## FCC and Phone Company Information

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Carefully unpack and remove your unit from the box.
2. Make sure all of the following items have been included:

- Base Unit
- AC Adapter
- Handset Unit
- Rechargeable Ni-Cd Battery Pack (3.6V,450mAH)
(AC120V, 60Hz/DC9V, 500mA)
- Telephone Cord
- Belt Clip

3. Make sure the Rechargeable Battery is installed or install the Rechargeable Battery as described on page 7 .
PLEASE REFER TO FIGURE 1 FOR STEPS 4 THROUGH 7 :

4. Slide the TONE/PULSE switch on the rear of the Base unit to TONE or PULSE to match the service provided on your telephone line. If you are not sure of your service, please contact your telephone company. The factory preset position for this switch is TONE.
5. Connect one end of the telephone line cord into the Telephone LINE jack on the rear of the base unit and the other end into a modular telephone jack.
6. Insert the small plug at the end of the AC adapter into the DC 9 V jack located at the rear of the base unit.
NOTE: Use only the center-positive 9V AC adapter provided with your unit.
7. Plug the AC adapter into a standard 120 V AC wall outlet.

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

This unit can be used on a desk, or other level surface or mounted on the wall away from excessive heat or direct sunlight.

## WALL MOUNTING

1. Drill two holes with a vertical distance between the two marked positions of 83 mm as shown in Figure 3.
2. Drive a screw into each of the holes. Tighten them to the end of the screw lines, only leaving the smooth part of the screw head outside the wall.
3. Plug the telephone line cord into the modular wall jack.
4. Hang the unit onto the screws, then slide it down firmly to fasten the base securely.


## HEADSET CONNECTION

One of the special features of your phone is that your handset could utilize a headset (not included) for hands-free communication. Insert the small plug at the end of your headset cord to the headset jack at the side of the handset. Follow the procedures discussed in "Placing a Call" and "Receiving a Call" to place and receive a call.
NOTE: The headset jack of your cordless telephone is compatible with 2.5 mm headset plugs only. When you plug in the headset into the headset jack, it automatically mutes the microphone and speaker of the handset. Unplug the headset to return the handset to normal use.

## BATTERY INSTALLATION

To install the two (2) AAA batteries, make sure the telephone line cord is unplugged and open the battery compartment on the bottom of the base unit by removing the screw and then pushing in on the battery door tab. Insert two (2) AAA batteries (not included) and replace the battery compartment cover. Replace the battery when the Battery indicator (" ") lights in the display.
NOTE: The battery is only used to store the clock and caller ID memory, it will not show the caller ID display nor play the radio when the AC adapter is not connected.

## BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:

1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the battery compartment.
3. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
4. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)
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## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

INSTALLATION OF THE RECHARGEABLE BATTERY


Remove the battery cover located on the rear of the handset by pressing on the top of the cover and sliding it downward.


Put the battery cover back on by sliding it upward until it clicks into place.

Connect the Ni-Cd battery pack plug into the battery connector; the LCD display will turn on in the Standby mode.
Insert the Ni-Cd battery pack into the battery compartment.

## CHARGING THE RECHARGEABLE BATTERY

Be sure the rechargeable battery is fully charged 12 hours prior to initial use. The handset's rechargeable battery will be charged when it's on the base's charge contacts; the IN USE/CHARGE indicator will light when it is placed in the base.

## NOTES:

- The Low battery indicator will appear in the display when the battery power is low and needs recharging.
- Every few months, or when charging becomes abnormal, clean the contacts of the handset and the base with a standard pencil eraser.
- To maximize battery life, fully discharge the battery every month or two. To do this, simply unplug the telephone line cord and press the TALK button until the battery is discharged, and then recharge it.


## SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS

## SETTING THE LCD CONTRAST

If you find the LCD screen difficult to read, set the contrast level as follows:


Press the FUNC/VOL button; "FUNC SET" will appear in the display.


Press the \# button (1) to increase or the * button © 2 to decrease the Contrast level.


Press the DIR button once to exit the Contrast setting mode and twice to exit the Function set mode.


Press the DOWN/ button once; the Contrast setting will appear.


When the desired Contrast setting appears, press the FUNC/VOL button 1; a long beep will be heard to confirm the setting has been saved. You can also press the DIR button(2 to exit the Contrast setting mode without saving.

## SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

## SETTING THE TIME AND DATE

Change the Time and Date as follows:


Press the FUNC/VOL button; "FUNC SET" will appear in the display.

Press the DOWN/ button twice; the Time setting will appear.


