

Pictures of baby's first steps...a party...opening Christmas presents...seeing old friends on vacation...or sitting around a nighttime campfire? With your Pony you can...and it's easy. Here's how:

Just attach the Flasholder (see opposite page), pop in a flash lamp, and shoot. You'll find flash useful in daylight, too. Ever notice how bright sun, high in the sky, casts black shadows across a person's face? Flash lightens these shadows . . . makes pictures more pleasing.

More about flash: Use SM or SF (Class F) or No. 5 or No. 25 (Class M) flash lamps with your Pony Camera. The SM or SF lamps can be used at 1/25, 1/50, or 1/100. The No. 5 or No. 25 lamps can be used only at 1/25 setting. For multiple flash work, get the Kodak Flasholder Extension Unit Model 1.

reflector which tells in a jiffy what exposure to use.

The B-C Flasholder has a built-in condenser which uses a 22½-volt battery for power. This economical combination gives fewer "missed" pictures, consistently better synchronization, and longer battery life. The Standard Flasholder is powered with two size C batteries; or if you decide later that you want dependable B-C (battery-condenser) power, then you can get the Kodak B-C Flashpack pictured here.

KODAK FILTERS FOR BLACK-AND-WHITE FILMS add new sparkle to your snapshots by darkening blue skies and emphasizing clouds.

For moderate emphasis, use a yellow filter (Kodak Wratten K2, or G). For extreme emphasis, use a red filter (Kodak Wratten A).

Note: Never use these filters with Kodachrome or Kodacolor Film.


move in extra close when taking big pictures of small objects. The three lenses (1+, 2+, and 3+) differ in power. The higher the number, the bigger the image. Pictured is a Portra Lens in use. The homemade frame centers the subject, and fixes the right distance.

KODAK COMBINATION LENS ATTACHMENTS make the use of filters quick and easy. Your Pony Camera takes Series V. Here's a typical hookup: First get a 1½-inch Kodak Adapter Ring (1). The ring slips over the end of the lens and holds a filter (4), or a Portra Lens (2) firmly in place. When using a filter and a Portra Lens together, get the double-threaded Kodak Retaining Ring (3). The Kodak Lens Hood (5) protects against bright reflections and glare. It's especially useful with filters.

KODAK FILTERS FOR KODACHROME FILM For sunlight pictures with Kodachrome Film Type A (indoor film) use the Kodak Daylight Filter for Kodak Type A Color Films—same exposure as with daylight film. The Kodak Skylight Filter is useful to reduce bluish haze in distant landscapes. Use the Kodak Flash Filter (No. 81C) for flash pictures with Type A Kodachrome with all lamps except SM or SF.

THE KODAK COMBINATION FILTER CASE protects your lens attachments and keeps them together. It holds four filters, adapter ring, and lens hood.

Making Your Own Prints

Double enjoyment—that's what you get when you add the fun of printing to snapshot making. Just shoot a roll of Kodak Plus-X or Super-XX Film and develop it yourself in the Kodacraft Miniature Roll-Film Tank. With a Kodak Enlarger (see page 15) you'll be turning out enlargements in the first evening.

You can't enjoy your prints if they are filed away in a drawer. It's much better to mount them neatly in a photo album. Kodak makes many albums—your dealer can show you the complete line. Prints can be mounted by two methods. Kodak Rapid Mounting Cement mounts prints rapidly and permanently on any dry, clean surface. Kodak Dry Mounting Tissue is fine for mounting prints with a flatiron.

When making prints at home, don't forget to print an extra few of the especially good shots. When writing to friends or relatives, include a few prints with the letter. This personal touch is always appreciated. KODAK PUBLICATIONS cover a multitude of photographic subjects. The one illustrated is Developing, Printing, and Enlarging—a booklet which illustrates how the beginner can develop his film and make prints and enlargements with Kodak darkroom equipment.



THE KODACRAFT MINIATURE ROLL-FILM TANK is ideal for developing either Kodak 135 or 828 black-and-white film. The film is loaded in the dark; processing can be done in a fully lighted room.



KODAK OXFORD ALBUMS are offered in two color schemes — black covers with black leaves, and maroon covers with brown leaves. Horizontal or vertical — 8 x 10 inches. A complete line of other Kodak albums is also available.



Enlarging turns ordinary snapshots into works of art. From your small snapshot negatives you can make big, impressive salon-type pictures... and for only a few cents each. Enlargements make excellent gifts for all occasions, and they are nice as home decorations, too.

Quite often the snapshot includes material which does not add to the picture—or you may find that there is more than one story in the snapshot. Enlarging enables you to print the area of the negative that you like the best, thus eliminating all the unwanted parts. In addition, enlarging lets you "paint" with light. By hold-

ing back or printing-in certain areas of the picture, you can do selective printing to produce extra detail or stronger emphasis.

Once you start enlarging, you'll be experimenting with different papers to produce just the effects you want. You may even find that you have an enlargement that is good enough to enter in a salon — and what a thrill it is to get that first blue ribbon.

Almost all neighborhoods have camera clubs. At these clubs you will find friendly, expert advice on how to improve your pictures. Your Kodak dealer can probably give you the name of the club nearest you.
