About this instruction manual

This instruction manual basically explains operations as follows:



Notes on handling

Important cautions

Installation of the unit

- Select a place which is level, dry and neither too hot nor too cold (between 5°C and 35°C, 41°F and 95°F).
- Leave sufficient distance between the unit and the TV.
- Do not use the player in a place subject to vibrations.

Power cord

- Do not handle the power cord with wet hands!
- A small amount of power (2.7 W) is always consumed while the power cord is connected to the wall outlet.
- When unplugging the player from the wall outlet, always pull the plug, not the power cord.

To prevent malfunction of the unit

- There are no user-serviceable parts inside. If anything goes wrong, unplug the power cord and consult your dealer.
- Do not insert any metallic object into the unit.
- Do not use any non-standard shape disc available on the market, because it may damage the unit.
- Do not use a disc with tape, seals, or paste on it, because damage to the unit may result.

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



Remote control unit



1) OPEN/CLOSE button (23)

Opens and closes the disc tray.

2 PLAY MODE button (29, 33, 34, 35)

Displays a play mode menu for controlling the advanced playback functions.

3 3D PHONIC button (39)

Produces a simulated surround effect.

4 Numeric buttons (11)

When the TV - DVD switch is set to DVD, these buttons are used to specify a title, chapter or track number, as well as used to enter a time for the Time search function.

When the TV - DVD switch is set to TV, these buttons are used to select a TV channel as well as mute the TV audio.

(5) ANGLE button (36, 37)

Changes camera angles during playback of a DVD VIDEO disc containing multiple camera angles.

6 SUBTITLE button (37)

Used to display the subtitle selection display on the TV screen, as well as used to turn the subtitle on or off (for DVD VIDEO).

7 DIGEST button (30)

(13) CHOICE button (42)

Displays the preference on-screen display on the TV screen.

(4) Infrared signal-emitting window

Point this window toward the remote sensor on the front panel when pressing buttons.

(5) TV STANDBY/ON O/I button (21)

Turns the television on or off (standby).

16 TV - DVD switch (11, 21, 27)

When setting this switch to "TV", the numeric, cursor and TV/VIDEO - CANCEL buttons are used to control your TV. When setting it to "DVD", these buttons are used to control the unit.

① DVD STANDBY/ON ७/I button (23)

Turns the unit on or off (standby).

(18) RETURN button (28)

Returns to the previous menu (for DVD VIDEO/Video CD).

(9 TV/VIDEO - CANCEL button (21, 33)

When the TV - DVD switch is set to TV, this button switches the TV input between TV and VIDEO.





① AUDIO OUT jacks (14, 16)

Outputs the multichannel signals of a DVD VIDEO disc recorded by the Dolby Digital or MPEG Multichannel surround format.

The FRONT jacks also output stereo analog audio signals when playing back a stereo audio source.

2 VIDEO OUT - VIDEO iack (14)

Outputs a composite video signal.

Note that, to use this jack, the Y/C - COMP, switch must be set to "COMP."

3 Y/C - COMP. switch (14, 15)

This selector must be set correctly according to the video signal type to be used. If you used any signal from the VIDEO OUT - VIDEO jack, or composite or RGB signal port in the VIDEO OUT - AV connector, set it to "COMP." If you use the VIDEO OUT - S-VIDEO jack or Y/C signal port in the VIDEO OUT - AV connector, set it to "Y/C".

(4) VIDEO OUT - AV connector (15)

This standard 21-pin SCART connector outputs video and audio signals. It handles the composite, Y/C (S-video) and RGB video signals. The Y/C - COMP. switch must be set correctly according to the video signal used. Note that to make this connector feed RGB signals, you must change the unit's setting. (see "How to make the unit feed the RGB signals" on page 15 for details),

5 Region code label (12)

Shows region code number.

6 DIGITAL OUT jacks (OPTICAL/COAXIAL) (18)

Outputs digital audio signals. You must select the signal type correctly according to the external device connected to via the Preference display.

⑦ VIDEO OUT - S-VIDEO jack (14)

Outputs an S-video signal.

Note that, to use this jack, the Y/C - COMP switch must be set to "Y/C".

Also, this jack does not feed correct signals when you make the unit feed the RGB signals. See "How to make the unit feed RGB signals" on page 15 for details.

8 AV COMPU LINK jacks

These jacks are provided for use in the future. They are currently not used.

Operational Principles

On-screen displays

The unit provides several on-screen displays. With some displays, you can set or select preferences or functions, while the others are display-only.

Opening displays

The Opening display appears automatically in some conditions.

At the bottom, the following information are indicated depending on the unit's status.

- NOW READING: The unit is now reading the disc information (TOC).
- REGION CODE ERROR!: The DVD VIDEO disc loaded cannot be played because the region code of the disc does not match the unit.
- OPEN: The disc tray is now opening.
- CLOSE: The disc tray is now closing.