Set the month using the Key buttons (0-9). Repeat this step to set the date, hour, and minutes. Two digits must be entered for each setting.
When setting the time, use military time. i.e. for 3:30PM, enter 1-5-3-0.


When the current time and date are set, press the FUNC/VOL button © ; a long beep will be heard to confirm the setting has been saved. You can also press the DIR button(3 to exit the Time setting mode without saving.


Press the DIR button once to exit the Time setting mode and twice to exit the Function set mode.

## SETTING THE LANGUAGE

Set the language (ENGLISH, SPANISH, FRENCH) as follows:


Press the FUNC/VOL button; "FUNC SET" will appear in the display.



Press the DOWN/ button three times; the Language setting will appear.

When the desired Language appears, press the FUNC/VOL button 1 ; a long beep will be heard to confirm the setting has been saved. You can also press
the DIR button(2) to exit the Language has been saved. You can also press
the DIR buttone to exit the Language setting mode without saving.



Press the DIR button once to exit the Language setting mode and twice to exit the Function set mode.

## SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

## SETTING THE AREA CODE

Set your local area code as follows:


Set the three digit area code using the Key buttons (0-9).


Press the DIR button once to exit the Area Code setting mode and twice to exit the Function set mode.


Press the DOWN/ - button four times; the Area Code setting will appear.


When the desired area code appears, press the FUNC/VOL button(1; a long beep will be heard to confirm the setting has been saved. You can also press the DIR button(2) to exit the Area Code setting mode without saving.

## SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

## SETTING THE KEYTONE

When a button is pressed a keytone will sound when the Keytone setting is On. Turn the Keytone setting Off if you do not want the keytone sound as follows:


Press the FUNC/VOL button; "FUNC SET" will appear in the display.


Press the \# button (1) or * button (2) to turn the Keytone setting On or Off.


Press the DIR button once to exit the Keytone setting mode and twice to exit the Function set mode.


Press the DOWN/- button five times; the Keytone setting will appear.


When the desired Keytone setting appears, press the FUNC/VOL button©; a long beep will be heard to confirm the setting has been saved. You can also press the DIR button 2 to exit the Keytone setting mode without saving.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION

RING SWITCH


Slide the RING ON/OFF switch on the side of the handset to the ON position to turn the ringer on. Slide the RING ON/OFF switch to the OFF position to turn the ringer off.

TONE/PULSE SWITCH


Slide the TONE/PULSE switch on the rear of the base to TONE or PULSE to match the service provided on your telephone line. If you are not sure of your service, please contact your telephone company.

## PLACING A CALL



After the battery has been fully charged, press the TALK button and listen for a dial tone; the timer will start counting in the display.


Press the Key buttons (0-9) © to dial the phone number you wish to call. When finished talking, press the TALK button 2 again or place the handset on the base to hang up.

## NOTES:

- You can also dial the number first, then press the TALK button. The unit will then dial the number automatically.
- Do not use this telephone within 20 feet of a microwave that is cooking as you may experience interference.


## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## RECEIVING A CALL

Incoming calls are saved in the Caller ID log.


Make sure that the Caller ID service is turned on by your phone company. When you receive a call, the display will show the name of the caller and number of the call. To answer the call, press the TALK button or just lift the handset from the base. The display will show the amount of time you have been on the phone. When finished, press the TALK button again or place the handset on the base to hang up.

## NOTES:

- If you subscribe to Caller ID, the time and date are automatically set when the first call is received.
- Calls picked up on the first ring will not be logged in the Caller ID log.
- Press the \# button to view caller ID information of more than 11 characters.


## WHAT APPEARS IN THE CALLER ID DISPLAY

- If a call is received from an area which does not provide caller ID service, the display will show "OUT OF AREA".
- If a call was received incorrectly or only part of the data was received, the display will show "DATA ERROR".
- If a call is received from a caller that has blocked his/her information, the display will show "PRIVATE".
- If there are new calls, "NEW" will blink in the display.


## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## REDIALING A NUMBER



Press the TALK button (1) (the display will light), followed by the RE/PA button (2) to automatically redial the last number dialed on this handset.
NOTE: Please note that only the last number you called on this handset can be stored in the Redial memory.

## ENDING A CALL



To end a call, simply return the handset to the base, or press the TALK button on the handset.

CHANNEL SELECTION


The base unit will automatically search for the clearest channel in the Standby mode. However, should you hear static or noise during the course of a conversation which makes it difficult to hear the caller, the CHN button on the handset allows you to choose between the many preset frequencies.
NOTE: The unit will beep to indicate the unit is changing to another channel.

