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



According to the Audemars Piguet archives, the present lot was manufactured in 1942 and sold in 1943. Only 210 chronographs were made by Audemars Piguet in the period of 1939-1945.

In the 1930s, production levels for Audemars Piguet dropped nearly to a halt following the worldwide economic depression resulting after the 1929 stock market crash. The firm adjusted by re-assessing the number of watchmakers on staff, but remained committed to the tradition of haute horlogerie that continues to define the brand today. By 1939, the firm began to produce more commercially priced chronograph wristwatches in order to safeguard their fine watchmaker's and the skills they have acquired over many years.

The category of pre-war Audemars Piguet Chronograph wristwatches are exceptionally rare. One such chronograph model numbered ahead of our present lot by only five digits appears in Brunner, Pfeoffer-Belli, and Wehrli, Audemars Piguet Masterpieces of Classical Watchmaking, 1993, p. 242. Another model with similar dial configuration with movement number 45603 and manufactured one year after the present lot, sold at Sotheby's Geneva, November 2013, lot 261.

The closest chronograph in number published of the same style is number 45996, appearing in *Audemars Piguet 20th Century Complicated Wristwatches*, 2018, p. 182, alongside a chronograph bearing an identical dial, number 45602. According to our research, there are 5 chronographs known with identical cases and variations on the dial with the 12 o'clock indication always an Arabic numeral.

The skillfully engraved case of the present lot demonstrates mastery of the medium by the case maker. Its intricate scrolling foliate design, grapes, pears, urn, and the important monogram A heightened by the imperial crown on the reverse emphasize the importance of the man who commissioned it.

The timepiece was very likely ordered by the last German Emperor and King of Prussia, Wilhelm II, for his son, Prince Adalbert of Prussia. The cuvette is finely engraved with symbols of this royal family, the House of Hohenzollern including the family's coat of arms, and inscribed "To my dear son Adalbert, July 14, 1914." The pointed stars which appear throughout the case also appear in the Emperor's family crest.

Symbols of the Imperial family appear on the cuvette as well, including the imperial crown flanked by two avian busts, a symbol from the House of Hohenzollern crest, along with the Initials W and A with Imperial crown.

Emperor Wilhelm likely gifted this piece to his son about one month prior to the Prince's marriage with Princess Adelheid of Saxe-Meiningen on August 14, 1914. To the best of our knowledge, this piece is entirely unique. Its fascinating history and magnificently crafted case would make it an excellent addition to a collector looking for rare vintage pieces.

The present lot is an exceptional example of an early 20th century highly complicated watch from Patek Philippe, a crown jewel of the firm's production. It features three important complications: the perpetual calendar for astronomical functions, the split seconds chronograph for timing two events at once, and a fine minute repeating complication which chimes the hours and minutes, activated from a slide at the case band.

The original owner, Clarence W. Barron, received this piece as a gift from his wife. To this day, Barron is considered one of the most influential figures in the history of the Dow Jones & Company. Barron worked for a number of newspapers throughout his life, eventually founding the Boston News Bureau and the Philadelphia Bureau. He specialized in financial journalism, and when he bought the Dow Jones & Company in 1903, he became de facto manager of the Wall Street Journal as well. He gained a reputation for deeply scrutinizing corporate financial records, and his investigatory work for the Boston Post helped to expose Charles Ponzi, leading to Ponzi's eventual arrest. His stellar career has justly earned him the legacy as the founder of modern financial journalism.

The present lot, signed by Tiffany & Co. makers, was ordered by William Henry Vanderbilt, and is one of the most complicated clocks made in America. Tiffany & Co. went on to exhibit this piece at the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1897, where it was one of the their most important pieces on view.

Standing at eight feet tall in the style of Louis XV, this magnificent piece combines exceptional aesthetics with brilliantly designed complications, with 13 silver and enameled dials within the Californian abalone frame. Each dial relays information which demonstrates the mechanical genius of the makers of this piece.

The uppermost dial displays the positions of the sun and moon with a horizon line above the sea, which indicates changes in tide. Of the two dials directly below, the right-most one displays a perpetual calendar indicating signs of the zodiac, month, date, day of the week, and leap

year. The left-most disc is divided into twenty four parts and degrees from Greenwich. This dial also includes 31 major cities around the world. Another revolving plate indicates the hour of the day or night in each location. Two rotating cylinders directly above indicate the since the Independence of the United States and the year of the Julian calendar. The five dials above the main dial indicate the Equation of Time, Golden number and Epact, Dominical letters, and Sun cycle. Lastly, the remaining dials display the local time, time in Washington D.C. and Greenwich, and declination by degrees north and south of the sun and moon.