Preference displays

When no disk is inserted or when a DVD VIDEO or Video CD disc is inserted and stopped, pressing the CHOICE button brings up the preference display for setting the preferences.

There are four pages: LANGUAGE, AUDIO, DISPLAY and SYSTEM as shown on the right.

In addition, there is the EXPERT SPEAKER SETTING subpage that can be accessed from the AUDIO page in a certain condition.





To prevent the monitor from burning out [SCREEN SAVER]

A television monitor screen may be burned out if a static picture is displayed for a long time. To prevent this, the unit automatically activates the screen saver function if a static picture, such as an on-screen display or menu, is displayed for over 5 minutes.

- Pressing any button on the unit or the remote control unit will release the screen saver function and return to the previous display.
- You can select one of several screen saver modes available (see page 45).
- The screen saver function is not activated during Audio CD playback or after stopping Audio CD playback.

About invalid operation icon

When you press a button, if the unit does not accept its operation, \bigcirc appears on your television screen. Operations are occasionally unacceptable even if \bigcirc is not displayed.


Note that some operations may not be accepted. For example, some discs may not allow rapid advance/reverse or slow-motion playback.

How to use numeric buttons



The function of the numeric buttons differs depending on the setting of the TV - DVD switch. When setting it to TV, the buttons are used to select a TV channel (see page 21). When setting it to DVD, the buttons are used to select a track/title or enter a disc time or chapter number.

The DVD VIDEO Logo is a trademark.

- CD-R and CD-RW discs recorded with the Audio CD format can be played back, though some may not be played back because of the disc characteristics or recording condition.
- DVD VIDEO players and DVD VIDEO discs have their own Region Code numbers. This unit only can play back DVD VIDEO discs whose Region Code numbers include "2."

This unit accommodates discs recorded with the PAL system.

Non-playable discs



- Playing back discs listed as "Non-playable discs" above may generate noise and damage speakers.
- This unit can play back audio recorded in CD-G, CD-EXTRA and CD-TEXT discs.

Disc structure

A DVD VIDEO disc is comprised of "titles," while an Audio CD, Video CD is comprised of "tracks". Each title may be divided into some "chapters". For example, if a DVD VIDEO disc contains some movies, each movie may have its own title number, and each movie may be divided into some chapters. In a DVD VIDEO KARAOKE disc, each song usually has its own title number and does not have chapters. In general, each title has independent content, while each chapter in the same title has continuity.


- *In the following description, "TV" may be substituted with "monitor" or "projector."
- *Before using the unit, you have to connect the unit to a TV and/or amplifier.

Before making any connections

- Do not connect the AC power cord until all other connections have been made.
- Since different components often have different terminal names, carefully read the instructions supplied with the component you are going to connect.

To connect to a TV

You can enjoy using the unit by simply connecting it to a TV. To improve audio sound quality, connect the audio outputs to your separate audio equipment. (See the following pages.)



Connect the unit to a TV equipped with stereo audio input and video input jacks using the supplied audio/video cables.

- If your TV has a monaural audio input instead of stereo, you need to use an optional audio cable which converts stereo audio output to monaural.
- If your TV has an S-video input, you can get better picture quality by connecting it with the S-VIDEO output of the unit using the S-video cable in addition to the (standard) video connection. Note that, to use the VIDEO jacks, the Y/C COMP. switch must be set to "COMP." and to use the S-VIDEO jacks, the Y/C COMP. switch must be set to "Y/C."


NOTES

- Connect VIDEO OUT jacks of the unit directly to the video input of your TV. Connecting VIDEO OUT jacks of the unit to a TV via a VCR may cause a monitor problem when playing back a copy-protected disc.
- Connect the unit to a PAL or Multi-scan TV. Do not connect the unit to an NTSC TV.
- When making the audio connection using the FRONT (LEFT and RIGHT) jacks, set "DOWN MIX" on the "AUDIO" page of the preference display to "Lo/Ro" and the "SPEAKER SETTING" to "2 CHANNEL" (see pages 44 and 45).

To connect to a TV with the SCART connector

English

You can enjoy using the unit by simply connecting it to your television set with a 21-pin SCART cable. To hear audio sound with better quality, connect the audio output to your audio equipment.



Set the Y/C - COMP. switch correctly according to your TV.

- If the TV only accommodates the composite video signal, set the switch to "COMP."
- If the TV accommodates the Y/C signals, set the switch to "Y/C" so that you can enjoy better-quality pictures.
- If the TV accommodates the RGB signals, set the switch to "COMP.", as well as make the unit feed the RGB signals by following the procedure shown below.