ADJUSTING EARPIECE VOLUME


While you are on the phone, repeatedly press the FUNC/VOL button to set the volume level.

## OUT OF RANGE

The handset and base communicate up to a maximum range. The distance can be affected by the weather, power lines or other cordless telephones. You are out of range and should move closer when:

- You hear noise or static.
- You cannot receive an incoming call.


## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## PAGING THE HANDSET



Press the PAGE button on the base to locate the handset when not in use; the handset will beep for six seconds and "B/S PAGING" will appear in the display during paging. Press the PAGE button again on the base to stop.

USING THE TEMPORARY TONE

If you are in a Pulse dialing area you may still take advantage of touch-tone
services after dialing to respond to may still take advantage of touch-tone
services after dialing to respond to touch-tone prompts. To do this, press the Temporary Tone $/ *$ button before dialing the number to temporarily change the dialing mode from Pulse to change the dialing mode from Pulse to
Tone after dialing in the Pulse mode. This will enable Pulse users to access
touch-tone services. It will revert back This will enable Pulse users to access
touch-tone services. It will revert back to Pulse after hanging up.


INSERTING A PAUSE

In some cases, such as a PBX or long distance service, a pause may be needed in the dialing sequence. Pressing the RE/PA button on the handset will insert a two second delay between dialed numbers. Pauses can also be entered in programming dialing sequence in memory dialing.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## DIGITAL SECURITY SYSTEM

The security code prevents your cordless telephone conversation from being accessed by a phone on a different line. Once the handset battery is fully charged, the handset will automatically select the code from a total of over 65,000 combinations. The code is changed every time the handset is placed in the cradle.

If you experience difficulty with placing or receiving calls, a lost security code may be the cause of the problem. When this occurs, the handset can no longer communicate with the base. Reset by placing the handset on the base for 5-10 seconds. If that does not work, unplug the AC adaptor from the wall outlet. Disconnect the handset battery for 5-10 seconds, then reconnect. Place the handset back on the base and then plug in the AC adaptor.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## CHECKING THE CALLER ID LOG



While the handset is in the Standby mode, repeatedly press the UP/ $\boldsymbol{1}$ or DOWN/ (2) button to cycle through the caller ID information of the received calls. The information of the call, including name, number, date and time received will be displayed. Press the DIR button 3 to return to the Standby mode.

NOTES:

- The IN USE/NEW CALL indicator will blink red until all new caller ID information has been reviewed.
- Press the \# button to view caller ID information of more than 11 characters.

DELETING ONE NAME/NUMBER FROM THE CALLER ID LOG


Scroll through the calls to select a number to delete using the UP/ $\boldsymbol{4}$ or DOWN/- (2) button.


Press the DEL button © " "DEL RECORD?" will appear in the display. Press the DEL button 11 again; the display will show "REC ERASED!".
Press the DIR button (2) once to cancel DEL RECORD or twice to return to the Standby mode.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

DELETING ALL NAME(S)/NUMBER(S) FROM THE CALLER ID LOG


Press and hold the DEL button 1; "DEL ALL CID?" will appear in the display. Press the DEL button 1 again; the display will show "ALL ERASED" and then return to the Standby mode. Press the DIR button © once to cancel DEL ALL CID.

## DIALING A NUMBER IN THE CALLER ID DISPLAY

You can automatically call a number from the caller ID log as follows:


Scroll through the calls to select a number to call using the UP/ $<\boldsymbol{1}$ or DOWN/- (2) button.


Press the TALK button to dial the displayed number. Press the TALK button again or return the handset to the base to end the call.


Press the OPTION button to change the displayed number to 7,10 or 11 digits. The first dialing option displayed is 11 digits, for a long distance call.


Press the DIR button to cancel dialing and return to the standby mode.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## STORING NAMES \& TELEPHONE NUMBERS IN THE PHONEBOOK

The memory can store up to 40 name/telephone numbers.


Press the DIR button 11 while in the Standby mode. Press the ST/MT/ED button (2) to create a new directory entry; "ENTER NUM" will appear in the display. Enter the desired telephone number using the key buttons (3.


Press the ST/MT/ED button to create a new directory entry; "ENTER NAME will appear in the display.


See the Character Map Chart on the top of the next page and using the Key buttons ( $0-9,{ }^{*}, \#$ ), enter the name. Enter the first letter, then wait two seconds and the cursor will move to the right, then enter the next letter. For example, press the 4 button once to enter a " G ", then press the 7 button three times to enter the second character, "R". Repeat this step until all letters have been entered.


