





Figure 1. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Angular Displacement

Figure 4. Rel. Lumin. Intensity vs. Forw. Current/Duty Cycle







Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

Figure 5. Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current







Figure 3. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature
