Its creator Gérald Genta purportedly designed this watch in 5 minutes sat in a restaurant watching the Patek Philippe executives dining. It was a watch that was born during the 70s quartz watch crisis and a design, though only drawn in an instant, that has endured more than 40 years success. Any such watch is rightly deserving icon status.

It might be true that Gérald Genta was unaware that the octagon is an ancient symbol of rebirth and revival. However, it had exactly that effect once introduced in 1972. The Royal Oak took the world of watchmaking by storm and transformed not only the watch industry, but also Audemars Piguet. It challenged the status quo and unleashed imaginations. Since then the model has adopted several different versions, materials and almost every complication.

In 1981, the perpetual calendar complication was first incorporated in the Royal Oak line. It housed the extra-thin caliber 2120, which was developed by Audemars Piguet in 1978. The present Royal Oak perfectly combines a sporty aesthetic with the perpetual calendar complication. It is remarkably elegant and fascinating at the same time.

The present watch is in great condition with brushed metal finish and sharp edges. According to our research, the movement has been re-cased during a service.

Developed during the quartz crisis which strongly hit the Swiss watch industry in the late 1960s and beginning of the 1970s, the Royal Oak revolutionised the industry and created a new category: "stainless steel sports watches". The novelty,

designed by Gérald Genta, coincided with the tendency for less ostentatious watches as the focus had shifted towards understatement and quality. The Royal Oak was an all-purpose watch that was the perfect fit for different occasions ranging from daily use to formal occasions.

Inspired by the look of a diving-suit helmet, the monobloc case along with the octagonal bezel and integrated bracelet create an aesthetically appealing design that makes this watch such an emblematic model which is sought after by collectors everywhere.

The reference 5402 can be divided into four series, distinguished by the letters A, B, C and D in front of the case numbers and not surprisingly, the "A-Series" is the most sought-after by collectors. The present example has the low case number A717 engraved on the back and comes with a rare Royal Oak bracelet made by the famed manufacturer Gay Frères

With the introduction of the Heuer Autavia in 1962, it would be another 7 years before the Autavia GMT would be released to the market. 

The reference 6239 is the "original" Rolex Daytona, the watch that would become the most sought-after and celebrated wristwatch ever produced.

The model was introduced in 1963 in America and in 1964 in Europe and it was produced until 1969.

It is today admitted that about 14,000 pieces of that reference were produced with only 300 in yellow gold. As such, this version represents less than 2.5% of the total of 6239 made.

Rare is an adjective that can be used for any gold 6239. However, rarity is not enough to make a watch truly special or highly collectible.

Condition is also a crucial element to elevate a piece to a trophy status.

For the present lot, the case has been preserved in superb original condition with strong and large lugs, clearly defined angles as well as most attractive brossé and poli finishes. The holes to the lugs to attach the spring bars are also extremely well defined with a sharp edge. The case back, also retaining its original finish, does not bear a single watchmaker mark inside.

The case looks similar to how it was when originally purchased, with the addition of the subtle patina that only time can provide.

The dial is also in breathtaking condition. The grainé dial is exempt of any marks or scuffs. The lume plots are all present, complete and have been preserved in original condition with a patina perfectly matching the hands and complementing the gold writing and indexes.

Not only this piece is in mesmerizing condition but it is fitted with an extremely rare gold bracelet that is on its own a delight for a connoisseur. The band has a very unusual pattern and perfectly hugs the case of the watch. The yellow gold has today a warm and attractive patina. The clasp is signed inside with a large Rolex logo and, on the outside, a clearly defined raised and larger than usual Rolex crown.

The watch is further accompanied by its original full set comprising the Rolex guarantee, presentation case, outer box, Cosmograph booklet and invoice. The watch, with a 2.2 million serial number, was produced around 1969. It is interesting to note, that according to the documentation, the original owner seems to have paid a deposit in 1973 to finally receive the watch in 1976. This clearly demonstrates the very low number of pieces produced. The original lead time was probably extended to manufacture the bracelet.

In addition to rarity, condition and the accompaniments, provenance is also a key criteria to determine the quality of a timepiece. This watch was kept until today within the family of its original owner. Family tradition said that the piece had been lost years ago during a move. It was just recently rediscovered hidden in the cellar behind a collection of wines.

Rationally, the present lot ticks all the boxes to make it a very important piece. It is also and equally importantly a truly beautiful watch.

It can be stated without exaggeration that this Rolex Daytona 6239 in yellow gold is one of the most attractive and important specimens in its category to have ever been presented on the auction market.



The emergence and subsequent progression of scuba diving in industry during the 60s and 70s called for very specially designed equipment. Watches in particular played a significant role in the undertakings of professional divers and were thus tools and relied upon heavily. This new demand for precision timepieces that could tolerate the stresses of prolonged deep water submersion sparked a period of significant innovation within the major Swiss manufactures, keen to capitalise on a fresh and growing market.

Introduced in 1967, The Rolex Sea-Dweller was manufactured as an evolution of the Submariner reference 5513. The 5513, perhaps one of the most famous diving watches in Rolex's repertoire, was unable to withstand excessive depths for long periods of time. As divers plunged ever deeper the then current technology was tested to its limits and new technologies had to be developed. Helium atoms represent the smallest naturally occurring particles of any gas and as such could breach the seals and seep into watch cases. The pressure difference caused by this was identified as the leading cause of breaks while decompressing after a dive. The Helium Escape Valve (HEV) was primarily introduced in the 60s and first appeared on Submariners before they were then adopted and solely used by the Sea-Dweller to release pressure caused by helium infiltration.

While these watches are rightly considered rare, what is rarer is an example so wonderfully and completely documented as the present lot. Issued to Thèo Mavrostomos in 1998, Mavrostomos was a revered deep sea diver, having worked with COMEX for 20 years. Awarded the French Order of Merit in 1997 for achieving a simulated 'saturation' dive of 701m during COMEX's Hydra X trials, Mavrostomos was used by Rolex as an ambassador of the brand, appearing in their adverts for the Sea Dweller. The case back has been inscribed to celebrate this tremendous event and the watch is still retaining all original accessories.

