

- Retain Instructions—The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- **3. Heed Warnings**—All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. Follow Instructions—All operating and use instructions should be followed.5. Cleaning—Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleansers. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.



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- 4 Table of Contents / Description
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The R.L. Drake MM806 is a professional quality agile television demodulator with video and audio metering that demodulates any VHF, UHF, or CATV channel (54 - 806 MHz).

One MM806 may be added to a headend installation with the combined headend output sampled with a directional coupler and the sampled output fed to the MM806 RF input. Any NTSC channel from the headend can be selected and monitored on the MM806. This allows easy setup of video and audio levels.

The desired off-air VHF or UHF television channel from 2 through 69 or CATV channel from 2 through 125 is selected by a front panel pushwheel switch and associated slide switch. The MM806 provides a standard negative sync video output at a nominal level of 1 Vp-p.

Also provided is an audio output signal. Two modulation meters simultaneously provide readout of video modulation percentage and audio deviation percentage of 25 kHz peak deviation.

As previously described, channel selection switches are located on the front panel. The RF Input is through an "F" type connector located on the rear panel. The rear panel Video Output is also an "F" type connector. Unbalanced Audio Output is through a rear panel RCA type phono connector. The unit is powered through the attached AC line cord by a nominal 115 VAC, 60 Hz source of power.



F1 - POWER Indicator

Lights when the unit is connected to the required source of AC power.

F2 - Mode Switch

Sets the type of channel, Off-Air or CATV. The third position sets a leading "1" for CATV channels from 100 through 125. See also Item F3 for setting the channel number.

F3 - Channel Number Switch

Sets the received channel number for off-air TV channels 02 through 69 or for CATV channels 02 through 125. See also Item F2 which sets the type of channel (Off-Air or CATV) and sets the leading "1" for CATV channels 100 through 125.




F4 - VIDEO Modulation

This meter indicates a percentage of video modulation for the selected channel. The Desired level is 87.5%. Adjust the video gain of the modulator being monitored to obtain a reading of 87.5%.

F5 - AUDIO Modulation

This meter indicates a percentage of FM deviation of the monitored channel. 100% is equal to 25 kHz peak deviation, the NTSC standard in the U.S.A.



R1 - RF INPUT Connector

This is the 75 Ohm input to the demodulator circuits from an off-air television receiving antenna or from a CATV cable input.

R2 - VIDEO OUTPUT Connector

This is the 75 Ohm baseband video output at a nominal 1.0 Vp-p level which is adjustable with the front panel VIDEO LEVEL control over a range of approximately 0.7 to 1.5 Vp-p.

R3 - AUDIO OUTPUT Connector

The RCA phono connector AUDIO OUT, provides an unbalanced audio output.

R4 - FUSE

Always replace this fuse with one of the same type and rating: 1/8 Amp, 250 V, SLO-BLO®, 3AG type.

R5-LINE CORD

This is a three-wire power cable. When the cable is connected to a properly wired AC power line outlet, this cable grounds the instrument cabinet. Connect to a nominal 115 VAC ±10%, 60 Hz source. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the attached line cord plug.

TYPICAL HEADEND MONITOR APPLICATION Choose a Tap value so the video carrier level to the MM806 is in the 0 dBmV to +15 dBmV range.

RACK MOUNTING

Adequate ventilation is very important in multichannel installations. Units should be spaced apart by at least one panel height wherever possible, and some air movement is advisable in enclosed rack cabinets. Excessive heat will shorten component life and system performance will be degraded without proper cooling.




Figure 3 - Installation using a Directional Coupler




Figure 4 - Installation using an Output Monitor Port

Write your return address clearly on the shipping carton and on an enclosed cover letter describing the service required, symptoms or problems. Also include your daytime telephone number and a copy of your proof of purchase.

The unit will be serviced under the terms of the R.L. DRAKE COMPANY Limited Warranty and returned to you.

IF YOU NEED TO CALL FOR HELP

Call our Customer Service/Technical Support line at +1 (937) 746-6990 between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. Eastern Time, weekdays. Please have the unit's serial number available. We will also need to know the specifics of any other equipment connected to the unit. When calling, please have the unit up and running, near the phone if possible. Our technician(s) will likely ask certain questions to aid in diagnosis of the problem. Also, have a voltmeter handy, if possible.

Many of the products that are sent to us for repair are in perfect working order when we receive them. For these units, there is a standard checkout fee that you will be charged. Please perform whatever steps are applicable from the installation sections of the Owner's Manual before calling or writing—this could save unnecessary phone charges. Please do not return the unit without contacting R.L. DRAKE first: it is preferred to help troubleshoot the problem over the phone (or by mail) first, saving you both time and money.

Inside the carton, enclose a note with your name, address, daytime phone number, and a description of the unit's problem.

The unit must be sent to the following address:

Be sure to include your street address which will be needed for UPS return. UPS Surface (Brown Label) takes 7-10 days to reach us depending on your location, Blue takes 2-3 days. Red is an overnight service. Send the unit in a way that it can be traced if we can't verify receipt of shipment. We suggest UPS or insured postal shipment.

If the unit is still under the original owner's warranty, R.L. DRAKE will pay the cost of the return shipment to you. Our return shipping policy is that we will return it UPS Brown if received Brown or by US Mail, it will be returned Blue if received Blue or Red—or it will be returned however you prefer if you furnish the return cost for the method you select.

If the unit is out of warranty, it will be returned by UPS Brown label COD (UPS does not accept cash/currency) unless:

- 1) It was received UPS Blue/Red, in which case it will be returned UPS Blue/Red COD;
- You designate billing to American ExPress, VISA, MasterCard or Discover card;
- 3) You prepay the service charges with a personal check, or
- 4) You specify some other method of return.

When calling, the technician can estimate the repair charges for you over the phone. This is another good reason to call before sending a unit in for repair. Typically, equipment is repaired in five to ten working days after it arrives at R.L. DRAKE if we have all the facts. If we must call you, it may take longer. R.L. Three Year Limited Warranty


