

14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

Example of Grounding According to National Electrical Code Instructions



15. Lightning

For added protection for this product (receiver) during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

16. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

17. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

18. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this product

through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.

Watching TV Programs

- * Please make sure to connect the TV to the adapter before connecting the power plug to the wall power outlet.
- a. Remove the connection panel cover as shown below.
- b. Connect the antenna cable to the antenna input port on the TV.
- c. Connect the adapter to the power input port on the TV.
- d. Plug the power cord into the wall power outlet after connecting the power cord to the adapter.
- e. Reinstall the connection panel cover.





Note : ● If the TV feels cold to the touch, there may be a small "flicker" when turned on. This is normal, there is nothing wrong with TV.

- Some dot defects may appear on the screen, like red, green or blue spots. However, this will have no adverse effect on the monitor's performance.
- Avoid touching the LCD screen or holding your finger(s) against it for long periods of time.
 Doing so may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.

* You can adjust the angle of the TV between 2° and 13°.








* For better picture quality, adjust antenna direction.

Connecting to wall antenna socket

Typical wall antenna jack used in apartment buildings, connect the antenna cable as shown below.
 (Use the correct type of antenna cable for the type of wall antenna jack.)






- * If you have a 75Ω round cable, insert the bronze wire and then tighten the connection nut. And if you have a 300Ω flat wire, connect the twisted wire to the antenna converter and then connect the converter to the antenna jack.
- * When using 75Ω round cable, do not bend the bronze wire. It may cause poor picture quality.


Connecting to outdoor antenna

• This type of antenna is commonly used in single family homes.





- * In poor signal areas, you can get better picture quality if you install the antenna as shown at right.
- * If antenna is split for two TVs, use "signal divider" for connection.





VCR Connections


- * In Video mode, TV automatically reverts to TV mode if the channel (▲,▼) buttons or number buttons (0~9) are pressed.

The TV has been pre-adjusted to use XGA1024x768, 60Hz format.

- a. If possible, use one of the XGA formats to obtain the best image quality for your TV/LCD monitor. If set up under other resolutions, a distorted picture may appear on the screen. If set to Vertical frequency 85Hz, some noise can be seen when PIP is on. In this case, set the Vertical frequency to 60Hz.
- b. If the message "**OUT OF RANGE**" appears on the screen, adjust the PC output to a format listed in the 'Displayable Monitor Output Format Specifications' chart above.

- H-Position/V-Position
 - : This function adjusts picture left/right and up/down. The adjustment ranges are -100~+100 / -30~+30.
- Clock
 - : This function minimizes any vertical bars or stripes appearing on the screen background. The adjustment range is -30~+30.
- Phase
 - : This function allows you to remove any horizontal noise and clear up or sharpen the character images. The range adjustment is -15~+15.
- Auto-configure
 - : This function is for the automatic adjustment of the screen position, clock and clock phase. (The displayed image will disappear for a few seconds while Auto-configuration is in progress.)
- Reset
 - : This function allows you to return to the default setting programmed at the factory; default settings cannot be changed.




- * Some signals from some graphics boards may not function properly. If the results are unsatisfactory, adjust your monitor's position, clock and clock phase manually.
- * If you turn on PIP, you cannot access PC setup. If you need to adjust PC setup, turn off PIP first.

- * Be sure to select the PC source before operation.
- * PIP (Picture In Picture) lets you view 2 different inputs (sources) on your TV screen at the same time. One source will be large, and the other source will show a smaller inset image.


Remote Control: Installing Batteries/Operation

Installing batteries

Pull the battery cover upward in the direction shown by the arrow and remove it.




Insert the batteries with correct polarity.



Replace the battery compartment cover.







- * Install two 1.5V alkaline batteries of AAA type. Don't mix the used batteries with new batteries.
- * Remove batteries when you don't use the remote control for a long time. Liquid leakage from old batteries may damage the remote.

Notes for using remote control

Make sure there are no objects between the remote control and its sensor.

Don't place the remote control near a heater or in a damp place. A strong impact on remote control may damage it. Signal from the remote control may be disturbed by sun light or other strong light. In this case, darken the room.








