Made in the 1970s to compliment the Ellipse range of watches, the lighters were most probably commissioned by Patek Philippe from the specialist lighter manufacturer Colibri. Literature of the period advertises each lighter as being individually numbered and unique, made entirely by hand out of 18k gold including both the case and mechanism. Colibri would have been the obvious choice for Patek Philippe, with facilities to manufacture high-quality gas lighters in France, Colibri were world-leaders in their field. Of potential interest, it was Colibri who made the highly ingenious golden gun which was assembled from a Colibri 88 lighter, cigarette case, cuff links and a fountain pen in the 1974 James Bond movie 'The Man with the Golden Gun'.

Delivered in excellent condition and with its undated original warranty, this lighter is a rare find for any Patek Philippe seasoned collector.

Sotheby's can send you a quotation for shipping your purchase(s) on request. Transit risk insurance may also be included in your quotation. If the quotation is accepted, we will arrange the shipping for you and will despatch the property as soon as possible after receiving your written agreement to the terms of the quotation, financial release of the property and receipt of any export licence or certificates that may be required. Despatch will be arranged at the buyer's expense.

All shipments should be unpacked and checked on delivery and any discrepancies notified immediately to the party identified in your quotation and/or the accompanying documentation.

## GCC VAT AND IMPORT DUTY

The following paragraphs are intended to give general guidance to buyers on the VAT and import duty Implications of purchasing property at Sotheby's. The

information concerns the most usual circumstances and is not intended to be complete. In all cases, the relevant tax legislation take precedence and the VAT rates in effect on the day of the auction will be the rates charged.

In the following paragraphs, reference to VAT or Import Duty shall mean those symbols located beside the lot number or the pre-sale estimates in the catalogue (or amending sale room notice).

### 1. PROPERTY WITH NO VAT SYMBOL

Where there is no VAT symbol, the property will be sold subject to the Profit Margin Scheme and will be subject to the prevailing rate, currently 5% on the buyer's premium only.

### 2. PROPERTY WITH A † SYMBOL

The property will be sold subject to the normal VAT rules. VAT will be charged on the hammer price and the buyer's premium at the prevailing rate, currently 5%.

### 3. PROPERTY WITH A ∑ SYMBOL

Property shall be imported from outside the GCC into the DIFC from other jurisdictions which are not party to a customs treaty with the UAE, under a temporary admission regime, in which case the GCC Import Duty shall be payable by the buyer at the prevailing rate, currently 5% on the Hammer Price. VAT will be charged at the prevailing rate, currently 5%, on the aggregate of Hammer Price, Buyers Premium and Import Duty. A buyer registered for VAT in another GCC implementing state may, prior to collection of the lot request that any lot offered with no symbol or the † symbol be sold under the Intra GCC VAT rules, in which case no UAE VAT will be charged and the buyer shall account for VAT in the GCC state in which he is registered. ## 1. INTRODUCTION

(a) Sotheby's and the Sellers' contractual relationship with prospective Buyers is governed by:

(i) these Conditions of Business;

(ii) the Conditions of Business for Sellers displayed in the saleroom and which are available upon request from Sotheby's in Dubai or by calling +44(0)20 7293 5331.

(iii) Sotheby's Authenticity Guarantee as printed in the sale catalogue;

(iv) any additional notices and terms printed in the sale catalogue, including the Buying At Auction Guide; and

(v) in respect of online bidding via the internet, the BIDNOW Conditions on the Sotheby's website, in each case as amended by any saleroom notice or auctioneer's announcement at the auction.

(b) As auctioneer, Sotheby's acts as agent for the Seller. A sale contract is made directly between the Seller and the Buyer. However, Sotheby's may own a lot (and in such circumstances acts in a principal capacity as Seller) and/or may have a legal, beneficial or financial interest in a lot as a secured creditor or otherwise.

