


The POWER button does not completely shut off mains power from the unit, but switches operating current on and off.

This unit is produced to comply with Standard IEC Publ. 65.

POWER SYSTEM:

This set operates on voltage of AC 110 – 220V $\sim,$ 50/60 Hz with automatic switching.

Use the conversion plug (provided) depending on the type of your AC WALL outlet.



The rating plate and safety caution are on the rear of the unit.

IMPORTANT:

It may be unlawful to record or play back copyrighted material without the consent of the copyright owner.

CAUTION

- When you are not using the VCR for a long period of time, it is recommended that you disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet.
- Dangerous voltage inside. Refer internal servicing to qualified service personnel. To prevent electric shock or fire hazard, remove the power cord from the AC outlet prior to connecting or disconnecting any signal lead or aerial.
- Changes or modifications not approved by JVC could void user's authority to operate the equipment.



- Cassettes marked "VHS" (or "S-VHS") can be used with this video cassette recorder. However, only "VHS" recordings can be played back in this model.
- HQ VHS is compatible with existing VHS equipment.

Failure to heed the following precautions may result in damage to the VCR, remote control or video cassette.

- 1. <u>DO NOT</u> place the VCR . . .
 - ... in an environment prone to extreme temperatures or humidity.
 - ... in direct sunlight.
 - ... in a dusty environment.
 - ... in an environment where strong magnetic fields are generated.
 - ... on a surface that is unstable or subject to vibration.
- 2. <u>DO NOT</u> block the VCR's ventilation openings.
- 3. <u>DO NOT</u> place heavy objects on the VCR or remote control. 4. <u>DO NOT</u> place anything which might spill on top of the
- VCR or remote control.
- 5. <u>AVOID</u> violent shocks to the VCR during transport.

****MOISTURE CONDENSATION**

Moisture in the air will condense on the VCR when you move it from a cold place to a warm place, or under extremely humid conditions—just as water droplets form on the surface of a glass filled with cold liquid. Moisture condensation on the head drum will cause damage to the tape. In conditions where condensation may occur, keep the VCR's power turned on for a few hours to let the moisture dry.

****ABOUT HEAD CLEANING**

Accumulation of dirt and other particles on the video heads may cause the playback picture to become blurred or interrupted. Be sure to contact your nearest JVC dealer if such troubles occur.

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



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

SIMPLE PLAYBACK AND RECORDING

Simple Playback



LOAD A CASSETTE

Make sure the window side is up, the rear label side is facing you and the arrow on the front of the cassette is pointing towards the VCR. Don't apply too much pressure when inserting.

- The VCR's power comes on automatically.
- The counter is automatically reset to "0H 00M 00S".
 If the cassette's record safety tab has been removed,
- playback begins automatically.

FIND PROGRAM START POINT

If the tape is advanced past the start point, press **REW**. To go forward, press **FF**.

START PLAYBACK

Press **PLAY**. "B.E.S.T. PICTURE SYSTEM" appears on screen (127 pg. 20).

STOP PLAYBACK



Press **STOP** or **STOP/EJECT**. Then press **STOP/EJECT** to remove the cassette.






* Compact VHS camcorder recordings can be played on this video recorder. Simply place the recorded cassette into a VHS Cassette Adapter and it can be used just like any full-sized VHS cassette.

** This video recorder can record on regular VHS and Super VHS cassettes. However, it will record and play back regular VHS signals only. It is not possible to play back Super VHS recordings.

Simple Recording





LOAD A CASSETTE

Make sure the record safety tab is intact. If not, cover the hole with adhesive tape before inserting the cassette.

SELECT RECORDING CHANNEL

Press **CH**▲**▼**. Or press the appropriate **NUMBER** keys, then press **ENTER**. (The channel changes after a few seconds whether you press **ENTER** or not.)



Press **SP/EP** to set the recording speed.

START RECORDING

Press and hold **REC** and press **PLAY** on the remote control, or press **REC** on the VCR's front panel.

B.E.S.T. takes place at the beginning of both the first SP and the first EP recording after inserting the cassette (() pg. 19).

PAUSE/RESUME RECORDING


Press PAUSE. Press PLAY to resume recording.

STOP RECORDING

Press **STOP** or **STOP/EJECT**. Then press **STOP/EJECT** to remove the cassette.




• To prevent accidental recording on a recorded cassette, remove its record safety tab. To record on it later, cover the hole with adhesive tape.



PLAYBACK AND RECORDING FEATURES

Playback





Still Picture

PAUSE DURING PLAYBACK

Press **PAUSE**. If there is vertical jitter, press **CH** \blacktriangle or \checkmark on the VCR's front panel or remote to stabilize the picture.

