Power Sources

This unit operates on a supplied AC adaptor, car adaptor and chargeable batteries.

- Make sure that the input voltage of the AC adaptor is in line with the local voltage. Otherwise, the AC adaptor and unit may be damaged.
- Do not touch the AC adaptor with wet hand so as to avoid electric shocks.
- When connecting with car power (cigarette lighter) adaptor, be sure the input voltage of the adaptor is identical with car voltage.
- Unplug the AC adaptor from the outlet or remove the chargeable batteries when the unit is not used for a long time.
- Hold the plug to disconnect the AC adaptor. Do not pull the power cord.

On Placement

Avoid placing the unit in the following places.

- Under direct sunlight or near a source of heat such as a heater.
Never leave the unit in a closed automobile, on a dashboard or a parcel shelf. Excess heat may deform the cabin or cause malfunction.
- Where it is very dusty or sandy.
- Wet or humid places, such as bathroom.
- Near sources of strong magnetism, such as television, speaker, or magnet.

For Safety

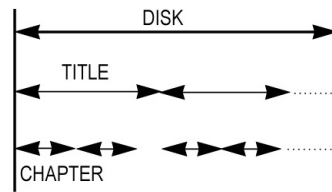
◦ Chapter

It is smaller than title among the units of a DVD. A title is made up of several chapters, and each chapter has a number for search. But some discs may not have numbered chapters.

