



### Cautions

#### **Rechargeable batteries**

- Only the BN-R1211 battery can be recharged.
- If the power delivered by the batteries lasts for a very short time after recharging, it means that the batteries' service life is over. Do not use them any more.
- Recharging already charged batteries will shorten their service life.
  When recharging batteries for the first time or when they have not been used for a long period of time, the play time may be shorter than usual. In a case like this, repeatedly recharge and discharge the batteries. This will restore them to their regular state.
- Do not allow any metal objects to touch the terminals of rechargeable batteries since this may cause short-circuiting which is dangerous.
- Do not peel off the plastic covering on the rechargeable batteries. Short-circuiting may occur which is dangerous.

# Dry cell batteries / rechargeable batteries

To prevent damage to the batteries and electrolyte leakage, heed the following points.

- Align the ⊕ and ⊝ polarities properly when inserting the batteries.
  Do not mix different types or makes of batteries or old and new batteries.
- Remove the batteries if you do not plan to use the unit for a long period of time.
- Do not throw batteries into a fire, and do not short-circuit, disassemble or subject them to excessive heat.
- Do not attempt to recharge dry cell batteries.

#### Carrying dry cell batteries / rechargeable batteries around

When putting dry cell or rechargeable batteries in a pocket or bag, ensure that no other metal objects such as a necklace are placed together with them. Contact with metal may cause shortcircuiting which, in turn, may cause a fire.

Be absolutely sure to carry the rechargeable batteries in the battery carrying case.



#### When purchasing rechargeable batteries

To use rechargeable batteries, be absolutely sure to purchase the rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries designed especially for this unit.



Open the lid and clean the lens as shown in the figure. Use a cotton swab to gently wipe off any finger-prints. Recommended product: Lens cleaner kit








Recharging will be completed after 10 hours.

**3** When recharging is complete, unplug the AC adaptor from the AC power outlet and the DC IN jack.

#### Notes:

- To operate the unit on batteries, the AC adaptor must be disconnected from the DC IN jack.
- It takes approximately 10 hours to recharge the rechargeable batteries.
- Rechargeable batteries have a service life of approximately 300 charge-discharge cycles. If the operating time on one full charge becomes noticeably shorter than it used to be, the batteries have reached the end of their service life and should be replaced.
- Recharging takes place only when the unit is powered off. (It is not possible to recharge the batteries while playing a CD.)
- The AC adaptor and rechargeable batteries may become warm while recharging is in progress. This is normal and is not a malfunction.
- You cannot charge the rechargeable batteries using the external battery case.




#### Using dry-cell batteries (not included)

After disconnecting the AC adaptor, insert two "R6" (LR6) alkaline batteries.

The procedure for inserting and removing dry-cell batteries is identical to that rechargeable batteries.

#### Using external battery case

Open the battery cover of the external battery case (supplied) and insert two "R6" (LR6) alkaline batteries (not included) into the battery compartment. Then, install the external battery case in the unit by turning the knob of the battery case.



#### **Battery indicator**



This indicator lights when the batteries are almost out of power. Power is shut off a short while later.

#### Rechargeable batteries: Recharge batteries.

### Dry-cell batteries: Replace batteries with new ones.

#### Notes:

- The length of time the unit can continue further operation after the battery indicator lights differs depending on the type of batteries used.
  - The battery indicator may not light if rechargeable batteries, other than those designated by JVC, are used.

#### Tip:

Turning off the Anti-Shock Protection (see page 6) will save the battery power more or less. (Available for an Audio CD only)

If the unit malfunctions or freezes during use, disconnect the AC adaptor and batteries. Then, connect the AC adaptor and batteries, and operate the unit again.

#### Using the AC adaptor

#### Connect the AC adaptor supplied.

Refer to "Using rechargeable batteries" for connection instructions.

#### Note:

The unit is in the standby condition when the AC adaptor is connected. The primary circuit is always "live" as long as the AC adaptor is connected to an AC power outlet.

#### AC adaptor (for multi voltage area only)

#### Before use

Make sure the present voltage of your AC adaptor fits to your local voltage before plugging it into the AC power outlet. If it doesn't, shift the AC line-voltage selector with a screwdriver so that it corresponds to your local voltage.




#### Playing order of MP3/WMA files

The illustration below shows the normal playing order of the MP3/WMA files. You will see that the MP3/WMA files are played back in the order from the higher hierarchy to the lower one.

