







A Getting Started

Basic Antenna Connection

Cable Connections

(A) Without a Converter/Descrambler Box

Use this connection if your cable system connects directly to your Monitor/Recorder without a converter box.



With this connection, you can:

- 1) use your Monitor/Recorder remote control to select channels.
- 2) program one or more unscrambled channels for timer recording.

NOTE:


- You can use the Monitor/Recorder Channel Up/Down keys to select the desired channel.
- You cannot record or view scrambled channels with this connection.

Note to CATV System installer

This reminder is provided to call the CATV (Cable TV) System Installers attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

B) With a Converter/Descrambler Box

If your cable service supplies you with a converter box, you can use the basic connection shown here.



With this connection, you can record and view any channel including scrambled channels. However, channel selection must be made at the cable company converter box. This means that channels cannot be changed using the Monitor/Recorder remote control. Timer playback is limited to one channel at a time, and you cannot view another channel other than the one you are recording.


To Record and View a Scrambled/Unscrambled Channel

- 1. Set the Monitor/Recorder channel selector to the output channel of the cable converter box (e.g. CH3).
- 2. Select the channel to be recorded at the cable converter box.
- Note: Refer to pages 8 and 9 for instructions on setting tuner to the cable TV mode.

Description of Controls

Front



1) Cassette Compartment

Where the video cassette is inserted.

② Stop/Eject Button

To stop the tape. To remove a cassette in the stop mode.

③ On Timer Indicator

This indicator lights when the On Timer is set.

Program Timer Indicator

This indicator lights when the Monitor/Recorder is set for unattended (timer) playback. It flashes when a Timer Playback has been set, but a tape has not been inserted or the clock is not set.

5 Built-In Speaker

Sound comes out here.

6 Rewind/Search Button

To rewind tapes. Also, during playback press this button to view the picture in rapid reverse.

Play/Repeat Button

To play back a tape. In SP or SLP playback, press this button once more for rapid search at twice the normal speed. Also, during playback press this button to set the Auto Repeat function.

8 Fast Forward/Search Button

To rapidly advance the tape. Also, during playback press this button to view a rapid forward search.

9 Earphone Jack

An optional earphone plugs in here to monitor the sound.

- (1) Rec Button Press this button and Play button at the same time to begin a recording.
- (1) Repeat Indicator This indicator lights when the repeat function is selected and playback is in progress.
- 12 Record Indicator

This indicator lights during recording.

- (3) Wireless Remote Sensor Receives the signal from the wireless remote control.
- Power Button To turn the monitor on and off.
- (5) Channel Up/Down Keys

Used to select the desired Monitor/Recorder tuner channel. Can also be used to clear or reset items in a displayed program.

Tracking Control

Use these keys during playback if the image is partially obscured by bands of noise.

V-Lock Control


Use these keys to lock out vertical jitter in SP or SLP Still mode.

(b) Volume Up/Down Buttons

Press either the Volume Up or Down button to change the sound level from the built-in speaker.

6 Description of Controls (continued)

Rear



1 Video Input Connector

For video input connection from another VCR.

2 Audio Input Connector

For connection from a portable video camera, another VCR or the output connector of another audio source.


③ VHF/UHF Antenna Input Terminal

In from the Antenna or Cable.

Wireless Remote Control

Most of the Monitor/Recorder functions are conveniently controlled with your wireless remote control.

For battery replacement see the back cover.



Description of Controls (continued)

- On Timer Button
 To set the On Timer.
- ② Power Button

To turn the monitor on and off.

③ Pause/Still Button

To temporarily stop the tape during recording or to view a still picture during playback.

(4) Rewind/Search Button

To rewind tapes. Also, during playback press this button to view the picture in rapid reverse.

(5) Stop Button

To stop the tape.

¿ Zero Search/1 Minute Skip Button

In play mode, press this button to skip over 60 seconds of tape. In Stop mode, press this button to search for the point the Time Counter was set to 0:00:00.

⑦ Numbered Keys

(0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9) Used to select desired Monitor/ Recorder tuner channels. (100) Press this button first when selecting channels 100 through 125.

⑧ Menu Button

To select the MENU screen.

