# **Room Monitor**

If you wish to continue the room monitoring press (2) key again within 8 seconds.





### To stop and save messages during playback



- Press the (7) key on the telephone keypad to stop message playback.
- 2. You hear a double beep and all messages are automatically saved.


#### To erase all messages after playback




- After message playback, press the (\*) key on the telephone keypad followed by the (4) key within 8 seconds after the remote voice menu is played.
- 2. You hear a long beep and all messages are erased.

#### To record a memo message

Follow steps 1-4 "Accessing your Unit by Remote Control" to access the unit



- 1. Press the (\*) key followed by the (2) key on the telephone keypad.
- When you hear a long beep, start dictating your memo message (for a maximum of 60 seconds).



3. Press the (7) key to stop recording and you hear a beep.


note >>> If you wish to enter further commands for remote functions, do so within 8 seconds after the remote voice menu is played or a long beep sounds and the call is automatically terminated.


- A. Power Jack Socket Connect power adaptor lead.
- B. Telephone Jack Socket Connect the unit to telephone socket.
- C. LED Indicator Illuminates when unit is on and flashes when new messages are received.
- D. Skip ◀ / Memo button Used when recording or replaying Memo and 2 Way Recording messages. Used when setting Day / Time stamp and Security code.
- E. Delete button To erase recorded messages.
- F. ON / OFF button To turn unit on or off. Used when setting Security Code.
- G. Microphone Used when recording Out Going Message (OGM), memo messages and handsfree conversation.
- H. Ringer Volume Switch Adjust the ringer volume to high, low or turn the ringer off.
- 1. Receiver Volume Switch Adjust the handset receiver volume to high or normal.
- J. Message Counter Display -Shows total number of messages recorded. Shows unit status.
- K. Play / Stop button To play recorded messages. To stop message playback.
- L. Time button To set and check the Day / Time stamp.
- M. Skip ► / OGM button To record and check Out Going Message (OGM). Used when setting 3 digit Security Code.
- N. Volume Control Adjust to clearly hear recorded messages, OGM announcements.
- O. Tone / Pulse Switch To set the unit either Tone or Pulse dialling mode.
- P. Flash button Use with network service.
- Q. Mute button To disable the handset and handsfree microphone.
- R. Redial / Pause button To redial the last number called or insert a pause during dialling.
- S. Handsfree button To receive and place calls without having to use the handset.

# Turn the unit Off by Remote Control

Follow steps 1-4 on "Accessing your Unit by Remote Control" to access the unit.









# Connecting to the Telephone Line

Connect the telephone line cord to the Telephone Jack Socket (B) on the rear of the base.

Connect the opposite end of telephone line cord to the telephone modular wall jack.

Connect one end of the coiled handset cord to the handset jack of the base unit (located on the left hand side of the base) and the other end of the handset jack of the handset.





#### Set Tone / Pulse Switch

The **PULSE** mode is used if you have pulse dialling service. The **TONE** mode is used if you have Tone (**DTMF**) dialling service.


If you are not certain which type of service you have, check with your local phone company.

If your local telephone system is **PULSE**, you can access the computer operative service such as phone banking or other carrier service by pressing "•" key once, the telephone will change to **TONE** dialling temporary. Your telephone will automatically revert back to **PULSE** dialling after the handset is replaced on cradle or **HANDSFREE** function released.






# To change or check the Security Code




1. Press and hold the ON / OFF button (F) until the beep (about 2 seconds), the Message Counter (J) displays "Sc".




2. Release the button and the Message Counter display (J) scrolls the current code set giving a beep after each digit.

3. After the long beep the display shows the first digit of the code ready for setting.



4. Press and release the SKIP → / OGM (M) button or SKIP 44 / MEMO button (D) repeatedly to select the first digit for your new code.



5. Press and release the ON / OFF button (F) to accept the first digit and the display shows the second digit of the code ready for setting.