How to make the unit feed the RGB signals

The unit cannot output the RGB signals from the SCART connector and the S-video (Y/C) signals from the S-VIDEO jack simultaneously.

In the initial (factory-preset) condition, the S-VIDEO jack is active, while the RGB signals cannot be output.

To make the unit feed the RGB signals, follow the procedure below. Note that the S-VIDEO jack does not feed correct signals when the unit is set to output the RGB signals.

- When the unit is turned on
- 1 Set the Y/C COMP. switch to "COMP.".
- **2** Press and hold down the (STOP) button on the front panel when no disc is inserted or while the unit is stopped. "S-VIDEO" appears in the display window after a few seconds.




3 Keep holding down the ■ (STOP) button on the front panel.

After a few more seconds, "RGB" replaces "S-VIDEO" in the display window.

Now the RGB signal can be output when setting the Y/C - COMP. switch to "COMP."



- Connect the unit for a PAL or Multi-scan TV. Do not connect the unit to an NTSC TV.
- When making the audio connection using the AV connector, set "DOWN MIX" on the "AUDIO" page of the preference display to "Lo/Ro" and the "SPEAKER SETTING" to "2 CHANNEL" (see pages 44 and 45).

To connect to an audio amplifier or receiver

You can enjoy high-quality audio by connecting the unit's audio output to your amplifier or receiver.



 Connect the unit's AUDIO OUT (FRONT LEFT/RIGHT) to any line-level inputs (such as AUX, DVD, CD, etc.) of an audio amplifier or receiver.

NOTE


• When making the audio connection using the FRONT (LEFT and RIGHT) jacks for stereo use, set "DOWN MIX" on the "AUDIO" page of the preference display to "Lo/Ro" and the "SPEAKER SETTING" to "2 CHANNEL" (see pages 44 and 45).

To connect to an amplifier/receiver equipped with 5.1-channel inputs

English

The unit is equipped with the Dolby Digital and MPEG Multichannel decoders and can feed 5.1-channel outputs. So you can enjoy any type of the high quality surround sounds by connecting the unit to an amplifier/receiver equipped with the 5.1-channel inputs.

Connect the unit's AUDIO OUT jacks to the analog 5.1-channel inputs of an amplifier or receiver using the supplied audio cables.



• Be sure to connect correctly between corresponding terminals. The order of the 5.1-channel terminals depends on units.


NOTES

- The DTS surround signals are output only from the DIGITAL OUT jacks.
- When using the 5.1-channel outputs of the unit, set "DOWN MIX" to "OFF" and "SPEAKER SETTING" to "5.1 CHANNEL" or
 "EXPERT" on the "AUDIO" page of the "PREFERENCE" display. If "EXPERT" is selected, you can adjust the audio output
 balance of the speakers using the "EXPERT SPEAKER SETTING" display (see page 47).

To connect to audio equipment with a digital input

You can enhance the sound quality by connecting either of the unit's DIGITAL OUT jacks (OPTICAL or COAXIAL) to the digital input of an amplifier, MD, etc. by using an optional digital cable. The digital audio signal from a disc is directly transferred. If you connect the unit to a Dolby Digital, DTS or MPEG Multichannel decoder or an amplifier with a built-in decoder by using an optional digital cable, you can enjoy high-quality surround sound.

When you make the digital connection, we recommend also to make the analog connection, because, depending on discs, no signal may be output from the DIGITAL OUT.



NOTES

- When you connect the unit's DIGITAL OUT to digital audio equipment, before using, make the "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" setting on the "AUDIO" page of the preference display correctly according to the connected audio equipment. If the "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" is not set correctly, loud noise may be generated from speakers, causing damage to your speakers. See "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" on page 43.
- When you connect the unit's DIGITAL OUT to a Dolby Digital or DTS decoder (or the amplifier with a built-in decoder), the unit's
 "COMPRESSION" setting and "SPEAKER SETTING" on the "AUDIO" page of the preference display are invalid. Make
 appropriate surround audio settings within the decoder.

To connect the power cord

English

When all the audio/video connections have been made, insert the smaller plug of the supplied AC power cord to the unit's \sim AC IN connector, then insert the other end to the wall outlet. Make sure that plugs are inserted firmly. The STANDBY indicator lights and setup is completed.



Warning

- Disconnect the power cord if you are not going to use the unit for a long time.
- Disconnect the power cord before cleaning the unit.
- Disconnect the power cord before moving the unit.
- Do not connect or disconnect the power cord with wet hands.
- Do not pull the power cord when disconnecting it, as this may damage the cord and cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.



Caution

- Do not damage, alter, twist, or pull the power cord, as this may cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.
- To prevent any accidents or damages caused by an unsuitable AC power cord, only use the supplied power cord. If the cord is damaged, contact a dealer and get the new power cord.
- Do not put anything heavy, or the unit, on the power cord, as this may cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.

Using the remote control unit

Using the remote control, you can operate not only all the functions of the unit but also basic functions of your TV.


To install batteries in the remote control unit

The battery compartment is located on the back of the remote control unit.


1 Press down on the point shown by the arrow at the top of the compartment cover, and pull up the cover to open the compartment.



2 Place the two accessory R6P (SUM-3)/AA(15F) batteries in the remote control according to the polarity markings ("+" and "-") inside the compartment and on the batteries.



3 Place the cover over the compartment, and press down lightly.



The batteries will last about six months with normal use. If the functions of the remote control become erratic, replace
the batteries. See page 20 for more information.

Precautions for the safe use of batteries

Observe the following precautions for the safe use of batteries. If they are used improperly their life will be shortened, they may burst or their contents may leak.


Precaution

- · Remove the batteries from the remote control if it is not going to be used for a long period of time.
- · Remove dead batteries and dispose of them properly.
- . Never leave dead batteries lying around, take them apart, mix them with other refuse, or throw them into an incinerator.
- . Never touch liquid that has leaked out of a battery.
- . Do not mix new and old batteries, or batteries of different types, when replacing them.

Remote sensor

• Operate the remote control unit while pointing it toward the remote sensor on the unit.

The remote control unit can be used within a range of about 5 meters from the remote sensor. If you operate the remote control unit from a diagonal position, controllable distance may be shorter.



NOTE


• If the remote sensor on the unit is exposed to the sunshine or strong light, you may not be able to control the unit from the remote control unit.

To use the remote control unit for TV operation

English

You can operate your TV from the remote control unit.

Setting the remote control signal for operating your TV.



1 Holding down TV/VIDEO - CANCEL, enter the manufacturer code of your TV listed below by using the numeric buttons (0 to 9).

Do not release TV/VIDEO - CANCEL. Keep holding it until the next step is completed.

Example:

To enter the manufacturer code "01": Press "0" then "1."

- 2 Press while holding down TV/VIDEO CANCEL.
- **3** Try to operate your TV by pressing TV STANDBY/ON \circlearrowleft I. If your TV turns on or off, you have successfully set the control signal.

The following buttons can be used for operating the TV: To use the CURSOR (CH-, CH+, VOL-, VOL+), TV/VIDEO - CANCEL and numeric buttons for TV control, set the TV - DVD switch to "TV".


Basic operations


In the following description, the buttons on the remote control unit are mainly used, however, you may use the corresponding buttons on the front panel of the unit if available.

English

Turning on/off the unit

Press DVD STANDBY/ON \circlearrowleft /| on the remote control unit or press STANDBY/ON \circlearrowleft /| on the front panel.





- You can turn on the unit by pressing the button. In this case, the unit starts playback if the disc is set in the disc tray.
- If no disc is set, "NO DISC" appears on the display window.
- You can turn on the unit by pressing the ≜ (OPEN/CLOSE) button on the front panel. In this case, the disc tray opens.


NOTE

• Even if you press the DVD STANDBY/ON $\bigcirc/|$ or STANDBY/ON $\bigcirc/|$ button to turn off the unit, the unit is not disconnected from the AC power source as long as it is connected to the wall outlet. This state is called the standby mode. In this state, the unit consumes a very small amount of power.

Inserting and removing discs

1 Press \triangle (OPEN/CLOSE) to open the disc tray.

2 Place the disc in the tray.



3 Press **△** (OPEN/CLOSE) to close the disc tray.




• If you press ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) during playback, the unit stops playback and opens the tray.

NOTES

- The unit can playback DVD VIDEO, Audio CD, and Video CD discs only. Do not load non-playable disc. For details about playable and non-playable disc types, see page 12.
- When loading a disc in the tray, be sure to position the disc inside the recess. Otherwise, the disc may be damaged when the tray is closed, or the disc may not be removed from the unit.
- Some DVD VIDEO discs may start playback automatically after loaded.
- If you load a DVD VIDEO disc whose region code does not match the unit, "REGION CODE ERROR!" is shown on the DVD opening display. For details about the region code, see page 12.

Basic playback

Now you can play a disc. First, let's enjoy simple playback according to following procedure.



To start playback







Press ►.

The unit starts playback from the biginning.

NOTES

- When the resume point is memorized, pressing ➤ starts playback from that point instead of the beginning. See page 26 and 46.
- During playback, the display window shows the disc number or the title/chapter or track number being played.
- With Video CD discs with PBC control or some DVD discs, the menu display may appear on the TV screen after starting play-back. In such a case, select an item to be played back from the menu.
 For operation using a menu, see page 27.
- Some DVD discs may starts playback automatically after loaded.

To stop playback completely









Press ■.

The unit stops playback.



To stop playback temporarily







Press II.

The unit pauses playback. To resume playback, press ▶.

To advance or reverse playback rapidly while monitoring







During playback

From the Remote control unit

Press **◄** or **▶** .

Each press of \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright increases the playback speed. You can select the speed among 2x, 5x, 10x, 20x and 60x the normal speed.

Pressing ► returns the unit to normal playback.

From the Front panel

Hold down I◀◀ or ▶►I.

Holding down ►►I advances playback rapidly, while holding down I◄◄ reverses playback rapidly. The speed will change from 5x to 20x the normal speed if you keep holding down the button for a certain period of time. Releasing the button returns the unit to normal playback.

To locate the beginning of the scene or song







During playback

Press I◄◀ or ▶►I.

Press ► to locate the beginning of the current chapter, title, or track, and press ► to locate the beginning of the next chapter, title, or track.

NOTE

When you play a Video CD disc with the PBC function or a DVD VIDEO disc, the unit may locate a different place, but it will
generally locate the beginning of the title or chapter or track.

Resuming playback

The unit can memorize the position on a disc where you interrupt playback, and resume playback from that position later ►.

To memorize the interrupted position





- **1** Set the "RESUME" setting on the "SYSTEM" page of the preference display to "ON". (See page 46 for details about how to set.)
- 2 At the position you want to interrupt playback, press ■, or press DVD STANDBY/ON ७/I on the remote control or STANDBY/ON ७/I on the front panel.

The unit memorizes the interrupted position.



If you interrupt playback by pressing ■ in step 2 above and then turn off the power, the memory is not cleared.

To resume playback





• While the disc you interrupt playback last time is still in the disc tray.

Press ►.

The unit starts playback from the position where you interrupted playback last time.

To clear the resume position memory

Carry out one of the followings.

*Take out the disc from the tray.

*Press ■ while stopped.

*Turn on the unit by pressing DVD STANDBY/ON 0/1 (on the remote control) or STANDBY/ON 0/1 (on the front panel).

NOTES

- The resume function does not work with Audio CD discs.
- The resume function does not work if "RESUME" on the "SYSTEM" page of the preference display is set to "OFF".
- In the case of a Video CD disc with PBC function, the unit may resume playback from a point slightly earlier than the resume point you stored.
- The resume function does not work in the program or random mode.

Advanced operations

When controlling the unit using the CURSOR ▲/▼/◄/▶, TV/VIDEO - CANCEL or numeric buttons, make sure that the TV - DVD switch is set to "DVD".




When it is set to "TV", these buttons are used to control a TV.

Playing from a specific position on a disc

You can play a disc from the selected track, title or chapter, or from the specified time.

To locate a desired scene from the DVD menu

DVD VIDEO discs generally have their own menus which show the disc contents. These menus contain various items such as titles of a movie, names of songs, or artist information, and display them on the TV screen. You can locate a desired scene by using the menu.




- Whenever a DVD VIDEO disc is loaded
 - **1** Press TITLE or MENU.

The menu appears on the TV screen.



About menu

Normally, a DVD VIDEO disc which contains more than one title may have a "title" menu which lists the titles. In this case, the menu appears on the TV screen by pressing the TITLE button. Some DVD VIDEO discs may also have a different menu which appears by pressing the MENU button.



See the instructions of each DVD VIDEO disc for its particular menu.

2 Use CURSOR ▲/▼/◄/► to select a desired item, then press ENTER.

The unit starts playback of the selected item.



 With some discs, you can also select items by entering the corresponding number using the numeric buttons, which may cause the unit to automatically start playback.





A disc menu appears on the TV screen (The PBC function is activated).

The unit starts playback of the selected item. You can return to the menu by pressing the RETURN button.

When "NEXT" or "PREVIOUS" appears on the TV screen, the unit generally works as follows:



Up to 18 titles or tracks can be programmed. You may select the same title or track more than once.



The programmed title/track number is shown under each program number.

• If you specify a wrong selection

Press TV/VIDEO - CANCEL button. The last selection programmed is erased.

To clear the program

Press ■.

4 Press **►** to start program play.

When all of the programmed titles/tracks have finished playback, the unit stops but the program remains.

NOTES

- Some DVD VIDEO discs may not be played back correctly in program mode.
- During program playback, pressing ►►I skip to the next selection of the program. Pressing I◄◄ returns to the beginning of the current selection, however, you cannot skip back to the previous selection.
- By pressing PLAY MODE during program playback, the program table is displayed on the TV screen and the current program number is indicated in yellow.

To quit program playback

Press ■ while stopped.

The "PROGRAM" indicator in the display window turns off.

Note that the program remains.



To playback in random order [RANDOM] PVD Audio Video CD


You can play titles or tracks in random order by using the Random function.



- While stopped
 - **1** Press PLAY MODE.