Comex (Compagnie Maritime d'Expertise) was founded in 1961, in Marseille, at a time when industrial deep-sea diving did not yet exist. Very soon, however, Comex promoted new technology and became a pioneer in deep sea diving operations for the offshore oil industry. Today, Comex has over 2000 employees and 800 divers located all over the world.





This Patek Philippe Reference 531 is unique. Created for Richard Bordenache and executed to his design. It is, in essence, his style immortalised. The form is guintessential 30s, specifically late 30s, and embodies a range of styles that Bordernache was undoubtedly exposed to. The archive image photographs of the watch when new show brutal, almost fascist like lines, and is accentuated by the engraved minute track; the dial, unmistakably Art Deco, features an enamel inscription stating 'This timepiece was made by Patek Philippe & Co to the design of Mr Richard Bordenache 1938'.

Born in 1905 Richard Bordenache was to become a leading figure in Romanian Architecture. Studying in the Romainan School in Rome, he went on to design numerous buildings in Romania following the styles that had influenced him in France and Italy. Though little concrete information about Mr Bordenache is readily available, it was in the interwar years that gained him significant recognition. He was awarded the State Prize for Architecture in 1954 for which he was one of three laureates. His studies and time abroad clearly influenced not only his architectural style but also his more general aesthetic as can be seen in the present lot.

This watch, when compared to the original archive images, has clearly lived a life and the case has lost its sharp, rigid form, having now softened. Nonetheless however this watch remains an incredibly special piece and poses a rare opportunity for any collector to add a truly one off piece to their collection.

Patek Philippe began experimenting with new ways of powering their time-pieces as early as the 1940's, trying out photoelectric, electronic, and

nuclear timekeeping. Patek also introduced some mechanisms with a photo-electric cells in order to store the energy in an accumulator. Additionally, if the mechanism was fully wound, the cells also switched over to charge the accumulator.

'Dome clocks', or 'Pendulettes,' sometimes so named after their dome shapes cases and small size, were introduced during the 1950s and have continued since. However, perhaps in part to their complicated and sometimes delicate production processes, Patek Philippe dome clocks are very rare. The majority that are found at auction might feature a colourful cloisonné enameled case or sometimes gilt cases with attractive applied and engraved abstract designs. On this example, we have the attractive theme of the card game, 'Bridge' applied to the round case.

The Patek Philippe Dome clock was first presented in 1955. Back then, and throughout the 50s and 60s, the clock was equipped with a mechanical 17"' pocket watch movement, which was wound by an electric winding device that was itself powered through solar cells. Starting in 1970, dome clocks were sold with quartz movements and over time their solar captors have become smaller. They completely


disappeared in the year 2007, as the quartz movement is since powered solely with batteries.

What makes these clocks appealing and desirable for collectors is the fact that every single one is a unique work of art, often upon request of clients, and the enamel decoration never repeated. The theme of the present lot is called 'The sea in the 19th century'.

Mainly kept in tones of blue and green, the enamel beautifully depicts exploration and travel on the high seas during that period. On top of the clock there is a compass and the night sky with moon, stars and planets. Adorning the cylindrical case are three main panels of cloisonné enamel. Starting in a clockwise motion, the first panel to the left of the dial shows a large vessel, a harbor and a ship's wheel. The middle panel shows a sailing boat, stars, birds flying in the sky and a pair of dividers. Finally, the last panel depicts a sextant, the sun, clouds and an hour glass.

On the first panel below the ship's wheel is the signature 'EPL', standing for the renowned enamel artist Elisabeth Perusset Lagger. She is known as one of the best of her craft and created several exceptional enamel works for Patek Philippe Dome clocks.

The present lot is one of only two examples made by Vacheron Constantin with Westminster Chimes. Confirmed by a facsimile letter dated October 3rd 1995 from Vacheron Constantin. The facsimile also confirms the sale in Bombay on 8th of November 1958.

The melody, comprised of 4 notes in 5 arrangements, also known as the Cambridge Quarters, was written in 1793 and first used in the clock tower of St Mary the Great University Church, Cambridge, England. Of course after this, during the the 19th Century, their adoption for use in Big Ben at the Palace of Westminster gained the melody global renown.

It is clear then that to allow a watch of this scale the ability to chime so complex an arrangement would have required on the most skilled craftsmen in its construction.

The present lot, signed by Louis-Elysée Piguet, exemplifies the maker's technical artistry and talent. Piguet founded his firm in 1858, and during his prolific and successful career, he improved chronographs and invented a fixed-star wheel repeating mechanism. He also notably made innovative keyless winding systems, as seen here. His work earned him the respect of his peers, and he served on several horological committees, and worked with LeCoultre Piguet when the latter received the commission for "La Marveilleuse", a watch with 24 complications.

The dynamic enamel work on this piece is attributed to P.-Amédée Champod (1834-1913), the noted enameller who specialized in Indian hunting scenes featuring tigers, lions, and horses. Champod studied painting with Sauerländer, Hugenin, M. Constantin, and Charles Glardon, and expressed interest in creating large paintings, however, his economic situation led him to make a career for himself as an enameller. He established a reputation of creating beautifully rendered enamelled scenes, as displayed here, particularly in the portrayal of the horses and the expressions on the hunters' faces. The artist clearly displays his attention to detail on the reverse side of this lot, delicately painting the reflection of the building in the water below. Champod received a silver medal for his work at the Paris World Exhibition in 1900.

and he continued to demonstrate a mastery of composition seen in the present lot throughout his career. He created several excellent Indian Tiger Hunt scenes, such as this one, throughout his career. His Tiger Hunt pieces appear in notable horological scholarship.

