

#### Note to CATV system installer:

- ... in an environment prone to extreme temperatures or humidity.

- ... in a dusty environment.
- ... in an environment where strong magnetic fields are generated.
- on a surface that is unstable or subject to vibration.
- 2. DO NOT block the VCR's ventilation openings.
- 3. DO NOT place heavy objects on the VCR or remote control. 4. DO NOT place anything which might spill on top of the VCR or remote control.
- 5. AVOID violent shocks to the VCR during transport.

#### **\*\*MOISTURE CONDENSATION**

Moisture in the air will condense on the VCR when you move it from a cold place to a warm place, or under extremely humid conditions-just as water droplets form on the surface of a glass filled with cold liquid. Moisture condensation on the head drum will cause damage to the tape. In conditions where condensation may occur, keep the VCR's power turned on for a few hours to let the moisture dry.

#### **\*\*ABOUT HEAD CLEANING**

Accumulation of dirt and other particles on the video heads may cause the playback picture to become blurred or interrupted. Be sure to contact your nearest JVC dealer if such troubles occur.

## IMPORTANT PRODUCT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Electrical energy can perform many useful functions. But improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. This product has been engineered and manufactured to assure your personal safety. In order not to defeat the built-in safeguards, observe the following basic rules for its installation, use and servicing.

#### ATTENTION:

Follow and obey all warnings and instructions marked on your product and its operating instructions. For your safety, please read all the safety and operating instructions before you operate this product and keep this booklet for future reference.

#### INSTALLATION

#### 1. Grounding or Polarization

(A) Your product may be equipped with a polarized alternatingcurrent line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature.

If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

(B) Your product may be equipped with a 3-wire grounding-type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature.

If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

#### 2. Power Sources

Operate your product only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. If your product is intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

#### 3. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

#### 4. Power Cord Protection

Power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the product.

#### 5. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered.

- Do not block the openings by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface.
- Do not place the product in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.

#### 6. Wall or Ceiling Mounting

The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.

#### ANTENNA INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding connectors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.


#### 2. Lightning

For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

#### 3. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

#### USE

#### 1. Accessories

To avoid personal injury:



You are now able to perform simple playback (IFF pg. 22) and recording (IFF pg. 23). (If 'Auto' is displayed on the front display panel, the clock is being set automatically. Wait for the time to be displayed before powering on the VCR.) <b>NOTEES</b> • The VCR channel is the channel on the TV which will display the audio and video signals from the VCR. The VCR's CH3- CH4 switch sets the VCR channel to CH3 or CH4. • The CH3-CH4 switch is preset to the CH3 position. set to CH4 if CH3 is used for broadcasting in your area. • If your TV has no AV input terminals, set the channel on the TV to correspond to the CH3-CH4 switch on the back of the VCR.

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### INITIAL SETTINGS

## **Dual Quick Set**



#### **IMPORTANT**

- Don't press any buttons on the VCR or remote during Dual Quick Set.
- If you perform Dual Quick Set successfully, there's no need to perform the Clock (IF pg. 8) and Tuner (IF pg. 12) procedures. If, however, you want to add or delete channels, refer to "Add Or Delete A Channel" on page 14.

#### ATTENTION CABLE BOX SUBSCRIBERS

If you perform the Dual Quick Set procedure .

- Select the PBS channel on your cable box before plugging your VCR's power plug into the AC outlet. (If you have more than one PBS channel, you may have to select an alternative PBS channel if Dual Quick Set is not successful.)
- If there is no PBS channel in your area, perform the Manual Clock Set procedure (137 pg. 11).
- For automatic clock adjustment to take place the VCR's power must be off and the cable box must be set to the PBS channel at clock adjustment times
- If you perform Dual Quick Set successfully, D.S.T. will be set to "AUTO". At the D.S.T. adjustment time (IF pg. 10), your VCR's power must be off and your cable box must be set to the host PBS channel in your area for the D.S.T. adjustment to take place. If the clock is not set correctly, change the D.S.T. setting to "ON" or "OFF. See step 6 of Semi-Auto procedure (r pg. 9) or step 3 of Manual procedure (🖙 pg. 11).