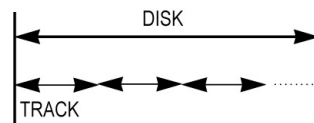

Structure Of CD

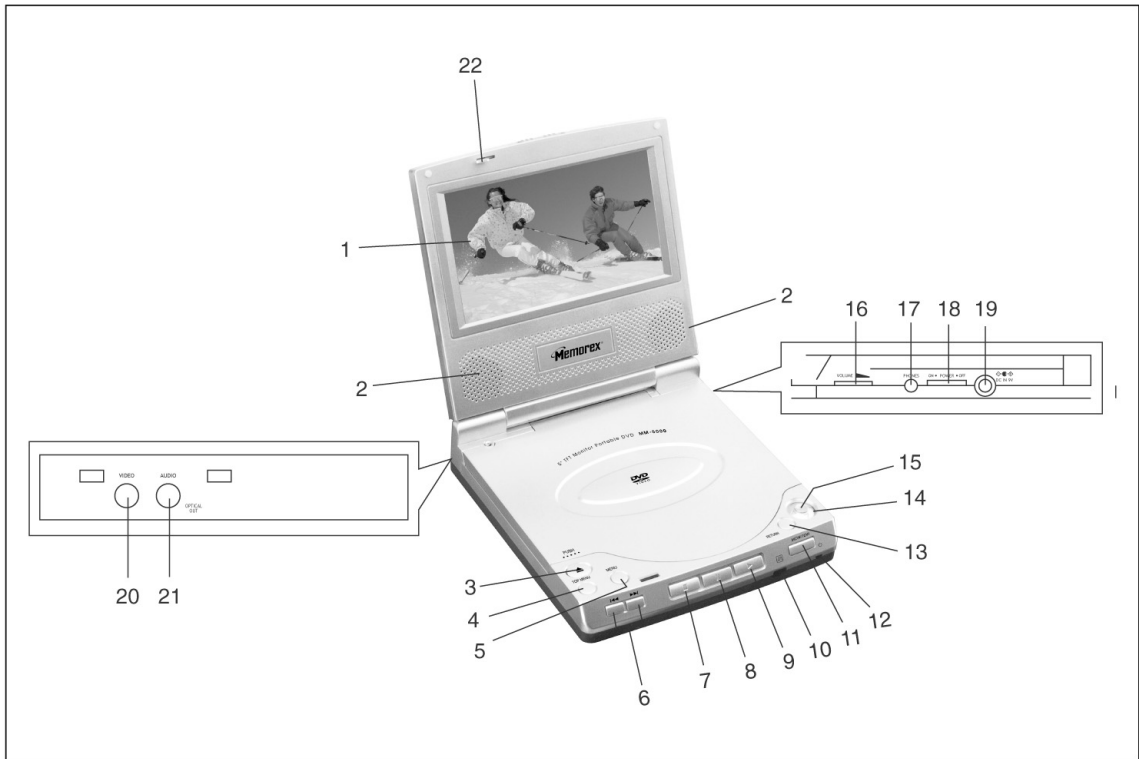

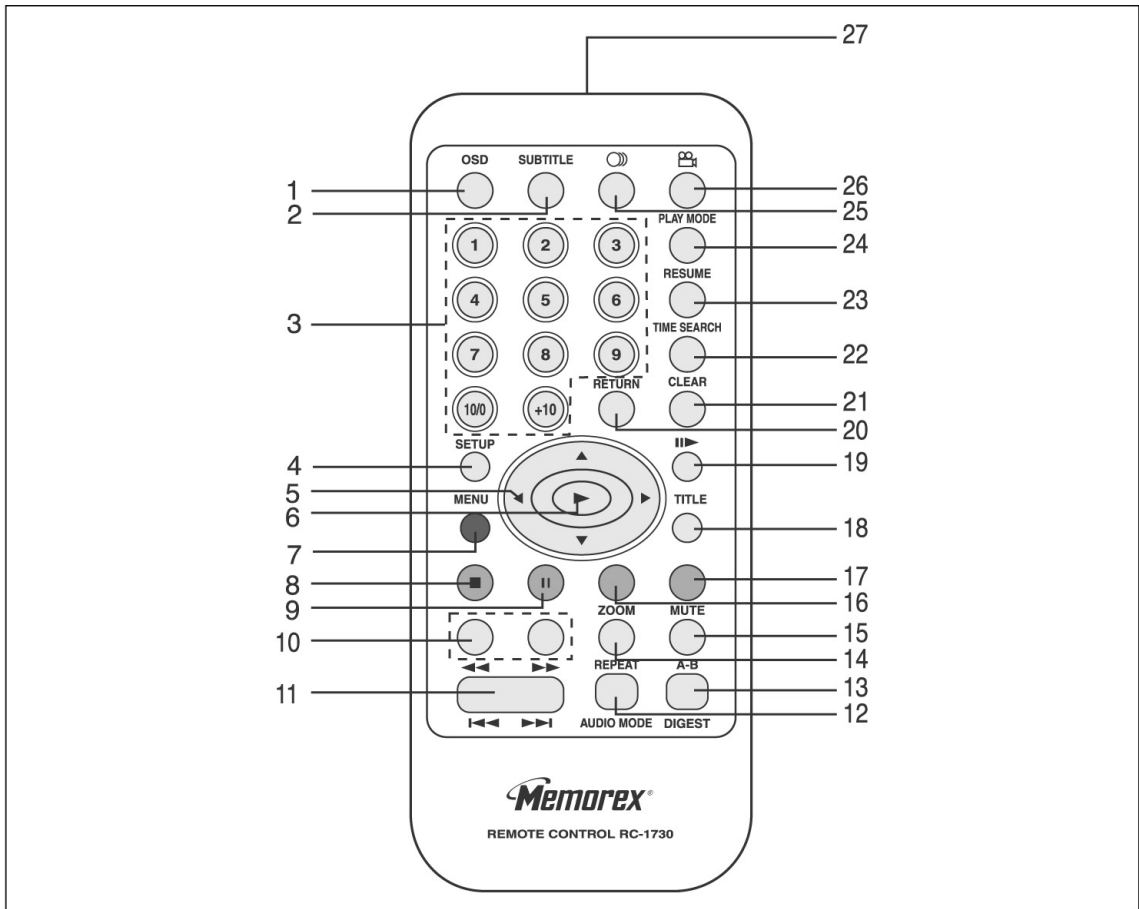

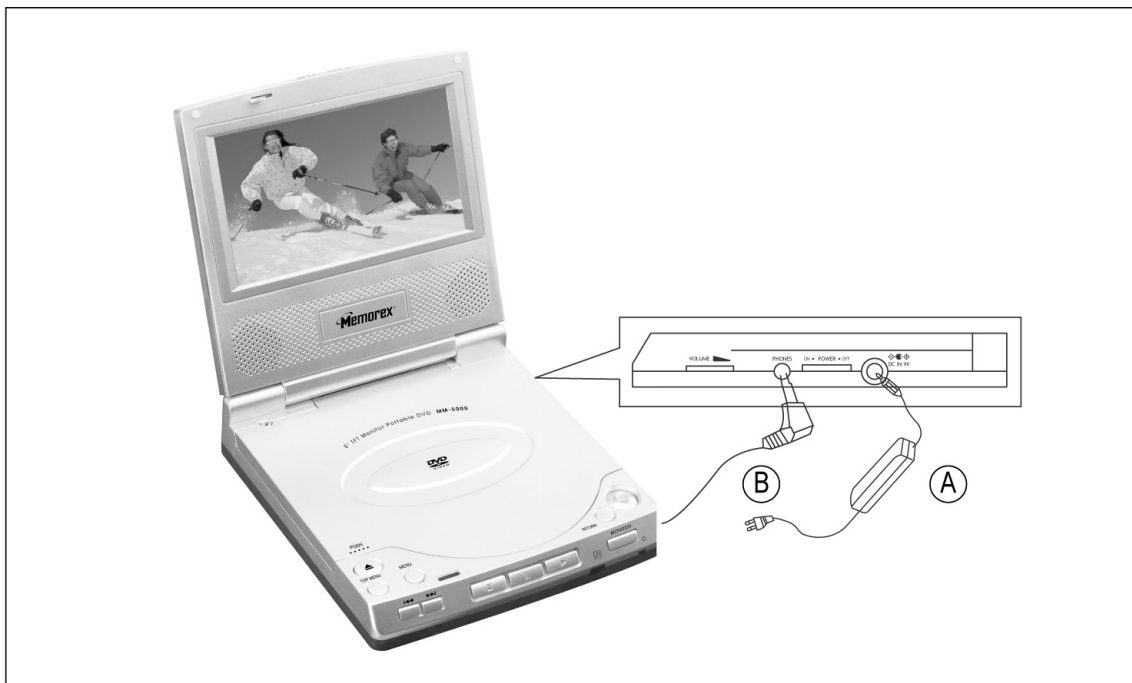

Connections



BEFORE MAKING ANY CONNECTIONS

- Turn the MM-5000 off and also make sure that the external equipment's power is turned off as well.