The entire clock is a marvel of American woodworking, design and horology. Featured alongside four other clocks within Tiffany & Co.'s exhibition in 1893, the piece would have surely been one of the most breathtaking wonders of the Manufactures and Liberal Arts Building at the Columbian Exposition.

Reference 2497 was ground-breaking for Patek Philippe, as well as the horological community. The iconic reference features a perfectly symmetrical dial configuration and wellproportioned sculpted 'claw' lugs.

Launched in 1951, it was the world's first perpetual calendar wristwatch with center seconds made in series. Shortly thereafter, reference 2438/1 was introduced to the market – essentially a reference 2497 with a waterresistant screw-down caseback rather than a snap-back caseback.

Reference 2497 ceased production in 1963, and according to scholarship, less than a total of 200 pieces of these references combined were made. Of the pieces manufactured, roughly 20 were encased in pink gold.

Reference 2497 can be divided into a first and second series, depending on the case maker. First series cases were made by Emile Vichet featured a flatback with elongated 'claw' lugs while second series cases made by Wenger featured a domed back with slightly shorter lugs.

Patek Philippe has long dominated the narrative for fine watchmaking, creating extraordinary timepieces that have challenged the way we think about horology. Among the numerous impressive and confounding complications mastered by the firm, it is perhaps their poetic interpretation of the night sky above us that is most visually dazzling.

Patek Philippe's first iteration of the Celestial was launched in 2002, condensing the magnitude of the night sky onto the wrist for the very first time in watchmaking history. The celestial chart rotates counter clockwise, showing the progression of stars relative to the meridian passage of Sirius. Simultaneously, the meridian passage and phases of the moon can be seen. 25 trillion (25,000,000,000,000) ratio combinations were researched by Patek Philippe to determine the greatest accuracy for this display. This gives some sense of the tremendous challenges that the production of this highly complicated model posed to the company's watchmakers.

Indeed, to truly appreciate the ingenious display of this celestial map, we must observe that the movement operates three separate sapphire crystal discs, delicately colored and layered harmoniously to create a vision of the night sky on one dial plane.

Ten years after the launch of this triumphant timepiece, Patek Philippe introduced the present model, the Ref. 6102, improving upon the original case design, and including a calendar around the dial.

The Ref 5029 was launched in 1997 and made to commemorate the opening of Patek Philippe's factory in Geneva. The model was produced in a highly limited edition of 30 examples in three metals: 10 pieces in yellow gold, 10 pieces in platinum, and 10 pieces in pink gold like the present lot.

This understated timepiece is dressed in the iconic *Officier* case, manufactured by the celebrated Jean-Pierre Hagmann, whose case maker's mark, JHP, is stamped on the inside of the hinged case back.

This model combines the time honored tradition of minute-repeating watches with the contemporary desire for self-winding wristwatches. In order to fulfill both of these demands, Patek Philippe designed the cal. R27PS movement which utilizes an offset rotor to allow space for the minute repeating gongs. Ensuring the chime's clarity of sound is a significant challenge in the creation of any minute-repeating timepiece. To meet this challenge, Patek Philippe tested a multitude of alloys, finally developing new acoustic steel for the sole purpose of minute-repeating gongs.

The marvel is powered by the manufacture's in house caliber 177 composed of 679 individual parts and an impressive 117 jewels. The timepiece was manufactured in limited editions from 2005 to 2010. The Perpetual Calendar features a patented double retrograde for date display. One hand on the left indicates the dates 1 through 16, and a second hand on the right indicates the dates from 16 through 31. Both hands rendezvous on the 16th of every month before retreating to their respective resting points. The retrograde leap year indicator is visible on the reverse side of the watch, while the retrograde month hand elegantly mirrors the 8-days power reserve indicator on the front dial.

The Ref 1019 Milgauss was first introduced in the early 1960s as a great departure from its predecessors, the Milgauss Ref 6541 and 6543 in both dial and case design. The watch was guaranteed to resist magnetic fields up to 1,000 oersted. The word Milgauss means 1,000 gauss (gauss being a measurement for magnetic induction). Magnetic fields can affect a watch's accuracy at just 60 oersted; at 100 oersted the watch will no longer work. The Milgauss overcame the effects of magnetic fields by using antimagnetic alloys and an iron movement cover to create a Faraday cage (a nonporous enclosure used to block electrostatic and electromagnetic influences).

