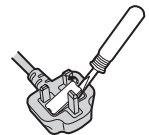

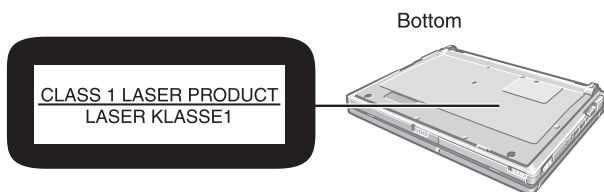

## Precautions (Battery Pack)

- Care should be exercised with regard to the following in order to avoid the possibility of overheating, fire or damage.



### Avoid Heat

Do not throw the battery pack into a fire or expose it to excessive heat.



### Keep Articles Away

Do not place the battery pack together with articles such as necklaces or hairpins when carrying or storing.



### Do Not Disassemble

Do not insert sharp objects into the battery pack, expose it to bumps or shocks, deform, disassemble, or modify it.



### Do Not Short

Do not short the positive (+) and negative (-) contacts.



### Avoid Extreme Heat, Cold and Direct Sunlight

Do not charge, use or leave the battery pack for extended periods where it will be exposed to direct sunlight, in a hot place (in a car on a sunny day, for example), or in a cold place.



### Do not charge the battery using the methods other than indicated in this manual



### Do Not Use With Any Other Computer

The battery pack is rechargeable and was intended for the specified computer. Do not use it with a computer other than the one for which it was designed.



### Do Not Put into a Microwave

Do not put the battery pack into a microwave oven or a pressurized chamber.



### Stop Using

Should the battery emit an abnormal odor, become hot to the touch, become discolored, change shape, or become in any way different from normal, remove it from the computer and stop using it.

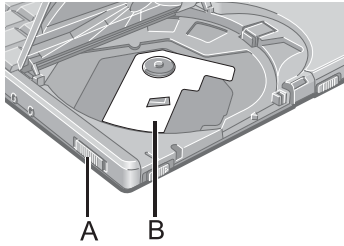
- Do not touch the terminals on the battery pack. The battery pack may no longer function properly if the contacts are dirty or damaged.
- Do not expose the battery pack to water, or allow it to become wet.
- If the battery pack will not be used for a long period of time (a month or more), charge or discharge (use) the battery pack until the remaining battery level becomes 30% to 40% and store it in a cool, dry place.
- This computer prevents overcharging of the battery by recharging only when the remaining power is less than approx. 95% of capacity.
- The battery pack is not charged when the computer is first purchased. Be sure to charge it before using it for the first time. When the AC adaptor is connected to the computer, charging begins automatically.
- Should the battery leak and the fluid get into your eyes, do not rub your eyes. Immediately flush your eyes with clear water and see a doctor for medical treatment as soon as possible.

### NOTE

- The battery pack may become warm during recharging or normal use. This is completely normal.
- Recharging will not commence outside of the allowable temperature range (0 °C to 55 °C {32 °F to 131 °F}). (→ "Chapter 2: Battery Power" in onscreen Reference Manual) Once the allowable range requirement is satisfied, charging begins automatically. Note that the recharging time varies based on the usage conditions. (Recharging takes longer than usual when the temperature is 10 °C {50 °F} or less.)
- If the temperature is low, the operating time is shortened. Only use the computer within the allowable temperature range.
- The battery pack is a consumable item. If the amount of time the computer can be run off a particular battery pack becomes dramatically shorter and repeated recharging does not restore its performance, the battery pack should be replaced with a new one.
- When transporting a spare battery inside a package, briefcase, etc., it is recommended that it be placed in a plastic bag so that its contacts are protected.
- Always power off the computer when it is not in use. Leaving the computer on when the AC adaptor is not connected will exhaust the remaining battery capacity.

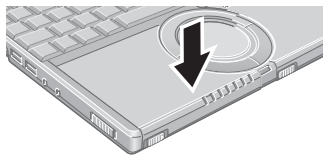

## Usage Precautions



### ◆ Before using the drive:

- When using the drive for the first time, slide the open lever (A) on the left side of the computer to open the disk cover after the computer has been powered on, and if the protective sheet (B) is attached to the drive, remove it from the lens area.
- Do not expose the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive to excessive smoke that may leave a residue, e.g. oil smoke, or tobacco smoke. Doing so could shorten the life of the drive lens.



### ◆ When closing the disk cover:

- Press down near the power indicator ⌚ (position of the arrow) to ensure that the cover is locked.

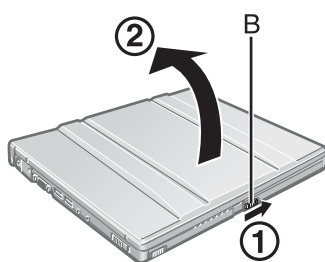


## 3 Turn the computer over and insert the battery pack.

- ① Slide the left-side latch (A) to the unlock position (🔓).
- ② Make sure the battery pack is facing the correct direction, slide it in the direction of the arrow.
- ③ Slide the left-side latch to the lock position (🔒), and then check to ensure that the battery pack is held firmly. (Right-side latch is locked automatically.)