Prog Button

Used for Timer Playback and to display timer programs.

① Clear Button

Press this button to clear the setting for the displayed program contents. Press to move the cursor back for correction during Timer Programming and Clock Set.

(1) Counter Reset Button

Resets the time counter when it is displayed.

(2) Tape Speed Selector (SP/LP/SLP)

Set this selector to the desired recording speed.

(3) Slow Buttons Slow Motion

Press the Slow button in playback for slow motion on tapes recorded in SP or SLP. The Up/Down buttons let you adjust the slow motion speed from about 1/5 to about 1/60 of normal speed. **Frame Advance**

Press repeatedly or hold down to advance the picture frame-byframe in still mode for tapes recorded in SP or SLP.

Image: Seep Timer Button

Each press of this button advances the automatic off timer by 30 minutes (maximum is 90 minutes).

(5) Mute Button

To turn the sound off. Press again and the sound will return.

(6) Play Button To play back a tape.

⑦ Rec Button

Press to record.

(B) Fast Forward/Search Button

To rapidly advance the tape. Also in playback press this button to do a rapid forward visual search.

(9) Rapid Tune Button

To instantly select the last channel you were watching.

② Channel Up/Down Keys

Used to select the desired Monitor/Recorder tuner channel. Can also be used to clear or reset items in a displayed program. Tracking Control

Use these keys during playback if the image is partially obscured by bands of noise.

V-Lock Control

Use these keys to lock out vertical jitter in SP or SLP Still mode.

Add/Delete Button

Used to add or delete a channel from the current channel memory.

② Volume Up/Down Buttons

Press either Volume Up or Down button to change the sound.

23 Set Button

To enter selections when setting the clock, setting up a Timer Playback etc. To set items from on-screen displays.

② Select Up/Down Buttons

To make selections when setting the clock, setting up a Timer Playback etc. To select items from on-screen displays.

25 Closed Caption Button

To select the desired caption mode.

Display Button

Press this button to display or clear the time counter, time, function, tape speed, and channel number.


One Time Set Ups

Your Monitor/Recorder can be set to Tuner ON or Tuner OFF. When the Monitor/Recorder is first turned on, the tuner is set to off and a prompt to set the clock is displayed. By selecting "TUNER:ON" (see below), you can place channels in memory and/or use the Auto Clock Set feature (see next page).

Set the Clock (Initial Power On)

Accurate clock time is a must for all types of timer Playback. Your Monitor/Recorder will accurately maintain its calendar up to Dec. 31, 2089, 11:59PM, once you have set the current day and time.

1 Press the Power button. When the Monitor/Recorder is first turned on, the screen at right appears.



: PUSH SET

- 2 Press the Menu button to display the SET CLOCK screen.
- 3 Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to select and enter the month, date, year, time and D. S. T. (Davlight Saving Time).
 - The day of week appears automatically.
 - "DST:ON" automatically adjust for daylight saving time. (See page 25 for details.)

To make Corrections


Press the Set or Clear button repeatedly to move back or forward to the desired item.

4 Press the Menu button twice to start the clock and exit this mode.


Select Tuner ON or OFF

When Tuner OFF is selected, your Monitor/Recorder is automatically in LINE mode. When Tuner ON is selected, Channel selection, Input selection, Channel Add/Delete, etc. is available.


1 Press the Menu button to display the menu.




Set Up Channels (TUNER:ON only)

- 1 Press the Channel Up or Down button to display the CHANNEL AUTO SET guide screen.
 - If you turn the Monitor/ Recorder off after the tuner is set to ON, when you turn it back on, the CHANNEL AUTO SET screen appears automatically.

2 Press the Channel Up button to start Channel Auto Set.

 If the clock is not set, after channels have been placed in memory, the following on-screen displays appear in sequence: "PLEASE SET CLOCK BY PUSHING MENU KEY' If this screen appears, set the clock.

One Time Set Ups (continued)

Auto Clock Set (TUNER:ON only)

When TUNER:ON is selected, you can program your Monitor/Recorder for Auto Clock Set by entering your PBS channel. This feature is not available when Tuner OFF is selected.

