



Safety Instructions For Monitor/Receivers

- Read and apply the operating instructions provided with your monitor/receiver.
- 2. Read all of the instructions given here and retain them for later use.
- 3. Unplug this monitor/receiver from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4. Do not use attachments not recommended by the monitor/receiver manufacturer as they may cause hazards.
- Do not use this monitor/receiver near water. For example: Avoid placing it near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a
 wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.



Video Monitor/Receiver Location

This unit is intended to be used with an optional stand. Consult your dealer for available options.


- Avoid excessive sunlight or bright lights, including reflections.




Incoming Cable from Home Antenna





- 4 Action Button Press to display Main Menu and to access or exit onscreen menus.


Trilingual Animated Icons
