

Read the operating instructions and WITHOUT LOADING ANY AMMUNITION, proceed several times through the operating steps with your gun (dry fire the gun at a safe target) so that you will be able to operate your Daisy properly and safely. ahead and avoid situations that might lead to accidents

## **HOW TO OPERATE**

**CAUTION:** Be sure gun is always pointed in a safe direction. Step 1. PUT "ON SAFE" Step 2. COCK

Step 3. FEED B.B

Step 4. AIM AT SAFE TARGET Step 5. TAKE "OFF SAFE" Step 6. FIRE

## SIEP 1. PUT "ON SAFE"

Push safety back toward the stock so the word "SAFE" is showing and the word "FIRE" is covered. It is a good practice to get in the habit of keeping the trigger safety "ON" until ready to fire the gun (See Drawing No. 2).


### Step 2. COCK

When cocking, raise muzzle with sight up. Firmly grasp the cocking lever and pull outward until a click is heard (see drawing 3). Close cocking lever and your gun is ready to fire.

CAUTION: Gun must always be pointed in a safe direction. Keep a firm grip on the lever while cocking. The lever could slip and slam shut, possibly causing injury. Also be careful to keep fingers out of cocking mechanism when closing lever. (See "Pinch Points" Drawing No. 3)


## Step 3. FEED B.B

Your model 499B is a single shot muzzle loading B•B gun. Point muzzle up in a safe direction away from your face and body. Drop only ONE B•B down the muzzle. (Drawing 4).

**CAUTION:** Loading more than one B•B is extremely dangerous as all of the B•B's will fire and fly off in various directions.

IMPORTANT: For best accuracy use only clean new Daisy Bullseye B•B's.

# WHAT IS A JAM, AND WHY DOES IT HAPPEN?

A jammed gun is one that does not fire a B•B when it is loaded, cocked and the trigger pulled. Jamming is a dangerous condition which must have immediate and careful attention, (See Step 6 for instructions on clearing the jam.) It can result from:

- Reusing shot that has been damaged by hitting a hard surface
   Using ammunition not intended for B•B guns.
   Using dirty shot.

If you follow the instructions for proper loading and if you use recommended shot only, your Daisy will provide many hours of trouble free recreational air gun shooting.

## Step 4. AIM AT SAFE TARGET

This model has an adjustable rear peep sight. Raise the rear sight to make the gun shoot higher, lower the rear sight to make the gun shoot lower. Move the rear sight to the left to make the gun shoot to the left; move the rear sight right to make the gun shoot to the right (see Drawing 6). The front sight has interchangeable sight inserts (see Drawing 5). Try each one and use the one that suits you best. See Drawing 7 for the correct sight picture for each

To be a consistent marksman, use the correct sight picture each time you fire your gun

**CAUTION:** Sight or point the gun only in a safe direction—never shoot at anyone. Do not shoot at hard surfaces as the B-B's will bounce or ricochet. Do not shoot at water.

## Step 5. TAKE "OFF SAFE"

When you are certain that the target, backstop and surrounding area are safe, push the safety forward toward muzzle until the word "Fire" is showing.

CAUTION: Keep gun pointed in a safe direction.

### Step 6. FIRE

After completing the operation steps, your gun may be fired by gently squeezing the

trigger.

NOTE: A good rifleman squeezes his trigger when on target, he does not jerk or pull the

CAUTION: Never carry a cocked gun. Cock it only when ready to fire. Even with the manual safety in the "SAFE" position, your gun is in a fully loaded condition and must be handled

trigger, the gun is jammed. This is a dangerous condition which must have immediate and careful attention. To correct it, unscrew the barrel assembly by turning the muzzle cap counterclockwise until it is free, then remove from gun. The jammed shot can then be removed by running a smooth rod through the barrel. If you are unable to clear the gun, return it to the Daisy Service Department. (See Repair of Daisy Guns section.) **CAUTION:** If the gun does not fire after loading, cocking, feeding and squeezing the trigger, the gun is jammed. This is a dangerous condition which must have immediate and

### UNLOADING

Make certain your gun is not cocked by firing in a safe direction. Put "On Safe" ,cock and fire several times in a safe direction to be sure no B•Bs remain in gun.

### PROPER CARE

100 times. Dúring the breaking in period of the 499B, we recommend you run a cotton swab, preferably dry, through the shot tube after each shooting session. Continue to run clean cotton swabs until no gray residue is evident. This will enhance the accuracy ability of your an opportunity for oil to enter the shot tube when the gun is new and being fired for the first OILING: Oil the trigger, cocking mechanism and other moving parts regularly. Use a "20" weight oil. The plunger head is factory lubricated and requires no oiling.

BARREL CLEANING: It is vital that you maintain a clean shot tube in this gun. There is

**CLEANING:** The exterior can be cleaned by wiping with a soft clean cloth. The screws and sights are a gun blue finish and should be wiped with an oiled cloth to prevent rust.

### STORAGE

Practice safety, store B•B's and gun separately to keep them away from untrained shooters. Before putting gun away in a safe place, make sure it is clean, dry, oiled, unloaded

### MODIFICATION-

performance. Any modification or tampering with a gun may cause a malfunction and may make it unsafe to use. Any change in performance, such as a lowered trigger force and shortened trigger travel, indicates possible wear, and such gun should be inspected, replaced, or properly repaired by qualified personnel. Any gun that has been dropped should be checked by qualified personnel to insure that its function has not been affected

Daisy will repair the gun or replace it with a reconditioned gun of the same model, if available; otherwise, with a model of equivalent quality. A charge will be made for repairing

For Models 499B-The repair charge is \$16.00

Any gun should be accompanied by check or money order (not cash) in payment of the charge. If payment is not included, you will be invoiced for the charges plus \$4.00 handling charge. Upon receipt of payment, the gun will be shipped to you.