- It takes about 10 seconds for the Monitor/Recorder to determine whether or not Auto Clock Set is available. Then, depending on your local broadcasting company, it takes from about 1 minute to 10 minutes to set the clock. If you would rather not wait, please press the Stop button and set the clock manually.
- 1 Press the Menu button to display the SET CLOCK screen.

To Make Corrections

Add or Delete a Channel (TUNER:ON only)


1 Select the channel to be add or deleted using the Channel Up/Down or the Numbered keys.

The Numbered keys select all channels regardless of whether they have a signal or not.

The Channel Up/Down Keys select only those channels which are in the Monitor/Recorder's channel memory.

2 Press the Add/Delete button.

The display shown below appears for a few seconds. To select a deleted channel, use the Numbered keys on the remote control.



Using the 100 key (TUNER:ON only)

When selecting CATV channel numbers 100 to 125 with the numbered keys, first press the 100 key and then enter the remaining two digits. For example, for 125 channel.

Press Numbered keys 100, 2, 5.

Rapid Tune (TUNER:ON only)



To Play Video Tapes

Preparation:

• Make sure that the steps in "Getting Started" on page 3 have been completed.



1 Insert a cassette.

The power will come on automatically. If the record tab (p.23) is removed, playback will start automatically. In this case, skip step 2. If a cassette is already in the Monitor/Recorder, just press the Power button ON.

- 2 Press the Play button. Playback starts.
- **3** Press the Stop button.


Playback stops.

4 Press the Rewind button if you want to rewind the tape. And press the Stop/Eject button on the Monitor/Recorder if you want to eject the tape.

Caution:

Please inspect your cassette tape for any loose or peeling labels as it may become jammed in your unit.

The Play Lock mode will be cancelled.




Play Lock Mode

The Monitor/Recorder may be locked in Repeat Play mode so that all other function keys are inoperative.

Hold down the Play button about 7 seconds.

The Monitor/Recorder goes into Play Lock mode.

To Cancel the Play Lock Mode :



12 On Screen Indications

Whenever you press a function button (Stop, FF, etc.) or change channels, a 4 second OSD appears. The function name or channel number (if tuned) are displayed first as a large overlay for 2 seconds, then for 2 seconds as a smaller overlay. The display then disappears from the screen.

Warning and Instruction Display

These displays will alert you to a missed operation or provide further instructions.




Closed Caption System

This feature not only allow the hearing-impaired to enjoy selected programs, but also makes valuable information from your TV stations available to you.

To Set the Closed Caption Mode

Press the C.C. (Closed Caption) button to select the desired caption mode (see below).

The overlay will disappear in 5 seconds.



Each press of the C.C. button will change the caption mode as follows:




 You may also select the caption mode from the menu screen. Press the Menu button. Use the Select Up/Down and Set buttons and the Set button to select the SET UP TV and then the CAPTION. Finally choose the desired caption mode with the Set button.


To Set the Caption On Mute

This feature allows you to turn off the sound and, at the same time, display the closed caption narration. Perfect for when you need silence, but would like to continue enjoying the program.


1 Press the Menu button to display the menu screen.




- **2** Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to first, select SET UP TV and then, to select the CAPTION screen.
- **3 Press the Select Up/Down buttons** to select the CAPTION ON MUTE mode.
 - Make sure the CAPTION MODE is "OFF."



4 Press the Set button to select the desired caption mode. Each press of the Set button will change the display as shown below:





Selecting the Proper Mode

Caption Mode: CAP C1 or C2

A narration of selected TV programs will be displayed on the screen. Check your TV program listings for CC (closed caption) broadcasts.

Caption Mode: TEXT C1 or C2

In this mode, the screen will be blocked out. Then, when the TV station broadcasts text such as program listings, special information, etc., it will appear in this space. This text block will remain on the screen until you cancel this mode.

Caption Mode: OFF

In this mode, narration will not appear on the screen even if a closed caption broadcast is received.

• The closed caption or text signal may be broadcast over C1, C2, or both. Also, text contents can vary so you may wish to try different settings.