FRAME-BY-FRAME PLAYBACK

Advance the tape one frame by pressing PAUSE again.

 To control the direction of Frame-by-Frame playback, press PUSH JOG I or ►►I during still picture mode.

RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

Press PLAY during still picture mode.

Slow, Reverse, Reverse Slow Or Fast-Motion Picture

Press **PUSH JOG** I

To increase the speed in the forward direction, press ►►I.

- To decrease the speed in the forward direction, press I << .
- To play in reverse slow motion, and in reverse play mode, continue to press I◄◄ after selecting all the forward slow motion modes.

Press \mathbf{FF} for forward fast motion, or \mathbf{REW} for reverse fast motion.

RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK Press PLAY.

NOTES:

- Press and hold **FF** or **REW** for more than 2 seconds for short fast-motion searches. When the button is released, normal playback resumes.
- If noise bars appear during playback or slow motion, correct using manual tracking. (IF pg. 13).

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Manual Tracking

Once playback begins, the VCR's automatic tracking function is engaged. If noise appears in the picture, you can override this and make the adjustment manually.

ENGAGE MANUAL TRACKING MODE

During playback, press the CH▲▼ buttons on the VCR's front panel simultaneously to cancel the automatic tracking mode and enable manual tracking adjust.

ADJUST MANUAL TRACKING

Press **CH**▲▼ on the VCR's front panel or remote. Press lightly for fine adjust, or press and hold for coarse adjust. Watch the screen and continue adjusting until optimum picture and sound quality are achieved.

RE-ENGAGE AUTOMATIC TRACKING


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
Press the **CH**▲▼ buttons on the VCR's front panel simultaneously.



NOTE:

During slow-motion playback, simply press $CH \blacktriangle$ or \checkmark on the VCR's front panel or remote to adjust tracking.






PLAYBACK AND RECORDING FEATURES (cont.)

Superimpose

This function, switchable between ON and OFF, determines whether or not operational indicators will appear on screen.




"Cassette Loaded" mark When a cassette is loaded, the mark is displayed for 5 seconds. It blinks when the VCR's EJECT button is pushed.



Skip Search



SECTIONS Press SKIP SEARCH 1 to 4 times during playback. Each

press initiates a 30-second period of fast-motion playback. Normal playback resumes automatically.

NOTE:

To return to normal playback during a Skip Search, press PLAY.

Repeat Playback



START REPEAT

Press and hold PLAY (until "PLAY" blinks on the front display panel) during playback, then release.

• The entire tape is played back 20 times.



To stop, press STOP at any time.

NOTE:

Pressing PLAY, REW, FF, PAUSE or PUSH JOG ►► also stops Repeat Playback.

Index Search

This function seeks out index codes that are placed on the tape at recording start.

START SEARCH


While the tape is stopped, press **PUSH JOG** I

ACCESS DISTANT CODE

To access a recording 2-9 index codes away, press PUSH JOG Id or ►► repeatedly until the correct number is displayed on screen (only if SUPERIMPOSE is set to ON (IF pg. 14). Playback begins automatically when desired recording is located.

• To find the very beginning of the desired program, press REW or FF and search visually for the start point.

PLAYBACK AND RECORDING FEATURES (cont.)



Instant ReView

At the press of a button, you can power up your VCR, rewind the tape and begin viewing the most recent timer-recorded program.

ACTIVATE INSTANT REVIEW After ensuring that the VCR is off and the Timer mode is

- disengaged, press **REVIEW**.
- The power comes on and the VCR searches for the index code indicating the start of the last timer-recorded program, then begins playback automatically.
- You can access a program 2–9 index codes away from the current position on the tape. If, for example, you have 5 programs recorded and you want to watch the third one, press **REVIEW** three times.
- To find the very beginning of the desired program, press **REW** or **FF** and search visually for the program's start point.

Counter Reset



RESET COUNTER TO ZERO Press C.RESET.

NOTE:

By pressing the **DISPLAY** button, you can change the display to show the counter reading, channel number or clock time. (Channel number is not displayed during playback.)

Counter Memory

When activated, this feature returns the tape to counter position "zero".

ACTIVATE COUNTER MEMORY


Press **C.RESET** during playback at a point you want to have quick access to later. The counter reads "0H 00M 00S".


Then press **C.MEMORY**. The Counter Memory indicator in the front display panel lights.

RETURN TO COUNTER POSITION ZERO

Press **STOP** (during playback), then press **REW**. The tape rewinds and stops at approximately "0H 00M 00S" automatically.


• To cancel Counter Memory, press C.MEMORY.