The play mode menu appears on the TV screen.

2 Use CURSOR $\blacktriangleleft / \triangleright$ to move \bowtie to [RANDOM].

The "RANDOM" indicator appears in the display window on the front panel.

The unit starts random playback. After playing all titles/tracks of all the discs, random playback ends.



- The same title or track will not be played back more than once during random play.
- To stop/quit random playback in the middle

Press ■ to stop playback. The unit is still in random playback mode, so pressing ► starts random playback again.

To quit random playback, press ■ again while stopped. The "RANDOM" indicator in the display window turns off.



* When you play a DVD VIDEO disc recorded in Dolby Digital which contains more than 3 channels, ACTION is not available.

NOTES

- The 3D PHONIC display will automatically disappear if you do not change the 3D PHONIC for 5 seconds.
- To turn off the 3D PHONIC display manually, press ENTER.
- With a Video CD disc, if the Audio setting is set to L or R, you cannot activate the 3D PHONIC function (i.e. the 3D PHONIC mode is fixed to OFF).

Conversely, when the 3D PHONIC function is active, changing the AUDIO setting to L or R from STEREO cancels the 3D PHONIC function.

- The 3D PHONIC function works correctly when playing back discs recorded in the Dolby Surround or Dolby Digital 5.1-CH format.
 - It also works when playing back discs other than those above, but does not provide the correct effect.
- The 3D PHONIC function does not affect the DTS or Dolby Digital bitstream signal from the DIGITAL OUT jack.
- The sound effect will not be set or operate, even if 3D PHONIC is pressed, for the sound of DVD VIDEO discs recorded in Linear PCM.
- When you set the 3D PHONIC function to on, the DOWN MIX and COMPRESSION settings on the AUDIO page of the preference display are disabled.




* With some DVD VIDEO discs that are not fully copyprotected, a 20 or 24 bit digital signal may be output.

NOTES

- The unit does not provide the DTS decoding function.
- When playing a DVD VIDEO or Audio CD disc with DTS, use a DTS decoder to get correct signals from your speakers. Never use the unit's analog output jacks, which output incorrect signals that may damage your speakers.
- If you connect the analog outputs and digital outputs simultaneously, be sure to select the source of the amplifier correctly, or set the level control of the amplifier connected to the analog outputs to minimum.

DOWN MIX

To playback a DVD VIDEO disc recorded with surround multichannel audio correctly, the DOWN MIX setting must be properly made according to your audio system. Note that this



setting affects the output signal from the AUDIO (both DIGITAL and ANALOG) output jacks when playing back a DVD VIDEO disc recorded with surround multichannel audio.

Lt/Rt

Select this option when you enjoy multichannel surround audio by connecting the unit's AUDIO output (normally, the DIGITAL output) to a surround decoder.

Lo/Ro

Select this option when you enjoy conventional 2-channel stereo audio by connecting the unit's AUDIO output to a stereo amplifier/receiver or television set, or when you duplicate audio of a DVD VIDEO disc recorded with surround audio to your MD, cassette, etc.

OFF

Select this option when you enjoy multichannel surround audio by connecting the unit to a surround amplifier via the multichannel AUDIO outputs.

NOTES


- The DOWN MIX function does not work when the 3D PHONIC function is activated.
- The DOWN MIX setting does not affect an MPEG or Dolby Digital bitstream signal from DIGITAL OUT.

To enjoy the DOWN MIX effect from DIGITAL OUT when playing back a disc recorded with the MPEG multichannel or Dolby Digital format, set "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" to "PCM ONLY" (see page 43).

 When playing back a disc recorded with DTS, you cannot get the DOWN MIX effect from both DIGITAL and ANALOG outputs.

COMPRESSION

To enjoy a disc with dynamic sound at low or middle volume, setting COMPRESSION to ON makes you hear sound comfortably.



ON

Audio is played back with the dynamic range compressed.

OFF

Audio is played back as it was recorded.

NOTES

- The Compression function works only when playing back a disc recorded with DOLBY DIGITAL 1CH or 2CH.
 The setting is not effective for other discs.
- The Compression function does not work when the 3D PHONIC function is activated.

SPEAKER SETTING

Select the speaker setting option. Normally, simply select "5.1 CHANNEL" or "2 CHANNEL" according to your speaker system. However, if you want to make fine tuning, select "EXPERT".



• 2 CHANNEL

Select this option when you connect the unit to a stereo amplifier or TV.

• 5.1 CHANNEL

Select this option when you connect the unit to a surround amplifier and use the front, rear, center and sub-woofer speakers.

EXPERT

Select this option if you want to make fine tuning to match your speaker system.

When selecting "EXPERT", pressing ENTER brings up the "EXPERT SPEAKER SETTING" display on the remote control unit shown below, in which you can make fine tuning for speaker settings.