Recording and Playing Back a Closed Caption/Text Program

Your Monitor/Recorder will automatically record the Closed Caption/Text signal of applicable programs. To see the Closed Caption narration or text during playback, simply follow the steps above left.


• When selecting prerecorded tapes for rental or purchase, look for the CC (closed caption) mark.

• This television receiver provides display of television closed captioning in accordance with §15.119 of the FCC rules.

14 To Watch TV

This section describes the basic operations for watching TV. Use the controls described on page 15 to adjust the picture as you desire while you are watching TV.



Audio Mute

To mute the sound temporarily, press the Mute button on the remote control. When you press it again, the volume will return to the previous level.


Earphone Jack

An optional earphone plugs in here to monitor the sound.

Sleep Timer

You can set the Sleep Timer to turn the Monitor/Recorder off automatically at the end of a preset time period (30, 60 or 90 minutes). Sleep Timer is not available during Play Lock Mode. (See page 11.) This feature is useful to turn the Monitor/Recorder off when watching a late program, otherwise you might doze off leaving the Monitor/Recorder on.

- **1** Press the Sleep button on the remote control. "SLEEP TIMER 30" will appear as an On Screen Display.
- **2** Press the Sieep button repeatedly to increase the time. The desired time (60 or 90 minutes) will appear on the screen.
 - If you press the Display button with the SLEEP TIMER set, the remaining time will appear on-screen.




To cancel the Sleep Timer Function

Press the Sleep Timer button until "SLEEP TIMER 00" appears.

On Timer

You can set the On Timer to turn the Monitor/Recorder on automatically at a desired time. For example, the Monitor/Recorder can be set to wake you up in the morning or to remind you that a favorite program is about to start.

- Even if you set the On Timer, it will not be performed during Play Lock Mode. (See page 11.)
- **1** Press the On Timer button on the remote control. The On Timer display will appear as an On Screen Display.
- 2 Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to set the ON time.
- 3 Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to set the desired channel except for Line input or press the Play button to select the Playback mode when power comes on.
 - Press the Clear or Set button repeatedly to move back to an item you want to change.
- Press the On Timer button to set the On Timer function.
 This screen will appear for about 5 seconds.
 The On Timer indicator lights on the front panel on the Monitor/Recorder.

To cancel the On Timer Function

Press the Clear button while above screen is displayed. "ON TIMER END" will appear for about 5 seconds as an On Screen Display.

 60 minutes after the Monitor/Recorder turns itself on, it will turn itself back off unless any remote or Monitor/Recorder is pressed.

To Watch TV (continued)

How to Adjust

- **1** Press the Menu button to display the Menu screen.
- 2 Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to first, select the SET UP TV and then, to select the VIDEO ADJUST.
- **3** Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to select and display the desired video adjust overlay. (See description at right.)




- **1 Press the Menu button** to display the Menu screen.
- 2 Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to first, select the SET UP TV and then, to select the VIDEO ADJUST.
- **3** Press the Select Up/Down and Set buttons to select and set the Normal. All controls return to factory setting.

16 Special Playback Features

After you are familiar with tape playback (see page 11, "To Play Video Tapes"), you are ready to enjoy the special playback features described on this page. These features work best in the SP or SLP mode. The sound will be muted.

To Rapidly Locate a Particular Segment

1 Press the Search button during playback on the remote control.

This starts a rapid forward or reverse visual search.

2 Press the Search button again or the Play button to return to playback.

Search speed in SP mode is about 9 times the normal speed. Search speed in SLP mode is about 27 times the normal speed.

During search playback, some noise bars will appear on the TV screen.

Intelligent Search

If the search is re-started within 5 seconds of a previous search, the search speed will be slowed down (SP mode: 5 times, SLP mode: 9 times). Select a function within 8 second to locate the particular segment. If a function is not selected within 8 seconds normal search speed with resume.

To Advance a Still Picture

1 In still mode, press the Slow button on the remote control.

Frame advance will only operate during still. The picture will slowly advance frame by frame while this button is held down.

To View a Still Picture (During Playback)

1 Press the Pause button on the remote control.

A freeze frame playback image appears. After the Monitor/ Recorder is in the still or slow mode for 3 minutes, it will stop automatically to protect the tape and video head.

