




#### **Note to CATV system installer:**

#### **CAUTION:**

#### Failure to heed the following precautions may result in damage to the VCR, remote control or video cassette.

#### 1. DO NOT place the VCR . . .

- ... in an environment prone to extreme temperatures or humidity.
- ... in direct sunlight.
- ... in a dusty environment.
- ... in an environment where strong magnetic fields are generated.
- on a surface that is unstable or subject to vibration.
- 2. DO NOT block the VCR's ventilation openings.
- 3. DO NOT place heavy objects on the VCR or remote control.
- 4. **DO NOT** place anything which might spill on top of the VCR or remote control.
- 5. AVOID violent shocks to the VCR during transport.

#### \*\*MOISTURE CONDENSATION

Moisture in the air will condense on the VCR when you move it from a cold place to a warm place, or under extremely humid conditions—just as water droplets form on the surface of a glass filled with cold liquid. Moisture condensation on the head drum will cause damage to the tape. In conditions where condensation may occur, keep the VCR's power turned on for a few hours to let the moisture dry.

#### \*\*ABOUT HEAD CLEANING

Accumulation of dirt and other particles on the video heads may cause the playback picture to become blurred or interrupted. Be sure to contact your nearest JVC dealer if such

# IMPORTANT PRODUCT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Electrical energy can perform many useful functions. But improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. This product has been engineered and manufactured to assure your personal safety. In order not to defeat the built-in safeguards, observe the following basic rules for its installation, use and servicing.

#### **ATTENTION:**

Follow and obey all warnings and instructions marked on your product and its operating instructions. For your safety, please read all the safety and operating instructions before you operate this product and keep this booklet for future reference.

#### INSTALLATION

#### 1. Grounding or Polarization

- (A) Your product may be equipped with a polarized alternatingcurrent line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature.
  - If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- (B) Your product may be equipped with a 3-wire grounding-type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature.
  - If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

#### 2. Power Sources

Operate your product only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. If your product is intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

#### 3. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

#### 4. Power Cord Protection

Power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the product.

#### 5. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered.

- Do not block the openings by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface.
- Do not place the product in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.

#### 6. Wall or Ceiling Mounting

# ANTENNA INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding connectors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.


#### 2. Lightning

For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

#### 3. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

#### **USE**

#### 1. Accessories

To avoid personal injury:

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
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
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# Basic Connections





### CHECK CONTENTS

Make sure the package contains all of the accessories listed in "SPECIFICATIONS" ( pg. 40).

#### SITUATE VCR

Place the VCR on a stable, horizontal surface.

### CONNECT VCR TO TV

The connection method you use depends on the type of TV you have.

#### **RF Connection**

- To Connect To A TV With NO AV Input Terminals . . .
- **a** Disconnect the TV antenna from the TV.
- **b** Connect the TV antenna cable to the ANT IN jack on the rear of the VCR.
- c– Connect the supplied RF cable between the RF OUT jack on the rear of the VCR and the TV's antenna terminal.

#### **AV Connection**

- To Connect To A TV With AV Input Terminals . . .
- **a** Connect the antenna, VCR and TV as shown in the illustration.
- b– Connect an Audio/Video Cable (not supplied) between the AUDIO OUT and VIDEO OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR and the AV IN jacks on the TV.

# CONNECT VCR TO POWER SOURCE

Connect the power plug to an AC outlet.

• Perform Auto clock setting ( pg. 7).

# FINAL PREPARATION FOR

Select the VCR channel (3 or 4) by setting the switch on the rear of the VCR as shown in the illustration.

Turn on the power to the TV. You are now able to perform simple playback ( pg. 14) and recording ( pg. 15).

#### **NOTES:**


- The VCR channel is the channel on the TV which will display the audio and video signals from the VCR.
- The CH3–CH4 switch is preset to the CH3 position. Set to CH4 if CH3 is used for broadcasting in your area.
- If your TV has no AV input terminals, set the channel on the TV to correspond to the CH3–CH4 switch on the back of the VCR.
- Even if your TV has AV input terminals, you must connect it to the VCR using an RF cable in order to record one show while watching another ( pg. 24).