Press the ST/MT/ED button 1 to store the number into memory. Press the DIR button (2) twice to return to the Standby mode, or if no buttons are pressed within 30 seconds, the unit will automatically revert back to the Standby mode.

## NOTES:

- If the data is stored in a location where data has already been stored, the old data will be overwritten.
- To delete a character or number while programming, press the DEL button.

VIEWING THE PHONEBOOK


Press the DIR button.


Press the UP/ < © or DOWN/- (2) button to locate the desired record.


Press the Key button that corresponds to the first letter of the saved name.


Press the \# © or $*$ button $\mathbf{( 2 )}$ to view a name or number of more than 11 characters. Press the \# (1) or $*$ button to view the preceding characters/ numbers

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## SAVING CALLER ID INFORMATION TO THE PHONEBOOK

The Phonebook can save the information directly from the caller ID.


Scroll through the calls to select a number using the UP/ $<1$ or DOWN/- (2) button.


Press the ST/MT/ED button; "SAVE CID?" will appear in the display. Press the ST/MT/ED button again; "CID SAVED" will appear.

## DIALING A NUMBER FROM THE PHONEBOOK

To select and dial a number from the phonebook, follow the steps below:



Press the UP/ $\boldsymbol{4} 1$ or DOWN/-2 button to locate the desired Phonebook entry OR: Press the Key button (3) that corresponds Press the Key button 3 that corresponds
to the first letter of the saved name, then press the UP/ < © or DOWN/ (2) button to locate the desired name/number.


Press the TALK button to dial the displayed number.

## EDITING TELEPHONE NUMBERS/NAMES

You can edit a phone number in the Phonebook as follows:


Press the DIR button.


Press the ST/MT/ED button; the display will show the phone number.


To erase a character, press the DEL button. To add a letter or number, use the Key buttons.


Press the UP/41 or DOWN/- (2) button to locate the desired Phonebook entry.


To erase a number, press the DEL button (1. To add a number, use the Key buttons. Press the ST/MT/ED button (2) again; the name will appear.


When the entry is edited as you desire, press the ST/MT/ED button to store the edited record.

## TELEPHONE OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## DELETING A NUMBER FROM THE PHONEBOOK

Delete a number from the Phonebook as follows:


Press the DIR button 11 while in the Standby mode and locate the entry to be deleted using the UP/ < (2) or DOWN/-3 button.


Press the DEL button 1 ; "DEL RECORD?" will appear in the display. Press the DEL button 11 again; the display will show "REC ERASED". Press the DIR button © 2 once to return to the phonebook.

## RADIO OPERATION

TO PLAY THE RADIO


Slide the BUZZ/MUSIC/OFF/ON switch to the ON position to turn the radio on.


Tune a station by turning the TUNING control.


Slide the AM/FM Band switch to select the AM or FM band.


Adjust the VOLUME control as desired.

## Antennas

FM: Extend the AC cord for better FM reception.
AM: Turn the unit for better AM reception.

## NOTE:

- THE RADIO WILL NOT WORK WITH THE TWO AAA BATTERIES, you must have the $A C$ adapter plugged into an $A C$ outlet to listen to the radio.


## CLOCK OPERATION

TO SET THE CLOCK


Press and hold the TIME/OFF button until the hours blink.


Press the TIME/OFF button again; the minutes will blink.


Within seven seconds, set the current hour using the UP 1 and DOWN (2) buttons. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting, as indicated at the left side in the display.


Within seven seconds, set the current minutes using the UP (1) and DOWN (2) buttons. Press the TIME/OFF button (3) and the clock will be set.

## CLOCK OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## TO SET THE ALARM TIME(S)



Press and hold the ALARM button until the alarm hours blink.


Press the ALARM button again; the alarm 1 minutes will blink.


Within seven seconds, set the desired alarm 2 hour using the UP 1 and DOWN © buttons. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting, as indicated at the left side in the display. Press the ALARM button (3; the alarm 2 minutes will blink.


Within seven seconds, set the desired alarm 1 hour using the UP 1 and DOWN 2 buttons. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting, as indicated at the left side in the display.


Within seven seconds, set the alarm 1 minutes using the UP 1 and DOWN 2 buttons. Press the ALARM button (3) the alarm 2 hour digit will blink.


Within seven seconds, set the alarm 2 minutes using the UP 1 and DOWN (2) buttons. Press the ALARM button (3) and the alarm time will be set.