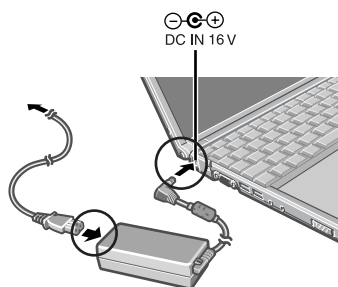
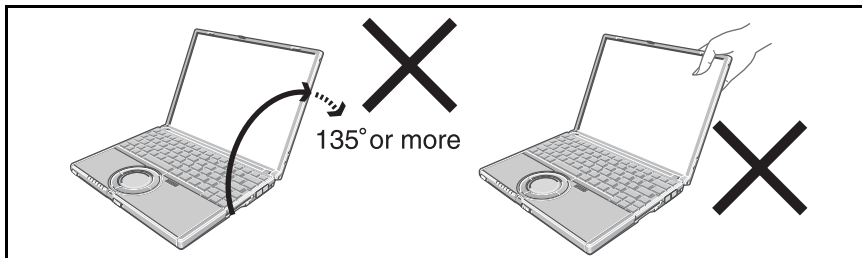
### CAUTION

- Confirm that the latch is properly locked. If it is not, the battery pack may come off while you are carrying the computer.
- Do not touch the terminals on the battery pack and the computer. The battery pack may no longer function properly if the contacts are dirty or damaged. Also, the computer may not operate properly.
- Before using the battery pack, carefully read "Precautions (Battery Pack)" (→ page 11).



#### 4 Open the display.

- ① Slide the latch (B) located at the front.
- ② Lift open the display.
  - Do not open the display wider than necessary (135° or more), and do not apply excessive pressure to the LCD. Also, do not hold the LCD when opening or closing the display.



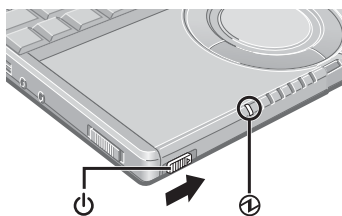
#### 5 Connect your computer to a power outlet.

- Be sure the AC adaptor is connected until completing the first-time use operation.
- The battery pack will be charged automatically.  
Charging Time: Approx. 4.5 hours (Varies depending on the usage conditions.)
- When using the computer for the first time, do not connect any peripheral device except the battery pack and AC adaptor to the computer.



#### CAUTION

##### Handling the AC adaptor

- Do not subject the AC adaptor to any strong impact.  
Using the AC adaptor after a strong impact such as being dropped may result in electrocution, short circuit, or fire.
- Use only the specified AC adaptor with your computer. Using an AC adaptor other than the one supplied might damage the battery and/or the computer.
- Problems such as sudden voltage drops may arise during periods of thunder and lightning. Since this could adversely affect your computer, an uninterruptible power source (UPS) is highly recommended unless running from the battery pack alone.

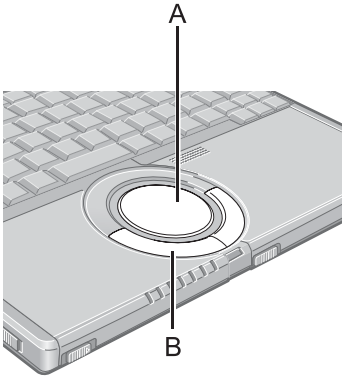


#### 6 Turn your computer on.


- Slide the power switch  and hold it for approximately one second until the power indicator  turns on before releasing it.

#### CAUTION

- Do not slide the power switch and hold it for more than four seconds; this will cause the power to be turned off forcibly.
- Do not slide the power switch repeatedly.
- It takes some time before [Windows XP Professional Setup] is displayed. Do not press any keys or touch the touch pad, and do not change the Setup Utility settings. If you do, Windows setup may not operate properly.

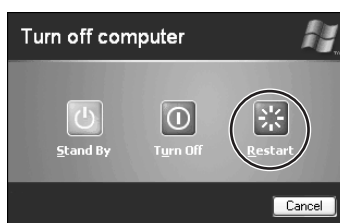
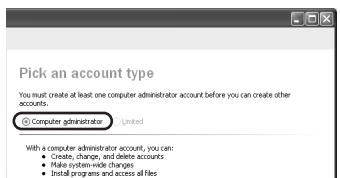
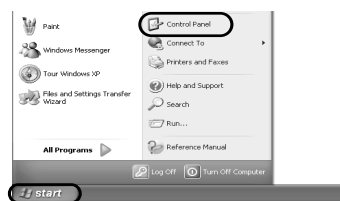
- ① At [Welcome to the Windows XP Setup Wizard], click [Next].
- ② After reading the agreement, click [I accept this agreement], then click [Next].
  - If [I don't accept this agreement] is selected, the Windows setup will be aborted.
- ③ Select settings for your region, then click [Next].
- ④ Enter your name and then click [Next]. (You do not need to enter your organization.)
- ⑤ Enter your computer name and administrator password and then click [Next].
  - "Computer name" is for recognizing this computer when multiple computers are connected via the network.
  - Remember this password! This password may be needed to manage the computer.
- ⑥ Enter the correct date, time and the time zone, then select [Next].
  - Click  or  to set.
  - If set properly, click [Next].
  - After being set automatically, the computer will restart automatically, and Windows will start.

