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

# CHECK CONTENTS

Make sure the package contains all of the accessories listed in "SPECIFICATIONS" (IF pg. 37).

# SITUATE VCR

Place the VCR on a stable, horizontal surface.

# CONNECT VCR TO TV

The connection method you use depends on the type of  $\mathsf{TV}$  you have.

#### **RF** Connection

- To Connect To A TV With NO AV Input Terminals . . . a– Disconnect the TV antenna from the TV.
  - **b** Connect the TV antenna cable to the ANT. IN jack on the rear of the VCR.
  - c- Connect the supplied RF cable between the RF OUT jack on the rear of the VCR and the TV's antenna terminal. Select channel 3 or 4 on your TV corresponding to the CH3 – CH4 switch setting on the back of the VCR.

#### **AV Connection**

- To Connect To A TV With AV Input Terminals . . .
  - **a-** Connect the antenna, VCR and TV as shown in the illustration.
  - **b** Connect an Audio/Video Cable between the AUDIO OUT and VIDEO OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR and the AV IN jacks on the TV. Select video input mode or A/V input mode on your TV. Refer to the TV Instruction Manual.

If your TV has AUDIO IN L (MONO) and R connectors, connect the VCR to the L (MONO) connector.

### CONNECT VCR TO POWER SOURCE

Connect the power plug to an AC outlet.

# FINAL PREPARATION FOR

Select the VCR channel (3 or 4) by setting the switch on the rear of the VCR as shown in the illustration. Perform Plug & Play ( $\square p$  g, 6 and 7).

#### **NOTES:**

- The VCR channel is the channel on the TV which will receive the audio and video signals from the VCR. The VCR's CH3-CH4 switch, on the back of the VCR, sets the VCR channel to CH3 or CH4.
- The CH3–CH4 switch is preset to the CH3 position. Set to CH4 if CH3 is used for broadcasting in your area and set the channel on the TV to correspond to the VCR's CH3– CH4 switch setting.
- If RF connection to TV is used, when switching from VCR to TV mode and from TV to VCR it may be necessary to issue a CH UP and then CH DOWN on TV to obtain a good quality picture.
- Even if you are using AV cables to connect your VCR to your TV, you must also connect it using the RF cable. This will ensure that you can record one show while watching another (III) pg. 23).
- For full identification of the VCR's rear panel, refer to the Index (REAR VIEW II) pg. 35).



# Plug & Play

#### Before starting...

- Connect the TV antenna cable to the ANT. IN jack on the VCR and plug the power cord into the AC outlet.
- $\bullet$  Turn on the TV and select the VCR channel 3 or 4 (or AV mode).



The Plug & Play function simplifies installation by guiding you through the procedures of setting the language, clock and tuner channels — simply follow the on-screen menus that appear when the **POWER** button is first pressed to power on the VCR after you connect the power plug to an AC outlet.

#### IMPORTANT

- Don't press any buttons on the VCR or remote control that are not directly related to the steps you are performing while Plug & Play is in progress.

# Still Picture/Frame-By-Frame Playback

# PAUSE DURING PLAYBACK

Press **PAUSE**. If there is vertical jitter, use the **CH**  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  button to correct the picture.

# ACTIVATE FRAME-BY-FRAME PLAYBACK

Press **PAUSE** repeatedly to advance one frame at a time. **OR**






# **Index Search**

Index codes are placed on the tape at the start of each recording. You can find and automatically play back from the start of any recording using the Index Search function.

# START SEARCH

While the tape is stopped, press **PUSH JOG** I◀◀ or ►►I.

# ACCESS DISTANT CODE



To access a recording 2–9 index codes away, press **PUSH JOG** I ← or ► I repeatedly until the correct number is displayed on screen (only if SUPERIMPOSE is set to ON (II) pg. 19). Playback begins automatically when the desired recording is located.

• If necessary press **REW** or **FF** when play starts to search visually to find the very beginning of the desired program.

### NOTE:

An index code is not placed on the tape when recording is paused and then resumed.

# **Manual Tracking**

Once playback begins, the VCR's automatic tracking function is engaged. If tracking noise appears in the picture, you can override this and make the adjustment manually.

# ENGAGE MANUAL TRACKING MODE

During playback, press the **CH**  $\blacktriangle$  and  $\checkmark$  buttons on the VCR's front panel simultaneously to cancel the automatic tracking mode and enable manual tracking adjust.

# ADJUST MANUAL TRACKING

Press **CH**  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  on the VCR's front panel or remote control. Press briefly for fine adjust, or press and hold for coarse adjust. Watch the screen and continue adjusting until optimum picture and sound quality are achieved.

# RE-ENGAGE AUTOMATIC TRACKING









# **Tape Position Indicator**

The Tape position indicator appears on screen when, from the stop mode, you press **FF** or **REW**, or perform an Index Search. The position of " $\blacksquare$ " in relation to "B" (Beginning) or "E" (End) shows you where you are on the tape.



#### **NOTES:**

- "SUPERIMPOSE" must be set to "ON", or the indicator will not appear (IP pg. 19).
- It may take a few seconds for the Tape Position Indicator to be displayed.

# **Next-Function Memory**

The Next Function Memory "tells" the VCR what to do after rewinding. Before continuing, ensure that the VCR is in stop mode.



# Playback

The VCR assesses the quality of the tape once you start playback.






### ATTENTION

- As B.E.S.T. takes place before recording actually starts, there is a delay of about 7 seconds after REC and PLAY on the remote, or **REC** on the VCR's front panel, are pressed. To make sure you record the desired scene or program completely, first perform the following steps:
- 1) Press and hold PAUSE, and press REC to engage the **RECORD PAUSE mode.** 
  - The VCR then automatically checks the condition of the tape and, after about 7 seconds, re-enters RECORD PAUSE.

#### ATTENTION

This VCR contains microcomputers. External electronic noise or interference can cause microcomputer to malfunction. 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#### Failure to heed the following precautions may result in damage to the VCR, remote control or video cassette.

#### 1. <u>DO NOT</u> place the VCR . . .

- ... in an environment prone to extreme temperatures or humidity.
- ... in direct sunlight.
- ... in a dusty environment.
- ... in an environment where strong magnetic fields are generated.
- ... on a surface that is unstable or subject to vibration.
- 2. <u>DO NOT</u> block the VCR's ventilation openings.
- 3. <u>DO NOT</u> place heavy objects on the VCR or remote control.
- 4. <u>DO NOT</u> place anything which might spill on top of the VCR or remote control.
- 5. AVOID violent shocks to the VCR during transport.

#### **\*\*MOISTURE CONDENSATION**

Moisture in the air will condense on the VCR when you move it from a cold place to a warm place, or under extremely humid conditions—just as water droplets form on the surface of a glass filled with cold liquid. Moisture condensation on the head drum will cause damage to the tape. In conditions where condensation may occur, keep the VCR's power turned on for a few hours to let the moisture dry before inserting a tape.