Breguet started producing the 'Type XX' around 1954 becoming the company's most sought after post-war aviator's wristwatch. 



Patek Philippe launched this model Ref. 3970 in 1986 and continued production for approximately two years. It features a solid snap-on case back. It was replaced with Ref. 3970E, which had a screw back rather than a snap back, with the suffix indicating étanche, or waterproof. This screw back model was produced until 2004.

This model is frequently referred to as 'Ref. 3970 First Series', with the later variations (Ref. 3970E) subsequently numbered second through fourth.

According to our research, it is believed that approximately 100 examples of the snap back Ref. 3970 were made, starting with movement number 875000. The present lot is numbered 62 among the first timepieces produced. Of those, the present example is one of fewer than 20 examples to appear at auction. To the best of our knowledge, this is the first time the present example has been offered at auction.

As Ref. 3970 was well-received for its combination of chronograph and perpetual calendar complications, Patek Philippe responded by increasing its production run for the various series of the 3970E. As such, first series examples of the Ref. 3970, such as the present model, are significantly more rare and less frequently seen at auction.

Produced from 1950 until 1985, Ref. 2499 is recognized as one of the most important wristwatches made by Patek Philippe. The successor to Ref. 1518 and the predecessor to Ref. 3970, Ref. 2499 holds a distinguished place among the firm's exceptional perpetual calendar chronograph wristwatches. With only 349 pieces made in total, or an average of only nine pieces per year, it is an extremely rare piece and one that was made with the utmost attention paid to each detail.

Ref. 2499 underwent four major evolutions during its 35 year production run. Square chronograph pushers and a tachometer scale distinguish the first series, produced between 1950 and 1960. The second series, produced between 1955-1964, introduces round chronograph pushers. A simple dial design designates the third series, which Patek produced from 1960 to 1978, and a sapphire crystal demarcates the fourth series, so called the 2499/00. The present lot represents the fourth series, which was produced between 1978 and 1984.

Patek Philippe and Tiffany & Co. share a remarkable history dating back to a handshake agreement between Antoine de Patek and Charles Lewis Tiffany in 1851. The two met each other during Patek's tour in America and held a deep respect for each other due to their mutual commitment to an exceedingly high level of craftsmanship and quality in their respective fields. Tiffany formalized their handshake agreement in 1876, and the two firms have had a successful relationship which continued to grow stronger for years to come. Today, Tiffany & Co. remains the only retailer in partnership with Patek Philippe, and thus, the only firm which can still co-sign the dial of a Patek Philippe watch.

The Ref. 2499 has left an indelible mark on the industry, and the present lot is a testament to the incredible contributions by each of the firms whose signatures it bears. To the best of our knowledge, the present lot is the only known fourth series Ref. 2499 signed by Tiffany. Furthermore, it comes from the original owner, making it the first time this piece has ever been at auction.



It is particularly interesting to note the time in between the manufacturing of the movement and its subsequent completion and sale in 1922. For the first decade of the 20th century, Audemars Piguet largely prospered in business and received orders for highly complicated watches. The company grew exponentially and even secured larger workshop space in 1907. Devastating historical events like the Knickerbocker Crisis of 1907 and the fall of Tsar Nicholas II in 1917 shook the Swiss watchmaking industry with a rapid decline in sales.

Audemars Piguet was an exceptionally resilient firm, supporting their rich heritage and high horology against all odds. Indeed, Audemars Piguet, Masterpieces of Classical Watchmaking (p.32) notes specifically that the fruits of their labor "started to appear in 1922," exactly the year the present lot was completed for sale to Gübelin, Lucerne.

From 1919 to 1936, Cartier created some of the world's most extraordinary clocks. Cartier's Art Deco period creations took inspiration from Egyptian, Persian, Indian, Chinese and Japanese cultures and motifs. Smith later became Daniels' only apprentice, and following that he also managed to master 32 trades of British watchmaking to become worthy of collaborating with the great master himself.

The Breguet La Tradition Grand Complication is a superlative model in the firm's repertoire. Breguet impressively showcases classic and new technologies with a 50 hour fusee and chain power reserve, and a one minute tourbillon with titanium bridge and silicon overcoil hairspring. Each separate complication requires remarkable skill and patience to manufacture.

The fusee chain is a traditional technique that has been used in pocket watches since the 19th century. By 1953, the commercial trans-Atlantic airline industry was at a point where planes were able to take off on one side of the ocean and land on the other in a matter of mere hours.

Partly as a result of this, Pan American airlines approached Rolex, and the two companies began working on a watch that could easily tell the hour in two different time zones.