- It may take some time before the computer restarts. Wait, and do not press any keys, or touch the touch pad, etc.
- ⑦ Enter your password set in step ⑤ and select .
  - When inputting the password, confirm that character input is not set to "Caps Lock" or "NumLk." (→ page 17)

- At the time of purchase, the wireless LAN is turned on. If you want to use the computer with the wireless LAN turned off: → page 39.



## 8 Create "User Accounts" to recognize this computer's user.

- If you make mail settings, create password reset disks (→ page 23), or conduct other related operations before creating the user account, you will be unable to use mail history or settings. Create the user account at this time.

① Click [start]<sup>\*1</sup> - [Control Panel] - [User Accounts] - [Create a new account].

\*1 Immediately after Windows setup, the screen may show a display as though [start] has been clicked (i.e., [All Programs] and other menus may be shown above [start]).

② Enter a new name for the new account, then click [Next].  
(For example: Matsushita)

③ Click [Create Account].

- When you create the first new account, you can only select [Computer administrator].

Once a "Computer Administrator" account has been created, you can create additional limited user accounts by operating step 8.

④ Set the password.

- When sharing this computer with multiple users, we recommend setting a password for your own account.

- When setting password, click the account for which you will set the password, click [Create a password], and the password following the onscreen instructions, and click [Create Password].

● Remember the password you have set. It is useful to input a hint in [password hint] in case you forget your password. In addition, we recommend that you create a password reset disk beforehand (→ page 23).

Refer to "When administrator password is forgotten" (→ page 23) in "Dealing with Problems (Summary)."

⑤ Click [start] - [Turn Off Computer] - [Restart] to restart the computer.

⑥ At the Welcome screen, click the created user (user icon) to log-on.

- If the password has been set, enter the password and click [OK]. You cannot operate the computer until the proper password is entered. Confirm that character input is not set to "Caps Lock" or "NumLk." (→ page 17)
- Note also that only the added user account will be displayed in the Welcome screen. The account for the administrator created during Windows setup will not be displayed.

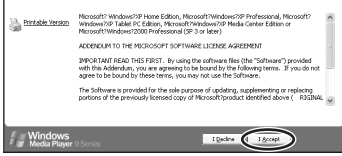

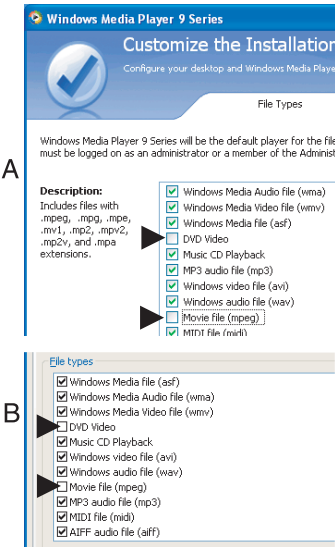

# Password Reset Function

## ◆ When you have forgotten a Windows log-on password.

Windows XP has a function to reset a current password and to set a new password. To use this function, you need to create a password reset disk beforehand following the steps below.

- ① Connect the USB floppy disk drive (optional: CF-VFDU03) to your computer.
- ② Click [start] - [Control Panel] - [User Accounts].
- ③ Click the account you have logged on, and click [Prevent a forgotten password] from [Related Tasks] menu.

Create a password reset disk following the onscreen instructions, and store the password reset disk in a safe place.

- Only the log-on password for each account can be reset. The password set in the Setup Utility cannot be reset.



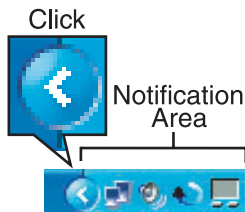
## Screen Display



The screen displayed first when powering on the computer and logging on to Windows, is called the “desktop.” (These screens and icons are only examples.)

- Icons on the desktop  
When you double-click icons, the software application will run and the window will open.
- [start] menu  
When you click [start], the menu will be displayed.  
Select the software application, etc. that you want to use from the menu, and click it.

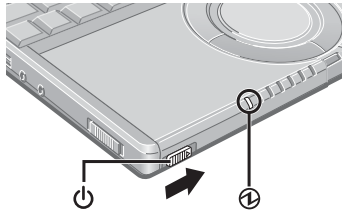
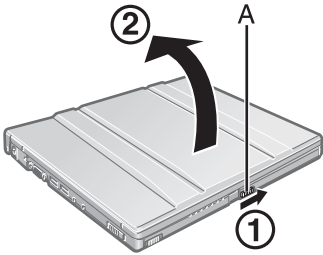

# Starting Up/Shutting Down



## Starting Up




### 1 Open the display.


- Slide the latch (A) located at the front.
- Lift open the display.
  - Do not open the display wider than necessary (135° or more), and do not apply excessive pressure to the LCD. Also, do not hold the LCD when opening or closing the display.


### 2 Turn your computer on.

Slide the power switch  and hold it for approximately one second until the power indicator  turns on before releasing it.

- Do not slide the power switch and hold it for more than four seconds; this will cause the power to be turned off forcibly.
- While booting, avoid the following until the hard disk drive indicator  has turned off.
  - Connecting or disconnecting the AC adaptor.
  - Touching the power switch.
  - Performing any keyboard, touch pad, or external mouse operations.
  - Closing the display.
- Do not slide the power switch repeatedly.
- Once the computer is powered off, you must wait at least ten seconds before powering it on again.