- Make sure that all the connections are secure.
- When disconnecting a cord or cable hold the plug of that cable and pull in the opposite direction of the external equipment. Do not pull from the cord, this could cause damage to the cord's plug.

USING THE AC ADAPTOR → (A)

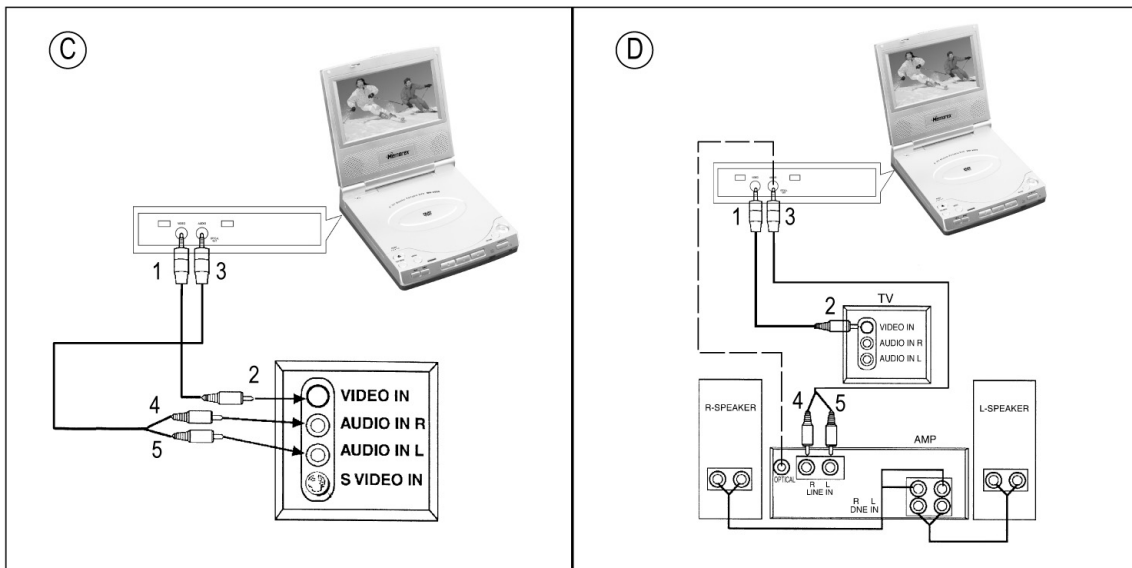
The MM-5000 is designed to use the AC adaptor.

