brilliance of Charles Chevallier from the 1990s to early 2016 has added extra lustre to this exceptional liquid, with the fame of the property spreading further throughout the world. When serving Lafite, decant it well in advance of drinking as its bouquet and taste amplify to multi-faceted dimensions on contact with the air. At the Château itself, they double decant, back into the original bottle with its unchanging, instantly recognisable label. Lafite matures slowly, developing gloriously with bottle age, as historic tastings have shown. Collect Lafite for yourself and watch it grow! Serena Sutcliffe, MW

It is a wine that can start slowly and then takes off like a rocket. It is always profound with many layers of taste, a real reflection of the heart of Pauillac. Château Margaux is the most imposing building of all the First Growths, its neo-classical elegance reflected in the sheer aristocratic bearing of the wines. The superb scent of Margaux fascinates - so alluring, so complex and so giving. The Mentzelopoulos régime wines are unerringly consistent in quality, often topping the charts against the toughest opposition. There is weight and depth, added to the breed and class that come from this fabulous terroir. Modern vintages are giants, brilliant creations of the late, great Paul Pontallier, exuding richness and rewarding the drinker with undying memories. Serena Sutcliffe. MW




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Ullages (Level of Wine)

For Bordeaux, Port and other wines in bottles with defined shoulders the ullage/level is indicated, if applicable, by its relative position in the bottle. Our interpretations are as follows:



u. - ullage/ullages (levels)

bn. - bottom neck; completely acceptable for any age of wine

vts. - very top shoulder; completely acceptable for any age of wine

ts. - top shoulder; usual level for wines over 15 years old

hs. - high shoulder; typical reduction through the cork, usually no problem

ms. - mid shoulder; usually some deterioration of the cork and therefore some variation

Example: (u. 3hs) means 3 bottles ullaged to high shoulder.

For Burgundy, German and other wines in bottles with sloping necks the ullage is indicated in centimetres, measured from the base of the cork.

Example: (u. 2x5cm) means 2 bottles ullaged 5 centimetres.

Fully branded cork indicates the producer, vineyard and vintage are legible on the cork.

Branded cork indicates that the cork is branded with either the producer, wine and/or vintage being legible on the cork.

Sotheby's does not indicate levels under 3 cm in the necks of the bottles inspected.

Parcel is a group of lots of the same type and quantity of wine.

It is Sotheby's policy to request any new clients or buyers preferring to make a cash payment to provide proof of identity (by providing some form of government issued identification containing a photograph, such as a passport, identity card or driver's licence) and confirmation of permanent address. Thank you for your co-operation.

For these purposes, "counterfeit" means a wine that in Sotheby's reasonable opinion is an imitation created to deceive as to producer and vintage, where the correct description of the producer and vintage is not reflected by the description in the catalogue.

The Guarantee is provided for a period of twenty one (21) days from the date of the relevant auction, is solely for the benefit of the original Buyer of record and may not be transferred to

any third party.

To be able to claim under this Guarantee, the Buyer must:
(i) notify Sotheby's in writing within such 21 day period of the reasons for believing the wine to be counterfeit, specifying the lot number, date of the auction at which it was purchased; and (ii) return the item to Sotheby's at the original selling location in the same condition as at the date of sale to the Buyer and be able to transfer good title to the lot, free from any third party claims arising after the date of the sale.

Sotheby's has discretion to waive any of the above requirements. Sotheby's may require the Buyer to obtain at the Buyer's cost the reports of two independent and recognised experts in the field, mutually acceptable to Sotheby's and the Buyer. Sotheby's shall not be bound by any reports produced by the Buyer, and reserves the right to seek additional expert advice at its own expense. In the event Sotheby's decides to rescind the sale under this Guarantee, it may refund to the Buyer the reasonable costs of up to two mutually approved independent expert reports.

Subject to the above, in the event that Sotheby's determines that the Property is "counterfeit", as the Buyer's sole remedy Sotheby's will rescind the sale and the seller will return the purchase price for the lot to the Buyer. Wine charges relating to wines in bond Please note that there may be an administration charge made by the warehouse for processing export paperwork for wine being exported under bond. Any such charge is the sole responsibility of the buyer and is a matter between the warehouse and the buyer or their agent.

Release of Lots Authority for the release of lots to the buyer will be a Release Order signed by Sotheby's which will be issued only after full payment has been received and appropriate identification has been provided. Supply of a Release Order constitutes delivery by Sotheby's.

If by that date collection has not taken place or Sotheby's has not received full payment together with valid delivery instructions, storage will be charged at the rate of £2.00 per case or part case per week. No lot will be released until all outstanding charges have been paid.

VAT AND OTHER TAX INFORMATION FOR BUYERS AT WINE SALES

1. PROPERTY WITH NO VAT SYMBOL

Where there is no VAT symbol, Sotheby's is able to use the Auctioneer's Margin Scheme and VAT will not normally be charged on the hammer price.

Sotheby's must bear VAT on the buyer's premium and hence will charge an amount in lieu of VAT at the standard rate on this premium. This amount will form part of the buyer's premium on our invoice and will not be separately identified.

Please see 'Exports from the European Union' for the conditions to be fulfilled before the amount in lieu of VAT in the buyer's premium may be refunded.