### 3 Log-on to Windows.

After confirming that the hard disk drive indicator  has turned off, click the user (user's icon).

- Input the password, then click . Until the correct password is entered, the computer will not operate. Confirm that character input is not set to “Caps Lock” or “NumLK.” (→ page 17)
- This operation may differ according to [Use the Welcome screen setting].
- When only one user has been created and no password has been set, the screen for selecting the user will not be displayed (automatic log-on).

### 4 Select your application.

Run various software applications, etc. and operate them.

#### NOTE

- The power saving function is factory set, so if there is no input from a key, the touch pad or an external mouse (when one is connected) for a certain interval of time, the power to the LCD and hard disk may be turned off. The LCD will resume operation when the touch pad or an external mouse (when one is connected) is used or a key is pressed.

The power to the LCD may be turned off even when an application software is being installed. In this case, because it is conceivable that a selection dialog box will be shown, do not press the **Space** key or the **Enter** key to attempt to resume from this condition as doing so may trigger a selection, but instead, press a key unrelated to the direct triggering of a selection, like the **Ctrl** key. In addition, when the computer is left alone, it automatically enters the standby or hibernation mode. The computer will resume by sliding the power switch. (→“Chapter 2: Standby/Hibernation Functions” in onscreen Reference Manual)



- When the CPU temperature rises, the computer may not power on to prevent the CPU from overheating. Should this happen, allow the computer to cool down then switch the power on again.  
If the computer still does not power on, contact your technical support office. (→ page 65)

### ◆ If the screen on the left is displayed immediately after you turn on the power...



A password has been set to ensure the computer's security.

Enter your password\*<sup>1</sup> and press the **Enter** key.

- When the correct password is input, the computer will start.
- When three incorrect password attempts or nothing is input for one minute, the computer will power off.

\*<sup>1</sup> Supervisor Password or User Password set in the Setup Utility (not the Windows password).

## Shutting Down (power off your computer)

**1 Save important data and close each application.**

**2 Display the shutdown screen.**

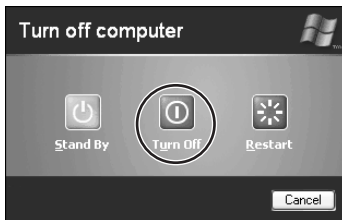

- Restarting your computer (without shutting down): click [Restart].

### ◆ To shut down using the keyboard:

- ① Press the **[Fn]** key, the **[U]** key, and select [Turn Off] with **→ ← ↑ ↓**.
- ② Press the **Enter** key.



### CAUTION

- Do not do the following during the shutdown/restart procedure.
  - Connecting or disconnecting the AC adaptor.
  - Touching the power switch.
  - Performing any keyboard, touch pad or external mouse operations.
  - Closing the display.

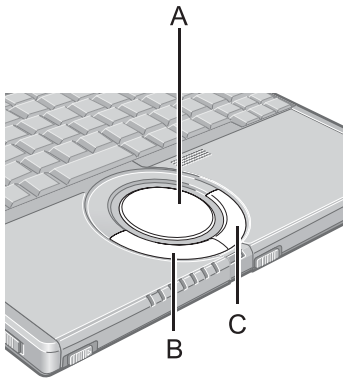
### NOTE

- When the DC plug is not connected to the computer, disconnect the AC cord from your AC wall outlet. About 1.5 W of power is consumed simply by having the AC adaptor plugged into an electrical outlet.

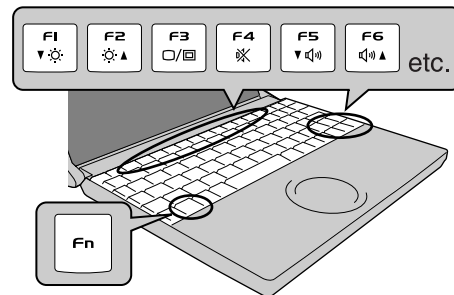
## NOTE

- You can change the speed of the double-click or the operations of mouse buttons using [Mouse Properties] screen
  - To display [Mouse Properties]:  
Click [start] - [Control Panel] - [Printers and Other Hardware] - [Mouse].
- Sensitivity when touching the touch pad can be adjusted (→ “Chapter 2: Using the Touch Pad” in onscreen Reference Manual)
- When an external mouse is connected and the cursor does not operate properly:  
In the [Main] menu of the Setup Utility, set [Touch Pad] to [Disable]. When you want to use the touch pad again, return the setting to [Enable]. (→ page 32)
- When using the touch pad, keep the following in mind.
  - By design the touch pad is to be used with a finger tip only. Do not place any object or press down forcefully with sharp-pointed objects, i.e. finger nails, pencils, or pens on the work surface.
  - Try to avoid having any harmful substances, such as oil, come in contact with the touch pad. The cursor may not work properly in such cases.

# Using the Fn key

If you press a key for a character or symbol contained in a frame while pressing the **Fn** key, the function for the character or the symbol contained in that frame will be executed.