6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 above to enter the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> digits for your new code.

note >>> To exit and abandon the changes or retain the previous set code, press and release the PLAY / STOP button (K) and you hear a double beep.

> The unit gives a double beep and automatically abandons the setting procedure if no key is pressed within 8 seconds of the last entry.

# **Remote Control**


When you call your number and want to retrieve your messages, you must first enter your 3 digit Security Code via a remote tone telephone keypad. All the units functions are then accessible via the tone telephone keypad.

important >>> During remote operation, you must press and hold all key commands for a minimum of 1 second, and enter a command within 8 seconds of any beep or previous command. If you do not respond within 8 seconds after voice menu is played you hear a long beep and the unit automatically disconnects the call. During remote voice


announcement you can skip the voice menu by entering the selected command key.

#### Flash

On a switchboard this function facilitates call transfer from one extension to another. To transfer a call:




1. Press FLASH button (P) once. Press extension number to transfer call to.







 Press and hold the Delete button (E) for (about 2 seconds), the Message Counter (J) displays "ES" until long beep.




# To restore all erased messages

note >>> This function only works to restore all erased messages. You cannot restore messages erased individually during message playback.




# **Recording Memo Messages**

- Start dictating your memo message. After the long beep, speak clearly towards the microphone (G) from approximately 6-8 inches. The display counts the seconds as you record your memo message.





# **Two Way Recording**


You can record an ordinary telephone conversation if required. This feature can be achieved when handset is picked up or press **HANDSFREE** button (S) or during a call in progress.



 Press and hold the SKIP 4/ MEMO button (D) for about 2 seconds. After a short beep Message counter (J) displays "2A".




The conversation is now being record and the Message Counter (J) continues to show "2A".





#### To turn unit on or off

The unit is set to answer calls only when the LED Indicator (C) is illuminated.


 To turn the unit off, press and release the ON / OFF button (F). The Message Counter display (J) quickly flashes "OF", the unit will beep and the LED Indicator (C) goes out.

note >>> If there were outstanding messages when the unit was turned off, the LED Indicator (C) flashes when the unit is turned on again and the Message Counter displays the message total.

#### To record or change your OGM

Your announcement should ask callers to leave a message.

Try to keep your announcement brief (under 60 seconds) as this maximizes the recording time available for incoming messages.




 Press and hold the Skip → / OGM button (M), the Message Counter (J) displays "A1" until you hear a long beep.


- Release the button and start recording your OGM announcement speaking clearly towards the microphone (G) from approximately 6 - 8 inches.
- The Message Counter display (J) counts from 0 (zero) to 59. The maximum record time is 60 seconds at which point you will hear a beep and recording automatically stops and the unit replays your announcement.

- After the last message the unit announces "End of messages", and they are saved automatically.
- note >>> All messages remain in the memory buffer until erased. Follow the procedure above to replay your messages.
- note >>> If no messages are recorded, the unit will announce, "You have no messages".

#### To stop message playback




 Press the PLAY / STOP button (K) during message play back and you hear a double beep.



Playback stops and all messages are automatically saved.

#### To skip or repeat messages



- Press and release the SKIP 4/ MEMO button (D) or the SKIP >> / OGM button (M) during message playback.
- note >>> Press and release the SKIP →/ OGM button once, the current message will skip ahead to the next message.
- note >>> Press and release the SKIP 4/ MEMO button (D) once to replay current message and twice to skip back to previous message.





#### Mute

During a call you can mute your voice so that your caller cannot hear you while you hold a conversation with someone else in the room.




Press & hold the MUTE button (Q).






You can press the **PLAY** / **STOP** button (K) at any time during the setting procedure to exit and abandon any changes. You hear a double beep to confirm exit.





# To erase individual messages



- During message playback, press and release the DELETE button (E) to erase the current message being replayed.
- The unit beeps, erases that message and then continues to replay the next recorded message.




