

BEFORE YOU OPERATE YOUR NEW TELEVISION

To get the most from your new color television, read and follow this Owner's Manual carefully.

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

- Place your TV in a room with adequate ventilation.
- Keep your TV set away from sources of direct heat, such as heat registers or direct sunlight.
- Do not place your TV on soft surfaces, such as rugs or blankets.
- Leave enough room for air to circulate around the bottom, top and back of the set.

ANTENNA CONNECTIONS

• For best picture quality, we recommend that you use an outdoor antenna. Follow in - structions on page 6 for proper antenna hookup.

POWER CONNECTION

Serial No

Your TV works on normal household current (120 volts, 60 Hz).

For safety purposes, your TV's electrical plug has one blade wider than the other. If you cannot insert the plug fully into the socket, try reversing it.




REMOTE CONTROL

The REMOTE CONTROL unit requires two 1.5 volt "AA" size batteries. The BATTERY COMPARTMENT is located on the back of the unit. To open, press down of the lid and slide toward the bottom of the unit. Install the batteries exactly as shown by the diagram in the compartment.

NOTE: If one or both of the batteries are reversed, the REMOTE CONTROL will not operate and the unit may be damaged.

This REMOTE CONTROL units uses an INFRARED WIRELESS CONTROL SYSTEM. This means that the remote commands are sent out as invisible light. For best operation, aim the REMOTE CONTROL unit directly at the REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR window on the lower center front of the TV. Please note that furniture or other solid objects can block the path of the infrared light. Dark walls might absorb the light.

Do not allow strong sunshine to fall on the TV set front panel as this may affect the operation of the remote control. In this case, tune the TV away from the light or darken the room slightly.



Remote Control

Number Buttons

Press to select a channel. For channels 1-9, press 0, then the channel you want to watch. For example, for channel 6, press 0, 6. For channels 100-125, press the 100 button, then press the last two digits of the channel you want to watch. For example, for channel 116, press 100, 1,6. Note :Make sure you press the second or third digit of a channel within a few seconds of pressing the first digit. If you don't, you'll have to start over

> - and + Buttons Press to adjust or select functions listed in on-screen displays.

MENU Button

Press to call up the main menu screen. Also, press to enter data when going to the next step of an operation.

TV/CAP (tion) / TEXT Button When you are watching a closed caption program, press this button to switch between the standard TV screen, closed captioning, and half-screen text. See page 17 for details.

MUTE Button Press once to eliminate sound. Press again to hear sound.

POWER Button

Press to turn the TV on or off.

SLEEP Button

Press to start the sleep time or to display the time left in a sleep timer. See page 15 for details.

RECALL Button

Press to display the channel being viewed. Press again to display the time. Press again to remove the on-screen display. Note: If the RECALL button is pressed when the TV is in closed caption mode (See page 17 for details), captions or text will not be displayed.

Q. REV. (Quick Review) Button

Press to return to the previous channel. For example, if you were watching channel 2, then use the Number buttons to switch to channel 6, pressing the Q.REV button will return the TV to channel 2.

CH 1/CH 2 Button

Switches between channel 1 and channel 2 of the closed caption mode. See page 17 for details.

CHANNEL (Up/Down) Buttons

Press to scroll up or down through the channels.


VOLUME (Up/Down) Buttons

Press to raise or lower the sound.

ANTENNA CONNECTIONS

If you are using an indoor or outdoor antenna (antennas no included) follow the instructions below that correspond to your antenna system. If you are using a cable television service (CATV), refer to CATV connections.

Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Single 75 ohm cable or 300 ohm twin-lead wire)



Connect the 75 ohm cable from combination VHF/UHF antenna to the antenna jack.


OR

If your combination antenna has a 300 ohm twin-lead wire, use the 300-75 ohm matching transformer (not included)



To prevent problems it is recommended that you use only the specified transformer. (Transformer Part No.:1398-017)

CATV CONNECTIONS



For subscribers to basic cable service. For basic cable service without a converter/descrambler box, connect the CATV 75 ohm coaxial cable directly to the antenna jack on back of the unit.



Some cable companies offer "premium pay" channels in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.

