Cleaning the Lens

If the lens becomes dusty, clean it with a camera lens blower. Be careful not to scratch the surface of the lens.

Cleaning the Cabinet

From time to time, clean the cabinet with a soft dry cloth. For more stubborn stains, slightly moisten the cloth with water or a mild detergent solution. Never use benzene, alcohol or other solvents as they may damage the finish of the cabinet.

Cleaning the Disc

When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out. Note - Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static sprays intended for analog discs.