- Make sure that your household electric sockets correspond with your AC adapter's specifications.
- Insert the AC adaptor into the MM-5000's DC INPUT jack.
- Insert one end of the power supply cord into the input jack of the adapter and the other end into the household electric socket.

USE HEADPHONES → (B)

- Insert headphones into the phones jack B of the unit.
- Turn off the power when inserting or removing headphones.

Connections



CONNECT TO A TV → (C)

Connect the AV cables according to diagram (C) :

1. Connect the yellow cable's Mini-plug to the MM-5000's VIDEO OUTPUT jack.
2. Connect the Yellow plug to the TV's VIDEO INPUT jack.
3. Connect the red and white Audio cable's Mini-plug to the MM-5000's AUDIO OUTPUT jack.
4. Connect the Red plug to the TV's AUDIO IN R jack.
5. Connect the White plug to the TV's AUDIO IN L jack.
6. After all connections have been made select the TV's correct input channel by pressing the TV's correct input channel selection button.

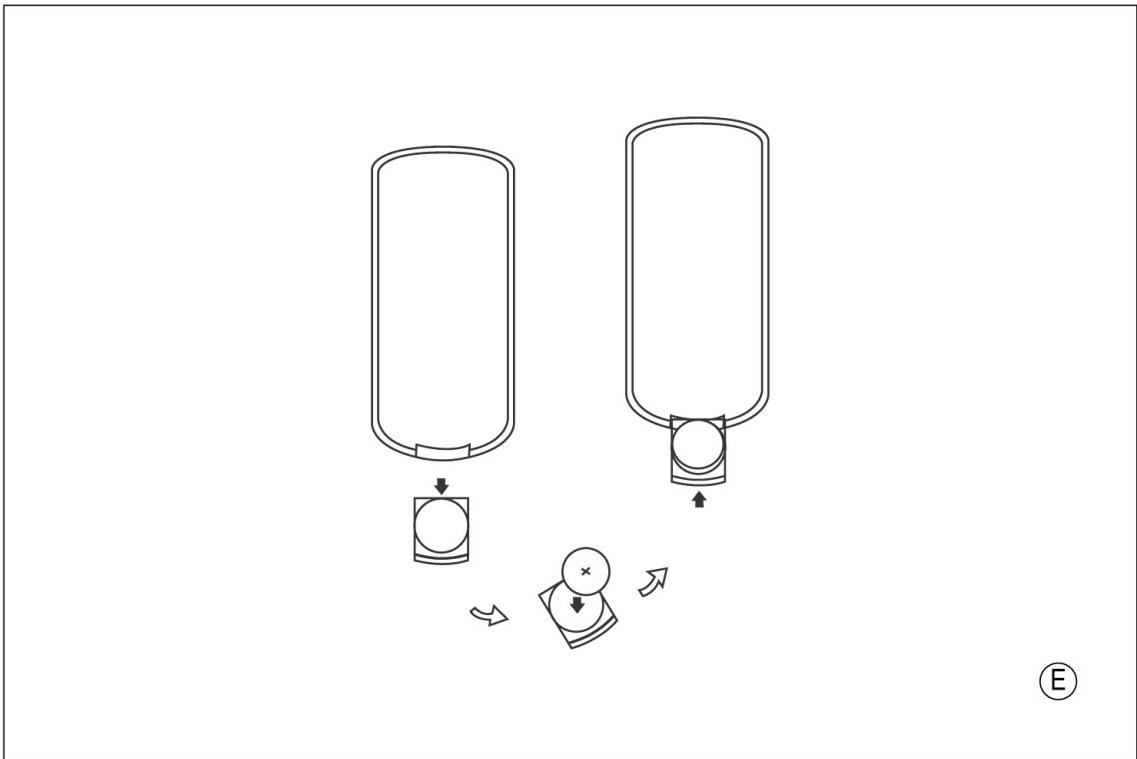
CONNECT TO A TV AND AN AMPLIFIER → (D)

Connect the AV cables according to diagram (D) :

1. Connect the yellow Video cable's Mini-plug to the MM-5000's VIDEO OUTPUT jack.
2. Connect the Yellow plug to the TV's VIDEO INPUT jack.
3. Connect the red and white Audio cable's Mini-plug to the MM-5000's AUDIO OUTPUT jack.
4. Connect the Red plug to the amplifier's AUDIO IN R jack.
5. Connect the White plug to the amplifier's AUDIO IN L jack.
6. If your amplifier has optical digital input terminal, you can connect the DVD player to the amplifier with an optical cable through the optical terminal.
7. After all connections have been made select the TV's correct input channel by pressing the TV's correct input channel selection button and configure the amplifier according to the amplifier's user guide.