- When using with the **Fn** key and the **Ctrl** key functions interchanged. (→ page 32)

# Expanding Memory

- Matsushita Electric Industrial Co., Ltd. will bear no responsibility whatsoever for failures or damage caused by the use of non-recommended RAM modules, or by incorrect installation or removal of such RAM modules. Before installing a RAM module, confirm the product type and the correct installation method.

## CAUTION

- RAM modules are extremely sensitive to static electricity. There are cases where static electricity generated by the human body has adversely affected such RAM modules. When inserting or removing a RAM module, do not touch the terminals or internal components, insert objects other than the module, or allow foreign particles to enter. Doing so has been known to cause damage, fire or electric shock.

The RAM module will be raised at an angle.

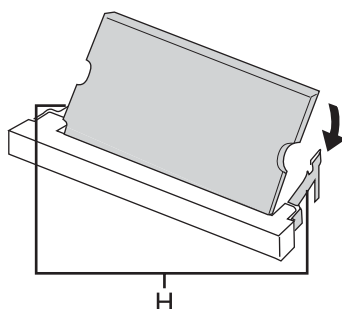
After making the settings in step 1 to 2 of “◆ Removing”, insert the RAM module as follows.



- ① Check direction of a RAM module (D).  
Hold the RAM module in the direction that the notch (F) of the RAM module suits to the protrusion (E) of the slot.
- ② Place the RAM module lightly in parallel with a slot.  
(The gold terminals (G) are visible)



- ③ Insert the module parallel to the slot and press firmly until the gold terminals are no longer visible.
  - If the RAM module is difficult to insert, do not force it. Check once more to ensure that the module is positioned correctly.
  - The slot may be damaged if the following procedure is performed without inserting the module firmly.



- ④ Press the RAM module down until the right and left hooks (H) lock into place.
  - When pressing down the module, the right and left hooks will open slightly and will return after locking.
  - If the RAM module is difficult to press down, do not force it. Check once more to ensure that the module is positioned correctly.

- ⑤ Put the cover back in place.  
Refer to step 4 of “◆ Removing”.

#### NOTE

- The memory size in [Information] menu of the Setup Utility (→ page 31) has increased if the RAM module has been recognized.  
If the RAM module is not recognized, power off the computer and insert it again. Refer to the main memory in the specifications to check the memory size at the time of shipment. (→ page 62)



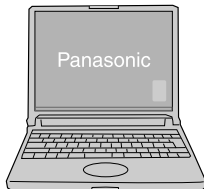
# Setup Utility

The Setup Utility sets the computer's boot-up operating environment (i.e. passwords, startup drive). The following six menu items are available:

[Information], [Main], [Advanced], [Security], [Boot], [Exit]

## Running the Setup Utility

### 1 Turn on or restart the computer.



### 2 Press the **F2** key while [Panasonic] boot screen is displayed soon after the computer begins the startup procedure.

When the password is set, the screen shown at left will be displayed. Enter your password, and press the **Enter** key.

When the Setup Utility is started with Supervisor Password

- You can modify all items of the Setup Utility

When the Setup Utility is started with User Password

- On the [Advanced] and the [Boot] menu:
  - You can view the settings, but cannot change them
- On the [Security] menu:

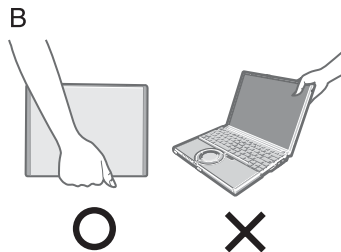
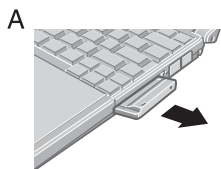
# Usage / Handling / Maintenance

## Usage Environment



- Place the computer on a flat stable surface.  
Do not place the computer to tip over. When the computer receives extremely strong shock after disk may become inoperable.
- Operation: Temperature: 5°C to 35°C {41°F to 95°F}  
Humidity: 30% to 80% RH (No condensation)
- Storage: Temperature: -20°C to 60°C {-4°F to 140°F}  
Humidity: 30% to 90% RH (No condensation)
- Keep the computer clear of electromagnetic cards and objects that emit electromagnetic waves.
  - Do not place the computer near magnets, electromagnetic bracelets, or other magnetic fields.
  - This computer uses a magnet in the position marked with a circle in the diagram on the left. Do not place a magnetic card or other magnetic field in contact with the computer.

## Handling



### ◆ When Carrying the computer, be sure to keep to the following:

- Turn off the computer.
- Remove all external devices, cables, PC Cards protruding from the computer (see figure A), SD memory cards, and MultiMedia Cards before transporting the computer.
- Close the display, and ensure that the latch (→ page 15) is positioned correctly in the slot.  
Do not carry the computer by gripping the display or the cabinet around the display (see figure B).
- Do not drop or hit the computer against solid objects.
- When taking an airplane
  - Always carry your computer and disks, etc with you. Never check it in with luggage.
  - Before using the computer inside an airplane, we recommend asking the airlines regarding their policy on this issue.
- When transporting a spare battery pack (sold separately) inside a package, briefcase, etc., it is recommended that it be placed in a plastic bag in order to protect its contacts.
- If the computer is being carried in a soft bag when the battery pack has been removed, be careful to avoid undue pressure on the body of the computer in a crowded place, etc., as this may result in damage to the LCD.