To turn the TV on

TV Operation Overview

- First, connect antenna cable and power cord with the adapter. Press **on/off** on the TV side panel.
 - Press power on the remote control to put the TV into standby mode. In standby mode, press the power, ch (▲,▼), tv/video and number button on the remote control or ch (▲,▼), tv/video on the TV side panel to turn on it fully.
- Select the viewing source by pressing tv/video on the remote control.
 - Note: See page 30 if you have not auto programmed the TV to receive channels in your local broadcast area.
- After viewing, press the **power** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode. Press the **on/off** on the TV side panel again to turn off the TV.

Watching TV programs

- Press **power** on the remote control to turn the TV on.
- $\boldsymbol{\gamma}$. Use the channel $(\blacktriangle, \blacktriangledown)$ or number buttons to select a channel to view.
- Adjust Volume level.
 - Volume (▶) button increases the sound level.
 - Volume (◄) button decreases the sound level.







Channel Search (Auto Programming)

- * For Auto program to work, the programming source must be connected to the TV and the TV must be receiving programming signals either over-the-air or from a cable-type service provider. (See page 7.)
- Use the **menu** button to select the Channel menu.



Press the volume (▶) and then use the channel (♠,▼) buttons to select the Auto program option.

- Press the volume (►) button to begin the channel search.
 - Wait for auto program to complete the channel search cycle before choosing a channel. The TV scans for over-the-air channels and then channels provided by a cable service.

Stop:

Press the **enter** (■) button.



- * When the channel search is complete, use the channel (▲,▼) buttons to review the memorized channels
- * If you press the **enter** (**II**) button in auto programming, the function will stop and only channels programming up to that time will remain.

- Use the channel(\blacktriangle , \blacktriangledown) buttons to select Run.
 - Each press of channel (▲,▼) button changes the screen display as below.



The screen display will disappear if you press the enter (■) button one more time.






Closed captions

Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words which then appear as subtitles on the television screen. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

Using Closed Captions



Captions are the subtitles of the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. It's possible to caption a live program by using a process called real-time captioning, which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system and computer for translation into English.

Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also aid in teaching language skills.

The picture at left shows a typical caption.

Caption Tips

- Not all TV broadcasts include closed caption signals.
- Sometimes TV stations broadcast four different caption signals on the same channel. By selecting From CC 1 to CC 4, you can choose which signal you view. CC 1 is usually the signal with the captions, while Another mode might show demonstration or programming information.
- Your TV might not receive caption signals normally in the following situations.
- 1 Poor reception conditions are encountered:



IGNITION:

Picture may flutter, drift, suffer from black spots, or horizontal streaking. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills, and other electrical appliances.

· GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused when the TV signal splits and follows two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected off tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception.

SNOW:


If your receiver is located at the weak, fringe area of a TV signal, your picture may be marred by small dots. It may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.

- 2 An old, bad or illegally recorded tape is played.
- 3 Strong, random signals from a car or airplane interfere with the TV signal.
- 4 The signal from the antenna is weak.
- **5** The program wasn't captioned when it was produced, transmitted, or taped.



Text Setup

Text services give a wide variety of information on all kind of subjects (ex. captioned program lists, weather forecasts, stock exchange topics, news for hearing-impaired---) on up to half of the TV screen. But not all stations offer text services, even though they might offer captioning.

- In the event you are receiving a poor signal, an empty black box may appear and disappear, even when the text mode is selected. This is normal function in such an event.
- Repeat steps 1-3 on page 49.
- Use the channel (▲,▼) buttons to select: Text 1, Text 2, Text 3, or Text 4.



Parental Control

The Parental Control Function (V-Chip) is used to block program viewing based on the ratings sent by the broadcast station. The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by the type of program and by the categories chosen to be blocked. It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use the Parental Control Function, the following must be set:

- 1. Ratings and categories to be blocked.
- 2. Number of hours to lock the television viewing control
- 3. Set a password
- 4. Enable the lock

V-Chip rating and categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcast stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System(MPAA) only.

For Movies previously shown in theaters:

* Unblocked

* G and Above (general audience)

* PG and Above (parental guidance suggested)

* PG-13 and Above (13 years and up) * R and Above (restricted)

Maintenance

Caring for your TV

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have with your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and pull out the plug before you begin any cleaning.

Screen Cleaning

- 1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cabinet Cleaning

- 1. Use a soft cloth with a mild soap solution to wipe the cabinet.
- 2. Rinse the cloth and wipe the cabinet again.
- 3. Let the cabinet air-dry before turning your TV on.


Extended Absence



If you leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges. If you use an off-air antenna, you may also want to disconnect it from the back of your TV before leaving.