- When selecting "5.1 CHANNEL" or "EXPERT", set "DOWN MIX" to "OFF" (see page 44).
- The Dolby Digital LFE (Low Frequency Effect) signal is always fed from the SUBWOOFER output on the rear panel of the unit regardless of speaker setting.
- If you connect the unit's digital output to an external Dolby Digital or DTS decoder (and set the "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" to "STREAM/PCM"), the speaker setting above is not effective. Make the speaker setting of the external decoder appropriately.

DISPLAY page

MONITOR TYPE

You can select the monitor type to match your TV when you playback DVD VIDEO discs recorded for wide screen televisions.



4:3 LB (Letter Box Conversion)

Select this option when you connect a normal TV to the unit.

When you play a wide picture recorded on a DVD VIDEO disc, the picture is displayed with bands across the upper and lower portions of the screen.



4:3 PS (Pan Scan Conversion)


Select this option when you connect a normal TV to the unit. When you play a wide picture recorded on a DVD VIDEO disc, a portion of the picture is automatically cut off from the left and right



sides of the image. Depending on the disc, it may not be possible to playback in this mode. In that case, the picture is played back as in 4:3 LB ___ mode.

• 16:9 WIDE (Wide Television screen)

Select this option when you connect a wide-screen TV to the unit.



SCREEN SAVER


A television monitor screen may be burned out if a static picture is displayed for a long time. To prevent this, the unit automatically activates the screen saver function if a static picture, such as an on-screen display or menu, is displayed for over 5 minutes.

The current picture gets dark.

Cuts or boosts audio signals from the rear speakers between –6 dB and +6 dB in 1 dB steps.



Adjusts the delay time of the rear speakers between –15 ms and 0 ms in 5 ms steps.

SUB WOOFER settings



Cuts or boosts the audio signal from the subwoofer between –6 dB and +6 dB in 1 dB steps.



BASS

When your sub-woofer or front speakers do not fully reproduce the low-frequency range, you can boost up the low-frequency signal using the "BASS" setting.



Selects between "S.woofer" and "L/R" according to your speaker system.


- S.woofer: The low-frequency signal fed from the subwoofer output is boosted up.
- L/R: The low-frequency signals fed from the front speaker outputs are boosted up.

The "BASS" setting is effective only when at least any one of the speaker sizes is set to "Small". If none of them is set to "Small", "None" appears in the setting field and you cannot change it.

Please note that the "L/R" setting is effective only when playing back a Dolby Digital encoded DVD VIDEO disc. If the front speaker size is set to "Small", the BASS setting is fixed to "S.woofer".

TEST TONE

You can check the level setting by monitoring the test tone.



1 Make sure that none of the speaker setting item is selected (i.e. none of left and right allows are highlighted).

If any item is selected, press ENTER.

2 Select [TEST TONE] using CURSOR ▲/▼, then press ENTER.

The color of "TEST TONE" changes.

3 Select the desired speaker(s) by moving ⟨¬ using CURSOR ▲/▼/◄/▶, then press ENTER.

The test tone is output from the selected speaker(s).

While the test tone is being output, the indication shown above [TEST TONE] tells you the speaker from which the test tone is being output.

The following table shows the relations between the indications and speakers.

Indication	Speaker
L	Front-left speaker
R	Front-right speaker
С	Center speaker
SL	Rear-left speaker
SR	Rear-right speaker

- 4 Repeat step 3 above to select the speaker(s).
- To exit the test tone mode

Press ENTER while $\langle \neg \text{ points "TEST TONE"}.$



- When "TEST TONE" is active, you hear pink noise, which includes all frequencies in the audible range, from the speakers. This is not a malfunction.
- If you do not move the cursor after step 2 above, the test tone is output from each speaker one by one.
- The test tone is not output from the SUBWOOFER output.

NOTE

• To dismiss the "EXPERT SPEAKER SETTING" sub-page

Move \leftarrow to "EXIT" and press ENTER. The display returns to the AUDIO page.


Example: Making speaker settings according to speaker and room conditions

The following shows an example of how to make speaker settings according to speaker and room conditions. We assume the surround system with the following speaker conditions.

Front speakers: Large ones that can fully reproduce the low-frequency range

• Rear and center speakers: Small ones


• Super-woofer: A small one but the signal derives from the SUB WOOFER output

















Limiting playback by children

This function restricts playback of DVD VIDEO discs which contain violent (and other) scenes according to the level set by the user. For example, if a movie which includes violent scenes supports the parental lock feature, such scenes which you do not want to let children view can be cut or replaced with other scenes.

To set Parental Lock for the first time [PARENTAL LOCK]



- While a DVD VIDEO disc is stopped or no disc is inserted
 - **1** Press ENTER while holding down on the remote control unit.