This piece bears many similarities to a watch with a hunting scene signed Champod, sold at Sotheby's Geneva, May 16, 1995, lot 226. Another piece with a similar Tiger Hunt scene also appears in Alfred Chapuis, *La Montre Chinoise*, p. 213, and the automaton scene bears a striking resemblance to another watch in *Timepieces in the Imperial Palace, Classics of the Forbidden City*, p. 271.

This watch is stamped with the Swiss patent number 7832, which was granted to Louis Brandt & Frère (Omega) on December 30th, 1893, for their carillon repeating system.



The present lot exhibits every characteristic one would associate with a watch made for a Royal household. The case is finely chased and engraved with folitate scrolls forming cartouche around a diamond-set monogram 'KS' to the front cover and an enamel portrait to the obverse. The decoration continues as the band and bow are both too engraved in the same style. The cuvette is also engraved denoting the name of the man for whom the piece was created, 'Especially made for H.M. Maharao Keshi Singh K.C.S.J of Sirohi'.

The well-executed enamel is signed J. Graff. John Graff was an exceptionally skilled Swiss portrait enamellist, who produced work for many noble families across Europe. He also specialised in portrait miniatures of Indian and Chinese dignitaries, to which point this watch is a fine example.

The movement of this watch is complicated and would have required the utmost skill to complete. The clockwatch feature will automatically sound the times; thus at the hours, the hours will be struck, whilst on the quarter hours, the hours and quarters will be struck. The repeating functions are powered by their own barrel and spring and as such, interestingly, the crown will wind the repeating barrel when wound one way, and the mainspring when wound the other.

This city of Sirohi, in southern Rajasthan state in western India, was formerly the capital of the princely state of Sirohi ruled by Sirohi Jat rulers. Maharao Kheshri Singh KCSJ of Sirohi was born in 1857 and ruled from 1875 until his abdication in 1892. He died in 1920.

It is estimated that from approximately 1865 he produced in the region of 20-25 tourbillons for prestigious manufactures such as F.L Favre-Bulle, Girard-Perregaux, and Patek Philippe. Indeed such was the esteem in which he was held that Patek chose him to create their first tourbillon regulator.

His designs paved the way to modern tourbillon's, and Guinand created three distinct shapes of carriage types 1, 2 and 3 as illustrated in figure one. The present lot exhibits his type 2 carriage.

Another interesting feature of this particular watch is the configuration of the bridges. At first seemingly ornate, the bridges spell the makers initial 'EG'. This makes the present lot one of perhaps as few as only three known to have this feature.

Joseph Oudin (1773 - c.1842) was one of several of his family members to be occupied in horology. Audemars Piguet confirms that the watch movement was made in 1971, and later completed and sold in 1978 in the Caribbean to the present consignor.

Few manufacturers continued to produce grand complication watches in favor of more utilitarian pieces. Audemars Piguet committed their brand to maintaining an extraordinary level of watchmaking, and continued to manufacture highly complicated hand-finished timepieces such as the present lot, featuring a minute repeater, perpetual calendar and split-seconds complication.

Breguet's earliest marine chronometers are numbered 104 (the present lot), 105, and 106. Until the present lot was discovered, No. 106, sold at Sotheby's New York, May 2018, was thought to be the only survivor. Numbers 104 and 105 were originally sold in 1817 and 1818 respectively, for 2000 Francs, whereas 106 was sold in 1816, despite the numbering sequence. Work on the chronometers was believed to have started prior to Breguet's exile to Switzerland in 1793.

The box of 104 differs in construction to the other examined early chronometer, 106, which is more in kind with the work of English watchmaker John Arnold. Indeed, like many of Arnold's marine chronometers, 106 is housed in an octagonal mahogany box, (see Sotheby's London, The George Daniels Horological Collection 6, November 2012, lot 101). The present lot, 104, is in a large, double mahogany box with rectangular gimbals, and is more like Breguet's pieces finished later, (see George Daniels, The Art of Breguet 1974, p. 274 illustration 339a). Nevertheless, the movements of both chronometers are strikingly similar, and still retain strong influence from Arnold. The balance echoes those constructed by Ferdinand Berthoud, with four arms and semicircular weights secured by what appear to be gold and platinum screws. It can be presumed that as this chronometer was sold later, the box was likely finished later, and with more experimentation from Breguet himself and therefore not in an octagonal box similar to Arnold's style.

In 1815, Breguet received the title of Horologer de La Marine. Shortly thereafter, he sold No. 106, and shortly thereafter 104 and 105. From 1818, Breguet's production of marine chronometers was well under way.

To the best of our knowledge, this is the first time chronometer No. 104 has appeared to public market, and may be the only opportunity to acquire Breguet's lowest numbered marine chronometer, a true relic of horological history.

While not immediately obvious, this watch, retailed by Cartier, was manufactured by Audemars Piguet. It represents the height of understated complexity, a watch perfectly suited to adorn the wrist of a Royal. Its humble 25 mm case conceals the tripe calendar movement and the case back, engraved with a monogram, reveals that this watch was formerly in the possession of King Hassan II of Morocco. While the dial displays a significant amount of information, namely the day, date, month, and both phases and age of the moon, its format, which could so easily be busy and superfluous, is instead balanced and legible.

King Hassan the II (1929 – 1999), son of Mohammed V (1909-1961), led an extraordinarily political life from a very young age. He was introduced to President Roosevelt at the age of fourteen, appointed Chief of Staff to the Moroccan Armed Forces at the age of twenty seven, and ascended to the throne upon his Father's death at the age of thirty two. His career was remarkably turbulent leading a country that was in a constant state of change, he survived two assassination attempts, one of which required him, ostensibly, to take control of his Royal Boeing 727 facilitating an emergency landing after it was attached by fighter jets in an attempted coup by his interior minister.