### ◆ We recommend the following:

- Preparing a spare battery pack (sold separately).
- Making backup copies on SD memory cards, etc. and if necessary, carrying them with you.

## Maintenance

- Care of the display / touch pad:  
Wipe lightly with a gauze or other dry, soft cloth.
- When the touch pad or other area other than the screen becomes dirty: wet a soft cloth with water or a diluted kitchen cleanser (neutral), wring the cloth out thoroughly, and wipe the dirty area gently. Using a detergent other than a neutral kitchen cleanser (e.g., a weak alkali cleanser) may adversely affect painted surfaces.

### CAUTION

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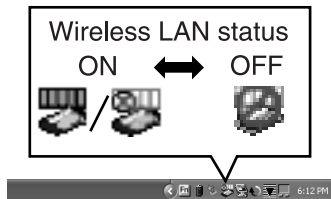
- Do not use benzene, thinner, or rubbing alcohol. Doing so may adversely affect the surface, e.g., discoloration. In addition, do not use commercially-available household cleaners and cosmetics, as they may contain components harmful to the surface.
  - Do not directly add or spray water or detergent onto the computer. If liquid enters the inside of the computer, it may cause it to work improperly or be damaged.

# Wireless LAN

For instructions on settings for wireless LAN and cautions during use, click [start] - [Reference Manual], and refer to "Chapter 5: Wireless LAN".

## About Turning on/off the Wireless LAN

- Before using a wireless LAN, turn it on using the following method (at the time of purchase, the wireless LAN is set to [On]).
- Turn on/off the wireless LAN using Intel(R) PROSet client.



**1** Double-click the  icon / the  icon (when the wireless LAN is on) or the  icon (when the wireless LAN is off) on the notification area.

**2** Select your wireless LAN adaptor and click [General].

**3** Click [On] or [Off] for [Switch radio].

**4** Click [OK].

- Do not click [Disable]<sup>\*1</sup> in [Network Connections].

<sup>\*1</sup> This is displayed by right-clicking [Wireless Network Connection] in [Network Connections].

◆ **Do not use the wireless LAN in airplanes, hospitals, or in other locations where wireless LAN signals may affect the operation of devices in the vicinity.**

Abide by instructions regarding use in airplanes and hospitals.

◆ **This computer uses channels 1 through 11<sup>\*2</sup>**

Check the channel being used by the access point.

<sup>\*2</sup> In the case of wireless communications, the frequency band being used can be divided into segments, so that different communications can be conducted on each band segment. A "Channel" refers to the individual frequency bandwidth divisions.

# Windows/Antivirus Measures

## Windows

Depending on the settings in Windows installed applications, drivers, menus and other displays may be inoperable. In this case, refer to the items below, and the applied items from this manual, “Chapter 7: Dealing with Problems (Advanced)” in onscreen Reference Manual, Windows Help (→ page 13), and the software application and driver’s operating instructions, etc.

### Change the Way Users Log on or off

If the check mark is added for [Use the Welcome screen] or [Use Fast User Switching] in [start] - [Control Panel] - [User Accounts] - [Change the way users log on or off], the operation differs as follows.

#### ◆ Welcome screen settings



The operations when starting and exiting Windows differ as follows.

[Use the Welcome screen] setting	Operation when starting	Operation when exiting
When adding the check mark (when using)	The list of user names will be displayed. Click the user name with which you want to log-on.	Click [start] - [Turn Off Computer] - [Turn Off].
With no check mark (when not using)	Enter the user name and password, and click [OK].	Click [start] - [Shut Down] - [Shut down] and click [OK].

- At the time of purchase, it is set with the check mark added (when using).
- When [Use when logging on to Windows] is set in [SD Card Setup] (→ “Chapter 4: SD Memory Card Security Function” in the onscreen Reference Manual), the Welcome screen cannot be used.

#### ◆ Fast User Switching settings



When adding the check mark for this setting, you can change to another user without logging on again when multiple users use the computer.

In the following case, Fast User Switching cannot be used.

- When the check mark is not added for [Use the Welcome screen]
- When joining the network domain
- When the [Use when logging on to Windows] is set in [SD Card Setup] (→ “Chapter 4: SD Memory Card Security Function” in the onscreen Reference Manual)

Depending on the software application, the computer may not work properly if this function is used.

This manual explains the procedure for cases where the check mark is added.

- When switching to a different user with the Fast User Switching function, it may not be possible to set the display settings. In this case, log-off all users, and retry the operation.

## Antivirus Measures/Windows Updates

To improve the security of the computer, use the following measures.

- Use antivirus software (commercially available).
- Use Windows XP Internet Connection Firewall.
- Update Windows  
If you can connect to the Internet, perform Windows Update. This can help protect the computer against virus attacks.  
Windows Update enables you to update Windows on your computer by applying the latest patches and service packs for Windows.
- Get the newest information about viruses from the Website of Microsoft Corp. and other software makers, etc.

