Unpacking


The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code.

The wires in this mains lead must be connected to the terminals in the plugs as follows:

Plug terminal marking Blue... ... N or Black 1 or Red Brown



Notes: -

- 1. If a 13-amp plug is used, this must be fitted with a 5-amp fuse.
- 2. If a 3-pin plug with earthing contact is used, no wire must be connected to the E terminal.



Units shipped to countries other than the above countries are equipped with an AC voltage selector switch on the rear panel. Refer to the following paragraph for the proper setting of this switch.

AC voltage selection

This unit operates on 110 - 120 or 220 - 240 volts AC. The AC voltage selector switch Type A or Type B on the rear panel is set to the voltage that prevails in the area to which the unit is shipped. Before connecting the power cord to your AC outlet, make sure that the setting position of this switch matches your line voltage. If not, it must be set to your voltage in accordance with the following direction.

Our warranty does not cover damage caused by excessive line voltage due to improper setting of the AC voltage selector switch.



Move switch lever to match your line voltage with a small screwdriver or other pointed tool.



Please read all of the safety and operating instructions before operating this unit. For best results, follow all warnings placed on the unit and adhere to the operating and use instructions. These safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

- 1. Power sources The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
- 2. Power-cord protection Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.



- 3. Grounding or polarization The precautions should be taken so that the grounding or polarization means of this unit is not defeated.
- 4. Ventilation The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation.

To maintain good ventilation, do not put records or a table-cloth on the unit. Place the unit at least 10 cm away from the walls.

Do not use the unit on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings.



5. Water and moisture - The unit should not be used near water - for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.



6. Temperature - The unit may not function properly if used at extremely low, or freezing temperatures. The ideal ambient temperature is above +5°C (41°F).

7. Heat — The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other units (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



8. Electric shock — Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquid is not spilled into the enclosure through openings. If a metal object, such as a hair pin or a needle, comes into contact with the inside of this unit, a dangerous electric shock may result. For families with children, never permit children to put anything, especially metal, inside this unit.



9. Enclosure removal — Never remove the enclosure. If the internal parts are touched accidentally, a serious electric shock might occur.



10. Magnetic fields - Keep the unit away from sources of magnetic fields such as TV sets, speaker systems, radios, motorized toys or magnetized objects.



11. Cleaning - Do not use volatile solvents such as alcohol, paint thinner, gasoline, or benzine, etc. to clean the cabinet. Use a clean dry cloth.

12. Carts and stands - An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.




- 13. Nonuse periods The power cord of the unit should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.
- 14. Abnormal smell If an abnormal smell or smoke is detected, immediately turn the power OFF and pull out the power cord. Contact your dealer or nearest service center.





- 15. Damage requiring service The unit should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. The power-supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the unit; or
 - C. The unit has been exposed to rain; or
 - D. The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - E. The unit has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- 16. Servicing The user should not attempt to service the unit beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

17. Outdoor antenna grounding — If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. See Figure.



- 18. Power lines An outdoor antenna should be located away from power lines.
- 19. AC outlets Do not connect other audio equipment with a power consumption larger than that specified to the AC outlet on the rear panel. Never connect other electrical units, such as an iron or toaster, to it to prevent fire or electric shock.



Do not plug in the power lead until all connections are completed.




- Connect all cords firmly. If connections are loose there could be loss of sound or noise produced.
 When plugging and unplugging connection cords, be sure to first remove the power cord from the AC outlet. Plugging/unplugging connection. tion cords without removal of the power cord can cause malfunctions or damage to the unit.
- 3. Do not connect up a power source which is larger than that indicated on the socket at the rear of the unit.



■Connection of speakers



- Never short-circuit the + and speaker cords.
 If the left and right speakers are connected
- inversely or if the speaker cords are connected with reversed polarity, the sound becomes unnatural with ambiguous acoustic image positioning. Be sure to connect the speakers and speaker cords correctly.



■ Setting the SPEAKER IMPEDANCE SELECTOR (Except for some areas)

Speaker Impedance	Selector position
4 Ω, 6 Ω	"LESS THAN 8 Ω "
8 Ω, 16 Ω	"8 Ω OR MORE"



According to the impedance of the speakers used, set the SPEAKER IMPEDANCE SELECTOR on the rear panel as shown in the table.

- During speaker system connection and operation of the SPEAK-ER IMPEDANCE SELECTOR, set the POWER key to OFF.
- When only one set of speakers is used, use the SPEAKER A terminals.
- Even when only one of speaker systems A and B uses 4Ω or 6Ω speakers, be sure to set the SPEAKER IMPEDANCE SELECTOR to "LESS THAN 8 Ω ".


Speaker protection circuit


If the POWER switch of this unit is turned on with the speaker cord short-circuited, the speaker protection circuit will be activated automatically and no sound will be output.

In this case, remove the short circuit of the speaker cord and then turn the POWER switch on again to restore normal operation.



Controls and indicators





Operating instructions

■Listening to a program source

1 Switch the power on.



- **2** Select an input source on the control amplifier.
 - The audio signal of that source will be input from the control amplifier connected to this unit.
- 3 Adjust the volume on the control amplifier.
 - The output level is displayed on the POWER LEVEL METER.
- 4 Adjust the tone on the control amplifier.

■Listening through headphones

1 Insert the headphone plug into the headphones jack.



- Set the SPEAKERS switch so that both speaker systems A and B are OFF.
- 2 Adjust the volume on the control amplifier.
 - Be sure to minimize the volume before unplugging the headphone plug.

POWER LEVEL METER

The POWER LEVEL METER can display the output power level up to 200 watts. However, it is rather rare that you play music at such high levels as 50 or 200 watts at your home. In usual cases, the meter sensitivity can be boosed by ten times to display the level more finely.

Set the METER RANGE knob to the x0.1 position.





- Levels from 0.01 watt to 200 watts can be displayed.
- To return to the normal sensitivity, set the switch to the x1 position.
- The POWER LEVEL METER displays the levels from 0.1 to 200
 watts assuming that the speaker impedance is 8 ohms. If the
 impedance of your speakers is other than 8 ohms, the POWER
 LEVEL METER may not display correct values.

In case of difficulty

What appears to be a malfunction may not always be serious. If your unit should not perform as expected, consult the table below to see if the problem can be corrected before seeking help from your dealer or service representative.

Symptom	Cause	Remedy
Power is on but no sound. (Indicator is off.)	Poor connection at wall outlet. Power outlet inactive. Protection circuitry operating.	Check outlet using a lamp or other appliance (outlet may be controlled by a wall switch). Turn the POWER switch OFF, identify and remove the cause, and turn the POWER switch ON again.
Sound is not output. (Indicator lights.)	The speaker cords are disconnected. The VOLUME is set to the minimum position. Speaker switched off. Speaker cords are short-circuited. Audio cords are short-circuited.	Connect them properly referring to "System connections". Adjust the control amplifier's volume to a proper level. Check speaker switch. Turn the power off, eliminate the short circuiting, then turn on the power again.
Sound is not output from one of the speakers.	The speaker cord is disconnected. The BALANCE control is set to an extreme position.	Connect it properly referring to "System connections". Adjust the Left/Right balance.

Do not use contact cleaners because it could cause a malfunction. Be specially careful against contact cleaners containing oil, for they may deform the plastic components.