Tape Position Indicator

The Tape position indicator appears on screen when, from the stop mode, you press **FF**, **REW** or perform an Index Search or Instant ReView. The position of "■" in relation to "B" (Beginning) or "E" (End) shows you where you are on the tape.



NOTE:

SUPERIMPOSE must be set to ON, or the indicator will not appear (CF pg. 14).

Next-Function Memory


The Next Function Memory "tells" the VCR what to do after rewinding.


- * Before continuing, ensure that the VCR is in stop mode.
- a- For Automatic Start Of Playback After Tape Rewind . . .
- . . . press **REW**, then press **PLÁY** within 2 seconds.
- **b** For Automatic Power Off After Tape Rewind press **REW**, then press **POWER** within 2 seconds.
- **c** For Automatic Timer Standby After Tape Rewind . . .
- ... press **REW**, then press **TIMER** within 2 seconds.
- NOTE:

If you want the "next function" to automatically start when the counter reads "0H 00M 00S" (instead of at the beginning of the tape), press **C. MEMORY** so that the counter memory indicator appears on the front display panel before pressing **REW** or **FF**.




Your VCR is equipped with the B.E.S.T. (Biconditional Equalized Signal Tracking) feature, which checks the condition of the tape in use during recording and playback, and compensates to provide the highest-possible recording and playback pictures. *The default setting for both recording and playback is "ON".



- SUPERIMPOSE must be set to "ON" or the B.E.S.T. Picture System screen will not appear (137 pg. 14).
- As B.E.S.T. takes place before recording actually starts, there is a delay of about 7 seconds after **REC** and **PLAY** on the remote, or **REC** on the VCR's front panel, are pressed. To make sure you record the desired scene or program completely, first perform the following steps:
- 1) Press and hold PAUSE, and press REC to engage the **RECORD PAUSE mode.**
 - The VCR then automatically checks the condition of the tape and, after about 7 seconds, re-enters RECORD PAUSE.
- 2) Press PLAY to start recording.
- If you want to bypass B.E.S.T. and start recording right away, set "RECORDING" to "OFF" in step 4 of the Preparation procedure (127 pg. 18).

DISPLAY ELAPSED TIME ON SCREEN

During recording, press **OSD** at any time to see the elapsed time. All indications corresponding to the current status of the VCR are displayed for 5 seconds. The counter display remains on the screen indicating the elapsed time. Press **OSD** again to remove the display.



TIMER RECORDING

Instant Timer Recording (ITR)



This easy method lets you record for from 30 minutes to 6 hours (selectable in 30-min. increments), and shuts the VCR off after recording is finished.



ENGAGE ITR MODE

Press **REC** again. ITR blinks and 0:30 appears on the front display panel.

SET RECORDING DURATION

If you want to record for more than 30 minutes, press **REC** to extend the time. Each press extends recording time by 30 minutes.

NOTES:

- You can only perform ITR using the **REC** button on the VCR's front panel.
- After you set the time, the previous display reappears.
- To check remaining recording time, press **REC** once during recording and the remaining time is displayed for about 5 seconds. Be careful not to press again during this 5 seconds, or you'll add 30 more minutes to the recording.

On-Screen Timer Programming

* Refer to the illustration on page 23.

You can directly program the VCR's timer to record up to 8 shows, as far as a year in advance. Remember, the clock must be set before you can program the timer ($\Box P$ pg. 5).




Make sure the record safety tab is intact. If not, cover the hole with adhesive tape, then load.

- The VCR comes on, and the counter is reset, automatically.
- If watching channel 3 or 4, press **TV/VIDEO** to select the VIDEO mode. VIDEO is displayed on the front display panel.

ACCESS PROGRAM SET

Press **MENU**, then press **OK**.





EXAMPLE

If you program the VCR to timer record a show on September 6 on channel 40 from 12:00 noon to 1:00 PM in SP mode, the screen will look like this:

PUSH JOG

NOTES:

- To disengage the timer before recording starts, press TIMER again. Pressing once more re-engages it.
- In case of a power failure after programming, the VCR's memory backup keeps your selections for 18 hours.
- If you select "PROGRAM SET" without having set the date and time, an error message appears. Follow its instructions.
- If you enter a start time that has already passed, ERROR appears on the screen and flashes.
- Programs that start after midnight must have the next day's date.

SELECT PROGRAM NUMBER

Press the appropriate **NUMBER** keys or **CH** to select a vacant program number, then press OK. The first time you do this, all numbers will be vacant, so just press **OK** when the screen appears.