# Use of Peripheral Devices/Internal Hard Disk

## When Using Peripheral Devices

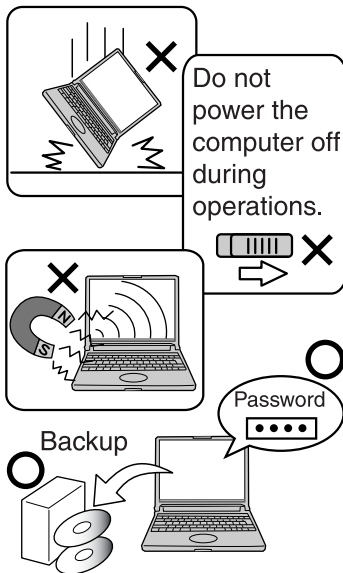
Pay strict attention to the following points to avoid damage to the computer, peripheral devices, cables, etc.

Also, in addition to following this manual and the onscreen Reference Manual, carefully read the instruction manuals for the peripheral devices being used.


- Use only peripheral devices that conform to the computer's specifications.
- Connect the devices properly, paying close attention to the condition and position of the connectors.
- If a connection cannot be made easily, do not apply undue force; check once more to confirm the condition and position of the connector (alignment of pins, etc.).
- If the connector has holding screws, fasten the screws firmly.
- Do not carry the computer with cables attached, and do not pull on the cables forcefully.

## Internal Hard Disk

### To Protect Data



Keep the following.

- **Do not expose your computer to shock.**  
Use care when handling your computer, shock may damage your hard disk or make your software applications and data unusable.
- **Do not power off your computer while software applications are running or hard disk drive indicator  is on.**  
Properly shut Windows down from the [start] menu to avoid problems. (→ page 25)
- **Do not place the Computer close to objects that emit electromagnetic waves (magnets, electromagnetic bracelets, etc.).**  
The data saved on the hard disk may be erased.
- **Important data saved on the hard disk should be saved regularly (e.g., in case of failures, unexpected data updates, erasure, etc.)**  
Regular backups are recommended as a means of minimizing damages in the event of trouble.
- **Use the security function for all important data.**  
(→ “Chapter 2: Security Measures” and “Chapter 4: SD Memory Card Security Function” in onscreen Reference Manual)

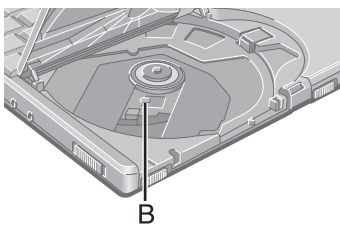
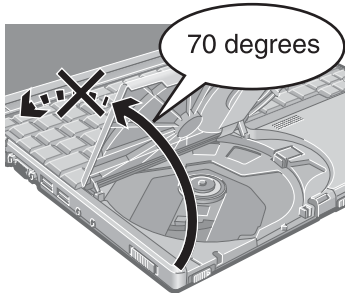
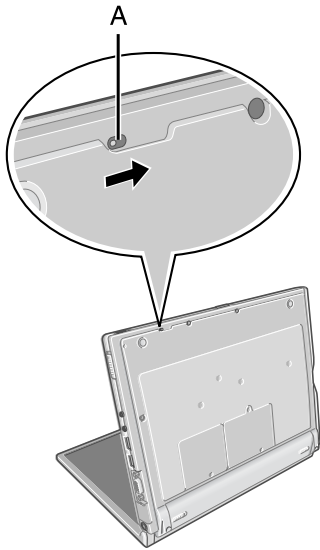
### When Changing Hard Disk Partitions

- During reinstallation, you can divide the hard disk space into two partitions by executing: [Make two partitions, for the operating system and data, and reinstall Windows to the operating system partition].


Confirm the minimum partition size required for the OS by checking the screen during the reinstallation.

If you want to create three or more partitions, after creating an OS partition and a data partition during the reinstallation, start up Windows, erase the second partition once using [Disk Management], and then create the partitions in the open space.

# Using CD/DVD



## ◆ About opening or closing the disk cover/cleaning the drive lens

- When the computer is on, be sure to use the open lever on the left side of the computer or perform the ejecting operation through Windows.  
When using the following software application, you cannot open the cover using the open lever
  - When using B's Recorder or B's CLiP, refer to "Chapter 3: Writing to CDs" in onscreen Reference Manual
- To remove a disk when the disk cover cannot be opened or when the computer is powered off, insert a pointed object (e.g., the bent-out tip of a paper clip, or the tip of a ballpoint pen) into the emergency hole (A), and move in the direction of the arrow
- Be careful not to do any of the following when the disk cover is open:
  - Do not close the display.  
Be sure to close the display only after confirming the disk cover is closed. If the disk cover is open, the LCD may become damaged
  - Never insert foreign objects such as paper clips into the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive.  
This could cause it to malfunction
- The disk cover can be opened up to an angle of 70 degrees. Do not force the cover open any further.  
If a hand or other object touches the disk cover and accidentally opens it wider than 70 degrees, pull it forward slowly until the stopper holds the cover in its proper position
- Do not leave the disk cover in the open position or touch the lens.  
Over time, dust may build up on the lens, or on a disk. This may result in a read or write malfunction
- Insert the disk securely. If the disk cover is closed without inserting the disk securely, it may become damaged.
- Do not access the drive until after the disk cover is closed and the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive status indicator  is off
- We recommend cleaning the drive lens (B) with an air puffer used for camera lenses (Do not use any spray lens cleaning products)