## 2. COMMON TERMS IN THESE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

In these Conditions of Business:

**"Bidder"** is any person considering, making or attempting to make a bid, by whatever means, and includes Buyers;

**"Buyer"** is the person who makes the highest bid or offer accepted by the auctioneer, and includes such person's principal when bidding as agent;

**"Buyer's Expenses"** are any costs or expenses due to Sotheby's from the Buyer, including an amount in respect of any applicable VAT and duties payable in respect of the sale of the property;

**"Buyer's Premium"** is the commission payable by the Buyer on the Hammer Price at the rates set out in the Buying At Auction Guide plus any applicable VAT;

**"Counterfeit"** is as defined in Sotheby's Authenticity Guarantee;

**"DIFC"** means the Dubai International Financial Centre;

**"GCC"** means the Gulf Cooperation Council;

**"Hammer Price"** is the highest bid accepted by the auctioneer by the fall of the hammer (in the case of wine, as

apportioned pro-rata by reference to the number of separately identified items in that lot), or in the case of a post-auction sale, the agreed sale price;

**"Purchase Price"** is the Hammer Price and applicable Buyer's Premium, VAT and duties;

**"Reserve"** is the (confidential) minimum Hammer Price at which the Seller has agreed to sell a lot;

**"Seller"** is the person offering a lot for sale including their agent (other than Sotheby's), executors or personal representatives;

**"Sotheby's"** means Sotheby's Art Services Limited, a private limited company (with registered number 2388) which has its registered office at Unit 1, Level B2, Gate Village, Building No. 3, DIFC, Dubai, UAE;

**"Sotheby's Company"** means both Sotheby's in the USA and any of its subsidiaries (including Sotheby's in London) and Sotheby's Diamonds S.A. and its subsidiaries (in each case, "subsidiary" having the meaning of Section 1159 of the UK Companies Act 2006); and

**"UAE"** means the United Arab Emirates.

**"VAT"** is Value Added Tax at the prevailing rate. Further information is contained in the guide to Buying at Auction.

## 3. DUTIES OF BIDDERS AND OF SOTHEBY'S IN RESPECT OF ITEMS FOR SALE

(a) Sotheby's knowledge in relation to each lot is partially dependent on information provided to it by the Seller, and Sotheby's is not able to and does not carry out exhaustive due diligence on each lot. Bidders acknowledge this fact and accept responsibility for carrying out inspections and investigations to satisfy themselves as to the lots in which they may be interested.

(b) Each lot offered for sale at Sotheby's is available for inspection by Bidders prior to the sale. Sotheby's accepts bids on lots solely on the basis that Bidders (and independent experts on their behalf, to the extent appropriate given the nature and value of the lot and the Bidder's own expertise) have fully inspected the lot prior to bidding and have satisfied themselves as to both the condition of the lot and the accuracy of its description.

(c) Bidders acknowledge that many lots are of an age and type which means that they are not in perfect condition. (f) Subject to the matters referred to in Conditions 3(a) to 3(e) above and to the specific exclusions contained in Condition 4 below, Sotheby's shall exercise such reasonable care when making express statements in catalogue descriptions or condition reports as is consistent with its role as auctioneer of lots in the sale to which these Conditions of Business for Buyers relate and in the light of: (i) the information provided to it by the Seller; (ii) scholarship and technical knowledge; and (iii) the generally accepted opinions of relevant experts, in each case at the time any such express statement is made.

## 4. EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY TO BUYERS

(a) Sotheby's shall refund the Purchase Price to the Buyer in circumstances where it deems that the lot is a Counterfeit and each of the conditions of the Authenticity Guarantee has been satisfied.

(b) In light of the matters in Condition 3 above and subject to Conditions 4(a) and 4(e), in light of the Bidders' ability to inspect items and the other matters set out in Conditions 4(a) and 4(e), neither any Sotheby's Company nor the Seller:

(i) is liable for any errors or omissions in information provided to Bidders by Sotheby's (or any Sotheby's Company), whether orally or in writing, whether negligent or otherwise, except as set out in Condition 3(f) above;