This very rare 200-year old Breguet quarter repeater is offered for the first time at auction as it was kept within a noble family over many generations. Accompanying this watch is an exquisite handwritten invoice from the year 1818, confirming the manufacturing specifics and the date of sale to the original owner Comte Alfred de Montesquiou for 2'700 Francs. In very nice condition the watch still retains well-defined engine turning to the back and its repeating mechanism is chiming nicely in phase.

A hidden miniature portrait can be discovered on the back of the cuvette. It is of exceptional quality displaying beautiful and consistent colours. The piece of art is crafted on a thin plate of ivory, signed by the artist 'Jacques' and dated 1819. The young attractive lady adorned with jewellery and a pearl-set tiara is Countess Alfred de Montesquiou-Fézensac, born Madeleine Perron. She was the daughter of General Pierre Cuillier-Perron (1754-1834), soldier of fortune in India (Perron jumped ship from the French Royal Navy off the Malabar coast in 1780, whence he made his way to upper India, enlisting first in the Rana of Gohads troops, and then under de Boigne, who appointed him to the command of his second brigade). Upon de Boigne's retirement, Perron became commander-in-chief of Maratha General Mahadji Sindhias' army, defeating the Rajput forces at the battle of Malpura in 1800. In 1803, Perron defected to the British and subsequently returned to France with a large fortune, dying in 1834 at his Château du Fresne in the Loire Valley.

Comte Alfred de Montesquiou, who originally ordered the watch from Bréguet in 1818, passed it down the family. When Comte François de Brantes married Aymone, Princesse de Faucigny-Lucinge et Coligny (and great-granddaughter of the last king of France, Charles X), the watch was her wedding gift.

Bidders need to be aware that this watch cannot be shipped to France or the United States due to the presence of ivory. For every other location outside of Switzerland, it is the responsibility of the buyer to organize and apply for a CITES license, if permitted by the respective local laws, in order for us to ship it.

The Patek Philippe reference 3448 represents a milestone in horology being the first automatic perpetual calendar wristwatch produced in a series by any manufacture. First produced in 1962, the reference enjoyed nearly 20 years of manufacture before being discontinued in 1980.

This particularly example has a very special feature, one that always serves to captivate collectors; a double signed dial. This 3448, signed 'Asprey' beneath the moon phases aperture, comes accompanied by its original box and paperwork including the Patek Philippe Certificate of Origin stamped Asprey & Co Ltd confirming the signature to the dial. What is more it has been preserved in very original condition, retaining strong proportions and crisp edges.

The case design, in comparison to the models it succeeded, displays a clear departure from Patek's aesthetic, especially when compared to the other perpetual calendar models. The case is somewhat brutalist in appearance, utilising sharper lines and angles to the lugs and bezel, the bezel itself is flat and wider than other models which tended to be softer and more rounded. The combination of these characteristics give the reference a very contemporary feel even today, it is therefore to be expected that the watch remains a hugely desirable model.

The terms factory fresh and new old stocks are thrown around, some may argue, fairly loosely. In this instance however one can rest safe in the knowledge that they are used entirely justly. Patek Philippe produced the reference 1593 from 1944 to 1967 in yellow gold, pink gold and platinum versions. Referred to as the 'Hour Glass', the present reference elegantly showcases the post art-deco creative design cues and Patek Philippe's form of choice for non-rounded timepieces.

The reference 1593 cases were made by the famed maker, Markowski, which also crafted some of the most iconic form-cases.

The 1518 is recognised as one of the most important chronograph wristwatches ever produced. So loved by the community is the 1518 that the amount of information available is so great that much of it need not be repeated here. The Nautilus reference 3712 was introduced in 2005 and had a very short production run. It is believed to have been made only for about eight months and therefore the overall production output is rather low too with an estimate of 1'700 pieces having been sold. At the time of production it was the most complicated Nautilus version as it included, in addition to the date which previous models had already, moon phases, a power-reserve indication and subsidiary seconds. The way those indications and apertures are placed on the dial is particular, and seems slightly off at first glance, giving the watch a special touch.

It was replaced already in 2006 by the similar reference 5712, which was introduced to commemorate the 30th anniversary of the iconic Nautilus model. The two models can be distinguished by a subtle difference to the dial, namely the very small applied index at 7 o'clock which can be found on the 3712 but not on the 5712.



Cartier is a manufacture synonymous with elegance and craftsman ship, held in highest esteem for the ground-breaking case designs, the most well-known of course being the Tank. However, and what is more, a fact easy to overlook, Cartier have produced a plethora of designs throughout the course of their 172 year history. While emphasis tends, now, to be on the dial, the 1950s was a time where many manufactures experimented with form, and Cartier was no exception. Indeed arguably some to most sought after pieces with a focus on case design were born in the mid-century and the present lot is certainly testament to this fact.

Nicknamed the 'Helm', the watch resembles a ship's wheel with its distinctive spoked yellow gold case housing a comparatively minute movement and plain silvered dial. Also, and to great effect, the crown is hidden behind the watch as opposed to its usual position at 3 o'clock. This small detail affords the watch great balance and forces the observer's attention evermore on the watch's Avant guard form.

Such watches tended to be made in very limited numbers, and therefore their appearance at auction is somewhat scarce. Furthermore, given the emphasis on shape and design the condition of the case is paramount. Thus, to find one in such well preserved condition, such as with the present lot is a rare treat for any collector of both these types of watches or even, items from this period.

The present lot reference 3646 demonstrates a very interesting, if not perhaps slightly embarrassing, period in the watches' production history. In 1944 a mistake was made. It is unclear whether this was a mistake on the part of Rolex or indeed of Panerai, all that can be discerned is that it was almost certainly an error in communication.


The California dial, loved by collectors, was developed in 1941 by Rolex, but would only appear on the 3646 three years later. The first order for these dials however was confused, and, while the dials were meant for wristwatches they were produced for pocket watches (dial reference 103*2731). The feet therefore were positioned in such a way that the dial, once fitted, would have sat rotated at 90 degrees. To amend this, and salvage the dials, the feet were removed, at times very crudely, and the dials were mounted instead with screws at 12 and at 6.