With the antenna cable connected the Dual Quick Set function allows the clock and tuner to be set automatically when the power plug is first connected to an AC outlet.

The time and date can be set automatically from clock setting data that is transmitted by one of the regular TV broadcast channels. We call this TV channel the "Host Channel" and it is a PBS channel in your area.

The auto clock set function scans all the channels received by your VCR to find the clock setting data of the Host Channel.

The auto channel set function scans all the channels received by your VCR, then automatically assigns receivable channels to the CH▲▼ buttons, and skips non-receivable channels.



VCR. Then connect the VCR's power plug to an AC outlet. For connection configuration, refer to "Basic Connections" (E pg. 6). The clock and tuner channels will automatically be set.

- Auto clock set is performed first. AUTO is displayed on the Front Display Panel during Auto clock set. Auto Channel set is performed next. The channel numbers are displayed in ascending order during auto channel set. When Dual Quick Set has been completed successfully the correct time is displayed.
- The clock can be adjusted automatically by the Host PBS every hour on the hour (except for 11:00 PM, midnight, 1:00 AM and 2:00 AM) by the incoming PBS channel clock setting data. (This automatic clock adjustment can only be performed when the VCR's power is turned off.)
- If an incorrect time is displayed on the front display panel, you may be receiving the clock setting data of a PBS channel from an adjacent time zone, or an incorrect PBS channel from a cable TV system. In this case, perform the Semi-Auto procedure (IF pg. 9). Auto channel set (IF pg. 12) has already taken place and it need not be set again.
- If "- -:- -" appears on the display, your antenna cable may not be connected to the VCR, there may not be a Host PBS signal available in your area, or your cable box may not be set to the PBS channel. If everything is connected and set correctly, perform the Manual Clock Set procedure (Er pg. 11). Auto channel set has not yet taken place, so please also perform the "Set Receivable Channels" procedure ( pg. 12).

## VCR Plus+ Setup



The VCR Plus+ timer programming system eliminates the need to input channel, date, start and stop time data when setting the timer record function. Simply key in the PlusCode number for the TV program you wish to record (found in most TV listings) and the VCR's timer is automatically programmed.

Depending on the TV or cable stations that you receive and the channel numbers that they are received on in your area, you may have to make certain changes in your VCR's "Guide Channel Set" menu to get proper results. Please read the following information carefully to find out which tasks you need to perform.

Before VCR Plus+ setup you must have performed the following procedures:

Clock setting (IF pg. 8)

Tuner setting (IF pg. 12)
Tuner and cable box setting if you receive your TV channels through a cable box (CF pg. 15)

#### **Channel Number Matching**

Most TV listings have a chart indicating the "Guide Channel" number assigned to each station for purposes of VCR Plus+ programming. Check the chart in your TV listings and see if the Guide Channel numbers listed for the stations you receive are the same as the channel number on which each is received by your VCR or cable box.

#### \*\*SPECIAL NOTES FOR CABLE SUBSCRIBERS\*\*

- In many instances, cable TV stations have VCR Plus+ Guide Channel numbers that **DO NOT** match the number of the channel on which you receive the station. Check your TV listings, or contact your cable supplier for details.
- Many normal broadcast TV stations can be viewed on cable. Check your TV listing, or contact your cable supplier for details.

If the numbers match, go directly to "VCR Plus+ Timer Programming" (🖙 pg. 37).

If the numbers are different, and you want to be able to timer record programs from those stations, you have to inform the VCR of the mismatch. Go to step 1. If timer recording on those stations is not important to you, you can go directly to "VCR Plus+ Timer Programming" (🖙 pg. 37).

The Next Function Memory "tells" the VCR what to do after rewinding. \* Before continuing, ensure that the VCR is in stop mode.