## ◆ While the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive is being accessed

- Do not open the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive or move the computer while the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive is being accessed  
Doing so could cause the disk to shift position, which may damage the disk, or cause the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive to malfunction.  
After running an application involving access to a disk, do not open the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive until after the application has been closed
- Do not apply excessive force on the disk cover
- Do not shock the computer by removing or inserting cables and cards, etc. This may result in a read or write malfunction

## ◆ About recognition of media

- It may take about 30 - 40 seconds for an image recorded to a rewritable media to be played back

This error occurs when the memory content is changed through some inadvertent operation by a program or other function.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Run the Setup Utility and load the default values, then change the settings to the appropriate values as needed. (→ page 30)</li> <li>● If the problem persists, the internal clock battery may need to be replaced. Contact your technical support office.</li> </ul>
0271: Check date and time settings	<p>The date and time setting are incorrect.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Set the date and time correctly in the [Main] menu of the Setup Utility. (→ page 32)</li> <li>● If the problem persists, the internal clock battery may need to be replaced. Contact your technical support office.</li> </ul>
0280: Previous boot incomplete - Default configuration used	<p>Startup has failed repeatedly, so the Setup Utility settings have been returned to their default values, and the computer has been booted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Run the Setup Utility and load the default values, then change the settings to the appropriate values as needed. (→ page 30)</li> </ul>
Press <F1> to resume, <F2> to Setup	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Write down the error details and press the <b>F2</b> key to run the Setup Utility. Confirm the settings, and change the settings to the appropriate values as needed. (→ page 30)</li> </ul>
Operating System not found	<p>The OS is not properly installed on the floppy disk or the hard disk that you are trying to boot from.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● If the computer cannot be booted from the floppy disk, check the floppy disk drive to ensure that the disk is in fact bootable, and change it to another if not.</li> <li>● If the computer cannot be booted from the hard disk, confirm whether the hard disk is properly recognized in the [Information] menu of the Setup Utility. 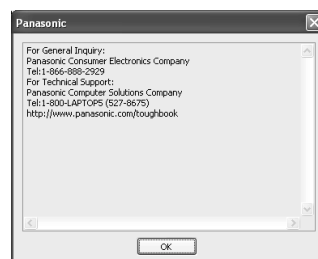
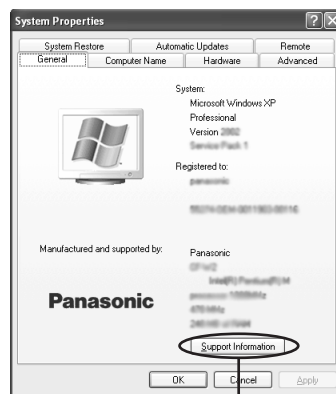

# Reinstalling Software

When reinstallation procedure is performed, the contents of the hard disk will be erased. Be sure to back up any critical data on your hard disk to another media or to an external hard disk before running the reinstallation procedure. The reinstallation procedure will return the computer to its original condition. If you have created partitions for data, the data may be erased or become corrupt as a result of the reinstallation procedure.

## ◆ What is “Reinstallation”?

Reinstallation refers to formatting the hard disk, and reinstalling Windows.

## ◆ When is “Reinstallation” necessary?

- When Windows does not start up, or when Windows operation is unstable and cannot be recovered.
- When using the hard disk with two partitions.

## Before Reinstallation

### ◆ Preparing

- You will need the Product Recovery DVD-ROM (included).

### ◆ Confirm the following

- Remove all peripherals and SD memory cards/MultiMedia Cards. Especially, when a USB floppy disk drive or a USB CD/DVD drive is connected, the reinstallation does not operate properly. Remove them.
- Even if reinstallation is executed, the number of times that the DVD video region code can be set will not be returned to the state set at the time of factory shipment.

### ◆ Reinstallation Procedure

Change the settings in the Setup Utility



Use the Product Recovery DVD-ROM to execute reinstallation. (About 20 minutes)



Return the Setup Utility settings to their default values.

At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press the **Enter** key.

The Setup Utility will close, and the computer will restart.

### ◆ Changing the drive letter

You can change the drive letter for the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive or hard disk drive by the following steps.

- Drive letters can only be changed when two or more partitions have been created on the hard disk drive. The name of the C: drive cannot be changed.
- We recommend that you make these changes before installing applications.
  - ① Click [start] - [Control Panel] - [Performance and Maintenance] - [Administrative Tools], and double click [Computer Management].
  - ② Click [Disk Management] from [Storage].
  - ③ Right click on the partition of the hard disk or the name of the DVD-ROM & CD-R/RW drive and click [Change Drive Letter and Paths...].
  - ④ Click [Change].
  - ⑤ Click [Assign the following drive letter] and select the new drive letter, and then click [OK].
  - ⑥ At the confirmation message, click [Yes].

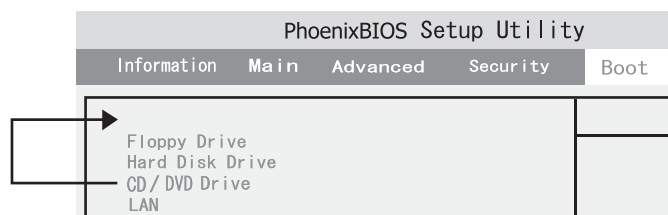