ATTENTION CABLE BOX SUBSCRIBERS

If you perform Auto or Semi-Auto clock setting procedures . . . Select the PBS channel on your cable box before

- plugging your cable box into the AC outlet. (If you have more than one PBS channel, you may have to select the PBS channel if Auto clock setting is not successful.)
- The cable box must be set to the PBS channel at clock adjustment times, or the adjustment will not take place.
- If you perform Auto clock setting successfully, D.S.T. will be set to "AUTO". In this case, once the D.S.T. adjustment time comes (F pg. 9), your cable box must be set to the PBS channel in your area or the adjustment will not take place. If this is not satisfactory, change the D.S.T. setting to "ON" or "OFF" (Semi-Auto procedure, step 6 or Manual procedure, step 3).

The time and date can be set automatically from additional clock setting data that is transmitted by one of the regular TV broadcast channels. We call this TV channel the "Host Channel" and it is a PBS channel in your area. With the antenna cable connected, your VCR can automatically set the clock when the power plug is first connected to an AC outlet.

The auto clock function scans all the channels received by your VCR to find the clock setting data of the Host Channel.

\*Don't turn the power on until the time (or "- - : - - ") appears on the front display panel.

Before the clock is set, AUTO appears on the display.

After setting, the current time appears (in hours and minutes).

The automatic clock setting function will normally set the clock correctly. However, if an incorrect time is displayed on the front display panel, you may be receiving the clock setting data of a PBS channel from an adjacent time zone, or an incorrect PBS channel from a cable TV system. In this case, perform the Semi-Auto (F pg. 9) or Manual (F pg. 10) clock setting procedure.

If "AUTO" remains in the display for more than 30 minutes, perform the Semi-Auto (F pg. 9) or Manual (F pg. 10) clock setting procedure. In the case of Semi-Auto, you have to set the Host Channel manually.

If "AUTO CLOCK SET" or "SEMI-AUTO CLOCK SET" is selected, the clock will be adjusted automatically by the Host PBS every hour on the hour (except for 11:00 PM, midnight, 1:00 AM and 2:00 AM) according to the incoming PBS channel clock setting data. (Automatic clock adjustments can only be received when the VCR's power is turned off.)

If "- - : - - " appears on the display, your antenna cable may not be connected to the VCR, there may not be a Host PBS signal available in your area, or your cable box may not be set to the PBS channel. If everything is connected and set correctly, perform the manual clock setting procedure (F pg. 10).

# **Preparation**

#### **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

#### **PLAYBACK**

- Q. What happens if the end of the tape is reached during playback or search? A. The tape is automatically rewound to the beginning. Q. Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the still mode? A. No. It stops automatically after 5 minutes to protect the heads. Q. During search, slow, still and frame-by-frame playback, I can't hear any audio. What's the problem? **A.** This is normal. Q. During search, still and frame-by-frame playback, the picture is intermittent. What's the cause? **A.** Picture loss occurs when these types of playback are attempted with a tape recorded in LP mode. Pressing PLAY to return to normal playback will restore the picture.
- Q. When returning from multi-speed search to normal playback, the picture is disturbed. Should I be concerned about this?
- **A.** No, it is normal.
- Q. Noise bars appear during multi-speed search. What's the problem?
- **A.** This is normal.
- Q. Other than preventing further recording, what effect does removing the safety tab have?
- **A.** It disables marking of index codes.
- Q. Sometimes, during Index Search, the VCR can't find the program I want to see. Why not?
- A. There may be index codes too close together.

#### **RECORDING**

- Q. When I pause and then resume a recording, the end of the recording before the pause is overlapped by the new recording. Why does this happen?
- **A.** This is normal. It reduces distortion at the pause and resume points.
- Q. Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the Record-Pause mode?
- **A.** No. The VCR shuts off automatically after 5 minutes to protect the heads.
- **Q.** What happens if the tape runs out during recording? **A.** The VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning.

#### **TIMER RECORDING**

- Q. REC and TIMER remain lit on the front display panel. Is there a problem?
- **A.** No. This is a normal condition for a timer recording in progress.
- Q. Can I program the timer while I'm watching a tape or a TV broadcast?
- A. You won't see the picture as it is replaced by the onscreen menu, but the audio from the program or tape you're viewing is present.

#### **ATTENTION:**

This recorder contains microcomputers. External electronic noise or interference could cause malfunctioning. In such cases, switch the power off and unplug the power cord. Then plug it in again and switch power on. Take out the cassette. After checking the cassette, operate the unit as usual.