#### File name and ID3 tag display (MP3/WMA only):

During playback, the file name and ID3 tag scroll on the display as follows:

#### For your reference:

#### "NO DISC"

This indication appears for about 30 seconds if  $\blacktriangleright/II$  is pressed when no disc is loaded in the unit or if the disc is not properly seated. Then, the unit is automatically shut off.



Above messages successively appear before playing the track.

#### "OPEN"

• Opened lid Stays lit for 30 seconds when the lid is opened. Then, the unit is automatically shut off.

#### Note:

Never insert foreign objects into the unit body.

#### Removing the disc

Turn off the unit and, after the disc has stopped rotating, remove the disc as shown below:



#### Auto power off function

If the unit is left in stop mode for 30 seconds, the unit powers itself off automatically to save power.

### **Anti-Shock Protection**

This function minimizes sound interruption caused by vibrations, by utilizing audio data that has been stored in the memory ahead of the following time:

For Audio CD: Up to 45 seconds worth (Anti-Shock Protection on/off selectable)

For MP3: Up to 140 seconds worth at 128 kbps (Anti-Shock Protection is fixed to on.)

Normally, "ASP" and the A.S.P. progress meters are displayed and the Anti-Shock Protection is in effect.



When the disc is played, as the audio data gradually stored in the memory, the A.S.P. progress meter progresses.

#### To cancel the Anti-Shock Protection (Audio CD only)

Press the A.S.P./T.SEARCH button in stop mode or during playback. "ASP OFF" appears on the display.

### To activate the Anti-Shock Protection again (Audio CD only)

To activate the Anti-Shock Protection again, press the A.S.P./  $\ensuremath{\text{T.SEARCH}}$  button once more.

#### Notes:

- The Anti-Shock Protection can be enabled or disabled during play, and this may cause a slight interruption in the sound because the disc's rotational speed changes.





# **Preventing Accidental Operation (HOLD)**





#### The HOLD switch on the unit/remote control is prepared to prevent an accidental operation by an unexpected button press.

#### Setting the HOLD switch ON prevents the following:

- Powering on the unit accidentally (which can cause the batter-
- ies to go dead).Play being cut off unexpectedly.
- Unexpected operation during play. (Set the HOLD switch to the ON position after you start playing disc.)

#### To set the unit/remote control in HOLD mode

• Set the HOLD switch on the unit/remote control to the ON position. The all buttons on the unit/remote control are disabled.

#### "HOLD " indication

When the unit is in HOLD mode, "HOLD" will be displayed if a button on the unit is pressed.

#### To release the HOLD mode

Set the HOLD switch to OFF position.


#### Notes:

- Before turning on the unit, be sure that HOLD is OFF. Otherwise, you cannot turn on the unit.
- The HOLD switch on the unit is effective for the unit only. While, that on the remote control is effective for the remote control only.

### Using with an audio system

You can use an audio system by connecting it to the unit with a stereo connection cable (not included).

- Connect the cable to the amplifier after turning off its power.
- Do not connect the cable to the PHONO jacks on the amplifier.
- Obtain the optional connecting cable if the amplifier comes with mini-phone jacks.
- Adjust the volume level on the amplifier.



• To obtain original sound, turn HBS to OFF. Also, set the sound effect to "FLAT". (See page 7)

## **Other Play Methods**

#### Descriptions are common to Audio CDs and MP3/WMA files unless otherwise noted.

#### **Random play**

You can play all tracks in a random order. After playing all tracks, the unit stops. Though the display for the Audio-CD and MP3/WMA differs a little, operation is the same.



#### Intro play

You can successively play the first 10 seconds of every track

from the first track Intro play stops after playing the last track

#### 1 In stop mode, press MODE until "INTRO" flashes.



#### 2 Press ►/II.

Intro play will start from the first track.



#### Cancelling

Press MODE until "INTRO" goes out and the unit returns to normal play mode.

#### For your reference:


- · You can also use intro play during playback. In this case, intro
- play after the current track has been played back.
- · You can also use intro play for program play.

#### **Program play**


You can program up to 64 tracks in any desired order including the same tracks

For Audio CD, go to step 3. Though the display differs a little, operation is the same.