Later in 1944 these 'faulty' California dials were replaced, research suggests, by Arturo Junghans who produced the dial that accompanies the present lot. Of course, upon opening the watches it was clear that the dial was attached with screws, and so, Junghans attached his dials in the same way, as is evident from the notches visible at 12 and 6.

Interestingly Rolex, having realised the mistake, changed the batch of California dials to correct the feet placement (dial reference 103*2802). This was apparently around the same time as they decided to stop signing the watches Rolex to the case back and movement. Added later, and replacing the 'Junghans' dial, this is the dial type currently fitted to the present lot.

Examining the case and movement numbers and movement ring, it is clear that this watch is original in all parts as the accompanying 'Junghans' dial was, in all likelihood, made for this watch. While the dial fitted at present is a later type, it is still period, made after Rolex rectified the initial problem, acting almost to bring the story full circle. This watch is undoubtedly a superb physical representation of an incredibly interesting piece of history.

Clearly inspired by the reference 96 and prior to that the officer watches, the 130 were the first chronographs the company produced that received a specific reference number.

The present lot, made in steel, is one of only a few hundred produced in this metal and much fewer still are those fitted with such numerals. In superb condition this watch has several very rare and beautiful features. The dial sympathetically cleaned by Patek during a servicing is further enhanced with applied Breguet numerals that are confirmed on the Extract from the Archives.

The case is in exceptional condition with crisp lines and lugs with their fullest proportions which are crisp and downturned. The case is also free of any corrosion or imperfections of any kind. It is interesting to note that the lugs of the stainless steel version are different from the yellow, pink or white gold examples. Their slightly thicker but shorter design gives the watch a rather tonneau-shaped design and a more sportive and robust look.

Released in 2010, the white gold reference 5205 welcomed some pleasing changes in aesthetic to Patek Philippe's annual calendar watches. The case at 40mm in diameter bears hollow lugs giving the watch a sporty feel on the wrist. Buying at Auction The following pages are designed to give you useful information on how to buy at auction. Sotheby's staff as listed at the front of this catalogue will be happy to assist you. However, it is important that you read the following information carefully and note that Sotheby's acts for the seller; you should refer in particular to Conditions 4 to 6 of the Conditions of Business printed in this catalogue. Provenance In certain circumstances, Sotheby's may print in the catalogue the history of ownership of a work of art if such information contributes to scholarship or is otherwise well known and assists in distinguishing the work of art. However, the identity of the seller or previous owners may not be disclosed for a variety of reasons. For example, such information may be excluded to accommodate a seller's request for confidentiality or because the identity of prior owners is unknown given the age of the work of art.

The conditions set out below and all other terms, conditions and notices set out in Sotheby's catalogues or announced by the auctioneer or posted in the sale-room by way of notice (together the 'Conditions of Business') form the terms on which Sotheby's contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. The Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship between you and us regarding the sale, purchase or holding by us of property. They also apply to you if you require inspection, appraisal or valuation of property. They are therefore very important and you should read them carefully. You agree that any future dealings which you may have with Sotheby's shall be on the Conditions of Business current at that particular time.

NOTICE TO BUYERS AND SELLERS

You should note that Sotheby's generally acts as agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer.

Sotheby's is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to items offered for sale.

Sotheby's cannot and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers

therefore have a responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the items which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw to the attention of all potential buyers Conditions 5 and 6 which limit the extent to which Sotheby's and the seller may be liable. We also specifically draw to the attention of all sellers Conditions 25 and 27 which set out the basis of the relationship between Sotheby's and the seller and limit the extent to which Sotheby's may be liable to the seller.

Actual and prospective buyers and sellers are bound by all Conditions of Business. However, for ease of reference, we have divided the Conditions set out below into sections. Please note that this Guarantee does not apply if either:-

(III) NONE OF 'SOTHEBY'S', ANY 'SOTHEBY'S AFFILIATED COMPANY', OR ANY AGENT, EMPLOYEE OR DIRECTOR THEREOF SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ANY ERRORS OR OMISSIONS IN ANY SUCH REPRESENTATIONS.

6 Limitation on claims by buyers: Without prejudice to Conditions 3 and 5 above, and save insofar as it relates to any liability which we may have for personal injury or death, any claim against 'Sotheby's' by the 'buyer' shall be limited to the 'hammer price' and the 'buyer's premium' actually paid by the 'buyer' to 'Sotheby's' with regard to that lot.

SELLER'S LIABILITY TO BUYERS

7 Seller's obligations to buyers: THE 'SELLER'S' OBLIGATIONS TO YOU ARE LIMITED TO THE SAME EXTENT AS OUR OBLIGATIONS TO YOU. ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED CONDITIONS OR WARRANTIES ARE EXCLUDED SAVE INSOFAR AS IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO EXCLUDE OBLIGATIONS IMPLIED BY STATUTE. IN ADDITION, WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO AGREE VARIATIONS TO THE 'SELLER'S' WARRANTIES WITH THE 'SELLER'.