The illustrations below show how to connect these types of converter/descrambler devices with the TV's VHF antenna jack.

You may need a two-set signal splitter (sometime called a "two-set coupler") and an A/B switch box from the cable installer or an electronic supply store. With the A/B switch in the "B" position, you can then tune directly to any non-scrambled channels using your TV's tuning system or remote control. In the "A" position, you can tune your TV to the output channel of the decoder (generally Channel 3/4) and use the cable company's equipment to tune scrambled channels. Since cable systems vary, you may wish to consult your local cable company.

For subscribers to scrambled pay cable service




To allow viewing of all channels through converter/descrambler. TV must be set to the output channel of the converter/ descrambler (usually ch 3 or 4).

NOTE: If you subscribe to a cable service which requires you to use a converter/descrambler box, follow the connections shown above.

If your basic cable channels are unscrambled and are using a converter/descrambler for premium channels, follow the connections shown below.

For subscribers of unscrambled basic cable with a converter/descrambler box for viewing premium channels.



A - Allows viewing of scrambled channels through converter/descrambler box.

B - Allows full use of TV tuner and Remote Control.

NOTE: For other cable connections, consult your cable company.

POWER SOURCE

Connect the polarized AC cord plug to a 120V AC 60Hz household outlet.

NOTES:

- 1. NEVER CONNECT THE AC CORD PLUG TO OTHER THAN THE SPECIFIED VOLTAGE.
 - USE THE ATTACHED POWER CORD ONLY.
- 2. IF THE POLARIZED AC CORD DOES NOT FIT INTO A NON-POLARIZED AC OUTLET, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO FILE OR CUT THE WIDE BLADE.




Polarized AC Cord

QUICK USE GUIDE


If you're already familiar with TV hookup and operation, just follow the quick steps below to make some basic connections and adjustments before using your new TV.


- Place batteries in the remote control. (See page 4).
- Connect the TV to an antenna or cable. (See page 6).
- Connect a power supply.
- Press the POWER button to turn the TV on.
- Press the MENU button to bring up the main menu screen. Press the + or – button to highlight LANGUAGE, then press the MENU button until the on screen menu is in the language you want it to be in. (See page 9).
- Use the + or button to highlight CH PROGRAM, then press the MENU button to select it. Press the + or – button to highlight AIR/CABLE, then press the MENU button until the input you have connected to your TV (AIR for antenna or CABLE for cable) appears to the right of AIR/CABLE. Then use the + or – button to highlight EXIT, and press the MENU button to exit. (See page 11 for details).
- 7 Go to page 11 and program channels.
- Use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) or Number buttons to select a channel for viewing. Use the VOLUME (Up/Down) buttons to adjust the sound level.










- Use the + or button to select the hour you want the timer to come on, then press the MENU button. Use the + or – button to select the minute(s) you want the timer to come on, then press the MENU button. Use the + or – button to select AM or PM, then press the MENU button. Follow the same steps to set the time off.
- ☑ Use the CHANNEL (Up or Down) buttons, + or − buttons, or Number buttons to select the channel you want the TV to come on, then press the MENU button.
- Press the MENU button to select the day(s) of the week you do not want the TV to come on. Once that day is flashing, use the + or button to unselect that day of the week (the TV will not come on) signified in red or reselect that day of the week (the TV will come on) signified in white.



While EXIT is blinking, press the + or - button to exit.







CLOSED CAPTION MODE


Close caption mode allows you to read the words of a broadcast on-screen while you are hearing them.

- There are two types of closed captioning: Captions Dialogue and descriptions of the action appear in a box at the bottom of the screen.
- · Text Words appear on the screen. This is often used for channel guides.

Often, you can access captions or text in more than one language.

Note: To obtain closed captioning, the TV station must be broadcasting a program in closed captioning. If the TV station is not broadcasting a program in closed captioning, you cannot view captions or text. Refer to your TV guide for information about which shows are avaiable in closed captioning.

Press the TV/CAP(tion)/Text button until CAPTION or TEXT – whichever you want - appears in the lower right corner of the screen.



Press the CH1/CH2 button to select English (CH1) or foreign language (CH2) captions or text.