SET PROGRAM INFORMATION

Press the appropriate **NUMBER** keys to set the date, start/stop time and channel number. Press CH▲▼ to set AM/PM and tape speed. Then press OK after AM/PM, channel number and tape speed settings. The next setting that can be set begins flashing.

- Any information comprised of 1 digit (except the channel number) should have a "0" entered before it.
- It is possible to set all information using the CH▲▼ buttons. (In this case, press OK after each setting.)

NOTE:

b

If you are using a cable box, enter the cable box channel, not the channel to be recorded. The channel to be recorded must be selected on the cable box. (The cable box channel is the VCR's channel that displays the chennels received by the cable box.)

** You can record selected programs at the same time every weekday, or once a week. Before entering the month, press NUMBER key "8" (DAILY) or "9" (WEEKLY). Either "DAILY" or "WEEKLY" appears. Press again and "DAILY" or "WEEKLY" disappears.

MAKE CORRECTIONS

To change any of the settings, press OK or PUSH JOG I until the item you want to change begins blinking. Then set as in step 4.

RETURN TO NORMAL SCREEN


Press MENU as many times as necessary.

• Press just once to access the Auto Timer screen (🖙 pg. 26).

ENGAGE TIMER MODE

Press TIMER. The VCR turns off automatically.

- After timer recording is completed, the VCR's power goes off automatically.
- You can program the timer while a regular recording is in progress; the on-screen menu will not be recorded.
- If the end of tape is reached during timer recording, the cassette is automatically ejected.
- When timer-recording cable channels received through a Cable Box, be sure to keep the Cable Box set to ON.



TIMER RECORDING (cont.)

Check And Cancel Programs

DISENGAGE TIMER Press TIMER, then press POWER.

ACCESS PROGRAM SET **SCREEN**

Press MENU, then press OK.

CHECK PROGRAM **INFORMATION** Press $CH \blacktriangle \forall$ to check the programs in succession.



• Repeat steps 3 and 4 as many times as necessary.

RETURN TO NORMAL

Press MENU as many times as necessary. If there are still programs remaining, go to step 6.

RE-ENGAGE TIMER



Auto SP/EP Timer

If, when recording in SP mode, there is not enough tape to record the entire program, the VCR automatically switches to EP mode to allow complete recording. This feature is especially handy when recording a program of more than 2 hours in length.





Make sure you select "ON" at the Auto SP/EP Timer screen before performing timer programming.





NOTES:

- If you have programmed the VCR to timer-record 2 or more programs, the second program and those thereafter may not fit on the tape if you set the Auto SP/EP Timer mode to "ON". In this case, make sure the mode is not engaged, then set the tape speed manually during timer programming.
- There may be some noise at the point on the tape where the VCR switches from SP to EP mode.
- The Auto SP/EP Timer feature is not available during ITR (Instant Timer Recording), and the feature will not work properly with any tapes other than the following: T-30, T-60, T-90, and T-120.





Auto Timer

When activated, this function automatically engages the timer when the VCR's power is turned off, and disengages it when the power is turned on.





NOTE:

For safety, when AUTO TIMER is set to "OFF", all other VCR functions are disabled while the Timer mode is engaged. To disengage the timer, press **TIMER**.




Control Two JVC VCRs

The supplied remote control is capable of controlling two JVC VCRs independently using the **A/B CODE** switch. You can set this VCR so it responds to remote commands only when the switch is set to **B**, and another VCR so it responds to commands when the switch is set to **A**. The switch is preset to **A** because this VCR normally responds to A-code signals. You can easily modify this VCR to accept B-code commands.

Unplug the VCR's power cord from the AC outlet.
 Set the A/B CODE switch on the remote control to B.
 Plug the VCR's power cord back into the AC outlet.
 Turn the VCR's power back on by pressing POWER on the remote.

The VCR will now respond only to B-code commands.

Random Assemble Editing



This function makes it easier to create edited videos when your VCR is used as the source player in combination with another VCR equipped with a Remote PAUSE Connector. You can preprogram up to 8 scenes or "cuts" for automatic editing in the sequence you have specified.

PREPARE RECORDING DECK

- Automatic editing begins; all the specified scenes are copied to the recording deck in the order they were registered.
- The on-screen display remains while your VCR searches for each scene (blinking cursor indicates scene currently being searched for), but disappears during actual editing.
- During scene search, the recording deck automatically enters its Record-Standby mode. "SEARCHING" appears on the screen.
- When all registered scenes have been edited, your VCR enters the Stop mode, the recording deck enters its Record-Standby mode, a blue background replaces the video playback (behind the R.A. Edit screen), and the cursor blinks at the next available number.



END R.A. EDIT

Press **MENU** as many times as necessary to return to the normal screen, and engage the Stop mode for the recording deck.

