### • To confirm the program


While stopped, press PROGRAM repeatedly. At this time, you can add and change the program, if required.

## **Anti-Shock Protection EX**

This function achieves excellent performance against sound interruption caused by vibrations. You will be able to enjoy listening to music during (not vigorous) jogging.

By utilizing the high-performance servo circuit, audio data will be stored in the memory ahead of time.

For Audio CD: Up to 40 seconds worth (Anti-Shock Protection on / off selectable)

For MP3: Up to 100 seconds worth at 128 kbps (Anti-Shock Protection is fixed to on ) Normally, this function is in effect.



As the audio data is gradually stored, the indicator changes as follows:



### To cancel (Audio CD only)



The "ANTI SHOCK" indicator goes out.

To activate again (Audio CD only) Press A.S.P/GROUP UP.

• During this operation, the disc rotates at a higher rate than usual in order to collect extra audio data. This may cause the batteries to run out faster and could result in a slight increase in disc rota-

• This function can be switched ON and OFF during playback. However, this may cause a slight interruption in the sound because the disc's rotational speed changes.