Note: If the MM-5000's video signal is outputted through a VCR Macrovision will be activated and distort the video playback. For a more detailed description of Macrovision refer to Pg.35.

Preparations Before Operation



USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- Before using the remote be sure to remove the plastic shipping strap located at the bottom of the remote.
- To use the remote control, point the remote at the sensor located on the front of the unit.
- Make sure to operate the remote within 16 ft at approximately 60 degrees.
- Generally, the remote battery will last for about a year. To replace the battery refer to diagram E and the following steps.

Turn the remote upside down so the buttons are facing down.

Pinch the lever located on the battery compartment towards the center.

While the lever is pinched inward pull the compartment toward you to remove the compartment.



When changing batteries make the + side of the battery corresponds with the + stamped side of the battery compartment.

After the battery has been changed slide the battery compartment back into the remote.



- Be sure to remove the batteries from the remote if the remote is not going to be used for a long period of time.

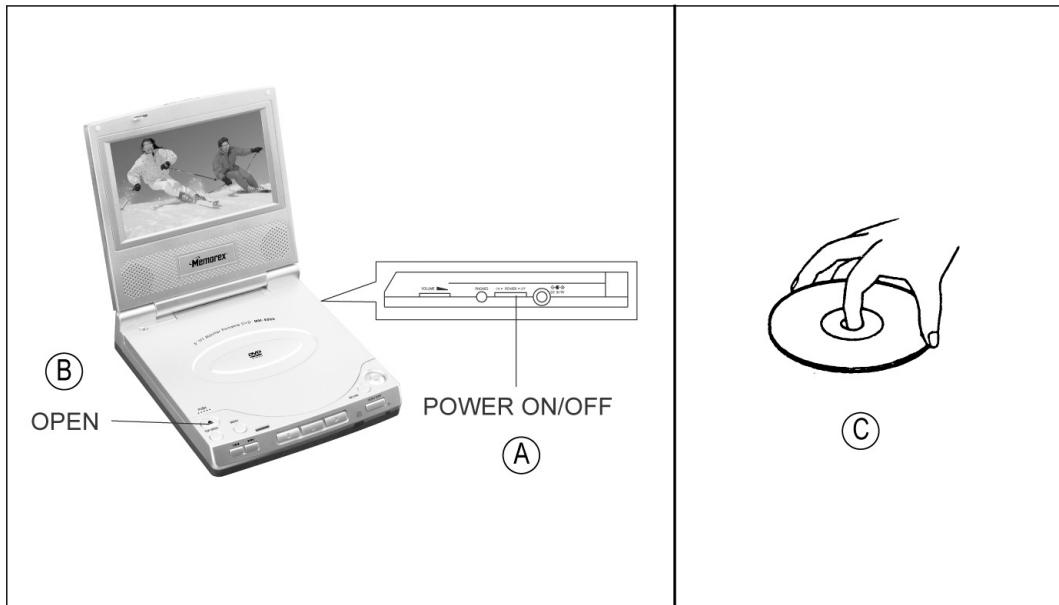

Basic Operations



BEFORE OPERATION → (A)

- To power up the MM-5000 slide the POWER ON/OFF switch shown in diagram A to ON.
- Slide the lock switch to the left and open the TFT screen to an upright position.
- Turn the VOLUME wheel to adjust the volume to preferred levels. The volume knob also controls the headphones volume as well.
- When the MM-5000 is connected to a TV or an amplifier adjust the volume according to the external equipment's user guide.

Note: If headphones are plugged into the AUDIO OUTPUT jack instead of the PHONES jack the VOLUME wheel will not control the headphones volume. To prevent this from happening make sure headphones are always plugged into the PHONES jack.

LOADING DISCS → (B) and (C)

- Press the OPEN button shown in diagram B to open the disc tray.
- To load a disc refer to diagram C and follow the directions below.

Hold the edge of the disc and align the center of the disk with the center of the disk tray.