- a- For Automatic Start Of Playback After Tape Rewind . . .
- ... press REW, then press PLAY within 2 seconds.
- **b** For Automatic Power Off After Tape Rewind . .
- ... press **REW**, then press **POWER** within 2 seconds.
- **c** For Automatic Timer Standby After Tape Rewind ...
- ... press **REW**, then press **TIMER** within 2 seconds.

### NOTE:

### Cable Box Multi-Brand Remote Control

The VCR's remote control can control functions on the brands of cable boxes listed below. Some cable box brands have more than one code. If your cable box does not function with a specified code, try other codes.




First, press **POWER** to see if the cable box's power goes off as it should. If it does, try other functions (**CH** $\triangleleft$ **v** and the **NUMBER** keys can be used to operate the cable box).

- For some brands of cable box, you must press **ENTER** after having pressed the **NUMBER** keys.
- To return the remote to VCR control, set the TV/ CABLE/VCR switch to VCR.


### **NOTES:**

- You must set the cable box brand for your remote control and the cable box brand for your Cable Box Controller ( pg. 17) individually. Cable box brands available for the remote control differ from those available for the Cable Box Controller.

### **Control Two JVC VCRs**

The supplied remote control is capable of controlling two JVC VCRs independently using the **A/B CODE** switch. You can set this VCR so it responds to remote commands only when the switch is set to **B**, and another VCR so it responds to commands when the switch is set to **A**. The switch is preset to **A** because this VCR normally responds to A-code signals. You can easily modify this VCR to accept B-code commands.



### The VCR will now respond only to B-code commands.

## Child Lock

This feature allows you to prevent the operation of the VCR.



### ENGAGE CHILD LOCK

Press and hold **POWER** on the remote control until the Child Lock indicator ("—") appears on the front display panel.

• To cancel Child Lock, press and hold **POWER** on the remote to turn the VCR on. During timer recording, pressing **TIMER** also cancels Child Lock.

### **NOTES:**

- When Child Lock is engaged, make sure to keep the remote control out of the reach of children.
- Timer recording can be performed while Child Lock is engaged. The feature remains in effect after the recording is finished.

Q.	What happens if the end of the tape is reached during playback or search?	(
<b>A.</b>	The tape is automatically rewound to the beginning.	A
	<b>Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the still mode?</b> No. It stops automatically after 5 minutes to protect the heads.	
-	During search, slow, still and frame-by-frame playback, I can't hear any audio. What's the problem? This is normal.	
•	During search, still and frame-by-frame playback, the picture is intermittent. What's the cause? Picture loss occurs when these types of playback are attempted with a tape recorded in LP mode. Pressing <b>PLAY</b> to return to normal playback will restore the picture.	
-	When returning from multi-speed search to normal playback, the picture is disturbed. Should I be concerned about this? No, it is normal.	(
	Noise bars appear during multi-speed search. What's the problem? This is normal.	
-	Other than preventing further recording, what effect does removing the safety tab have? It disables marking of index codes.	
-	Sometimes, during Index Search, the VCR can't find the program I want to see. Why not? There may be index codes too close together.	
Q. A.	During playback, on-screen operational indicators sometimes jitter. Why does this happen? If the condition of the tape being played back is not good, jittering of the video (including on-screen indicators) may occur.	

### RECORDING

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-	When I pause and then resume a recording, the end of the recording before the pause is overlapped by the new recording. Why does this happen? This is normal. It reduces distortion at the pause and resume points.
-	<b>Can the VCR indefinitely remain in the Record-Pause</b> <b>mode?</b> No. The VCR automatically goes to its Stop mode after 5 minutes to protect the heads. When paused during Instant Timer Recording (ITR), the VCR shuts off automatically after 5 minutes.
A.	What happens if the tape runs out during recording? The VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning. MER RECORDING
	<b>REC and TIMER remain lit on the front display panel.</b> <b>Is there a problem?</b> No. This is a normal condition for a timer recording in progress.
-	Can I program the timer while I'm watching a tape or a TV broadcast? You won't see the picture as it is replaced by the on- screen menu, but the audio from the program or tape you're viewing is present.