AT THE SALE

- 8 Rights of participation at auction: We have the right, at our absolute discretion, to refuse to allow any person to participate in our auctions and to refuse admission to our premises to any person.
- 9 Bidding as principal: If you make a bid at auction, you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid, and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as his agent in the same way as if he were bidding personally.
- 10 Commission and telephone bids: Although your interests are likely to be best served if you attend auctions in person, you may bid by telephone or by leaving a commission bid as set forth below.
- (a) Commission bids: We will seek to carry out any instructions to bid at an auction on your behalf which we receive from you sufficiently in advance of the sale and which we consider, in our discretion, to be sufficiently clear and complete. If we receive commission bids on a particular lot

for identical amounts, and at auction these bids are the highest bids for the lot, it will be sold to the person whose bid was received first by us. However, our obligation in relation to commission bids is undertaken subject to our other commitments at the time of sale, and the conduct of the sale may be such that we are unable to bid as requested. The 'net sale proceeds' will be applied in reduction of your debt. If a re-sale should result in a lower price than the original 'hammer price' obtained, we and the 'seller' shall

be entitled to claim the balance from you together with any costs incurred in connection with your failure to make payment. If the re-sale should result in a higher price than the original 'hammer price' obtained, the surplus shall be paid to the 'seller'. In such case, you waive any claim which you may have to title to the lot and agree that any re-sale price shall be deemed commercially reasonable; (f) set off any amounts owed by us or any 'Sotheby's affiliated company' to you against any amounts which you owe to us or any 'Sotheby's affiliated company', whether as the result of any proceeds of sale or otherwise:

- (i) charge you interest at a rate not exceeding 6% (six per cent) per annum above the discount rate quoted by 'Sotheby's' principal bank in Geneva from time to time on the 'total amount due' to the extent that it remains unpaid for more than five (5) working days after the date of the auction:
- (j) store the lot at 'Sotheby's' premises or elsewhere at the 'buyer's' sole risk and expense:
- (k) reject any bids made by or on your behalf at any future auction or require you to make a deposit with us before accepting any such bids.

25 Seller's warranties: This Condition governs your relationship with both the 'buyer' and ourselves. If we or the 'buyer' consider any of the warranties listed below to be breached in any way, either we or the 'buyer' may take legal action against you. You agree to indemnify 'Sotheby's' and any 'Sotheby's affiliated company', their respective servants, directors, officers and employees and the 'buyer' against any loss or damage resulting from any breach or alleged breach of any of your representations or warranties, or other terms set forth in these Conditions of Business. Where we reasonably believe that any breach of such representation or warranty has occurred, you authorise 'Sotheby's', in its sole discretion, to rescind

You warrant to us and to the 'buyer' that at all relevant times (including, but not limited to, the time of the consignment of the property and of the time of the sale): (a) you are the true owner of the property. or are properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner: (b) you are able to, and shall. in accordance with these Conditions of Business, transfer possession to the 'buyer' and good and marketable title to the property free from any third-party rights or claims or potential claims including, without limitation, any claims which may be made by governments or governmental agencies; (c) you have provided us with all information concerning the provenance, condition and restoration of the property and have notified us in writing of the existence of any endangered or protected species in the item or any concerns you may have or that have been expressed by third parties in relation to the ownership, condition, authenticity, attribution, or export or import of the lot; (d) you are unaware of any matter or allegation which would render any description given by us in relation to the lot inaccurate or misleading; (e) where the property has been moved to Switzerland from another country the property was lawfully imported into Switzerland; the property had been lawfully and permanently exported as required by the laws of any country in which it was previously located; required declarations upon the export and import of the property were properly made; and any duties and taxes on the export and import of the property have been paid; (f) you have or will pay any and all taxes and/or duties that may be due on the 'net sale proceeds' of the property and you have notified us in writing of any or all taxes and for duties that are payable by us on your behalf in any country other than the country of the sale; (g) unless you advise us in writing to the contrary at the time you deliver the property to us, there are no restrictions, copyright or otherwise, relating to the property (other than those imposed by law) and no restrictions on our rights to reproduce photographs or other images of the property: and (h) unless you advise us in writing to the contrary at the time you deliver the

a safe operating condition if reasonably used for the purpose for which they were designed and are free from any defect not obvious on external inspection which could prove dangerous to human life or health.

BEFORE THE SALE

- 26 Preparation for sale: You agree that we shall have sole and absolute discretion as to:
- (i) the way in which property may be combined or divided into lots for sale; (ii) the way in which lots are included in the sale:
- (iii) the way in which any lot is described and illustrated in the catalogue or any condition report:
- (iv) the date and place of the auction(s);
- (v) the manner in which any sale is conducted.

We reserve the right to consult with, and rely on, any outside experts, consultants or restorers of our choice in relation to the property and to carry out such other inquiries or tests in relation to the property either before or after the sale as we may, in our absolute discretion, deem appropriate. This is, however, a matter for our discretion and we are under no duty to carry out such consultation, inquiries or tests.

- 27 (a) Estimates: Any estimate given by us, whether written or oral, is a matter of opinion only and is intended only as a guide. An estimate shall not be relied upon as a prediction of the anticipated selling price. Any estimate given (whether written or oral and whether in a catalogue, receipt, letter or otherwise) may, in our absolute discretion, be revised from time to time. (b) Exclusion of liability: Any representations, written or oral and including those in any catalogue, report, commentary or valuation in relation to any aspect or quality of any lot, including price or value (a) are statements of opinion only and (b) may be revised prior to the lot being offered for sale (including whilst the lot is on public view). Neither 'Sotheby's', any 'Sotheby's affiliated company', nor any agent, employee or director thereof shall be liable for any errors or omissions in any such representations.
- (c) Limitations on claims by seller: Any claim by the 'seller' (excluding any claim covered by Condition 31) shall, in any event, be limited to the 'net sale proceeds' in respect of that lot.

25 ABOVE: OR (III) YOU BREACH ANY PROVISIONS OF THE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS IN ANY MATERIAL RESPECT OR (IV) THE LOT REQUIRES BUT LACKS THE APPROPRIATE CITES LICENCES OR SALE EXEMPTION: OR (V) THE LOT SUFFERS FROM LOSS OR DAMAGE SO THAT IT IS NOT IN THE STATE IN WHICH IT WAS WHEN WE AGREED TO SELL IT: OR (VI) THE RELEVANT AUCTION IS POSTPONED FOR ANY REASON: OR (VII) SOTHERY'S DETERMINES IN ITS REASONABLE DISCRETION THAT THE SALE OF SUCH LOT MAY BE DETRIMENTAL TO SOTHEBY'S REPLITATION AND/OR BRAND

If we become aware of an actual or potential claim or lien in respect of a lot consigned by you, we shall not release the lot to you until we are satisfied that the issue has been resolved in your favour.