## CLOCK OPERATION (CONTINUED)

TO SET THE ALARM TO WAKE TO RADIO


Set the alarm time as previously instructed. Slide the BUZZ/MUSIC/ OFF/ON switch to the MUSIC position; "MUSIC" will appear in the display. Make sure the radio is tuned to the desired station, and the volume is set as desired.


When the actual time matches the selected preset alarm time(s), the unit automatically turns on for 59 minutes and then shuts off.
To shut off the alarm, press the TIME/OFF button; alarm time will be reset for the next day.


Press the ALARM button once to activate Alarm 1, twice to activate Alarm 2 and three times to activate Alarm 1 and 2. The respective Alarm indicator will appear in the display.


Press the ALARM button until the Alarm indicators disappear from the display to turn off the alarm completely.

## CLOCK OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## TO SET THE ALARM TO WAKE TO BUZZER



Set the alarm time as previously instructed. Slide the BUZZ/MUSIC/ OFF/ON switch to the BUZZ position; "BUZZ" will appear in the display.


When the actual time matches the selected preset alarm time(s), the unit automatically turns on for 59 minutes and then shuts off.
To shut off the alarm, press the TIME/OFF button.; alarm time will be reset for the next day.


Press the ALARM button once to activate Alarm 1, twice to activate Alarm 2 and three times to activate Alarm 1 and 2. The respective Alarm indicator will appear in the display.


Press the ALARM button until the Alarm indicators disappear from the display to turn off the alarm completely.

## CLOCK OPERATION (CONTINUED)

## SNOOZE



The alarm can be temporarily turned off manually by pressing the SNOOZE button; the alarm will turn back on automatically 9 minutes later. It can be repeated endlessly.
NOTE: Press the SNOOZE button once to show the Alarm 1 time. Press the SNOOZE button a second time to show the Alarm 2 time. After 12 seconds, it will revert back to the timer. Press the SNOOZE button a third time to show the Second display, it will not revert back to the timer until the SNOOZE button has been pressed.

## TO ACTIVATE THE SLEEP TIMER



Slide the BUZZ/MUSIC/OFF/ON switch (1) to the OFF position. Press the SLEEP button (2; ":59" will appear in the display and the radio will turn on and play for one hour.

## NOTES:

- Press the SLEEP button once to check the remaining sleep time.
- Press the TIME/OFF button to cancel the sleep timer.

| No dial tone | Check that the telephone line cord connectors at both <br> ends are pushed in firmly until they click. |
|  | If you had a power failure or had unplugged the base <br> unit, return the handset on the base unit for two to five <br> seconds to reset the system. |
| Does not ring | Check to see if the RING ON/OFF switch is set to ON. |
|  | You may have exceeded the Ringer Equivalence <br> Number (REN ) limit of how many phones can be <br> connected to the same line. The REN total of all <br> devices (printed on the bottom label of each unit) should <br> not exceed five (5). Disconnect the appropriate units to <br> lower the REN total. |
| No power on the <br> handset unit | Check the Ni-Cd battery pack connection inside the <br> battery compartment on the handset. |
|  | The handset rechargeable Ni-Cd battery pack may need <br> charging. |
| Does not charge | Make sure the charging contacts on both the base unit <br> and the handset are in contact during charging. |
|  | The charging contacts may need cleaning with an <br> alcohol-moistened cloth or pencil eraser. |
| Range is limited | Move the base unit so that it is centrally located in your <br> residence or office and make sure that the base unit is <br> not located near appliances. |
| Calls received flutter <br> or fade | The handset rechargeable Ni-Cd battery pack may need <br> charging. |
| Interference on <br> reception | Choose an alternate channel using the CHN <br> button on the handset. |

| The Caller ID LCD panel does not show the caller's name and/ or phone number | The Caller ID unit will not function until you have Caller ID service provided by your local phone company. Call your local phone company to have Caller ID installed on your telephone line. |
|  | Check your telephone line connections. Make sure all connections are secure and connected. |
|  | If you have a telephone answering device (TAD) connected with the unit, set the TAD to answer after two rings or more. |
|  | If it is a blocked call or an out-of-area call, the caller's name and/or phone number will not appear on the display. |
|  | If only the caller's phone number appears on the display, it may be a Single Data Message Format (SDMF) call, as opposed to a Multiple Data Message Format (MDMF) call. |
| Random characters and/or "DATA ERROR" on the LCD panel | On rare occasions, the Caller ID information sent by the telephone company may have an error during the transmission. This is not the fault of your Caller ID unit. |