- The Message Counter (J) displays "Fu" when full.
- After 3 rings of the telephone, the unit answers calls with a voice message "Memory full, please call later".
- 3. The OGM announcement does not play and messages will not record.
- Replay all messages, then follow the "Erase all Messages" procedures above or erase messages Remotely.

# **Security Code**


Used to access your unit remotely. Before you can access your unit by remote control you must first enter a 3 digit Security Code into your unit. The unit comes with a factory default Security Code of 159 which can be changed to any 3 digits ranging from 000 to 999.

# Set Ringer Volume Switch



To alter the volume of the ringer, move the Ringer switch (H) at the rear of the unit, selecting HI, LOW or OFF.

#### Set Receiver Volume Switch



To alter the volume of the handset receiver, move the Receiver switch (I) at the rear of the unit selecting Normal , or High.

Having connected the system your unit is now ready to receive incoming calls "LED Indicator (C) illuminated".


If you have not recorded your own personalized Out Going Message (OGM) the unit will automatically announce the following, "Hello we cannot take your call at the moment, please leave your message after the tone".

To record your own personalized OGM refer to "To record or change your OGM".





# **Accessing your unit by Remote Control**



- 3. After the long beep enter your 3 digit Security Code and you hear one long beep.
- 4. The unit announces "You have xx messages" and plays voice menu. You now have 8 seconds to respond with a command or you hear a long beep and the unit automatically terminates remote operation.


# **Turn the unit On by Remote Control**

If you forget to turn the unit on:

- 1. Call your telephone number.
- 2. After (10) rings the unit answers and you hear a double beep.
- 3. Enter your 3 digit Security Code via the telephone keypad and you will hear one long beep.



 The unit sets the answer mode to ON and plays remote voice menu.




Press the (#) key on the telephone keypad and then hang up or continue with other remote commands.

# Installing the Unit

#### Installing the Battery

- 1. If connected, unplug the unit from the telephone line and power adaptor.
- 2. Remove the screw and open the battery compartment cover (located underneath the unit).
- Insert a 9V (1604) alkaline or carbon-zinc battery (not supplied) observing the polarity as indicated on the base of the compartment.
- 4. Replace the cover securing with the screw.



important >>> During power failure the 9V (1604) alkaline or carbon-zinc battery maintains your Out Going Message (OGM), any recorded messages and your Security Code, but the unit will not operate until mains power is restored.

note >>> If you do not install a 9V (1604) alkaline or carbon-zinc battery, any disruption to the mains power supply will result in loss of your own OGM announcement, any recorded messages and your own Security Code. The OGM announcement and Security Code will revert to the factory default settings.

# **Connecting the Power Adaptor**


Only use with the adaptor supplied or damage will be caused.

- Insert the power adaptor lead into the power Jack socket (A) and connect the unit to the mains supply.
- The unit beeps and performs a "self check" and the Message Counter display (J) counts from 0 (zero) to 15 and beeps again and switches on LED which illuminates.
- After a long beep the Message Counter display (J) flashes "CL" and "0" and repeats this sequence until the clock is set.


note >>> If the battery is installed incorrectly or exhausted, then "LO" is added to the display sequence - "LO", "CL" and "O".

If you do not want to be disturbed by incoming calls whilst you are setting up the unit, it may be desirable at this stage to set the Clock Day / Time stamp and your own Out Going Message (OGM) before following the connection procedure.

# 2. During message playback



- Press the (5) key on the telephone keypad once to skip forward to the next recorded message. The unit skips forward every time the (5) key is pressed.



 Press the (3) key once during current message playback to skip to the beginning of that message.



 Press the (3) key twice during message announcement to skip back and replay the previous message.


- Press the (\*) key followed by the (3) key on the telephone keypad.
- After a beep, enter your new 3 digit Security Code, you will hear a long beep.



Press the (#) key on the telephone keypad and then hang up after the long beep or enter further commands.

# To change your OGM announcement