#### 1 (MP3/WMA only) During playback or in stop mode,



2 (MP3/WMA only) Select the desired group number. (e.g. 02)




**3** Press PROGRAM.



4 Select the desired track. (e.g. 03)



#### 5 Press PROGRAM



6 For MP3/WMA, repeat steps 2-5 to select other tracks.

For Audio-CD, repeat steps 4 and 5.

Press ►/II.

#### • To confirm the programmed tracks

In stop mode, press PROGRAM repeatedly. The programmed track number will successively appear together with the program sequence number. At this time, you can change the program, if required.

If the programmed tracks are less than 64, track number "Ggi GGG" appears for the youngest programmable sequence number, enabling further programming.

#### · To delete the entire programmed sequence

Set RESUME to "OFF", then in stop mode, press ■. Turning off the unit deletes the program.

#### RESUME

This function allows you to listen from the beginning of the track that was lastly stopped.



To enable this function, set RESUME to "ON".

- Press  $\blacktriangleright/II$  to resume playback.
- The setting (e.g. sound effect, etc.) are also resumed. To cancel this function, set RESUME to "OFF".

#### Sound effect

You can enjoy various sound effects. Press SOUND



Each time you press the button, the sound effect changes as follows: ► ROCK → POP → FLAT → CLASSIC → JAZZ →

#### **Hyper-Bass Sound effect**

You can enjoy powerful bass sound.

#### To get the hyper-bass sound effect

Keep depressing SOUND. "HBS" will be displayed.



#### To cancel the HBS effect

Keep depressing SOUND again. The display "HBS" will go out.



#### Title search (MP3/WMA only)

#### File search (Alphabet search)

You can search a track title you want by specifying up to first five characters. For example, to search the track title "CHAMPION", you can specify "C", "CH", etc. In the following example, "CH" are specified.

 Note that search is made for the track title (file name) and not for the ID3 tag.

#### 1 In stop mode or during playback, press A.S.P./ T.SEARCH.



2 Enter the characters "CH", for example.
1) Press ►►I or I◄◄ repeatedly to select "C". ("C" flashes.)
2) Press ►/II to enter "C".

The first track title that begins with "C".




Group number Track number

- If no track title begins with "C", "NO File" is displayed. In this case, press ■ to cancel the character.
- When you specify only the first letter of the track title, skip the following step 3), 4), 5) and proceed to **3**.
- Keep depressing ►►I until "GHIJKL:" is displayed for entering the next character "H".



Each time ►►I or I◄◄ is kept depressing, the character set cyclically changes as follows:



4) Press ►►I or I◄◄ to select "H".
5) Press ►/II to enter "H".



The first track title that begins with "CH".

• If no track title begins with "CH", "NO File" is displayed. In this case, press ■ to cancel the character. 3 Select the track title you want. 1) Press MODE.



#### 2) Press >> or a to select the track title you want.



- By pressing SOUND, you can scroll the track title. To cancel scrolling, press SOUND again.
- If there is only one track that begins with "CH", the track title does not change.

### 4 Press ►/II.

The selected track starts playback.


#### Notes:

- To exit the File search (Alphabet search) mode, press or A.S.P./ T.SEARCH repeatedly at any time to return to the normal display.
- When playback starts, the File search (Alphabet search) mode is automatically released.
- If you leave the unit for more than 30seconds during operation, the File search mode will be cancelled and the display returns to the normal one.

#### Group search

You can search a group you want to play. Search is made for the group title (folder name) and not for the ID3 tag.

1 In stop mode or during playback, press A.S.P./ T.SEARCH two times.



2 Press ►►I or I repeatedly until the group you want is displayed on the first line.



- When you want to play from the first track of the group, skip the following 3 and 4, and proceed to 5.
- 3 To specify a track in the group, keep depressing ► or I ◄ until the letter "T (Track)" is displayed.



- By pressing SOUND, you can scroll the group title and track title. To cancel scrolling, press SOUND again.
- 4 Press ►► or I ◄◄ until the track title you want is displayed on the first line.

#### 5 Press ►/II.

Playback starts from the selected track of the selected group. When playback starts, the Group Search mode is automatically released.

#### Note:

- To exit the Group Search mode, press or A.S.P./T.SEARCH at any time to return to the normal display.
- When you skip the above steps **3** and **4**, playback starts from the first track of the group you selected in step **2**.
- If you leave the unit for more than 30 seconds during operation, the group search mode will be cancelled and the display returns to the normal one.
