

IBM tops Dell and HP in 4-way server price/performance on TPC-C benchmark

July 26, 2002 ... The xSeries™ 360 has delivered 31 percent better price/performance than the HP ProLiant DL580-G2 and 15 percent better price/performance than the Dell PowerEdge 6650. With this result, the x360 has set a new price/performance record for a 4-way server running the TPC-C benchmark. (1)

The xSeries 360 achieved performance of 45,230.03 tpmC and price/performance of \$4.52/tpmC. The total solution is available August 30, 2002. The xSeries 360 server used four Intel® 1.6GHz Xeon™ Processor MP and ran Microsoft® SQL Server 2000 and Microsoft Windows® 2000 Advanced Server. Both the ProLiant and PowerEdge servers used four 1.6GHz Xeon Processor MP and ran Microsoft SQL Server 2000 and Microsoft Windows 2000 Advanced Server.