The Parental Lock on-screen display appears on the TV screen.

The country code whose standards were applied to rate the DVD VIDEO disc should be selected.







To change the settings [PARENTAL LOCK]

The Parental Lock onscreen display appears on the TV screen. \(\to \text{points} [PASSWORD].



- **2** Enter your current 4-digit password using the numeric buttons (0 to 9) and press ENTER.
 - $\mbox{$\mbox{$\mbox{$\mbox{\sim}}$}}$ moves to [Country Code] if you enter the correct password.

If you enter the wrong password, "WRONG! RETRY..." appears on the TV screen, and you cannot go to next step.

3 To change the country code, use CURSOR ✓/► to select the desired country code and press ENTER.

⟨□ moves to [Set Level].

When you change the country code, you must select the parental level.

- **4** To change the set level, use CURSOR **◄/►** to select the desired level while <\(\tau\) points [Set Level], and then press ENTER.
 - ⟨□ moves to [PASSWORD].
- **5** Enter the password using the numeric buttons (0 to 9) and press ENTER.

⟨□ moves to [EXIT].


The password entered in the above step becomes the new password. If you do not change the password, enter the same password as in the step 2. Even if you want to change only the country code and/or parental level, do not forget to enter the password after changing the country code and/or parental level. Otherwise, the new country code and/or parental level will not become effective. Pressing ENTER again returns to the opening display.

NOTES

- If you forget your password in step 2 Enter "8888."

To temporarily release the Parental Lock [PARENTAL LOCK]

When you set the parental level strictly, some discs may not be played back at all. When you insert such a disc and try to play it, the following Parental Lock on-screen display appears on the TV screen, asking you whether you want the Parental Lock to be temporarily released or not.



1 Use the CURSOR **△**/**▼** to move <a>¬ to [YES], then press ENTER.

⟨¬ moves to the
[PASSWORD] field.
When selecting [NO],
press ≜(OPEN/
CLOSE) to remove
the disc.



2 Enter your 4-digit password using the numeric buttons (0 to 9).

If you enter the wrong password, "WRONG! RETRY..." appears on the TV screen.

The Parental lock is released, and the unit starts playback.



 ¬ moves to [NO] automatically and CURSOR ▲/▼ do not work.

Additional information

Care and handling of discs

How to handle discs

When handling a disc, do not touch the surface of the disc. Since discs are made of plastic, they are easily damaged. If a disc gets dirty, dusty, scratched or warped, the images and sound will not be picked up correctly, and such a disc may cause the player to malfunction.



Label side

Do not damage the label side, stick paper to or use any adhesive on its surface.

Storage

Make sure that discs are kept in their cases. If discs are piled on top of one another without their protective cases, they can be damaged. Do not put discs in a location where they may be exposed to direct sunlight, or in a place where the humidity or temperature is high. Avoid leaving discs in your car!

Maintenance of discs

If there are fingerprints or other dirt adhering to a disc, wipe with a soft dry cloth, moving from the center outwards. If a disc is difficult to clean, wipe with a cloth moistened with water.

Never use record cleaners, petrol, alcohol or any anti-static agents.



CAUTION

Sometimes during play noise or images may be garbled. This is sometimes due to the disc. (It may not be up to industry standards.)

These symptoms are caused by the discs, not by the malfunction of the unit.

Troubleshooting

What appears to be a malfunction may not always be serious. Please go through the following list before requesting service.

Symptom	Possible case	Remedy
Power does not come on.	Power plug is not inserted securely.	Plug in securely.
	Too far from the unit.	More closer to the unit.
Remote control does not work.	The tip of the remote unit is not pointed in the right direction.	Point the infrared light- emitting window toward the remote sensor on the front panel.
nemote control does not work.	Batteries are exhausted.	Replace the batteries with new ones.
	Battery polarity is incorrect.	Take out the batteries and insert them again in the correct direction.
	Connection of video cable is incorrect.	Connect the cable correctly.
No picture is displayed on the monitor.	Input selection of TV is incorrect.	Select correctly.
	Disc is not playable.	Use a playable disc. (See page 12.)
Picture is not normal when using the S-VIDEO jack.	The unit is set to feed the RGB signals (instead of the S-video signals).	Make the unit feed the S-video signals (see page 15.)
Picture is not normal when using the VIDEO or S-VIDEO jack.	The Y/C - COMP. switch is not set correectly.	Set the Y/C - COMP. switch correctly. (See page 14.)
Picture is noisy.	The unit is connected to a VCR directly and the copyguard function is activated.	Connect the unit so that the picture signal flows directly to the TV.
No audio is reproduced.	Connection is incorrect.	Check the connections.
No audio is reproduced.	Input selection of amplifier is incorrect.	Select correctly.