NOTES:

- You can also monitor the sound when searching for scenes you want to edit in steps 7 – 8. Since you can hear the soundtrack during selection, you can avoid abrupt or unnatural sounding scene-to-scene transitions.
- When editing, there may be a discrepancy of about 2 seconds on the source tape between the locations you chose as edit-in/out points and the locations the VCR recognizes as those points.
- For any scene, the edit-out point must have a counter reading that is at least 1 second after the corresponding edit-in point. Any less than 1 second and the edit-out point will not be registered.
- Since the source VCR prerolls during Random Assemble Editing, there must be at least 15 seconds worth of recorded material prior to any edit-in point on the source tape.
- If the search time for an edit-in point exceeds 5 minutes, the recording deck enters its Stop mode and editing will not take place.

To Make Corrections . . .

... during step 7 or 8, you can cancel registered in and out points by pressing **CANCEL** on the remote control. Each time you press, the preceding point is erased.

 If, for example, you have registered 5 sets of in and out points and want to reset the first set, you have to press CANCEL until all points after the first set have been erased. Reenter them after you've repaired the first set of points.

Memory Capacity

Random Assemble Editing shares memory space with the VCR's timer. If there are programs occupied by timer-recording data, those spaces cannot be used to register edit-in and -out points meaning you won't be able to edit 8 scenes.





TV Multi-Brand Remote Control

The VCR's remote control can control several functions on JVC remote control TVs and on the brands of remote control TVs listed below. Some TV brands have more than one code. If the TV will not function with one code, try entering another.

SET TV BRAND CODE

Refer to the chart below. While holding down **POWER**, enter your TV's brand code using the **NUMBER** keys, then press **STOP**.

• Once you have set the remote control to operate the TV, you don't have to repeat this step until you replace your remote control's batteries.

OPERATE TV

First, press **POWER** on the remote to see if the TV's power goes off as it should. If it does, try other operations.

 The POWER, TV/VIDEO, CH▲▼, VOL +/- and NUMBER keys on the remote can all be used to operate the TV. *For some brands of TV, you must press ENTER after having pressed the NUMBER keys.
 To return the remote to VCR control, set the TV/VCR switch to VCR.

NOTE:

Depending on the kind of TV, there may be cases where some or all functions cannot be operated using the remote control.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Before requesting service for a problem, use this chart and see if you can repair the trouble yourself. Small problems are often easily corrected, and this can save you the trouble of sending your VCR off for repair.

ATTENTION:

This recorder contains microcomputers. External electronic noise or interference could cause malfunctioning. In such cases, switch the power off and unplug the power cord. Then plug it in again and switch power on. Take out the cassette. After checking the cassette, operate the unit as usual.

PLAYBACK

-	What happens if the end of the tape is reached during playback or search? The tape is automatically rewound to the beginning.
	Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the still mode? No. It stops automatically after 5 minutes to protect the heads.
-	During search, slow, still and frame-by-frame playback, I can't hear any audio. What's the problem? This is normal.
·	During search, still and frame-by-frame playback, the picture is intermittent. What's the cause? Picture loss occurs when these types of playback are attempted with a tape recorded in LP mode. Pressing PLAY to return to normal playback will restore the picture.
	When returning from multi-speed search to normal playback, the picture is disturbed. Should I be concerned about this? No, it is normal.
-	Noise bars appear during multi-speed search. What's the problem? This is normal.
-	Other than preventing further recording, what effect does removing the safety tab have? It disables marking of index codes.
-	Sometimes, during Index Search, the VCR can't find the program I want to see. Why not? There may be index codes too close together.
	During playback, on-screen operational indicators sometimes jitter. Why does this happen? If the condition of the tape being played back is not good, jittering of the video (including on-screen indicators) may occur.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

RECORDING

Q.	When I pause and then resume a recording, the end
	of the recording before the pause is overlapped by
	the new recording. Why does this happen?

A. This is normal. It reduces distortion at the pause and resume points.

- Q. Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the Record-Pause mode?
- **A.** No. The VCR automatically goes to its Stop mode after 5 minutes to protect the heads. When paused during Instant Timer Recording (ITR), the VCR shuts off automatically after 5 minutes.
- Q. What happens if the tape runs out during recording?
- **A.** The VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning.

TIMER RECORDING

- Q. REC and TIMER remain lit on the front display panel. Is there a problem?
- **A.** No. This is a normal condition for a timer recording in progress.
- Q. Can I program the timer while I'm watching a tape or a TV broadcast?
- **A.** You won't see the picture as it is replaced by the onscreen menu, but the audio from the program or tape you're viewing is present.