30 Withdrawal compensation: If a lot is withdrawn from sale under Condition 29(1). (IV), (V) or (VI), you shall not be charged a withdrawal fee and the lot shall be returned to you at your expense. If a lot is withdrawn from sale under Condition 29(VII), you shall not be charged a withdrawal fee unless you failed to disclose to Sotheby's prior to the sale any facts or circumstances known to you which are relevant for the purpose of Sotheby's determination under Condition 29(VII). 32 Insurance by the 'seller':

(a) The 'seller' must agree with 'Sotheby's' in writing if it does not wish 'Sotheby's to accept liability for loss or damage to any item delivered to 'Sotheby's', and undertake to maintain insurance cover for the item until the 'buyer' has made payment for the item in full. In such circumstances, the 'seller' agrees to: (i) provide 'Sotheby's' with a copy of a certificate of insurance for the item and a waiver of subrogation by the 'seller's' insurer of all rights and claims which the 'seller' may have against 'Sotheby's', each in a form satisfactory to 'Sotheby's': (ii) indemnify 'Sotheby's' on demand against any claim for loss or damage in respect of the item, however such claim may arise and for all related costs or expenses. Any payment which 'Sotheby's' makes under this Condition shall be binding upon the 'seller' whether or not legal liability has been proved; (iii) notify the 'seller's' insurer of the terms of the indemnity set out in (ii) above: and (iv) waive all rights and claims which the 'seller' may have against 'Sotheby's' in connection with such loss or damage, other than in circumstances where the loss or damage was caused by 'Sotheby's' wilful misconduct.

- (b) If the Seller fails to comply with sub paragraph 32(a)(t) above within 10 days of delivery of the item to 'Sotheby's'. Sotheby's' shall assume liability for loss or damage to the item in accordance with the terms of Condition 31 from the following day, although 'Sotheby's' liability shall be limited to the excess (if any) of (A) the amount set out in Condition 31(c) over (B) any amount payable to the 'seller' under its own insurance plus any applicable deductible.
- 33 Reconsignment: We may, at our discretion, decide to reconsign any lot so that it shall be offered for sale at public auction by another 'Sotheby's affiliated company'. We shall notify you in writing

if we decide to do this and, unless you object in writing within ten (10) days of such notice, you shall be treated as consenting to such reconsignment. In those circumstances, any sale shall be conducted under the Conditions of Business in the relevant sale catalogue, save only that, as between you and us, these Conditions of Business shall continue to apply and shall prevail in the event of any conflict. Any proceeds of sale shall be remitted to you in the currency in which the auction is conducted and all local taxes shall apply.

35 Bidding at the sale: You may not bid for your own property. Although we shall be entitled to bid on your behalf up to the amount of the 'reserve', you shall not instruct or permit any other person to bid for the property on your behalf. You should note that the 'net sale proceeds' payable to you are derived from the actual proceeds of sale received by us from the 'buyer' Where the 'buyer' makes payment more than 30 days after the final day of the relevant sale, we shall send you the 'net sale proceeds' less any other amount you owe us or any 'Sotheby's affiliated company' within five (5) working days of receipt of cleared funds.

We reserve the right to release a lot to the 'buyer' before we receive the 'total amount due' for one lot. If we choose to do so, we shall remit to you the 'net sale proceeds' of the lot on the 35th day after the final day of the auction provided that appropriate identification has been received by Sotheby's.

- 38. Rescission: Where we are satisfied that the lot is a counterfeit, we shall rescind the sale and notify you of such rescission. We shall, in our absolute discretion, be entitled to dispense with the requirements of Condition 3 in determining whether or not a particular lot is a counterfeit. Within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice advising you of the rescission of sale, you will return to us any 'net sale proceeds' previously paid by us to you in connection with the lot and shall reimburse us for any 'expenses' incurred in connection with the rescinded sale. You shall indemnify us for all reasonable legal and associated costs and expenses incurred in connection with any enforcement action taken by Sotheby's in addition to any damages to which Sotheby's may be entitled. On receipt of such funds, we shall return the lot to you. We shall be entitled to the 'net sale proceeds' of the lot if, for reasons beyond our control, we cannot return the lot to you.
- 39 Non-payment by the buyer: We are under no obligation to enforce payment by any 'buyer' nor to undertake legal proceedings to recover such payment. You agree to inform us of any action which you choose to take against the 'buyer' to enforce payment of the amount due to you.

We have absolute discretion to take and enforce any of the remedies set out in Condition 23 above including the right to cancel the sale and return the property to you. On your request, we will inform you of any action being taken against the 'buyer' and shall give consideration to any views which you may express to us on the appropriate course of action to take to recover the amount due.

We shall be entitled to charge the 'buyer' interest for late payment in accordance with Condition 23(i) above and you authorise us to retain such interest for our own account.

If the 'buyer' fails to pay the 'total amount due' but we agree to remit to you an amount equal to the 'net sale proceeds', ownership of the relevant lot shall pass to us.

For the avoidance of doubt, we shall have the benefit of all of your representations, warranties and indemnities set out in these Conditions of Business.

- 40 Post-auction sales: If any lot fails to sell at auction, we shall be entitled for a period of forty (40) days following the auction to sell the lot. Unless you agree to the contrary, any post-auction sale shall only be concluded for a price that will result in a payment to you of not less than the 'net sale proceeds' to which you would have been entitled had the lot been sold at the 'reserve price'. If a post-auction sale is agreed, your obligations to us and the 'buyer' with respect to such lot are the same as if the lot had been sold at auction. Any reference in the Conditions of Business to the date of the auction shall be treated as being a reference to the date of the post-auction sale
- 41 Unsold lot: We will send you a notice to the address given on the relevant property receipt form if any lot fails to sell at auction. If such lot has not been sold privately pursuant to Condition 40 above, you shall either reconsign the lot to us for re-sale or, alternatively, collect the lot from us. If you decide to collect the lot, we reserve the right to charge you a reduced commission. amounting to fifty per cent (50%) of the 'seller's commission', plus 'expenses'. The 'seller's commission' shall in these circumstances be calculated as if the lot had sold at the 'reserve price'. The rate of 'seller's commission' shall be the rate applicable at the date of the auction.