When reference 6542 was released in 1954 it became the official timepiece of Pan-Am Airline - and became Rolex's first GMT-Master ever produced. Their pilots found the watch to be a useful tool in the cockpit where many timing calculations were necessary over the duration of the flight.

Rolex introduced the reference 5512 in 1959 as a continuation of the Submariner which launched officially in 1954 with the ref. 6200. The 5512 was the first Submariner to include crown guards for added protection. The first examples featured square, hard edged crown guards which lasted for a short production run, followed by the pointed guards as featured on the present lot. 

Since its founding in 1846, Ulysse Nardin has continually innovated and experimented in order to push the boundaries of haute horology. Throughout its history, the firm has won numerous awards for its achievements iand continued to make important contributions to the horological field.

The Freak Diavolo represents the best of the firm's desire to continually perfect and expand on its own creations. Originally introduced in 2001, the Freak employed the use of silicon parts in its mechanical movement, which had not been done by any other firm at the time. The unique dial design displaying the movement on the minute hand of the watch also took the watch industry by storm. Ulysse Nardin then decided to improve on this model by introducing the Diavolo nine years later in 2010.

The Diavolo expands on the traditional Freak by also including a flying tourbillon. While the original Freak included a metal rod that went through the center of the watch, the firm removed this in the Diavolo, and secured the movement in other ways to ensure better optics. The watch gets its name from the two windows resembling horns on the back of the case, which have a sinister effect.

Patek Philippe launched this model Ref. 3970 in 1986 and continued production for approximately two years. It features a solid snap-on case back. It was replaced with Ref. 3970E, which had a screw back rather than a snap back, with the suffix indicating *étanche*, or waterproof. This screw back model was produced until 2004.

According to our research, Patek Philippe produced about 650 second series models in yellow, white, and pink gold, and platinum. Of this total number, only 60 pieces are said to have been manufactured in pink gold, with only 24 pieces known to the market today. Indeed, pink gold is the rarest case color across all the series of this reference, making the present lot a particularly rare find for collectors.

The model was created following the success of the exceptional and iconic Ref. 2499. One main difference between the two models is the addition of the leap year indicator to the 3 o'clock subsidiary dial and 24-hour indicator to the 9 o'clock subsidiary dial. The general design of the case of Ref. 3970/3970E, with its down turned, fluted lugs, is clearly influenced by the form of iconic Ref. 2499.

As the Ref. 3970 was extremely well received in the market, Patek Philippe began increasing its production run during its last years of production, making an early model such as the present lot more remarkable today.

The exceedingly clean dial design with the linear calendar on the Ref. 844 was a particularity in the US market when it first appeared in 1965. Bearing a full digital display of day, month and date held within a single aperture, the dial of this watch is an especially rare Patek Philippe design, as the majority of perpetual calendar pocket watches by Patek Philippe were made with subsidiary dial indications. The 'single aperture' dial design enhances the clarity and ease of reading the date display and is of a type more commonly associated with wristwatches.

Antoine Gerlach, a Geneva-based case maker designed the triple-stepped bezel and case. With the sharp, clear lines of the case, the overall effect emphasizes the watch's purpose as a highly accurate timekeeper.

Patek Philippe produced the Ref. 844 from 1965 until 2000, when it was only available by special request. Despite this extensive production period, the firm produced an estimated total of only 80 pieces in yellow and white gold.

This example from 1982 features a "Roman" leap year indicator, located on the dial between the 3 and 4 o'clock position. Offered in overall excellent condition, the present watch is a wonderful representation of Patek Philippe's constant innovation over the course of its history.

INFORMATION ON SALES AND USE TAX RELATED TO PURCHASES AT AUCTION

Why Sotheby's Collects Sales Tax

Virtually all State Sales Tax Laws require a corporation to register with the State's Tax Authorities and collect and remit sales tax if the corporation either establishes or maintains physical or economic presence within the state. In the states that impose sales tax Tax Laws require an auction house, with such presence in the state, to register as a sales tax collector, and remit sales tax collected to the state. New York sales tax is charged on the hammer price. buyer's premium and any other applicable charges on any property picked up or delivered in New York, regardless of the state or country in which the purchaser resides or does business.

Where Sotheby's Collects Sales Tax

Sotheby's is currently registered to collect sales tax in the following states: Alabama. California, Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Texas, Utah. Vermont, Washington, Wisconsin and Wyoming. For any property collected or received by the purchaser in New York City, such property is subject to sales tax at the existing New York State and City rate of 8.875%.