Once the center of the disc is aligned with the center of the disk tray press the center of the disc so it is firmly seated under the spindle's pins shown in diagram C.

Close the disc tray and wait until it clicks.

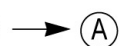

 - You have to press this "◂" button twice to stop the playback of DVD discs.


Pause



Press .


- Pause multi-media playback by pressing the pause button .
- After the pause button has been pressed the unit will go into step mode shown in diagram A.




- When the MM-5000 is in step mode it can advance playback frame by frame every time the pause button  is pressed.
To resume playback press the play button ► .

OSD



The On-Screen Display (OSD) contains many playback features. To see the Display, press the  button on the remote while a disc is playing. The picture being played will be zoomed out to the top of the screen. The Display appears under the zoomed picture. Use the ▲ or ▼ buttons on the remote to move through the different playback features in the Display. When a playback feature is highlighted, press the ► (PLAY) button and the text box by the right side of it will be highlight. Use the ▲ or ▼ buttons on the remote to move through the choices displayed in the text box. Remember, you can only access the Display when you're playing a disc. Also, the Display features are only available if the disc was created with that particular feature.

The invalid symbol "⊘" appears on the screen when a command cannot be performed because it is temporarily unavailable. If one of the playback features is "grayed out", that Display feature isn't available for the disc you're playing.

To make the Display disappear from the screen, press  on the remote.

Basic Operations

WHEN PLAYING DVD

DVD discs have the following playback features: Title, Chapter, Audio, Subtitle, Angle, TT (Title) Time, CH (Chapter) Time, Repeat and Time Display.

◦^ Selecting a Title

Some discs contain more than one title. Each title is divided into chapters. To select a title:

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. If "Title" on the Display isn't highlighted, use the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight it.
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a title number that you want to play.

Note: Some discs only have one title.

◦^ Selecting a Chapter

Because DVD discs use digital technology, a title can be divided into chapters (similar to tracks on a CD).

You can skip to a specific chapter by using the Chapter feature in the Display.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "Chapter".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a chapter number that you want to play.

Notes: The Chapter feature won't work if the disc isn't formatted with separate chapters. You can also advance to the next chapter by pressing ►►| on the remote and go to the preceding chapter by pressing |◄◄ on the remote.

◦^ Changing the Audio Language

If the disc was created with different language tracks (recorded in different languages), you can use the Display to temporarily change the DVD player's Audio Language setting.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "Audio".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the audio languages appear on the screen.
4. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to move through the audio languages that are available on the disc. Press the ► (PLAY) button when the audio language you want to use is highlighted.
5. To make the Display disappear, press the **OSD** button on the remote.

Note: The Language feature only works if the disc was created with multiple audio tracks. When you choose an audio language from the Display, you only override the audio language setting in the DVD player's main menu temporarily.

The audio language can also be changed through the DVD player menu.

◦^ Changing the Subtitle Language

If the disc was created with different subtitles, you can use the Display to change the Subtitle language.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "Subtitle".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the subtitle languages appears.

Basic Operations

4. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to move through the subtitle languages that are available on the disc. Press the ► (PLAY) button when the subtitle language you want to use is highlighted.

5. To make the Display disappear, press the **OSD** button on the remote.

Note: Changing the subtitle language with the Display will only affect the disc currently being played. When the disc is removed or the player is turned off, the subtitle language will revert to the language setting specified through the DVD player main menu. The subtitle language can also be changed through the DVD player menu.

◦^ **Changing the Camera Angle**

Some discs contain multiple angles of a particular scene or sequence. When multiple angles are available, to change the camera angle:

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "Angle".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons to enter an angle number that you want to play.
5. To make the Display disappear, press the **OSD** button on the remote.

◦^ **Setting Title Time**

You can skip to a specific title time by using the Title Time feature in the Display.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "TT (Title) Time".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a title time that you want to play.

◦^ **Setting Chapter Time**

You can skip to a specific chapter time by using the Chapter Time feature in the Display.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "CH (Chapter) Time".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a chapter time that you want to play.

◦^ **Using the Repeat Feature**

The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. There are three Repeat options:

- All-repeats the disc that is playing
- Title-repeats the title that is playing
- Chapter-repeats the chapter that is playing

To Use Repeat:

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to highlight "Repeat".
3. Press the ► (PLAY) button, the repeat options appears.
4. Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to move through the repeat options. Press the ► (PLAY) button when the repeat option you want to use is highlighted.
5. The selected repeat option will loop repeatedly until you turn Repeat off.