If you fail either to reconsign or collect the lot as set out above within sixty (60) days of the auction, we shall, in our sole discretion, be entitled to:

(i) store the lot at an independent storage facility at your risk and expense; or
(ii) re-offer the lot for sale at public auction with a 'reserve' no less than fifty per cent (50%) of the original 'reserve'.

In the event of such re-sale, we shall be entitled to deduct from the 'hammer price' the reduced commission in respect of the initial sale plus 'expenses' together with the 'seller's commission' on the re-sale plus 'expenses'. We reserve the right to charge you our reasonable legal and administrative costs incurred.

Any re-sale shall be conducted under the Conditions of Business printed in the sale catalogue of the relevant sale, save only that, as between you and us, these Conditions of Business shall continue to apply and shall prevail in the event of any conflict.

D CONDITIONS CONCERNING BOTH BUYERS AND SELLERS

42 Governing law: These Conditions of Business and any amendment to them shall be governed by and interpreted and construed in accordance with Swiss law.

43 Jurisdiction:

(I) 'SOTHEBY'S' AND ALL 'BUYERS' AND 'SELLERS' (AND ANY PROSPECTIVE 'BUYERS' OR 'SELLERS') AGREE THAT THE ORDINARY COURTS OF THE CANTON OF GENEVA (SWITZERLAND) ARE (SUBJECT TO CONDITION 43(II) BELOW) TO HAVE EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION TO SETTLE ANY DISPUTE (INCLUDING CLAIMS FOR SET-OFF AND COUNTERCLAIMS) WHICH MAY ARISE IN CONNECTION WITH THE VALIDITY, EFFECT, INTERPRETATION OR PERFORMANCE OF, OR THE LEGAL RELATIONSHIPS ESTABLISHED BY, THESE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS OR OTHERWISE ARISING IN CONNECTION WITH THESE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS.

- (II) THE AGREEMENT CONTAINED IN CONDITION 43(I) ABOVE IS INCLUDED FOR THE BENEFIT OF 'SOTHEBY'S'. ACCORDINGLY, NOTWITHSTANDING THE EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT IN CONDITION 43(I) ABOVE, 'SOTHEBY'S' SHALL RETAIN THE RIGHT TO BRING PROCEEDINGS IN ANY OTHERWISE COMPETENT COURT.
- 44 Service of process: All 'buyers' and 'sellers' irrevocably consent to service of process or any other documents in connection with proceedings in any Court by facsimile transmission, personal service, delivery at the last address known to us or any other usual address, mail or in any other manner permitted by Swiss law, the law of the place of service or the law of the jurisdiction where proceedings are instituted.
- 45 Photographs and illustrations: You agree that we shall have the absolute right (on a non-exclusive basis) to photograph, illustrate or otherwise produce images of any lot consigned to us for sale. We shall retain copyright in all images created by us of any lot and shall have the right to use such images in whatever way we deem appropriate, both before and after the auction.
- 46 Value Added Tax (VAT): Where these Conditions of Business refer to an obligation to make payment by 'buyer' or 'seller', the 'buyer' or 'seller' (as applicable) shall be liable to pay any VAT required by law or, if applicable, any amount in lieu of such VAT. Where the Conditions of Business give 'Sotheby's' a right to receive payment from 'buyer' or 'seller', such right shall include the right to receive any VAT due or, if applicable, any amount in lieu of VAT.
- 47 Copyright: No representations or warranties are made by either the 'seller' or 'Sotheby's' as to whether any lot is subject to copyright, nor as to whether the 'buyer' acquires any copyright in any lot sold.
- 48 Export/import and embargoes: No representations or warranties are made by 'Sotheby's' or the 'seller' as to whether any lot is subject to any export restrictions from Switzerland or any import restrictions of any other country. Similarly, we make no representations or warranties as to whether any embargoes exist in relation to particular lots.
- 49 Notices: Any notice or other communication shall be in writing and, if sent by post, shall be deemed to have been received by the addressee on the second working day after posting or, if the addressee is outside Switzerland, on the fifth (5th) working day after posting. If any written notice is delivered by hand, it shall be treated as having been received at that

time and, if any written notice is sent by facsimile, it shall be deemed to have been received 24 hours after sending. Any notice sent to us shall be sent to 2 Rue François-Diday, 1204 Geneva. Any notice which we send to you may be sent to your last address known to us.

- 50 Severability: In the event that any provisions of these Conditions of Business should be held unenforceable for any reason, the remaining conditions shall remain in full force and effect.
- 51 Personal details: If we so request, each of the 'buyer', the 'seller' and any bidder at auction agree to provide (in a form acceptable to us) written confirmation of their name, permanent address, proof of identity and creditworthiness.
- 52 Introductory commissions: We reserve the right to pay out of our remuneration a fee to any third party introducing clients or property to us.
- 53. Data Protection: Sotheby's will use information provided by its clients (or which Sotheby's otherwise obtains relating to its clients) for the provision of auction and other art-related services, loan and insurance services, client administration, marketing and otherwise to manage and operate its business, or as required by law. This will include information such as the client's name and contact details, proof of identity, financial information, records of the client's transactions, and preferences. Some gathering of information about Sotheby's clients will take place using technical means to identify their preferences in order to provide a higher quality of service to them. Sotheby's may also disclose the client information to other Sotheby's Companies and/or third parties acting on their behalf to provide services for the purposes listed above.