2 Press this button again to release the still and continue playback.

To View a Slow Motion Picture

1 During playback, press the Slow button on the remote control.

You can vary the tape speed of the slow motion by pressing the Slow Up/Down buttons on the remote control.

2 Press the Play button to release the slow mode.

Digital Auto Tracking


With Digital Auto Tracking there is usually no need for manual adjustments to minimize noise in playback for most tapes. Digital Auto Tracking continuously analyzes the signal to adjust for optimum picture quality for each recording. However, with some recordings you may get a better result using Manual Tracking.


Manual Tracking Control

Press the Channel Up/Down keys on your remote control or the Monitor/Recorder.

Manual Tracking adjustment is intended for use during playback and slow motion to minimize noise in the picture.

To return to Auto Tracking, eject and re-insert the tape.





V-Lock Control

Press the Channel Up/Down keys on your remote control or the Monitor/Recorder to reduce litter in still mode. Once you have made this adjustment, you probably will not have to do it again unless you select still on a tape that was recorded on a different VCR.

Blank Tape Indication

If a blank section of tape is encountered in the play mode or the channel you select has no broadcast, the screen will change to a solid blue field. The screen will remain blue until a recorded signal is again detected or an active channel is selected.

Head Cleaner

A clean video head helps produce a clear picture. So we have equipped your Monitor/Recorder with a built-in, non chemical head cleaning system that helps prevent clogging of the video heads. Cleaning is performed each time you load or unload a video cassette.

Note: This feature is preventative only. If your video heads are seriously clogged, take your Monitor/Recorder to a qualified service technician.

Black Tube

This Monitor/Recorder uses a Black tube for better color reduction and picture contrast.

Auto Operation Functions

Auto Playback

When a tape is inserted the power comes on (Auto). If the record tab* is removed, playback begins (Auto).

Auto Rewind

After a tape reaches its end during playback, fast forward or manual record, the Monitor/Recorder will rewind it and go into Stop mode.

Rec Auto Eject

After a tape reaches its end during recording, the Monitor/ Recorder will rewind and eject the tape.

Playback Auto Eject

After a tape without a record tab* is played to its end, the Monitor/Recorder will rewind and then eject the tape.

Eject Cassette

A cassette may be ejected with power on or off.

Memory Rewind Off

When the Power button is pressed during rewind, rewind will be completed even though the Monitor/Recorder.

* For record tab information refer to page 23.

Timer Playback

The Timer Playback feature lets you set the Monitor/Recorder from the remote control to do unattended playback.


For each program you set, the Monitor/Recorder will turn itself on at the scheduled time and do the playback, and turn off automatically. Instructions for each step appear on the TV screen after you select the program mode.

Preparations:

- The clock is set to the correct time.
- Enter program selections within 5 minutes of each other or the Monitor/Recorder will automatically leave this mode.


You can program the timer to:

- playback a tape everyday, Monday to Saturday of each week, or Monday to Friday of each week, at the same time length (Daily Playback).
- playback a tape once a week at the same time, length and day of each week (Weekly Playback).









- If "PROGRAM IS INCOMPLETE" appears, check start and stop items and then re-enter.
- Select the next program by pressing the Select Up/Down and Set buttons, then, repeat steps 2-5.
- 6 Press the Prog button to exit the programming mode and set the timer.

 - · When Repeat Play is turned on, the Monitor/Recorder will play to the end of a tape, or until it reaches a blank portion 30 seconds or more. (Erased portions of tape are not considered blank.) Then, the Monitor/Recorder will automatically rewind the tape and play it again and again until you cancel Repeat Play.
- 2 Press the Play button once again to turn the repeat function off. The REPEAT Indicator goes out.




One Minute Skip

This feature allows you to skip over commercials recorded on a tape.

Press the Zero/1 Min button in Play mode.

The Monitor/Recorder will go into FF search mode and skip over 60 seconds of recorded time. Then, normal playback will resume.

Video Head Cleaning:

Your Monitor/Recorder will not normally require head cleaning; however, it is possible that the heads may become clogged when playing an old or damaged tape. If the image on your screen resembles the photograph here during playback, the heads may require cleaning. It is recommended that the cleaning

be done by a qualified technician.