CABLE TV OPERATION

1 Press the MENU button to bring up the main menu screen.


- **2** Use the + or button to highlight CH PROGRAM, then press the MENU button to select it.
- **3** Press the MENU button until CABLE appears to the right of AIR/CABLE.


On CATV (Cable Television) systems, programs are brought into the home on VHF channels 2–13, mid-band channels A–I, super band channels J–W, hyper band channels AA–CCC, ultra band channels W+30–W+84 and sub midband channels (5A, A5–A1). When CATV is selected, the numbers will change color from yellow to green to indicate the TV is in the cable mode. Channels 2 through 13 are selected directly. Channel A can be tuned in by selecting number 14 on this TV, channel B by selecting number 15, and so on as follows:

NOTE: The actual number of channels received depends upon channel reception in your area or your cable system

Most CATV systems use letters to designate channels but others use numbers. To tune in a numbered channel, select the same number on the TV. Consult your local Cable TV company to find out which of these channels are receivable and which type of Cable system is used in your area. (Some cable TV systems use scrambled or encoded signals and require special converters to receive these channels.)








Table 1 indicates the only valid combinations of age and content based ratings with an "X" in the appropriate boxes. For example, TV-14-S,V is a valid rating, as is TV-14. However, TV-14-FV is not a valid rating.

SETTING TV RATING - 2 (CONTENT RATING)

• From item no. 4 of SETTING TV RATING -1 the selected age-based rating will flash, press the MENU button to confirm selection and at the same time content will appear with first content flashing. The Content will flash in this sequence :

 $D \rightarrow L \rightarrow S \rightarrow V$

• To select all, press the MENU button after every flashing rating to confirm selection.

If you want to delete any of the D, L, S, V Rating, when the selected Rating is flashing press the + or - button and the Rating will change to yellow blank. Press the MENU button, the yellow blank will disappear and the rating is deleted then the next rating will start flashing.

NOTES

- If user chooses to block program base on age-rating without any content rating therefore program will be blocked only base on age-rating while D, L, S, V Rating will be ignored.
- If users chooses to block program with combination of age and content rating therefore all programs with a more restrictive age rating but a similar content rating than the one selected will also be blocked.

For example :

If user chooses to block any program with TV-PG-V rating, all entries in that column are automatically blocked as shown in table 2. At the same time it will cause no blocking of any program with D, L, S rating. Similarly, the same will happen if user chooses to block other rating such as D, L or S.


V-BLOCK OPERATION


 When the TV set receives any input signal with the selected rating level, the TV automatically enable program blocking and V-BLOCK message is display on screen together with the rating level as shown below. The channel blocking should always cease if the input source is changed or if no rating data is received or if the channel is changed.



- MPAA RATING and TV RATING cannot be selected simultaneously so only one rating system can be used at a time.
- If you don't want to block MPAA RATING, set this Rating to OFF.

BEFORE REQUESTING SERVICE

Before requesting service, check the following list of problems and solutions. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

PROBLEM	SOLUTION
No Power	 Make sure the unit is plugged in. Unplug the unit from the electrical outlet for 60 seconds. Then plug it in and turn it on again.
No Picture	 Make sure the antenna is properly connected at the back of the TV. Make sure the antenna is not broken. Adjust the brightness and contrast controls.
No Sound	 Use the VOLUME (Up/Down) buttons to turn up the volume. Make sure the sound is not muted by pressing the MUTE button.
No Color	 Make sure the show is being transmitted in color by checking to see if another channel is in color. Adjust the color control.
Wrong Color	Adjust the color and tint controls.
Picture Too Light/Dark	Adjust the brightness and contrast controls.
Picture Interference	 Check the antenna for shorted or broken wires. Reposition the antenna. Try another channel to make sure there is no station trouble or local interference (such as electric motors). If possible, minimize by adjusting the antenna.
Remote control Doesn't Work	 Make sure batteries are inserted in the remote control. Make sure the remote control is aimed directly at the remote sensor on the TV.
Big black box on screen	 Press the TV/CAP/TEXT button until the CAP or TEXT box disappears from the screen.