Basic Operations

How to Cancel Repeat:

- Press STOP twice.
- Go to Repeat feature in the Display and select Off.
- Eject the disc.

◦^ Shifting the Displayed Time

Using the Time Display feature in the Display, you can shift the time displayed on the screen, between: Title Elapsed Time, Title Remain Time, Chapter Elapsed Time, and Chapter Remain Time.

1. While the disc is playing, press **[OSD]** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Time Disp".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the time options appears.
4. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to move through the time options. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button when the option you want to use is highlighted.
5. To make the Display disappear, press the **[OSD]** button on the remote.

WHEN PLAYING CD

CD discs have the following playback features: Track, Disc Time, Track Time, Repeat and Time Display.

◦^ Selecting a specific Track

1. While the disc is playing, press **[OSD]** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Track".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a track number that you want to play.

◦^ Setting Disc Time

You can skip to a specific disc time by using the Disc Time feature in the Display.

1. While the disc is playing, press **[OSD]** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Disc Time".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a disc time that you want to play.

◦^ Setting Track Time

You can skip to a specific track time by using the Track Time feature in the Display.

1. While the disc is playing, press **[OSD]** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Track Time".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the text box by the right side is now highlighted.
4. Use the number buttons on the remote to enter a track time that you want to play.

◦^ Using the Repeat Feature

The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. There are two Repeat options for CDs:

- All-repeats the disc that is playing
- Track-repeats the track that is playing

To Use Repeat:

1. While the disc is playing, press **[OSD]** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Repeat".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the repeat options appears.
4. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to move through the repeat options. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button when the repeat option you want to use is highlighted.
5. The selected repeat option will loop repeatedly until you turn Repeat off.

Basic Operations

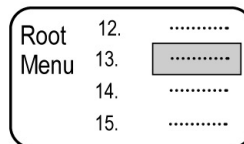
◦^ Shifting the Displayed Time

Using the Time Display feature in the Display, you can shift the time displayed on the screen, between: Single (Track) Elapsed Time, Single (Track) Remain Time, Total (Disc) Elapsed Time, and Total (Disc) Remain Time.

1. While the disc is playing, press **OSD** on the remote to bring up the Display.
2. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to highlight "Time Disp".
3. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button, the time options appears
4. Press the **▲** or **▼** buttons to move through the time options. Press the **▶** (PLAY) button when the option you want to use is highlighted.
5. To make the Display disappear, press the **OSD** button on the remote.

You can also do as follows:

1. Press **▼** to select track 13.



2. Press **▶** (PLAY) to start playing track 13.

Press **TITLE** once to return to the title menu. Press **MENU** once to return to the root menu.

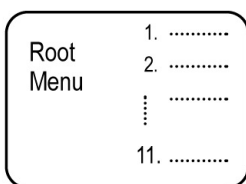

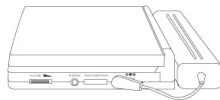
Others

The rechargeable battery pack is suitable when adapting the DVD player for portable use and when it is convenient for you to enjoy the unique functions of the DVD player out of doors. To recharge the battery:

1. Remove the battery pack from the DVD player (if being used) and attach it to the supplied battery charger. Then connect the battery pack output plug to the charger output jack. Connect the charger INPUT jack to the AC adapter output (DC 9V at 2.2A).



- Notes:
- 1) The input voltage of the battery charger is:DC9V, 2.2A;
 - 2) Generally, the battery pack can be charged and discharged about 500 times;
 - 3) The marking voltage of the battery pack is 7.4V, the capacity is 2200mAh. A special IC protection logic is included to prevent deformation caused by over-charging and over-discharging.
2. It takes about 6 hours to fully charge the battery pack; the red charging LED indicator goes out and charging is complete. Unplug the AC power supply cord from the AC adapter; then unplug the battery pack from the battery charger and attach it at the corresponding position at the back of the DVD player. Insert the plug of the battery pack to the DC IN jack of the DVD player.



- Notes:
- 1) A fully-charged battery pack will discharge automatically in a month, if it remains unused.
 - 2) If the battery pack is not used for a long period of time, discharge it and store it in a place that is cool, dry and dark.