(VAT-registered buyers from within the European Union (EU) should note that the amount in lieu of VAT contained within the buyer's premium cannot be cancelled or refunded by Sotheby's or HM Revenue and Customs.)

(VAT-registered buyers from within the EU requiring an invoice under the normal VAT rules, instead of a margin scheme invoice, should notify the Post Sale Service Group or the Client Accounts Department on the day of the auction and an invoice with VAT on the hammer price will be raised. VAT will be charged at the standard rate on the buyer's premium.

(VAT - registered buyers from the UK should note that the invoice issued by Sotheby's showing import VAT payable, is not suitable evidence for recovering that VAT. In order to recover this as input tax, a VAT registered buyer must purchase the wine in bond and clear it under his own name and VAT number. HM Revenue and Customs will then issue a Form C79 which is acceptable evidence for recovering the VAT as input tax subject to the normal rules.)

4. PROPERTY SOLD WITH A \Diamond SYMBOL

- Sotheby's is not able to cancel or refund any VAT charged on sales made to UK or EU private residents.
- any refund of VAT is subject to a minimum of £50 per shipment and a processing charge of £20.

Please note that where wine is offered in bond the only way to avoid paying UK VAT on the hammer price is to export the wine under bond.

6. VAT REFUNDS TO NON EU BUSINESS BUYERS

Where a non EU buyer is able to show that it is in business the VAT charged on Buyers Premium on lots described in paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 may be refunded. Sotheby's is required to keep evidence sufficient to show HMRC that this is the case, acceptable evidence would include a current VAT, GST or Sales Tax registration or advertising material to show that the business offers its goods and services for sale.

CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS FOR BUYERS

The nature of the relationship between Sotheby's, Sellers and Bidders and the terms on which Sotheby's (as auctioneer) and Sellers contract with Bidders are set out below.

Bidders' attention is specifically drawn to Conditions 3 and 4 below,

which require them to investigate lots prior to bidding and which contain specific limitations and exclusions of the legal liability of Sotheby's and Sellers. The limitations and exclusions relating to Sotheby's are consistent with its role as auctioneer of large quantities of goods of a wide variety and Bidders should pay particular attention to these Conditions.

1 INTRODUCTION

- (a) Sotheby's and Sellers' contractual relationship with prospective Buyers is governed by:
 - (i) these Conditions of Business;
- (ii) the Conditions of Business for Sellers displayed in the saleroom and which are available upon request from Sotheby's UK salerooms or by telephoning +44 (0)20 7293 6482;
- (iii) Sotheby's Authenticity Guarantee as printed in the sale catalogue;
- (iv) any additional notices and terms printed in the sale catalogue, including the guide to Buying at Auction; and
- (v) in respect of online bidding via the internet, the Conditions of Business for Live Online Bidding on the Sotheby's website, in each case as amended by any saleroom notice or auctioneer's announcement at the auction.
- (b) As auctioneer, Sotheby's acts as agent for the Seller. A sale contract is made directly between the Seller and the Buyer. However, Sotheby's may own a lot (and in such circumstances acts in a principal capacity as Seller) and/or may have a legal, beneficial or financial interest in a lot as a secured creditor or otherwise.

2. COMMON TERMS

In these Conditions of Business: Bidder is any person considering, making or attempting to make a bid, by whatever means, and includes Buyers; Buyer is the person who makes the highest bid or offer accepted by the auctioneer, and includes such person's principal when bidding as agent; Buyer's Expenses are any costs or expenses due to Sotheby's from the Buyer and any Artist's Resale Right levy payable in respect of the sale of the Property, including an amount in respect of any applicable VAT thereon; Buyer's Premium is the commission payable by the Buyer on the Hammer Price at the rates set out in the guide to Buying at Auction plus any applicable VAT or an amount in lieu of VAT; Counterfeit is as defined in Sotheby's Authenticity Guarantee; Hammer Price is the highest bid accepted by the auctioneer by the fall of the hammer, (in the case of wine, as apportioned pro-rata by reference to the number of separately identified items in that lot), or in the case of a post-auction sale, the agreed sale price; Purchase Price is the Hammer Price and applicable Buyer's Premium and VAT; Reserve is the (confidential) minimum Hammer Price at which the Seller has agreed to sell a lot; Seller is the person offering a lot for sale (including their agent (other than Sotheby's), executors or personal

representatives);

Sotheby's means Sotheby's, the unlimited company which has its registered office at 34-35 New Bond Street, London WIA 2AA; Sotheby's Company means both Sotheby's in the USA and any of its subsidiaries (including Sotheby's in London) and Sotheby's Diamonds SA and its subsidiaries (in each case "subsidiary" having the meaning of Section 1159 of the Companies Act 2006):

VAT is Value Added Tax at the prevailing rate. Further information is contained in the guide to Buying at Auction.

3. DUTIES OF BIDDERS AND OF SOTHEBY'S IN RESPECT OF ITEMS FOR SALE

- (a) Sotheby's knowledge in relation to each lot is partially dependent on information provided to it by the Seller, and Sotheby's is not able to and does not carry out exhaustive due diligence on each lot. - (b) Each lot offered for sale at Sotheby's is available for inspection by Bidders prior to the sale.