24 Re-Recording (Tape Duplication)

Dubbing from any VHS recorder (or camcorder) to another is simple and can be done using the connections and steps shown below.

- 1 Insert a pre-recorded tape into the Playing (Source) VCR.
- 2 Insert a blank tape with record tab into the Recording (Editing) Monitor/Recorder.
- **3** Select the "LINE" as the input on the Recording (Editing) Monitor/Recorder.
 - If you are using this Monitor/Recorder as the Recording (Editing) unit, see "Selecting the Input Mode" section on page 22.
- 4 Press the Play button on the Playing (Source) VCR.

When the reduces the point at which you want to start dubbing, **press the Pause button** on the remote.



Getting Started

• With cable connections, numbers selected to receive specific channels may differ from those for antenna connections. Refer to your cable service information.

Clock Adjustment

- Make entries within 5 minutes of the appearance of the clock set guide. Otherwise, the program you were watching will return to the screen. If this happens, press the Menu button and start again.
- The letters for day of the week will automatically appear when you have entered both digits for the year.
- If you press the Menu button while the clock set guide appears, the TV screen will return to the program you were watching.

Special Playback Features

- During search playback, horizontal noise bars will appear on the TV screen.
- After the Monitor/Recorder is in the still or slow mode for 3 minutes it will stop automatically to protect the tape and video head.
- The special effects playback feature is intended for tapes recorded in SP or SLP speed. Tapes recorded in LP mode can also be viewed in special effects playback, but the picture may be completely snowy.

To Record

- While it is possible to change the tape speed when you are recording, there will be some distortion on the tape where the change occurred.
- After the Monitor/Recorder has been in pause for 5 minutes it will stop automatically to protect the tape and video head.
- The cassette will eject automatically if its record tab is missing when you press the Rec button.


Timer Playback

- Timer playback may not be performed or continue if a power interruption of more than about 1 minute occurs before or during timer playback, even if power resumes thereafter.
- If the start times of 2 preset programs overlap, the preset time of the lower numbered program will have priority.
- If the preset time for a timer playback comes up during a normal playback, the timer playback will not be performed.

D. S. T . (Daylight Saving Time)

First Sunday in April (ahead 1 hour)

Because the clock automatically changes from 2AM to 3AM, keep in mind that any part of a scheduled timer playback which falls between these two times will not be performed.




Examples:

A playback set to begin at 1:30AM and end at 2:30 will actually play for 30 minutes.

A playback set to begin at 1:30AM and end at 3:30 will actually play for 1 hour, and so on.

Autumn

Last Sunday in October (back 1 hour) The clock automatically changes from 2:00AM back to 1:00AM and therefore affects your playback length.



Examples:

A playback set from 12:50AM to 2:30, will actually play for 2 hours and 40 minutes.

A playback set from 1:00AM to 1:30, will actually play for 30 minutes. (Not affected.)

A playback set from 1:30AM to 2:30, will actually play from 1:30 to 2:00 and then go into the Stop mode until it becomes 1:30 again. The playback will then continue until 2:30 for a total playback time of 1 hour and 30 minutes.

• Even if one timer playback of a daily or weekly series is affected, other playback segments of the series will be performed as programmed.

26 Before Requesting Service

Monitor/Recorder can't be remote controlled	Aim the Remote Control directly at the remote sensor on the Monitor/Recorder. (P.5) Avoid all obstacles which may interfere with the signal path. Inspect or replace the batteries. (P.2)

Video cassette can't be inserted	Insert the cassette with the window side up and the record tab facing you.
Video cassette can't be removed	Check that the power plug is completely connected to an AC outlet.

Video cassette ejects when the Rec and Play buttons are pressed on	Check the cassette to be sure that the record tab on the back of the cassette is still intact. (P.23)
In the stop mode, the motor (CYLINDER) continues to rotate	To enable quick play mechanism the cylinder will rotate for about 5 minutes. The quick play mechanism reduces response time from Stop to Play mode and from Play to Rewind search mode.
